The Holman Legacy

The death of Joseph W. Holman Jr. this spring, just two years after the passing of his wife, Kay, brought an end to the longtime racing and breeding partnership of Maui Meadow Farm and the Holmans.

A familiar face at Philadelphia Park/Parx Racing, Kay Holman was an enthusiastic Pennsylvania breeder who raced all of her homebreds, and rarely missed a chance to watch them run. Guadalupe Preciado trained most of the Holman/Maui Meadow runners, including stakes winners Red Hot Iron and Another Betty, with Don White taking on a division starting in 2009.

Red Hot Iron was a 1992 daughter of Iron. Her dam, Scarlet Alliance (by Maui Meadow stallion T. V. Alliance), was one of the first mares of the partnership, a relationship that spanned nearly 25 years. The mare earned 1997 PA-Bred champion older female honors and was a four-time stakes winner at Philadelphia Park, retiring with nearly \$350,000 in earnings.

"When Red Hot Iron broke her maiden against Pennsylvania-breds by 5 lengths, we were all so excited until we found out we had forgotten to register her as a PA-bred," said Charlie Lyman, who inherited Maui Meadow which was started by his grandfather, retired General Charles Lyman. "But Kay didn't get upset—she just said we'd fix it. It took awhile, but we eventually got the filly registered though we did have to refund the purse money from her maiden win."

Kay was as much involved with the foals as she was with the older horses, enjoying the youngsters as they romped in the fields at either Ron and Betsy Houghton's Sylmar Farm, or at Maui Meadow.

"She loved to come out to the farm to visit and play with the babies," said Lyman. "She named almost all of them, and loved seeing them grow up as much as she did watching them race."

Kay attended almost every race, at any track, in which her homebreds competed, even when illness slowed her down and she was forced to navigate the clubhouse in her wheelchair.

Everyone who knew Kay Holman agreed: she never did anything halfheartedly.

"Kate did everything at full bore," said her friend Dick Ogden, a steeplechase steward who Kate met at one of her dog shows. "She especially loved her dogs, and hosted national trials for Jack Russell Terriers at their farm, and was usually caring for a litter or two of dogs she bred herself."

"She was always involved in the social aspects of her sports, whether it was horseracing, or the point-to-points at Radnor Hunt, or the Devon Horse Show, where she and her husband each had a box."

Holman Legacy continued

Joe and Kay Holman married in 1967 after being introduced at a steeplechase meet, an interest the two shared along with the upbringing of Kay's four children, KC, John, Jay and Caroline. They purchased 16 acres at auction to start their Hi-Bid Farm, but the Holmans were determined to preserve the Malvern, Pa., area from development, so continued to buy land surrounding the farm whenever it became available. Although Kay was never a rider herself, she helped Hi-Bid to become a 50-acre horse heaven, first for KC's show ponies, then as a boarding stable where KC learned to become an upper level rider, who, with her mother, ran a succession of well-attended horse shows. KC currently manages the farm with her own daughter, Jess.

KC was particularly close to her stepfather. She and her own family lived nearby her parents' home in Malvern, a few minutes from Hi-Bid.

"I was not really involved in racing," said KC. "I had my ponies, then the show horses. All three of us really loved working at the farm, though, especially Pop, and we all loved the animals.

"When we recently cleaned out my parents' house, I don't know why, but

I took Red Hot Iron's trophy. It seemed the right thing to do."

Joe Holman was a quiet man, who spent much of his time running Lawn and Golf Supply Company, which his father started in 1937. When he wasn't working in the Phoenixville office, he seemed to prefer time working on his farm.

"It was very important to Joe to keep the property looking good. He wanted it to be kept up for KC," said Ogden. "He could never find anyone to mow the grass like he wanted it done—after all, he owned a company that had all the best equipment."

Linda and Dick Gallagher, fellow horse owners, met Kay at Philadelphia Park 15 years ago. "She made friends easily," said Linda. "We met her in the clubhouse where we had box seats, and took Kay on her very first trip to Saratoga about six years ago.

"She went with us every year since then, and loved to spend mornings at the Oklahoma training track just watching the horses. We had planned to take her to Keeneland with us the year she died. It was one of the few things in her life that Kay couldn't accomplish."

Before Kay died, she had decided to upgrade her breeding stock,

sending her mares to stallions such as Medallist and Dance With Ravens. Her homebred filly Darn That Raven, by Dance With Ravens, became a stakes winner two months after her death. With Kay's passing, Joe decided to become a more active participant and began attending the races with Ogden after a six-year hiatus.

Kay's horses began running under his name, and in the last two years before Joe became ill, he was able to see the progress of his wife's management.

According to Ogden any trainer would have wanted to have owners like the Holmans. "They never second-guessed their trainers' decisions, they never complained and never blamed the rider," he said. "As long as the horses came back sound, that is all Kay wanted."

This spring, Hot Smile, trained by Don White, was retired and sent to the farm. The daughter of their first stakes winner Red Hot Iron had won 6 of 37 starts and \$293,822.

With her retirement, the last of the Holman runners left the track. Maui Meadow will retain their half of the mare, and sell the other share, as part of the partnership's complete dispersal.
