Strong Sales Market for PA-Breds

Breeding and selling for auction has always been an unpredictable business, but producing commercially attractive horses that are also Pennsylvania-bred, and thus backed by the state's lucrative breeding program, has resulted in significant increases in average price over the last two years.

According to statistics released by The Jockey Club, average price for Pennsylvania-bred yearlings rose a combined 30 percent in 2017-18 from 2016 levels, from \$43,665 to \$56,857 last year.

Average price for 2-year-olds jumped 20 percent over the same two-year period, from \$57,494 in 2016 to \$69,642 last year. Gross

sales of 2-year-olds was up nearly 50 percent last year over 2017 totals, from \$1,871,000 to \$2,785,700.

"I think you're starting to see a better-bred horse in Pennsylvania," said Brian Sanfratello, executive secretary of the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association. "Breeders are willing to spend a little more, as they are confident in our program. You can see it in the stallions that are standing for their first and second years. The Pennsylvania yearling and 2-year-old auction numbers have increased in both 2017 and 2018. A Pennsylvania-bred is even more attractive to buyers because of the number of restricted races, stakes and percentage of owner bonuses. I'm confident this trend will continue."

The strong market is music to the ears of Pennsylvania breeders Doug Black of Blackstone Farm, as well as Steve and Jane Long,

all of whom have enjoyed success in the sales ring for the last several years.

"We raised the quality of our broodmares, and now produce about 45-55 foals each year," said Black. Blackstone Farm is located in Pine Grove, about 25 miles northeast of Penn National Race Course.

Black said that the stability of the Pennsylvania breeding program, whereby monies from the Race Horse Development Fund are now protected from being taken by Harrisburg lawmakers, has benefitted his business. If lawmakers were to touch the Fund monies, the penalties would be significant.

"It's helped tremendously," said Black of the Fund protection. "We've even had more people request to board their horses here. A couple of years back, people were down on the Pennsylvania program, but I believe you'll

see the foal crop numbers spike back up this year."

In 2018, horses bred by Blackstone Farm sold extremely well at auctions across the country. At the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July yearling sale, Blackstone's Street Sense yearling colt out of Mahkama, by Bernardini, sold to Godolphin for \$350,000; at the Saratoga select sale in August, three Blackstone-bred yearlings sold for an average price of \$177,000, with top price being \$250,000 for a Candy Ride (Arg)—Rhys filly.

At the 2018 Keeneland September yearling sale, Blackstone bred five of the eight six-figure Pennsylvania-breds, topped by a \$300,000 Quality Road—Circumspect (by Discreet Cat) filly and a \$210,000 colt by Honor Code—Escape With Me, by Arazi.

Overall, last year's Keeneland September sale was an especially good one for Pennsylvania-breds, as 24 sold for a total of \$2,692,500, for an average price of \$112,188.

And the Blackstone horses can run: Among their homebreds are multiple graded stakes winner Tom's Ready (\$1,036,267) and Delaware Oaks-G3 stakes winner Dark Nile; as well as stakes winners Bronx Beauty and The Critical Way.

Steve and Jane Long began breeding Pennsylvania-breds about 12 years ago at their farm in Airville, York County, initially breeding to race, with homebreds trained by Jonathan Sheppard. Their horses have also sold extremely well at auction.

"Our goal is to always raise healthy horses," said Jane Long. "That's very important to us. Therefore, when they go to the sales, they do pretty well. We have to be willing to go either way — keep to race, or sell. The bottom line is the health and physical well-being of our horses."

Last season, the Longs sold a full brother to their multiple stakes-winning mare Great Soul at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall Yearling sale at Timonium for \$120,000. By Great Notion out of What Am I Gonna Do, by Partner's Hero, the colt, named Valued Notion, was purchased by Hillwood Stable and has yet to start.

In addition to Valued Notion, the Longs have sold other foals out of What Am I Gonna Do. They include Magic Soul, a filly by Street Magician, who brought \$33,000 as a yearling at Timonium and then was resold as a \$95,000 2-year-old in training at OBS, and her full brother Giant Captain, who sold for \$95,000 as a 2-year-old at Timonium to Korean interests.

Earlier this spring, the Longs realized a nice price for their Pennsylvania-bred filly by Com-

petitive Edge at the Keeneland April 2-year-olds in training sale. The filly is out of the Longs' mare Lefreakcestchic, and was purchased for \$235,000 by Shepherd Equine Advisors, agent for Larry Hirsch.

Long said that What Am I Gonna Do had a foal by Gormley this year, and will go to Practical Joke, while Lefreakcestchic is likely to go back Competitive Edge.

The strong market for Pennsylvania-breds at auction is also reflected by the progeny of regional sires. At the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training sale at Timonium May 20-21, Patty Miller, EQB Inc., agent went to \$120,000 to buy Hip 118, a daughter of Pennsylvania stallion Weigelia. Named Our Dixie Blue, the filly is out of the Dixie Union mare Dixiewood, and was bred by Christopher Schartz and WynOaks Farm.

