A Breeders' Cup for Shamrock Rose

Trainer Mark Casse was unusually confident coming into the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint-G1, run Nov. 3 at Churchill Downs. "After this weekend, she will have shown she's one of the best sprinters in the world," he proclaimed two days before the race of his 3-year-old filly Shamrock Rose.

"Mark told me not to worry," said Lori Fackler, who bred the filly with husband Tommy under their Best A Luck Farm banner. "She had come out of her previous race very well, and that's why he wanted to go ahead and push the envelope."

That previous race was the Lexus Raven Run Stakes-G2 at Keeneland, just two weeks before the Breeders' Cup. It was Shamrock Rose's third win in a row, following stakes wins at Presque Isle and Woodbine on their respective synthetic tracks.

Before that, Shamrock Rose, a daughter of First Dude out of the Elusive Quality mare Slew's Quality, had been somewhat frustrating. She broke her maiden against stakes company, winning the Ontario Debutante first out in September 2017 at Woodbine for owner Manfred Conrad of Conrad Farms. But then Shamrock Rose did not win either of her next two starts.

"She's a funny horse," Casse said. "I sent her to Aqueduct in New York because I felt she really liked the dirt, and she's a Pennsylvania-bred. I thought while in New York I could sneak her over to Pennsylvania for one of their races."

Shamrock Rose ran second in the Cicada Stakes at Aqueduct in March, then third in the Weber City Miss Stakes at Laurel Park. "She was flat, not good that day," Casse recalled. "I decided to bring her home."

Casse operates the Casse Training Center in Ocala, Fla. His horses often go there to rest and recoup, which is a tactic he took with multi-millionaire Tepin in 2014.

"We often do that, bring them home to give them a little time," Casse said. "Tepin did the same thing. Most people don't remember that Tepin got beat 18 lengths at Del Mar as a 3-year-old, so we brought her home and gave her a little break. The rest is history with her. I thought I would try the same kind of thing with this filly, and boom!"

Shamrock Rose returned from a nearly four-month layoff to win the 1-mile Malvern Rose at Presque Isle, cruising home by 10¼ lengths. She returned to Casse's Woodbine base, captured the 1⅙-mile La Lorgnette by 4½ lengths a month later, and took to the dirt training track there, throwing down a 5-furlong workout in :57 and change. "Her options were very limited because of the synthetic track at Woodbine," Casse said, "so we sent her to Keeneland. I was ecstatic with the race there."

Shamrock Rose was 18-1 when she rallied to win the 7-furlong Raven Run, a \$250,000 contest against some of the best sophomore filly sprinters in the country. She came out so well that the Breeders' Cup was considered, despite the quick turnaround.

The \$1 million Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint drew a full field of 14, with Shamrock Rose dismissed as a 25-1 outsider. She was still eighth at the top of the stretch, but darted between rivals under jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. to win by a head in a blanket finish. Chalon finished second, a neck in front of Anonymity third. Favored Marley's Freedom was fourth.

Pennsylvania-Breds have done fantastically well in the division of late, with Finest City winning the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint in 2016 and Unique Bella losing the race as favorite in 2017 but ultimately winning the Eclipse Award. The top finishers last year, Bar of Gold and Ami's Mesa, used Presque Isle Downs in Pennsylvania to prep for the race. If Shamrock Rose defeats Marley's Freedom in the voting for Eclipse Champion Female

Sprinter, Pennsylvania-Breds will have taken that national title three seasons in a row.

"The Pennsylvania-Breds are doing well," Conrad said after the race. "I think the Presque Isle win was a big boost in getting her confidence up and I'm a big believer in confidence. I didn't buy her because she was Pennsylvania bred, I bought her because I loved her. I thought, I just thought—there was something about her."

"We were extremely excited," Fackler said. "It still hasn't sunk in, but it was such a great race."

The Facklers still own Shamrock Rose's dam, Slew's Quality, who they purchased for \$35,000 in 2007. "We are based in Florida, but we rotate our mares between Pennsylvania and Kentucky," Fackler said. "They are boarded at Horseshoe Valley Equine in Annville."

