Red Vine Kicks Off Bode Miller's Big Plans

While Olympic gold medalist Bode Miller is best known for his exploits on the ski slopes, his newest passion is an immersive foray into the world of Thoroughbred racing. The year 2017 marks the initial season at stud for Miller's first two stallions, with multiple stakes winner Unfettered in Maryland and multiple graded stakes-placed Red Vine in Pennsylvania.

The bringing of Red Vine to his new home, Xanthus Farm, was a carefully plotted plan executed when everything fell into place. Maria Vorhauer, Miller's stallion manager, said, "Bode wants to start racing his own horses, and the breeder awards are very good in both Maryland and Pennsylvania. I said let's not rule out these two states that are so lucrative. When this horse came up in the [Keeneland January] sale, we mapped out a plan for him before we bought him. We knew we would be coming in a little late, but we thought we could get a buzz going."

Miller said, "When I was first discussing the process of finding a stallion with Maria, she said it's tough. You can pay an insane amount of money for something that looks positive and has the cre-

dentials. It was super exciting to see Red Vine, who is really similar in a lot of ways to his sire."

Red Vine's wickedly fast, unbeaten sire Candy Ride (Arg) stands for \$60,000 in Kentucky, with 10 of his sons standing scattered between California and Kentucky. Red Vine is Candy Ride's first son to be available to breeders in the Mid-Atlantic region. His winning dam, Murky Waters, is a daughter of Storm Creek (Storm Cat) and out of the stakes-winning Fortunate Prospect mare Fort Pond, making Murky Waters a half-sister to millionaire Fort Prado. The Candy Ride – Storm Cat cross has produced the likes of millionaires Shared Belief, Gun Runner, and Sidney's Candy.

"Candy Ride's style of running was so compelling, it made him doubly exciting," Miller said. "There are some of his runners that are great horses but don't match up with why he was so successful, but I think this one does. When Red Vine raced you could sense he would be coming at the end. It makes watching racing even more exciting."

Through agent Patty Miller, Bode Miller went to \$25,000 to acquire Red Vine, who banked \$775,915 in his career. After breaking

Uptowncharlybrown Sires First Winners

Bob Hutt believes in magic. He has experienced it first-hand since Uptowncharlybrown became a part of his Fantasy Lane Stable family in 2009. And he believes that the “racing gods,” if you will, are smiling down on his chestnut stallion, who recently sired the first two winners of his stud career – 2-year-olds True Sweetheart and Alan’s Legacy, both owned and bred by Fantasy Lane.

True Sweetheart romped in her career debut, a six-furlong maiden event at Parx Racing. With apprentice Lery Pinero aboard, the dark bay filly seized the lead right out of the gate and increased her advantage at every pole, rolling home by 10 lengths over her nearest competitor.

And Charly’s second winner, Alan’s Legacy, broke his maiden in similar dramatic fashion. Jockey Mychel Sanchez sent him up after the lead early in the one mile, 70 yards contest, and then he shook clear after three-quarters of a mile and stormed home, a whopping 22½ lengths in front. Both True Sweetheart and Alan’s Legacy were trained by Eddie Coletti Jr.

The victories were especially meaningful to Hutt, who founded Fantasy Lane Stable in 1999 in his father’s memory so that people of even modest means could “feel like a millionaire without spending like one,” as it states in Fantasy Lane’s television commercial. Uptowncharlybrown was developed and trained by Hutt’s longtime friend Alan Seewald, who passed away unexpectedly in 2010, and in whose memory Hutt has developed the stallion’s stud career and raced his babies.

“I sat and cried for an hour, not taking any phone calls or talking to anyone,” said Hutt, in reflecting upon True Sweetheart’s win. “My first text was to Ryan Seewald, Alan’s son. I made Charly a stallion in Alan’s honor – that’s what this is all about.”

Alan’s Legacy, Uptowncharlybrown’s first colt to be foaled, was named for Seewald. His maiden-breaker on November 26 just so happened to be on Hutt’s birthday, too.