Weigelia has stood at WynOaks Farm, located in Delta, Pa., since the beginning of his stud career. A multiple graded stakes-winning millionaire, Weigelia has established a reputation for siring tough, hard-knocking runners like himself, and has lifetime average earnings per starter in excess of \$82,000, all from a \$3,500 stud fee. ■

Zipper's Hero: Getting Better With Age

Like a fine wine, Mario O. Mangini's Zipper's Hero has gotten better as she ages.

In the last two years, the 6-year-old daughter of Partner's Hero has only failed to hit the board one time, won two Pennsylvania-bred stakes races, and was honored as 2018's top older female by the Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association at Parx Racing.

Last season, Zipper's Hero captured the \$100,000 Dr. Teresa Garofalo Memorial Stakes at Parx, as well as three allowance races, one of which came at Laurel Park in late June. And on April 27, the dark bay or brown mare annexed her second added-money event, humbling 11 rivals in the \$100,000 Foxy J G Stakes at Parx.

The seven-furlong Foxy J G was a tour de force for Zipper's Hero, as she led every step of the way in a dominating performance under Johan Rosado. She was never seriously challenged at any point, in which she opened up a 6-length advantage in midstretch and then cruised home by 2½ lengths in 1:25.12.

The winner's share of \$69,750 boosted the mare's lifetime earnings to \$401,892; interestingly, she was bred by Peter Giangiulio, whose father bred the race's namesake, Foxy J G, and campaigned her under his Castle Rock Farm banner.

Zipper's Hero, who is out of the City Zip mare Open Zipper, has been a real family affair for Mangini and his two daughters: Victoria, who works in the horsemen's office at Parx, and Daniela, who works in the horse identification office there. Little did Mangini know that when he purchased the mare privately before her first start that she would reward him time and time again.

Mangini was born in the town of Morteros, Province of Cordoba, Argentina, and grew up around horses.

"As far back as I can remember, at the age of 5, my grandpa had horses in the backyard of our home," said Mangini. "My grandpa and my uncles all had racehorses, which fueled my passion. My grandpa started the tradition



of taking his son, my Dad, to the races, and then my Dad continued this with me."

Mangini said his grandfather and uncles used to breed horses in Argentina, and two friends had horse breeding farms there. He recalled that they always used to have barbecues together.

"When I was 18, I went to a university to study engineering, which introduced me to the world of car racing, my other passion," he said, noting that his son, Alex, shares his interest in cars.

Mangini said that he really became involved in horse racing when Daniela pursued a career as a jockey. But due to instability of the economy in Argentina, they decided to come to America in 2001 as a family.

Fast forward to 2014, and Mangini became an owner in this country. At a farm in New Jersey where he kept his horses, a dark bay or brown filly came into his life.

"An owner decided to sell all his babies; from the group, I picked Zipper, and we agreed that I would take care of the other horses until they were sold, and give him \$5,000 if she wins, which he accepted," said Mangini. "Surely enough, Zipper's Hero won her first race."

Her first start came at Parx in early May 2016, as a 3-year-old. The only first-timer in the field of six, she was dismissed at odds of 14-1, yet overcame a poor start to come from off the pace and edge past the heavy favorite to win, despite the fact the jockey dropped his whip 50 yards from the wire. That first victory was worth \$25,200 to Mangini, not a bad return on his initial investment.

From there, Zipper's Hero showed glimpses of what was to come. She recorded her second victory later in 2016 at Penn National, again overcoming a troubled start to take a Pennsylvania-bred allowance, in which she "closed with giant strides to get up in time for the win," according to the chart footnote.

Late in 2016, Ed Coletti Jr. took over the training of Zipper's Hero, and in 2018 she posted four victories, which earned her year-end honors from the PTHA. One of those victories was her stakes debut in the Garofalo Memorial on Sept. 1, in which she ran like the even-money favorite she was. Taking the lead right out of the gate under Rosado, she rolled home by 3 lengths in an excellent 1:09.96 for the six furlongs over a "good" surface. She

also posted three allowance wins, earning nearly \$200,000 for the season.

"I knew she was going to be nominated for the [PTHA] award, and I thought we had a shot," said Mangini. "I was so incredibly proud of her for winning as Best Older Female of the Year."

And this year, the first-class career of Zipper's Hero continued in the Foxy J G.

"She's pretty straightforward to train," said Coletti, who also collected two other awards for horses he trains the night of the PTHA banquet – 2-year-old filly winner Tara's Talent, and 3-year-old filly winner Dixie Serenade. "And she's big, one of the biggest mares I've ever

had. When I put the saddle on her, I can't see over her withers."

"We love to see her run," said Daniela Hampshire. "We were lucky enough to see her since she was a baby and watch her grow up to be this huge mare that loves to run and gives everything in each race. It's satisfaction for us."