Slew's Quality's second foal, Quality Harbor, was a four-time winner by Rockport Harbor. The Lion Heart gelding Quality Cat came next and won three times. Her 2014 Biondetti gelding Bet On Mike became stakes-placed at Woodbine; Shamrock Rose was born one year later.

"She was a very athletic foal," Fackler recalled. "She was very easy to do anything with, always tried and never gave us a hard time. Everything came naturally."

Slew's Quality, a half-sister to French stakes winner Slew the Red and the stakes-placed runners Grenadia and Rich City Girl, has an unnamed yearling by Stay Thirsty and is in foal to Hard Spun for 2019. She has five winners from six starters.

With Shamrock Rose scheduled to race for at least one more season, if not two, Casse is not ruling out future starts in Pennsylvania. "It all just depends," he said. "Being a Pennsylvania-Bred and that race at Presque Isle got her where she is, because it was such a boost for her. Pennsylvania will always be an option for her." ■

More Pennsylvania Sire Power

FLASHBACK JOINS DIAMOND B FARM ROSTER

Flashback, a graded stakes-winning son of Tapit who previously stood at stud at Hill 'N' Dale Farm in Kentucky, has moved to Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville for the upcoming breeding season. His fee is \$3,500 live foal, with special consideration to mares foaling in the state.

Campaigned by Gary and Mary West, the gray won the Grade 2 Robert B. Lewis Stakes and was second in the Grade 1 Santa Anita Derby (to Goldencents) and Grade 2 San Felipe in his first three stakes appearances, all at a mile or more over a three-month span in early 2013. In seven starts, he ran six times in stakes, also finishing second in the seven-furlong Damascus Stakes at Santa Anita and third in Churchill Downs' Ack Ack Handicap-G3 at one mile, and finished fourth in the Grade 1 Malibu Stakes to retire with earnings of \$405,730.



Flashback, now 8, has first-crop runners at the races this year and ranks in the top-15 among the nation's freshman sires. His runners include Grade 1 performer Boujie Girl, third in the Del Mar Debutante Stakes-G1 and Grade 2 Sorrento Stakes, as well as Tripwire, second by only a half-length in the Grade 3 Grey Stakes in his second start, and seven other winners.

Flashback is a full-brother to multiple Grade 1 winner Zazu (\$691,985, Las Virgenes S-G1, Lady's Secret S-G1, etc.), who is the dam of group placed Arusha. Their dam, the winning

Mr. Greeley mare Rhumb Line, also produced stakes winners Corinthian's Jewel and group-placed Art Princess. Both Zazu and Rhumb Line were million-dollar broodmares, selling for \$2.1 million and \$2 million respectively. ■

DOLPHUS BRINGS ROYAL CONNECTIONS TO CABIN CREEK IN BERNVILLE

Dolphus, a half-brother to Hall of Famer Rachel Alexandra, will stand his first season in 2019 at the newly established Cabin Creek Farm in Bernville. The 5-year-old son of champion and leading sire Lookin At Lucky out of stakes winner Lotta Kim (by Roar) retires a graded stakes-placed winner of \$211,060.

In a 12-start career, Dolphus recorded four wins while racing at Aqueduct, Gulfstream Park and Fair Grounds. He added black-type to the family when finishing second, missing by a neck, to Shaman Ghost in the mile and three-sixteenths Grade 3 Pimlico Special. He was a winner first-time out at 2 at Fair Grounds going



six furlongs, and took a seven-furlong Gulfstream Park allowance in 1:22.88 by nine and a quarter lengths.

Dolphus is one of five winners from as many starters for his dam, led by one of racing's all-time greats, Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra. An earner of \$3,506,730, Rachel Alexandra was champion 3-year-old filly during a year in which she defeated males in the Preakness Stakes-G1, Haskell Invitational-G1 and Woodward Stakes-G1, the latter against older males, and dominated fillies in the Kentucky Oaks-G1 and Mother Goose Stakes-G1. She is the dam of Grade 1-winning juvenile filly Rachel's Valentina.

Second dam Kim's Blues (by Cure the Blues) produced additional stakes winners High Blues and Lotta Rhythm.

