# Call Paul Speaks Volumes In Sophomore Debut

Pennsylvania breeder Vicky Schowe never could have guessed she would breed a horse better than Sloane Ranger. That Keystone State-bred runner earned \$540,004 and was a graded stakes-placed multiple stakes winner with 23 top-three finishes in 41 lifetime starts. Somehow, recent Gulfstream Park Grade 3 winner Call Paul might be even better.

Schowe was interested in a Forestry mare, Avani Force, who became available through

private sale. The mare was no stakes horse, but won five of eight races from California to Pennsylvania. Avani Force's first foal, eventual winner Aggreysive, by Pennsylvania sire Monba, was a yearling when Schowe asked her good friend Beatrice Patterson to go in with her. The rest is history.

The two women bred Avani Force to Friesan Fire in 2013, and got a winning filly named Friesani. They ultimately went back to Friesan Fire for the 2015 season, which produced Call Paul.

"The stallion season for Friesan Fire came from when I had bred another mare and when that baby was weaned she had to be put down," Schowe recalled. "Country Life Farm offered me another season for Friesan Fire after that. I asked Beatrice if she wanted to use the season."

The resulting foal – to be named Call Paul – was, "very mature from the beginning. He always knew what he was supposed to do. Gradually, as he grew, he became more handsome all the time."

Schowe and Patterson sold Call Paul to Grassroots Training and Sales for \$20,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2017 Eastern Fall Yearling Sale. Seven months later, the colt was pinhooked and purchased by Michael Dubb and his partners for \$210,000. "We were absolutely excited that they bought him," Schowe said. "We knew he would be taken care of, and Jason is a really good guy."

That Jason is Jason Servis, who trains Call Paul for Dubb, David Simon, Bruce Irom, and Michael Caruso's Bethlehem Stables LLC. Other horses they have had, individually or to

gether, include standouts Monomoy Girl, World of Trouble, and My Happy Face.

Call Paul broke his maiden first out at Delaware Park, winning by two and a quarter lengths as the favorite. He then immediately became a Grade 2 winner at Saratoga by taking the historic \$200,000 Saratoga Special-G2 despite a bad start. He was third in both the Grade 1 Champagne Stakes at Belmont and Grade 3 Nashua Stakes at Aqueduct, then finished out his juvenile campaign in the \$100,000 Pennsylvania Nursery at Parx on Dec. 1.

Under jockey Trevor McCarthy, Call Paul jumped well, sat just off the speed, took over rounding the turn, and drew away to win impressively by five lengths and stamp himself as a horse to watch.

While some trainers would be tempted to rush this kind of horse onto the Kentucky Derby trail, Servis is showing professional restraint. "I don't think we'll stretch him out," the trainer said. "Seven-eighths of a mile is probably the limit."

That's why the seven-furlong Swale Stakes-G3 at Gulfstream Park on Feb. 2 was so appealing. The \$150,000 race drew 11 runners, with Call Paul still sent off as the favorite. The 2018 Eclipse Award-winning jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. was aboard, but when the gates opened there was trouble. Call Paul rubbed against the gate as he broke, leaving slowly.

"I was a little shook up when he didn't get the break," said co-owner Mike Caruso. "The commentators were talking before the race that Call Paul has the speed and would be right up with the front runners."



Instead, the bay colt found himself midfield. "Irada put him in position, didn't rush up, and didn't panic. That's the experience showing, if you can say that about a jockey in his mid-20s," Caruso joked. "He took it nice and easy."

Call Paul came running, rallying around the turn and grabbing the lead at the head of the stretch and pulled away. He won by a length and a quarter, increasing his earnings to \$366,920 with four wins and two thirds in six starts.

"It all turned out for the best," Servis said of the slow break. "They went fast early and he would have been in the thick of that."

"We saw the same from our Eclipse champion Monomoy Girl last year," Caruso said. "The same thing happened in the Grade 2 Rachel Alexandra at the Fair Grounds in New Orleans. She broke way behind the field, we thought the

race was over, and she came around to win. We saw from that that she could win front end, middle, or behind, and now we know Call Paul can come from behind. We don't have to necessarily take him to the front all the time."