“It was an emotional day for all of us,” said Joerg Hoffman, a longtime Fantasy Lane partner that was part of Uptowncharlybrown’s ownership group and is also a partner in True Sweetheart and Alan’s Legacy. “We were all thinking of Alan. Without him, this wouldn’t have been possible.”

The Uptowncharlybrown story began when Fantasy Lane bought the son of Limehouse—La Iluminada, by Langfuhr, as a 2-year-old

at the April OBS sale for \$57,000 from bloodstock agent Norman Casse.

In what would be the first of many uncanny experiences surrounding Uptowncharlybrown, Hutt said that he returned to the barn at OBS after buying the colt and “out of nowhere” Casse appeared.

“It was the only time I’d met him,” said Hutt. “He congratulated me and said I bought a nice horse, and then he said ‘I’m going to ask a favor. I named him, and I know you can change the name, but I’m asking you to keep it, because he’s going to be very special.’ So we kept it.”

Seewald determined that Uptowncharlybrown, a big colt, needed time to grow, so he was turned out on a New Jersey farm for several weeks before joining Seewald’s stable at Monmouth Park.

“Alan tells me that ‘this chestnut is the best horse you’ve ever owned. Whatever you do, don’t tell the partners.’ Minutes later, an email went out to 500 people,” recalled Hutt with a laugh.

Charly’s first workout was also memorable, with more than 50 partners lining the rail to watch him go three furlongs. To Seewald’s dismay, the exercise rider couldn’t pull him up, and he recorded swift splits that included three furlongs in :34 and a six-furlong gallop out in 1:14 and change.

“Alan was mad,” said Hutt. “He said we broke him down, but the vet didn’t find anything wrong with him afterwards. For his second breeze the rider was under strict orders not to go that fast, and he went in :37½.”

Uptowncharlybrown made his debut December 26, 2009, at Tampa Bay Downs, winning by 10 lengths, and came right back and won the Pasco Stakes by six lengths a month later for his 3-year-old bow.

Hutt said that Seewald received an offer for him for \$2.5 million, but turned it down, telling the Fantasy Lane partners that he wanted to bypass the Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes for the Belmont Stakes and Haskell Invitational, and then sell him. Those plans, however, seemed to be in jeopardy with Seewald’s death April 12, 2010.

Uptowncharlybrown did indeed run in the Belmont for new trainer Kieran McLaughlin, but the saddle slipped during the race and the eight-pound weight pad dropped out, and he was disqualified from sixth to last place. Ultimately, an injury forced Charly’s retirement the

his maiden at Del Mar in 2013, he went on to run competitively in allowance company at Keeneland, Gulfstream Park, Saratoga and Belmont Park before going on a three-race win streak starting at Aqueduct in late 2014. The streak concluded with a victory in Monmouth Park's Majestic Light Stakes over millionaire Valid.

Red Vine went on to run almost exclusively in graded stakes after that effort. He finished second in the Salvator Mile-G3 before shipping to Del Mar for the \$1 million Pacific Classic-G1. It was by far the toughest field he had to face, including graded or group stakes winners Catch a Flight, Hoppertunity, Imperative, Hard Aces and Midnight Storm, let alone Breeders' Cup Classic-G1 winner Bayern and the incomparable mare Beholder. Red Vine held his own in the tough group, finishing third behind Beholder but well in front of most of the rest of the field, including Bayern.

A second-place effort in the \$400,000 Kelso Handicap-G2 at Belmont Park, in which he shockingly outran Metropolitan Handicap-G1 winner Honor Code, put Red Vine squarely in the hunt for the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile-G1. He ran third in that \$1,000,000 event, finishing behind winner Liam's Map but defeating Grade 1 winner Wicked Strong. In possibly the best performance of his career, Red Vine finished just a neck behind multiple Grade 1 winner Tonalist in the \$500,000 Cigar Mile-G1, pushing that mighty runner to give his all while suffering from his own traffic trouble in the race.