Owned by Dr. Dede McGehee, Dolphus will stand for a special introductory fee of \$2,500 live foal, with special consideration to approved mares.

Maria Vorhauer, former manager of Dana Point Farm, has taken the past year to get the Cabin Creek operation up and running. "I'm looking forward to the breeding season," she said. To make it convenient for breeders, the farm will have an open house each Saturday in December from noon to 3 p.m.

Diamond B Farm Stallions Show Off At Open House

Good food, good weather, a robust turnout, and a parade of both new and established stallions... all added up to a very successful Open House at Glenn and Becky Brok's Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville on Nov. 24.

A trio of new stallions join three established sires on the 2019 Diamond B roster, representing a wide variety of successful bloodlines, many of them unique to the Keystone State.

The newcomers are:

- Flashback, a graded stakes-winning son of Tapit owned by Gary and Mary West, whose first foals are 2-year-olds this year (\$3,500 LF)
- Social Inclusion, a track record-breaking and classic-performing son of Pioneerof the Nile (\$5,000 LF, or \$4,000 for Pennsylvania-foaling mares; also special price considerations for multiple mares if booked by Feb. 1)

- Eastwood, a sound and speedy son of sire-of-sires Speightstown (\$2,500 LF)

Diamond B's returning sires for 2019 are:

- Talent Search, a Grade 1 performer who was both the leading second-crop and third-crop sire in the Mid-Atlantic region (\$2,500 LF)
- Got the Last Laugh (\$2,000 LF), a precocious graded stakes-winning son of Distorted Humor whose 2018 runners include stakes winner Grady (\$311,932)
- Uptowncharlybrown, a leading third-crop sire in the Mid-Atlantic, and sire of stakes winners Dixie Serenade (Grade 3 Victory Ride Stakes) and Midtowncharlybrown (\$200,000 Fabulous Strike Stakes) this year. The son of Limestone stands for \$4,500 LF, or \$3,500 for Pa-breds

"We were so lucky for the open house – we had terrific weather of sunshine and blue skies, and we are very appreciative for the great turnout," said Glenn Brok. "People were here who have entrusted their horses to us

over the years, who have always supported us, and we saw lots of new faces, too."

Of the new Diamond B stallions for 2019, Brok said, "Gary and Mary West chose us to stand Flashback, whose 2-year-olds are off to a huge start this year. He's had three stakes-placed horses in his first crop, including Boujje Girl, third in the Grade 1 Del Mar Debutante, and Tripwire, second in the Grade 3 Grey Stakes at Woodbine. He's also had two maiden special weight winners in New York (Aquariva at Belmont Park Sept. 15, and Forever Changed at Aqueduct Nov. 8)."

Brok said that Social Inclusion's first foals are weanlings and that he is the only son of Pioneerof the Nile standing in Pennsylvania, and Eastwood, who sold for \$800,000 at Fasig-Tipton, is the only Speightstown in the state.

"Both Talent Search and Got the Last Laugh can get real runners, and what can I say about Uptowncharlybrown – Bob Hutt (president of Uptowncharlybrown Stud LLC, which stands the stallion) really believed in him, and has strongly supported him with mares," said Brok.

"We had a great turnout for the Diamond B Open House, as there were over 100 breeders with standing room only," said Hutt, who not only campaigned Uptowncharlybrown, but also campaigns his progeny through his syndicate Uptowncharlybrown Stud (utcbstud.com). "In just the last five days before the stallion show, we had an easy five and a half-length allowance winner in Midnightcharly; the following day, his full brother, multiple stakes-placed Midtowncharlybrown (2017 Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association's Horse of the Year) won the \$200,000 Fabulous Strike Stakes, his ninth win against a quality field while geared down late by two and three-quarters lengths, and then Motowncharlybrown broke his maiden after a very good second-place finish to Kentucky Derby contender Maximus Mischief, drawing off in hand by six and a half lengths. We have some other impressive Uptowncharlybrown juveniles in the barn waiting to make their debuts. We're close, and we hope to go over the million-dollar mark in 2018 earnings."