Caruso, who resides in Pennsylvania, is excited about the possibilities. "Dubb is the managing partner and will make the decisions," he said, "but I'm so excited to have him as a Pennsylvania-bred. He's also Delaware-certified and eligible for the Maryland Million. That gives us lots of options in this region."

The seven-furlong, \$250,000 Bay Shore Stakes-G3 at Aqueduct could be next, and Servis indicated that the six-furlong, \$100,000 Danzig Stakes for Pennsylvania-breds on June 1 at Parx was likely.

Schowe is still glowing from the Swale Stakes result. "He has such a level of maturity," she said of Call Paul. "It takes him a while to get into his rhythm, but he built momentum and took off. He doesn't give up, he puts everything into it. He's a good boy."

Schowe and Patterson still own Avani Force, who has three winners from three to race. She has an El Padrino 2-year-old filly named Pink Caddy who sold for \$40,000 last year. Her yearling is a Bullsbay colt, and she's in foal to Uncle Lino. She will be bred to Tapizar in Kentucky this season. "For being a small breeder and not having bred a whole lot of horses, it's an incredible feeling," Schowe said. "They all seem like your children. My husband makes me popcorn when there is a race on and we sit down and watch. Hopefully there will be a lot of popcorn in the future, fingers crossed." ■

# Putting the Smart in Smart Angle

Dan Ryan's parents made everything look easy.

Jim and Eleanor Ryan's Ryehill Farms seldom raced more than 10 horses at a time, but churned out consecutive Eclipse Award champion 2-year-old fillies with Smart Angle in 1979 and Heavenly Cause in 1980. They won the 1983 Belmont Stakes-G1 with Caveat, and bred Smarten, the sire of Canadian Broodmare of the Year Classy 'n Smart. "Everything they touched turned to gold," said the younger Ryan. "Unfortunately, everything I've touched has not turned to gold."

That said, Dan Ryan has been pretty successful. The first horse he ever owned was Danny's Quest, a mare that his mother gifted to him on his 25th birthday. "From there on out, I was completely hooked," Ryan said.

While perhaps not at the level his family competed, a host of winners soon followed. Danny's Quest produced a gelded son of Caveat named Beware the Quest, who won eight of 54 starts, became graded stakes placed, and remains one of Ryan's favorite horses to date. Another favorite is a horse he owned a minority interest in, his dad's \$3.2 million-earner Awad. The popular Maryland-bred, also by Caveat, started in 23 Grade 1 stakes and won 14 of his 70 lifetime starts.

"Not only was he an amazing horse," Ryan recalled, "but he had that running style where he came from out of the clouds."

In the beginning, Ryan preferred racing to breeding, but has since opened up his Smart Angle operation to all avenues. He did that by breeding in Pennsylvania. "I got in at the beginning stages of the Pennsylvania breeders' award program," Ryan said, "and at the end of the day, I'm very happy I did that. The reason I'm here is 100 percent because of the program."

Ten years ago he started keeping mares at Mark and Barbara Reid's Walnut Green Farm in Kennett Square. The partnership has flourished.

"Dan is a super straight up guy," Mark Reid said. "I've been blessed in my career to deal with a lot of top people in the industry, and

he's up there. He pays his bills, takes counsel, and generally comes up with the right answer. His family is lifetime Thoroughbred owners and breeders; Dan is continuing along that line and is also just a good guy."

Some of the first from the partnership, foaled in 2008, were \$305,076-earner Moon Eclipse and \$97,635-earner Sudden Calm. Stakes-placed \$154,0140-earner Kelwynne, \$197,208-earner Well Polished, \$157,993-earner Am Inspired, and \$102,760-earner Mellonbrook followed. More recently, Ryan has bred or owned Pennsylvania-bred horses such as multiple stakes win-

ners Please Flatter Me and Pumpkin Rumble, both of whom he sold to pay for the rest.