Red Vine ran just twice in 2016, finishing fourth in the Westchester Stakes-G3 in the spring and fifth in an allowance comeback in October that was the last start of his racing career. He won five of 23 starts, with eight seconds and six thirds. Only in his last start did he finish worse than fourth.

Miller met Vorhauer while she was still at the now-shuttered Dana Point Farm. The two stayed in contact, and when Vorhauer was ready to shoulder a new venture, Miller had one for her. "I'm so happy to be involved with this horse. Neat things are going to come out of him," Vorhauer said.

She praised the way Miller has begun to build his operation. "The breeding end of the game is such a shot in the dark," she said. "You have to have a plan, and budget, and not get overwhelmed or overhyped. Bode is off to a great start and being very practical."

Xanthus Farm, located in Gettysburg, is the brainchild of Barbara Rickline. She developed the farm in 1998, and glowed about the 80 acres of exceptional soil and clean air. "This is a nice area to raise horses," she said.

While the farm's stallion roster already boasts sterling pedigrees such as Xixixi, a young Maimonides half-brother to American Pharoah, Rickline thinks Red Vine is a perfect fit. "He's a nice horse with such a nice temperament," she said. "He fills the gap we were missing on the farm. We're looking forward to working with Bode and we're excited he's here. Red Vine has everything going for him and we think he'll be commercial."

Red Vine will stand for an introductory fee of \$2,500 live foal stands and nurses. Although many breeders book their mares earlier than late January, the enticing fee and complete package that is Red Vine should sway many. "The time is right to bring a horse like this to Pennsylvania," Vorhauer said. "I wanted an eye-popping response right away, where people realize this is a very nice horse for this area. I'm thrilled to be on board." ■

following year after a career that saw him face the best of his generation. Determined to give Charly his best chance as a sire, Hutt chose Pennsylvania for its outstanding \$30-million breeding program, and he now stands at Glenn and Becky Brok's Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville.

John and Susan Moore, prominent New Jersey-based owners and breeders whom Hutt knew through the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, gave Hutt two mares, including a daughter of Malibu Moon named Moonlight Serenade (the dam of True Sweetheart), because they wanted Charly to be successful. His first crop consists of six now 3-year-olds, all owned and bred by Fantasy Lane. Alan's Legacy is out of the Dixie Union mare Glorious Union.



"We believe in Charly with all our hearts," said Hutt. "Plus, we have a special offer for mare owners – pay the \$1,500 stud fee when the foal wins."

"His babies are big, strong, correct and have great bone," said Glenn Brok. "The crop foaled this past year is his best yet. Bob [Hutt] lets us raise and wean them, then they go to Florida and Irene Coletti [Eddie Jr.'s stepmother] breaks them. And

paying the \$1,500 stud fee when the foal wins is an outstanding incentive."

"We are big believers in the Pennsylvania breeding program," said Hutt. "There isn't a better program in the country, and we're proud and honored to stand Charly in the state." ■

Fast Start in 2017: PA-Breds on Graded Streak



No horse had a bigger day on Jan. 21 than FINEST CITY, when the daughter of City Zip easily captured the Grade 2 Santa Monica Stakes that afternoon at Santa Anita, then a few hours later was honored with the 2016 Eclipse Award as champion female sprinter. Bred by Hank Nothhaft's HnR Nothhaft Horseracing, the 5-year-old mare kicked off her new year as she finished 2016, as a winner. The final start of her championship season was the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint-G1. Owned by Seltzer Thoroughbreds and trained by Ian Kruljac, she also became racing's newest millionaire, earning \$1,045,594 from 15 starts.