Hutt pointed out the tremendous statistics that Uptowncharlybrown has amassed in his short stud career as he addressed the crowd.

"Uptowncharlybrown's progeny have averaged an eye-popping \$81,000 per starter, which places him with the very best stallions

in the Mid-Atlantic region," said Hutt. "But what separates him from all other stallions in North America is his AEI (Average Earnings Index) to CI (Comparable Index, the mares he's bred to ratio). As you might expect, the elite stallions in North America such as Tapit, War Front, etc. all have AEIs of about 2.34. Likewise, they're also bred to the very best broodmares that have CIs of 2.34.

"Uptowncharlybrown has a current AEI of 2.24, which places him in the same rarified air as the aforementioned elite stallions; however, his CI on the broodmares he's been bred to is only 0.85," Hutt continued. "This means that he's among the very best stallions in all of North America at moving his broodmares way up."

Thanks to the achievements of both Dixie Serenade and Midtowncharlybrown, Uptowncharlybrown's fee was raised for 2019, and Hutt expects him to exceed the nearly 50 mares he was bred to this past spring.

Flint Stites, a Penn National-based owner and trainer and also a breeder, said he attended the Diamond B Open House to see the new stallions, as well as the rest of its roster.

"Almost every year I have a Talent Search foal, and their dispositions are fabulous," said Stites. "They're so nice that I break them all myself."

Stites said he was really interested in seeing Social Inclusion, whom he likes a lot, as well as Uptowncharlybrown.

"It's amazing how well Uptowncharlybrown has done at stud," said Stites. "I had two older mares and I bred them both to him, and this spring I got two fillies – they were born on the same day."

Stites said the fillies, now weanlings, are out of mares by Tactical Cat and Pure Precision.

"One is a strawberry roan with four white feet, and the other is dark bay with no white, so they are completely different in color," said Stites. "But they are alike in that both have outstanding conformation and are very correct, and I am really happy with them both."

Stites signed up for a season at the Open House thanks to a one-time deal Hutt offered to breeders in attendance.

"I've got a mare by a Pulpit stallion, and Pulpit was by A.P. Indy," he said. "Uptowncharlybrown's good filly Dixie Serenade is out of a Malibu Moon mare, and Malibu Moon is by A.P. Indy, so it seems like my mare would be a great cross."

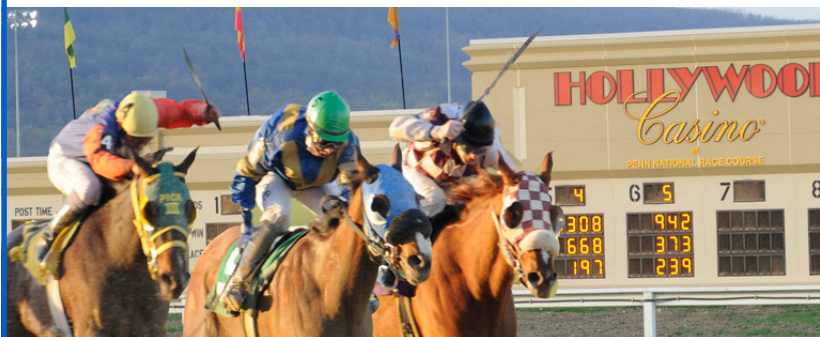

Pennsylvania Broodmare Domicile Requirements & Registration Eligibility for 2019 Foals

Please note the following broodmare domicile requirements for the 2019 crop of foals. Mares bred to registered PA-Sires are up again this year, according to our preliminary count, and continuing that trend will move us to an increase in registered foals, which is our priority.

- The dam of the foal resided continuously in Pennsylvania since **DECEMBER 1** of the year of conception through foaling. Mares not being bred back will fall under this category.
- The dam of the foal was purchased at a public sale after **DECEMBER 1** of the year of conception and brought into Pennsylvania within 14 days of the date of purchase and remained continuously through foaling. During the year of foaling, the foal or its dam spent at least ninety (90) days in the state.
- The dam of the foal arrived after **DECEMBER 1** of the year of conception, foaled in Pennsylvania and was bred back to a registered PA stallion standing in Pennsylvania and the dam of the foal resided **SIXTY (60)** consecutive days during which foaling occurred.

