## **PA Bred: Unique Bella a Starlet**

Two more months will tick past before that decision must be made. Unique Bella is Triple Crown nominated, but is also more likely to stay against other fillies on the wishes of her trainer, Jerry Hollendorfer. In contrast, however, stablemate and fellow standout filly Songbird was never nominated to face the boys in the Run for the Roses. and Hollendorfer's assistant trainer Dan Ward noted that there is physically no comparison between the two at the same point in their careers.

"Unique Bella is bigger and stronger, much more like a colt," he said.

That's not to take anything away from Songbird, a two-time Eclipse Award winner and nearly two-time Breeders' Cup winner. The daughter of Medaglia d'Oro has won 11 of 12 starts, including the 14 Hands Winery Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies-G1 in 2015, then missed by a nose in the Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff-G1 last year. She has earned \$3,712,000 through 2016, and is gearing up for a 2017 campaign.



was always oversized, even as a foal, said Brushwood's bloodstock manager Reiley McDonald. "She was a nice big foal, and was always guite pretty all the way through the time she was sold as a yearling," he said.

During the 2015 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, Unique Bella brought a final bid of \$400.000 from Liliana Solari and Carlos Heller's Don Alberto Corp. "I was always puzzled as to why she didn't light more people up," McDonald mused. "She's a big, rangy, two-turn filly with a huge shoulder, great length, and strong hip. She actually looked like a huge bargain then when the Don Alberto people bought her, but she's a much bigger bargain now."

Unique Bella sports a royal pedigree, being by Tapit and out of Breeders' Cup Ladies Classic-G1 winner Unrivaled Belle. The \$1,854,706-earner was purchased by Brushwood for \$2.8 million in 2011 and bred to Medaglia d'Oro the next year. While in the sales ring, Unrivaled Belle acted up so badly she had to be led away as the bidding continued on without her. Her retirement was necessitated when she flipped in the paddock at Belmont Park prior to a race and broke her withers. Unique Bella has made training difficult by inheriting her mother's antics.

"Not only are the Tapits high strung," Ward explained, "but her mother was, too. Unique Bella is settling down now, but that's with schooling her seven days a week. It takes work, but she's getting better and better. She's a sweetheart in the stall, but she can be upset by things happening outside, like if people pick up and drag a garbage can. But if she gets stirred up, I just go in there with her and she settles right down really nicely."

After impressing clockers in the morning, Unique Bella was a heavy favorite for her debut, June 23 at Santa Anita. She broke slowly, was forced wide, and eventually settled for second behind 9-1 upsetter Chalon. She did not resurface until November at Del Mar, and put on a procession, running away to win by 10¼ lengths in a 6½ furlong maiden contest. The ease and brilliance with which Unique Bella broke her maiden placed her squarely on the top of many Oaks watch lists.

Unique Bella surprisingly did not go off favored in her sophomore debut, the \$200,000 Santa Ynez Stakes-G2 at Santa Anita in January. That honor went to Shane's Girlfriend, runaway winner of the \$400,000 Delta Downs Princess Stakes-G3 by 13¼ lengths. Unique Bella effortlessly cruised past that rival and crushed the field once again, winning the 7-furlong race by 7½ lengths under Mike Smith.

Only four fillies would start in the \$200,000 Las Virgenes Stakes-G2
Feb. 5, as few wanted to try Unique Bella, although one was Breeders' Cup champion and 2016 Eclipse Award-winning 2-year-old filly Champagne Room, making her 2017 debut. Both the competition and the one mile distance—Unique Bella's first try around two turns—were cause for concern, but Smith had his charge leading by 5 lengths at the top of the stretch, and they went on to score by 8¾ lengths, with Champagne Room finishing third.

Her march continued in the \$100,000 Santa Ysabel Stakes-G3 March 4, a race that drew seven runners but was reduced to a field of six with the scratch of Noted and Quoted. Unique Bella broke slowly from the rail, bulled her way between horses to take the lead around the first turn, and had a few tense moments in the stretch as Grade 1 winner Abel Tasman threatened, but ultimately drew away to win. Jockey Smith admitted after the race, "I was extremely anxious," but added that Unique Bella's "extreme, superior talent" sets her apart from the competition.

Now a dual Grade 2 winner, Unique Bella has four wins in five starts for earnings of \$342,400. She makes Brushwood Stable proud every time she goes to the track. "It's always great to see horses you had something to do with perform at the highest levels," McDonald said. "It's great to even win a race with a horse you've bred or raced, but to have a filly that's become this good? Fingers crossed she can go on and win the Oaks."

Betty Moran's Brushwood has since sold Unrivaled Belle, who topped the 2016 Keeneland November Sale with a bid of \$3.8 million from Mandy Pope. The Don Alberto Corp. were the immediate underbidders, hoping to obtain more members of the family. Unrivaled Belle, who produced a Malibu Moon filly in 2015, and was barren in 2016, foaled a Tapit filly in January and will visit that stallion for the third time in 2017.

"It was a business decision," Mc-Donald said of selling Unrivaled Belle. "She was the highest-priced horse sold in America last year."

Although he is excited about Unique Bella's prospects this spring, McDonald is too wise a horseman not to temper his enthusiasm. "I always say, one race at a time," he cautioned. "But I'd like to see what comes beyond the Kentucky Oaks."