Trainer Jerry Hollendorfer unleashed another filly star when UNIQUE BELLA rolled home a seven and a half-length winner of the Grade 2 Santa Ynez Stakes at Santa Anita on Jan. 8 in only her third start, and first in stakes company. The regally-bred 3-year-old daughter of Tapit and Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic-G1 winner Unrivaled Belle (by Unbridled's Song) was bred by Brushwood Stable and sold as a yearling at Keeneland September for \$400,000 to her current owner Don Alberto Corp. Betty Moran purchased Unrivaled Belle as a broodmare prospect for \$2.8 million in 2011 and resold her at last fall's November sale for \$3.8 million. Unique Bella is her second foal.



GRANNY'S KITTEN, winner of the Alphabet Soup Handicap at Parx Racing last fall, recorded his first graded win at Fair Grounds on Jan. 21, taking the Colonel E.R. Bradley Handicap-G3 in a duel to the wire to win by a neck. Ken and Sarah Ramsey's homebred has finished in the top three in eight of his last nine starts, six in stakes company. On the board in 12 of his 18 career starts while amassing \$460,851 to date, the 5-year-old son of Kitten's Joy—Granny Franny, by Grand Slam, was also graded stakes-placed at 3, when third in the Grade 3 Penn Mile in his stakes debut.

He's Back! Page McKenney Returns a Winner After Layoff

Page McKenney, the 2015 PA-Bred Horse of the Year and one of the most popular horses in training in the region, returned a winner after a nine-month absence by taking his second consecutive Native Dancer Stakes on Jan. 21 at Laurel Park. It was like he was never away.

The 7-year-old son of former Pennsylvania stallion Eavesdropper, owned by Adam Staple and the Jalin Stable of his breeders Dr. James Bryant and Linda Davis and trained by Mary Eppler, has been money in the bank since May 2014, finishing third or better in all 25 of his starts, while rising through the ranks. Ten of his 14 wins during that span are stakes, including the Grade 3 General George in February 2016.

After a 2015 season in which he competed solely in stakes company, winning five of 10 starts, placing in three consecutive graded stakes and earning \$589,900, he kicked off 2016 in more spec-

tacular fashion, winning the Native Dancer in early January – which pushed his career earnings over the \$1 million mark – and followed with his first graded stakes score in the General George. In what would be his final race of the year, he finished second in the \$1.25 million Charles Town Classic-G2 to Stanford. Then minor injuries, to a hip, then a tendon, sidelined him for the remainder of the year as Eppler allowed him time off to recover.

“He’s back,” Eppler said after the race. “It’s great. I think this race really helped tighten him up a little bit. I thought he was coming in a little bit soft and a little bit heavy. They did try him.” He pulled away to win by a length and three-quarters over stakes winner Bodhisattva, with PA-Bred Cosmic Destiny missing the place spot by a nose.

Page McKenney has now earned \$1,450,978 from 45 starts and ranks 11th on the list of all-time richest Pennsylvania-breds.

PA Stallions Tops in the Region

Northview PA's Jump Start (below) had one of his best years ever in 2016. The son of A.P. Indy extended his record as the Mid-Atlantic region's leading sire for a third straight year with progeny earnings of more than \$5.8 million. His seven stakes winners in 2016 also tied for the most in the region.

Jump Start also was the leader by juvenile earnings for the year, and was represented by two stakes winners – Argentinian-bred Group 3 winner Long Jump and Pennsylvania Nursery winner Downhill Racer.

It was a year of strong performances for Pennsylvania stallions. Five of the top 10 regional stallions stand or completed their careers in the Keystone State, and combined the quintet – Jump Start, Rockport Harbor, Silver Train, Fairbanks and Lord Shanakill – sired the earners of more than \$16 million last year. Lord Shanakill and the late Rockport Harbor are Pin Oak Lane sires, while the deceased Silver Train and Fairbanks represent Northview PA.

Ranking second on Pennsylvania's leading 2-year-old lists was Northview PA's Bullsbay. The juveniles of 2016, a total of 11 foals, are from the Tiznow son's third crop. Four of his seven starters were winners, and included stakes winners Greatbullsoffire and Unrideabull.