Domicile forms can be found online at www.pabred.com/forms. Please **DO NOT** use any prior year forms as they have changed. We prefer online submissions, but if you are unable to submit the form online, you can print out a report and mail it, or let us know and we'll send a copy to you.





Pennsylvania News Briefs

SIX-FIGURE PA-BREDS AT KEENELAND NOVEMBER SALE

I'm Pretty Strong, a 3-year-old filly bred by Sagamore Farm out of their Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf-G1 winner Shared Account, brought the highest price of 39 PA-Breds sold at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock sale held Nov. 5-16 in Lexington, Ky. Sold as a racing or broodmare prospect by her breeder through the consignment of Upson Downs Farm, the winning daughter of Street Cry (Ire) was purchased by Boomer Bloodstock, agent, for \$220,000.

The filly was one of five state-breds sold for six figures in November. The top-priced weanling was HnR Nothhaft Horseracing LLC's Tiznow filly out of Randie's Legend, sold on the first day of the sale. With consignor Ballysax Bloodstock as agent, the March-born filly was purchased by de Meric Sales, agent, for \$180,000. She is a half-sister to PA-Bred multiple graded stakes winner Daddy Is a Legend, one of the top 3-year-old turf fillies of 2018, and is out of a half-sister to stakes winners Frumious and Eternal Rule.

The most expensive PA-Bred mare in foal was Steidle, a half-sister to PA-Bred Horse of the Year Princess of Sylmar, sold to Summer Wind Equine for \$175,000 out of the Valkyre Stud consignment. Carrying her first foal to the cover of Super Saver, the 5-year-old daughter of Petionville and stakes-placed Storm Dixie

(by Catienus) was a winner at 4 for Ed Stanco's King of Prussia Stable; Princess of Sylmar earned \$2,017,220 in 15 starts and was one of the top fillies of her generation while capturing such stakes as the Kentucky Oaks-G1, Coaching Club American Oaks-G1, Alabama Stakes-G1 and Beldame Invitational-G1.

James B. Keogh (Grovendale) was the agent for two six-figure horses: multiple stakes winner Discreet Seniorita, carrying her first foal by Mastery and selling for \$160,000 to Windways Farm Limited, and Sycee, purchased by Eliza Bloodstock for \$130,000.

Discreet Seniorita, winner of the Dr. Teresa Garofalo Memorial Stakes at 3 and Foxy J. G. Stakes at 4, is a 6-year-old daughter of Discreet Cat bred by Dun Roamin Farm and Rosemore Farms. An earner of \$424,636 during her career, she is out of Seniorita Louisa, a daughter of Louis Quatorze and half-sister to stakes winner Senior Cielo Two.

Sycee is also 6 and carrying her first foal to the cover of Distorted Humor. A winner of \$105,823, she was bred by Cornerstone Thoroughbreds and is a half-sister to Grade 3 winner Medea (Ire). Her dam, the Giant's Causeway mare Scoop of Gold, is a half-sister to millionaire and multiple Grade 1 winner High Yield from the family of champion Forest Flower. ■

PA-Bred Stakes Winners Spice Up the Holiday in November

COSMIC BURST

\$250,000 Zia Park Oaks - Zia Park, Nov. 21—In a campaign made up exclusively of stakes, Cosmic Burst scored her richest victory of the year in the \$250,000 Zia Park Oaks. Racing third early through the opening stages in the strung out field, the daughter of Violence rallied seven-wide around the far turn and battled the early leaders down the stretch before pulling away to win by a length and a quarter. Her time for the mile and a sixteenth was 1:42.97, a little over a second off the track record.

Bred by Pewter Stable, the 3-year-old filly won the Grade 3 Honeybee Stakes back in March at Oaklawn Park, and in seven starts throughout the year also competed at Prairie Meadows (where she was second in the Grade 3 Iowa Oaks), Remington Park (getting third in the Grade 3 Remington Park Oaks) and Arlington Park. In recording her fifth win in 11 career starts, Cosmic Burst pushed her earnings to \$499,780.



