### **Sylmar Farm still breeding to win**

For the last 38 years Ronnie and Betsy Houghton have worked side by side on their 300-acre Sylmar Farm in southeastern Pennsylvania. Surrounded by family members who all work on or for the farm, the Houghtons breed, foal, raise and race their own and clients' Thoroughbreds. Fan favorites like homebreds Whistle Pig, Banjo Picker and Turbo Speed contributed to Sylmar's four consecutive Leading PA Breeder Recipient titles from 2008 through 2011.

Betsy and Ronnie were Pony Clubbers together before he went off to college at Penn State. After Ronnie graduated they trained horses together during winters in Camden and travelled to racetracks the rest of the year. In 1970 they purchased their first farm on Sylmar Road in Rising Sun, Md.

It wasn't long before their breeding and training operation outgrew the boundaries of the Maryland property and by 1976 the Houghtons moved to Christiana and opened Sylmar Farm on 300 acres of rolling hills, fields and woods.

"We built all the barns and the training track," said Betsy, who after over 50 years breeding and racing Thoroughbreds demonstrates a remarkable memory for the details of many of the hundreds of horses born and raised at the farm. "My son Bernie, who is based at Penn National, trains all of the horses. We have a great system since our five-eighth-mile farm track has a starting gate and we can switch the horses back and forth from the track all the time. Turf gallops, six barns, two Eurocizers—we have a lot of options with the horses."

While Betsy spends her time in the training barn and in the office, Ronnie manages all of the outside work which according to Betsy is her reason the farm always looks so good.

"We built our whole operation up from nothing," she said. "This farm is our life. We don't play golf and we have no hobbies—our kids actually had to send us on vacation since we really don't go anywhere. They are all here and now our 11

grandchildren are too. More and more our family is taking over the farm as Ronnie and I get older."

The children are Bernie, Robin, Michael and Wendy who live at Sylmar or nearby. Robin works in the office while Michael owns a fleet of eight trucks in his Houghton Trucking Company. He supplies all the hay and straw for area farms including Sylmar.

Wendy Kinnamon and her husband, Travis, own Breakaway Farm just down the road and care for the Sylmar overflow of turnouts and layups.

Just as much a part of the Houghton family is Kim Eshleman, who since a teenager has been working for the Houghtons for nearly 38 years.

"Kim and her husband have their own little farm and we have her horses in training," said Betsy. "Kim has done every job on this farm at one time or another. She mainly runs the barns where the yearlings are being broke to ride and she was the first one to put tack on Princess of Sylmar."

Annually among the leading breeders in Pennsylvania, the Houghtons can proudly share in the notoriety of two stakes winners, neither one a homebred but both just as familiar to the Houghtons as if they were.

King of Prussia Stable's Princess of Sylmar was raised and began training at Sylmar before moving on to trainer Todd Pletcher. PJG Stable's Favorite Tale was bred by Paul Conaway and began training at Sylmar before moving to the track with trainer Guadalupe Preciado.

In 2013, Princess of Sylmar scored four consecutive Grade 1 wins in her 3-year-old campaign including the Kentucky Oaks, Coaching Club American Oaks, Alabama Stakes and Beldame Invitational Stakes. Her prowess against her age group and older fillies and mares earned her a trip to California and a start in the Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita. Although unplaced in the Distaff, she finished the year with over \$1.6 million in earnings.

Favorite Tale is a 2011 son of Tale of the Cat who won his first three starts at Parx at 3. Precia-

do then spotted him against stakes company in New York but returned to Parx on PA Derby Day for an impressive win in the Grade 3 \$300,000 Gallant Bob Stakes.

Like so many of the Houghton's clients, Ed Stanco, managing partner of King of Prussia Stables, and Conaway regularly visited their horses at the farm. Stanco, who was at Sylmar the day "Princess" was foaled, could often be seen in the field surrounded by 20 yearlings.

It is no coincidence that the talented filly shares a name with the Houghtons' operation.

"I love going to Sylmar to visit my horses," said Stanco. "But I don't like trying to think of names for them. So Betsy, Ronnie and I got together and named her for the farm."

"We will never have another one like her in our lives," said Betsy. "It was a great ride. We had her dam, Storm Dixie, here for seven years, and I still look out the window to the field where she was turned out. Ed Stanco got us so much recognition."

Betsy and Ronnie followed with great interest the purchase of their former charge when Princess of Sylmar sold for \$3.1 million as a broodmare prospect to Japanese interests

in Fasig Tipton's Select Fall Mixed Sale last November and her dam was purchased by agent Olin Gentry for \$1.9 million in foal to Tapit.

Like many reputable breeders and owners the Houghtons try hard to rehome their retirees. Betsy's favorite horse, a 2004 stakes-placed son of Patton named Saco River, retired at the age 8 and Betsy found him a home as a riding horse with a good friend.

"You can't take all of them back or you'd go out of business," she said. "But we do try hard to find safe homes for them all. We have 4-H groups and Pony Clubs close by and a lot of contacts and young girls who love to ride. We get pictures of them all the time with show ribbons and we just love to hear about their new lives."

Whistle Pig, PA-Bred Champion Older Male in 2008, is 11 years old and is back home at the farm lording over a field of 30 broodmares. His trainer and then owner Andy Carter had asked the Houghtons to take him upon his retirement four years ago and have offered to help financially if ever needed.

"We lost both Whistle Pig and Banjo Picker when they were claimed from us, but without spending another penny we picked up \$240,000 in breeders awards from Whistle Pig alone." said Betsy.

"And we loved Banjo Picker. We had been given the mare Sean's Gold for free but at one point she set the record for having 20 claims in for her at The Meadowlands," Betsy said. "Banjo made most of his purse money and won multiple stakes races for Danny Limongelli after he claimed him but the breeders awards those years were also very good to us."

Banjo, now 15, is retired at War Horses at Rose Bower in Virginia.

After over 50 years breeding and racing the Houghtons still feel the thrill of a talented young homebred. Cautious in their optimism both Betsy and her son Bernie look forward to their Tazewell County's 3-year-old campaign. A 17-hand son of Jump Start out of the Malibu Moon mare Prairie Heat, the colt is still a maiden, and finished fifth in the Pennsylvania Nursery Stakes in his second start.

"He ran a little green in the stake," said Betsy. "But he was just beat in his maiden race a month before. We are really hoping that he will prove that Prairie Heat is a good mare."