Please Flatter Me was a \$12,000 purchase at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Winter Mixed Sale in January 2017. The short yearling by Munnings was bred by Mary Katherine Haire, and went on to break her maiden first out for Ryan at Penn National by a widening 81/2 lengths in October. She wheeled back to win the Blue Mountain Juvenile Fillies by 4 lengths in November, proving her class.

Ryan sold her to a partnership of Sol Kumin's Madaket Stables and the Heider Family Stables, then watched Please Flatter Me keep her unbeaten record alive by winning the Gin Talking Stakes at Laurel Park in December. "I'll be following her," Ryan said. "She is a very good prospect."

The Smart Angle-bred Pumpkin Rumble was sold at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall Yearling Sale for \$30,000. He is now owned by Al and Bill Ulwelling. Pumpkin Rumble started his career in the United States, rac-



ing at the Fair Grounds, Arlington, Canterbury Park, Presque Isle, Belmont Park, Keeneland, Churchill Downs, and even Sam Houston and Remington Park. Now he calls Woodbine home and has made 17 consecutive starts there.

After winning the Mystic Lake Mile at Canterbury and being graded stakes placed at Arlington and Woodbine, Pumpkin Rumble finally

got his first graded stakes win in the Valedictory Stakes-G3 on Dec. 9. The win was bittersweet, as Reid and Ryan bought his dam Clarins, a Storm Cat mare in foal to English Channel, for \$25,000 at the 2010 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December sale, but lost her a year later.

"After the English Channel colt that became Pumpkin Rumble, we bred her back to Congrats which was a good match for her," Reid explained. "She colicked and we lost both her and the foal."

Remarking on the Valedictory, Ryan said: "It was an exciting race, and I'm very excited for the connections. It's sad since we lost the mare and her foal, but we were so happy to see Pumpkin Rumble become a graded stakes winner."

Pumpkin Rumble's trainer, Kevin Attard, had another horse in the race, the popular millionaire Melmich, who was seeking his 18th lifetime victory and was the race's defending champion. The two horses threw it down in the lane, battling to the wire until Pumpkin Rumble prevailed.

"It was a great race," Attard said. "They were both deserving of the win, but it was nice to see Pumpkin get one. He was so impressive in the prep for the race (winning an allowance by 6¾ lengths), and he laid it down hard to the wire."

Attard said that Pumpkin Rumble, a quiet laid-back guy, will get the winter off on the farm before gearing up for "another strictly Woodbine campaign. You wouldn't even know he was there in the barn, he's hon-

estly just a straightforward, good boy. He's easy to gallop, a good veteran that knows what he's doing. We just have to stay out of his way."

Pumpkin Rumble is the highest-earning horse Smart Angle has bred, with \$550,453 to date. Selling horses like him is bittersweet, but Ryan tries to take the emotion out of it. "It's such a difficult decision for me to make, but with 55 horses in the barn, every now and then you have to sell a good one to pay for the rest," he explained. "It's still a tough decision."

Eleven of the 55 horses are broodmares with Reid, the rest are in training or at the track with trainers such as David Donk in New York. Mike Pino and Reid train the Pennsylvania runners.

"We buy some horses every year, but we have to sell some, too," Reid explained.

"It's a combination of selling some weanlings and yearlings, usually," Ryan said, "Sometimes it's 2-year-olds in training. We

have and we sell a bit of everything."

Ryan, a homebuilder whose company Dan Ryan Builders is one of the top in the nation, is having fun and simply happy to keep the Smart Angle name alive. "Champion 2-year-old Smart Angle was my mom's favorite horse, so I named the operation after her," Ryan said. "The name has a lot of sentimental feeling." And even if everything hasn't yet turned to gold, the name is becoming synonymous with Ryan and Reid's Pennsylvania breeding partnership. sit down and watch. Hopefully there will be a lot of popcorn in the future, fingers crossed. ■



# Making the Grade: Prince Lucky

Pennsylvania-Bred champion at 2. New York stakes winner at 3. Prince Lucky then disappeared for more than eight months. Trainer Todd Pletcher took an ambitious path and entered Dan McConnell's homebred in the Grade 3 Hal's Hope at Gulfstream on Feb. 23 for his first start at 4. The result was spectacular.