JOHNNY JUMP UP

\$100,000 Swatara Stakes - Penn National, Nov. 21—Not seen in stakes company since the 2017 Swatara Stakes, Johnny Jump Up was overlooked at 23-1 in the 2018 edition of the mile and a sixteenth stakes but ran like the favorite, leading at every call to win by three-quarters of a length, turning back stakes stalwarts Monongahela and favorite Dr Blarney for the win.

Bred by Charles C.D. McGill, the 7-year-old son of Jump Start has made 43 starts, winning 11 and finishing second in six and third in seven more while earning \$344,044. He was stakes-placed at 3 with a second in the 2014 Danzig Stakes in his stakes debut, but was most noted for a consistent record in allowance and claiming company, the majority of his career spent at Penn National (every one of his 19 starts since 2016 have been at the Grantville oval). He has won three of five starts in 2018, including his prior outing, an allowance at the same distance on Sept. 13.

MIDTOWNCHARLYBROWN

\$200,000 Fabulous Strike Stakes - Penn National, Nov. 21—Numerous wins and a number of stakes placings filled the resume of Midtowncharlybrown until he burst through with his first stakes win in his 16th career start. The speedy chestnut son of Uptowncharlybrown had the rest of the seven-horse field at his mercy as he set every fraction easily – getting his first quarter in :21.91, the half in :44.71 and five-furlongs in :56.95 – and cruised home a nearly three-length winner. He completed the six furlongs in 1:10.15.

Bred by Godric LLC and owned by the breeder in partnership with Uptowncharlybrown Stud LLC, Midtowncharlybrown has won eight of his starts, and earlier in his career was second in the 2017 Danzig Stakes and third in this year's Banjo Picker Sprint. He boosted his earnings to \$336,668.

Blue Mountain Juvenile Fillies Stakes

Smart Angle LLC's 2-year-old Munnings filly Please Flatter Me followed a smashing debut with a victory in the Blue Mountain Juvenile Fillies Stakes on Nov. 21 at Penn National to remain undefeated in two starts.

Sent off as the 9-10 favorite in the field of 10, Please Flatter Me set fractions of :21.98, :45.64 and :58.25 before drawing off to win by four lengths and getting six furlongs in 1:11.24. Her maiden victory was an eight and a half-length romp in a five-furlong maiden special at Penn National on Oct. 13.

Bred by Mary Katherine Haire, the filly was sold as a short yearling at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Mixed sale in January 2017 for \$12,000, with Daniel Ryan making the purchase. Trained by Mark J. Reid, the filly is the second foal, and second winner for the Flatter mare She's Flattering, purchased by Haire with Please Flatter Me in utero for \$30,000 at the 2016 Keeneland January All Ages sale. ■