The top Pennsylvania freshman sires were Mad Flatter, the recently relocated Cal Nation and Uptowncharlybrown.

Mad Flatter stood at Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville until his untimely death at age 11 early in last year's breeding season. The graded stakes-winning son of Flatter has 19 foals in his first crop, and seven started last year at 2, with three winning, led by Windcries.

Cal Nation, who will stand his first Pennsylvania season this year at Richard Wukich's Kingfisher Lane Farm in Slippery Rock, also had three winners, from 11 starters in a crop of 24.

Uptowncharlybrown, standing at Diamond B Farm, had the smallest crop, just nine foals, but had two winners from four runners.

CAL NATION MOVES TO PENNSYLVANIA

Richard Wukich, owner of Kingfisher Lane Farm in Slippery Rock, has purchased the young Distorted Humor stallion Cal Nation privately and will stand him for the 2017 season. One of the region's leading freshman sires of 2016, Cal Nation previously stood at Country Life Farm in Maryland.

A graded stakes-placed performer from the incredible sire family tracing back to champion Numbered Account, Cal Nation is one of five stakes horses for the A.P. Indy mare She's a Winner. He is a full brother to graded winner Dramey and a half-brother Grade 1-winning millionaire and top California sire Bluegrass Cat, graded winner Lord of the



Game, and stakes winner and champion sire Sonoma Cat. His half-sisters have produced 2016 graded stakes-winning juvenile Nonna Mela and graded stakes-placed Poof Too.

The family is a who's who of sire power, including Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver, champion sire Private Account, longtime Mid-Atlantic leading sire Not For Love, leading freshman and sophomore sire Girolamo, Mutakddim, Frost Giant and Polish Numbers, and champion Rhythm. The family remains one of the most dynamic in the world today. ■





Blasts From The Past

MARTIE'S ANGER

1975, by Spring Double—Martie's Mad, by Martins Rullah. Bred by Jonathan Sheppard and William Pape; owned by William Pape; trained by Jonathan Sheppard.

The first PA-bred ever to earn an Eclipse Award, steeplechase star Martie's Anger gained that distinction as a 4-year-old in 1979, a season in which he registered five wins from eight steeplechase starts and was never worse than third. His hard-fought half-length score in the season-ending Colonial Cup over the year's leading money-earner Leaping Frog landed him the championship title.

Martie's Anger was smart, versatile and consistent. In 49 career starts on the flat and over jumps, he won 15 times, was second in eight and third nine times, earning \$196,990. The Colonial Cup was his biggest score, but he also won such features as the International Gold Cup Steeplechase over Leaping Frog, the Hard Scuffle while bettering that year's champion Zaccio by more than a length, the National Hunt Cup at Malvern under top weight of 159 pounds, and the Atlanta Cup in his first start in stakes company.

Bred in partnership by his trainer Jonathan Sheppard with Bill Pape, Martie's Anger made his first 11 starts on the flat, from five and a half furlongs on the turf (at Atlantic City) to a mile and an eighth over a sloppy track (at Saratoga). His first win came in his fourth start, a six-furlong maiden special on the dirt at Atlantic City in July 1978. He got his first as a steeplechaser at Ligonier in October that year.

He successfully switched back and forth from the main track to racing fences. After the win over Zaccio in three-mile Hard Scuffle in 1980, he won a mile and a sixteenth Atlantic City allowance on the turf as odds-on favorite less than three weeks later, and followed that with a turf score at Belmont Park in a mile and a half handicap. Less than a month later he was competing in Saratoga's Lovely Night Hurdle and finished second to Zaccio while giving him five pounds.

Martie's Anger competed through 1983, and was expected back at the races the next year, but while recuperating at Sheppard's Ashwell Stables that November, he jumped a fence, landed onto the road and was struck and killed by a truck. Sheppard told The Blood-Horse magazine, "He did have quite an inde-



pendent personality and we feel this is one reason why he was such a good horse and also why he used to get in trouble." ■