Rating off the pace of stablemate Copper Town through the opening quarters, Prince Lucky was urged on by John Velazquez around the far turn of the one-mile Hal's Hope, battled into the stretch and pulled away late to win by six lengths. He completed the distance in 1:34.84 and earned a 106 Beyer Figure, the third highest in the nation this year for races up to a mile. It was the first graded win in the career of the son of Corinthian, who has now won five of nine starts, with two thirds, while earning \$291,830.

"We just felt like the distance suited him well, he was doing well, and then he drew a really favorable [outside] post position for him," Pletcher told Gulfstream Park's media department. "I was happy to see him come back strong off the layoff, and hopefully bigger and better things to come."

Winner of the Pennsylvania Nursery at Parx by nearly three lengths at 2, one of three wins from four starts that season, the flashy bay moved from

the barn of Larry Jones to that of Pletcher's after an off-the-board finish a year ago at Fair Grounds. In his final two starts at 3, Prince Lucky was third in the Sir Barton Stakes at Pimlico on Preakness Day, and won the Easy Goer Stakes at Belmont Park on Belmont Stakes Day. Pletcher is now targeting the Gulfstream Park Mile on Florida Derby Day, March 30.

Prince Lucky is a second-generation homebred for McConnell, who co-bred the colt's dam Lucky Notion (by Great Notion) with Norris Gelman and Lee Vosters, and campaigned the PA-Bred mare with Gelman for two full seasons before retiring her after a January start in 2012. Lucky Notion picked up checks her entire 12-start career, earning \$117,464 with five wins, three seconds, two thirds and two fourths.

Lucky Notion has produced three foals of racing age, all winners, two stakes performers. Her second foal, Saint Main Event, a 5-year-old daughter of Redeemed campaigned by McConnell and trained by John Servis, was third in last year's All Brandy Stakes at Laurel Park and has six wins and earnings of \$282,466. She won her first start of 2019 in a Parx allowance on Jan. 12.

Lucky Notion's current 2-year-old is the El Padrino filly Lucky Olivia Rose, and she has a yearling Uncle Lino filly named Katesaluckygirl. The mare delivered a filly by Birdstone on Feb. 10.

# Pennsylvania Broodmare Domicile Requirements & Registration Eligibility for 2019 Foals

Please note the following broodmare domicile requirements for the 2019 crop of foals. Mares bred to registered PA-Sires are up again this year, according to our preliminary count, and continuing that trend will move us to an increase in registered foals, which is our priority.

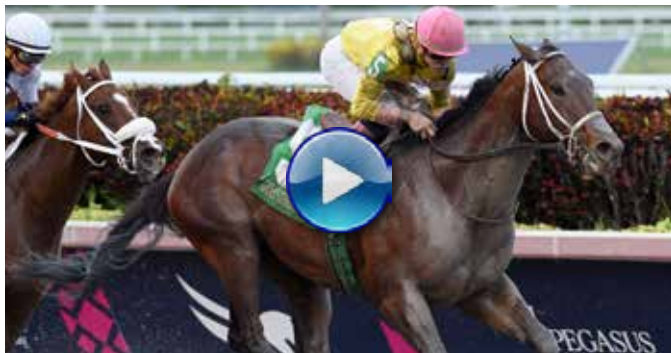
- The dam of the foal resided continuously in Pennsylvania since **DECEMBER 1** of the year of conception through foaling. Mares not being bred back will fall under this category.
- The dam of the foal was purchased at a public sale after **DECEMBER 1** of the year of conception and brought into Pennsylvania within 14 days of the date of purchase and remained continuously through foaling. During the year of foaling, the foal or its dam spent at least ninety (90) days in the state.
- The dam of the foal arrived after **DECEMBER 1** of the year of conception, foaled in Pennsylvania and was bred back to a registered PA stallion standing in Pennsylvania and the dam of the foal resided **SIXTY (60)** consecutive days during which foaling occurred.