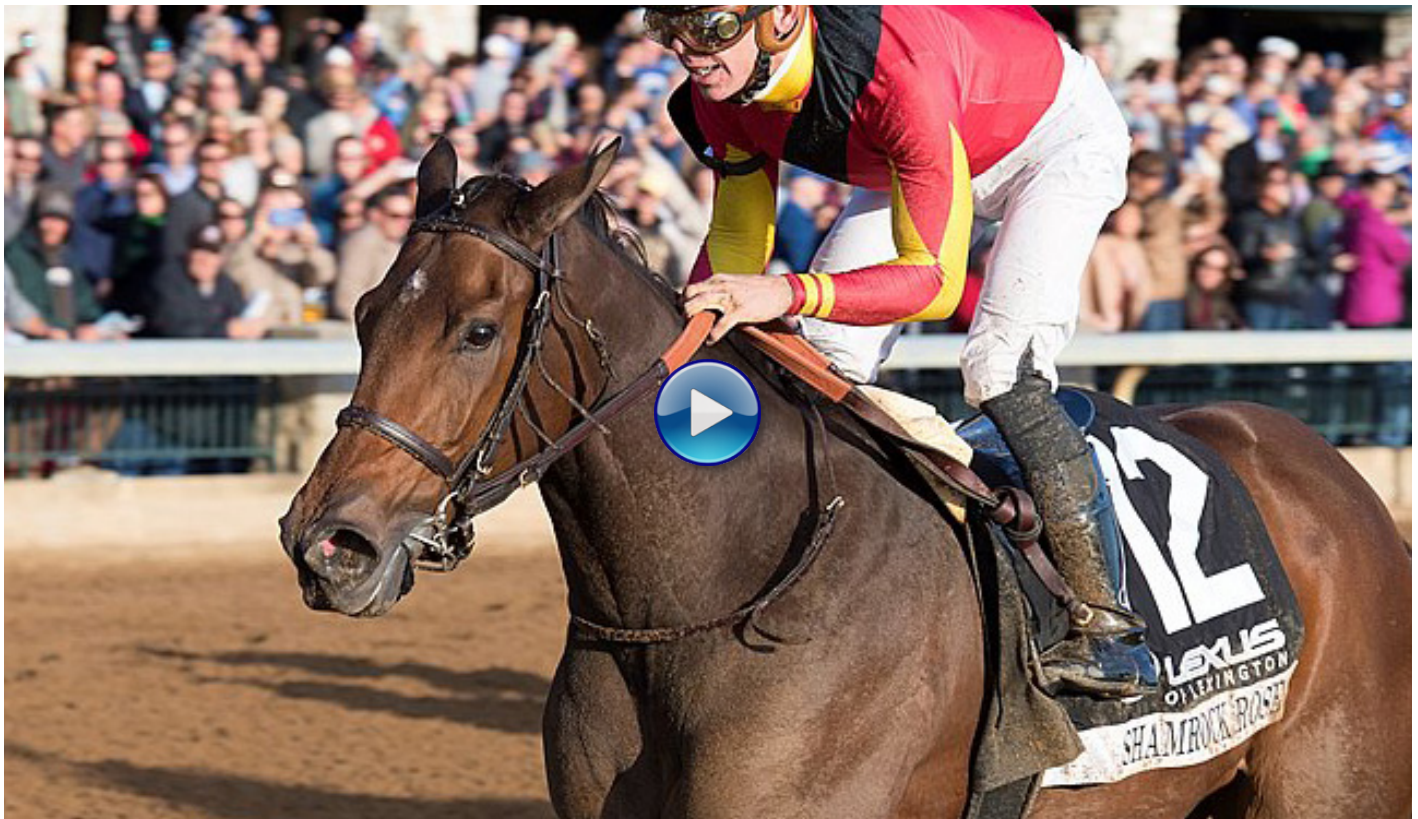

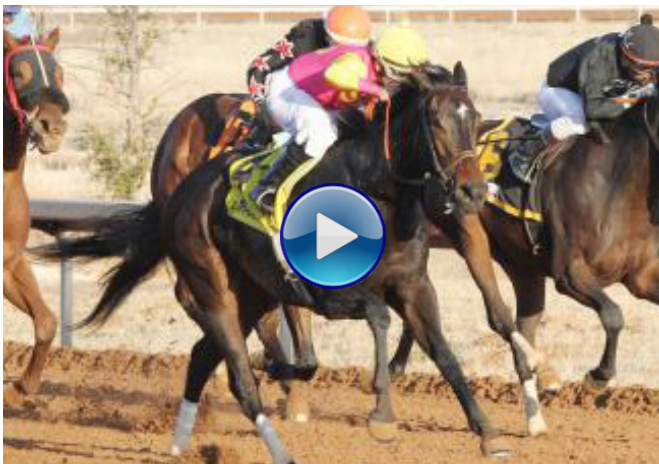

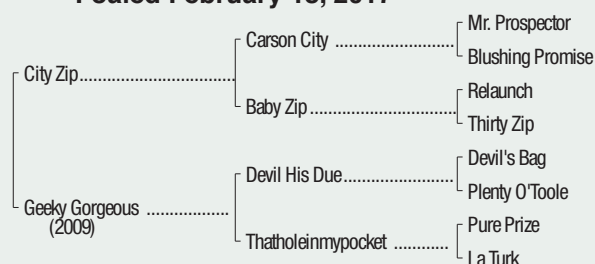
