PA-Breds Shine at Pennsylvania's Day at the Races

Despite the cloudy skies from Hurricane Hermine, PA-Breds shone at Parx on Saturday, September 3. The 16th annual Pennsylvania's Day at the Races kicked off Parx's fall season after their three-week-long break. The action-packed card featured over \$800,000 in purses, including five restricted Stakes races, and showcased over 80 PA-Breds that turned for home. Also included was the newly-added open Stakes, the \$150,000 Princess of Sylmar for three-year-old fillies.

The Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association celebrated Pennsylvanian breeders, owners, and trainers with a buffet lunch, complete with a private third floor view of the track. Also present was PTHA's Turning for Home — a 501(c)(3) non-profit that provides thoroughbred racehorses with safe retirement. Guests had the chance to enter a raffle to win a basket filled with Turning for Home swag, as well as baskets from a Kennett Square winery and golf course—both local to the PHBA.

Additionally, owners, trainers, and breeders of the Stakes-winning PA-Breds were invited to join PHBA's Executive Secretary Brian Sanfratello and Racing/Stallion Manager Wendi Graham in the Hall of Fame room for a champagne toast to celebrate. Stakes winners received a PHBA duffel bag for both the owner and trainer and an engraved shank for the winning PA-Bred—both of which were presented by a PHBA Board Member in the winner's circle. Stakes participants all received a PHBA Patagonia backpack, filled with pint glasses and leather coasters, while overnight participants received a PHBA tote bag filled with a blanket, hat, and tumbler.

Among the 11 races on the program was the \$100,000 Banjo Picker, a six-furlong sprint for horses 3 & up. Winner of the Stakes was A Fleet Attitude, ridden by Frankie Pennington. The six-year-old gelding by Afleet Alex, was bred by Charles Zacney and Tim Ritchey, is owned by Morris Kernan Jr., and is trained by Marcos Zulueta. He won by a half-length after a battle with Purcell late in the stretch. This year PHBA had welcomed co-breeder Charles Zacney to their annual Iroquois Awards Banquet as the guest speaker for the event. Zacney is a partner in Cash is King, LLC, which owns Cathyrn Sophia, winner of the Princess of Sylmar Stakes, and A Fleet Attitude's sire, Afleet Alex.

Zacney wasn't the only person who celebrated twice — Pennington also won the \$100,000 Roanoke Stakes with Kobel, a five-year-old, dark bay gelding by Sequoyah. Bred by Donald Clifford Wilson, owned by Richard Malouf, and trained by Scott Lake, Kobel was a front-runner throughout the 1 1/16, leaving betting favorite Res Judicata to settle for 2nd.

In a different turn of events, Valued Strike overtook front-runner Persnickity mid-stretch in the \$100,000 Mrs. Penny Stakes for 3 & up fillies and mares. Jockey Trevor McCarthy pushed the four-year-old, Smart Strike filly to victory, making her 5 for 9 in her career starts. Although they weren't at Parx, breeder and owner George Strawbridge, Jr. (Augustin Stable) and trainer H. Graham Motion celebrated their Stakes-winning filly from afar.

Trainer Michael Lerman and friends were there to take in the excitement when four-year-old filly Black

Mission Fig won the \$100,000 Dr. Teresea Garofalo Memorial Stakes with Paco Lopez in the irons. The Fusaichi Pegasus filly, bred and owned by Gold Square, LLC, made its first start at Parx on PA Day at the Races and will hopefully be back to race more after such a favorable upset against even-money Disco Chick.

Lerman, along with friends, joined PHBA staff in the Hall of Fame room after celebrating in the winner's circle. Along with them was Dr. Teresea Garofalo's brother, Ted Vanderlaan. The Garofalo Stakes is a particularly special one to the PHBA — Garofalo was the treasurer on the board before she passed away in 2010 from acute myeloid leukemia. She was a joyful, loving, and generous woman who owned an equine practice in Chester County, focusing on racehorses and equine reproduction; therefore, she was very close to the PA-Bred community. As Vanderlaan raised his glass, he said that Teresea would be very proud.

The last Stakes win of the day was, appropriately, Winning the Medal in the \$100,000 Marshall Jenney Handicap, who won in a blanket finish despite starting the five-furlong sprint breaking from an outside post. The Medallist gelding is living up to his pedigree, with the Jenney being his first Stakes win — bringing his lifetime earnings up to \$195,725. Breeder and owner Rick Molineaux (R&L Racing), trainer Patricia Farro, and jockey Emanuel Esquivel accepted the trophy.

After Winning the Medal's victory, Molineaux headed up to the Hall of Fame room with his wife, daughter, and two granddaughters. As he popped open the champagne and clinked glasses with everyone in the room, he pulled a Smarty Jones button out of his shirt pocket. He held it up and said that his granddaughter gave it to him before the start of the race. He recalled her saying, "It will bring you good luck!" And it did just that. Sanfratello joked that Molineaux will have to bring the button to every race now — and he said he'd be sure he would.