Coletti said that Mangini comes to the barn every day to take care of Zipper's Hero himself. He said he's very happy for him, his family, and the success of Zipper's Hero.

"Zipper's Hero is very easy and relaxed in the stall," said Mangini. "She also eats a lot and loves candy. But when she gets to the track,

she's full of personality, with bursts of energy. [The late] Jose Flores was her jockey in the beginning, and he used to tell me that if she relaxes more on the track, we will have fun. We made it."

Mangini gave credit to jockey Rosado and exercise riders Maria Remedio and Abner Adorno, both of whom do a great job with her in the mornings, he said.

"I want to thank [Eddie] Coletti, we make a great team at Parx Racing," said Mangini. "He always treated me with the utmost respect and care. Most of all, I want to thank this country for making the American dream a true reality." ■

Jump Start's Pennsylvania Legacy

There are the numbers. And then there was the horse.

Northview PA's Jump Start, the leading sire in the Mid-Atlantic region for the past five years, lost his battle with colitis on Sunday morning, May 19 at the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center. The international sire of Grade/Group 1 winners, millionaires, Pennsylvania-bred champions and hard-trying runners was 20.

After the news was announced on Facebook, Northview Stallions posted: "How lucky we were to have Jump Start. At a loss for words, he will surely be missed greatly for many reasons."

The arrival of Jump Start at Tarry Bratton's Ghost Ridge Farms in Felton, Pa., for the 2010 season made headlines. He was already an established sire with four crops to race – when the news came in late 2009 that he would move to Pennsylvania from his birthplace at Overbrook Farm in Kentucky, he had \$4 million-plus progeny earnings that year, the most of any stallion in the state, and ranked second behind Not For Love in the region. His runners included that year's Hollywood Gold Cup-G1 winner Rail Trip and additional graded winners Assessment and Bold Start. His son Icabod Crane had finished third in the previous year's Preakness Stakes-G1, and he was proving to be a very good sire of 2-year-olds.

A son of A.P. Indy out of Overbrook Farm's homebred Steady Cat, a graded stakes-placed daughter of Storm Cat from the family of major sire Miswaki, Jump Start was also a very good juvenile. Trained by D. Wayne Lukas for his breeder, William T. Young, the dark bay burst on the scene as a 2-year-old, winning his first two starts, including the 2001 Saratoga Special Stakes-G2 over Heavyweight Champ and Booklet, and finished second in the Grade 1 Champagne Stakes to division leader Officer. Going for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile-G1 at Belmont Park that fall, he ran off the board in what proved to be his final race when exiting with a condylar fracture of his left front cannon bone. From five starts, he had earned \$221,265.

Jump Start stood two seasons at Ghost Ridge before moving to Northview PA in Peach Bottom. His first Pennsylvania-sired crop yielded eight stakes winners, led by \$790,834-earner and graded stakes-winning juvenile filly Miss Behaviour, \$735,250-earner Disco

Chick and Philip H. Iselin Stake-G3 winner Just Call Kenny. To date, he has more than 40 stakes performers in his Pennsylvania-sired crops. He's been the region's leading sire since 2014, has average annual progeny earnings of more than \$5 million since 2009, and was the top U.S. sire standing outside Kentucky by North American earnings in 2011.

His runners of 2019 include New York stakes winners Startwithsilver and Durkin's Call and Panamanian Group 1 winner Trincheto (Arg).

Lifetime, Jump Start has sired multiple stakes winners in every one of his 13 crops to race (through current 3-year-olds), for a total of 69 stakes winners, 24 graded/group winners. His runners have earned more than \$64 million, topped by multimillionaire and four-time graded winner Prayer for Relief and \$1.6 million earner and four-time graded winner Pants On Fire. Two of his runners hit the board in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile-G1 – Rail Trip, second in 2012, and Pants On Fire, third in 2014.

Sent to Argentina for seven breeding seasons through the mid-2010s, Jump Start is the sire of three South American champions: 2014 Argentinian Horse of the year Idolo Porteno (Arg), Uruguay's 2017 champion 3-year-old filly and older mare Sexy Reasons (Arg) and Argentina's 2-year-old filly champion of 2015 Seresta.

At the time of his death, Jump Start was the most expensive stallion in the region, standing for \$10,000 live foal. He has 44 current 2-year-olds and 41 yearlings, and was bred to 63 mares in 2018.

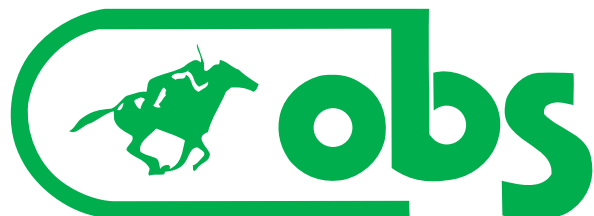

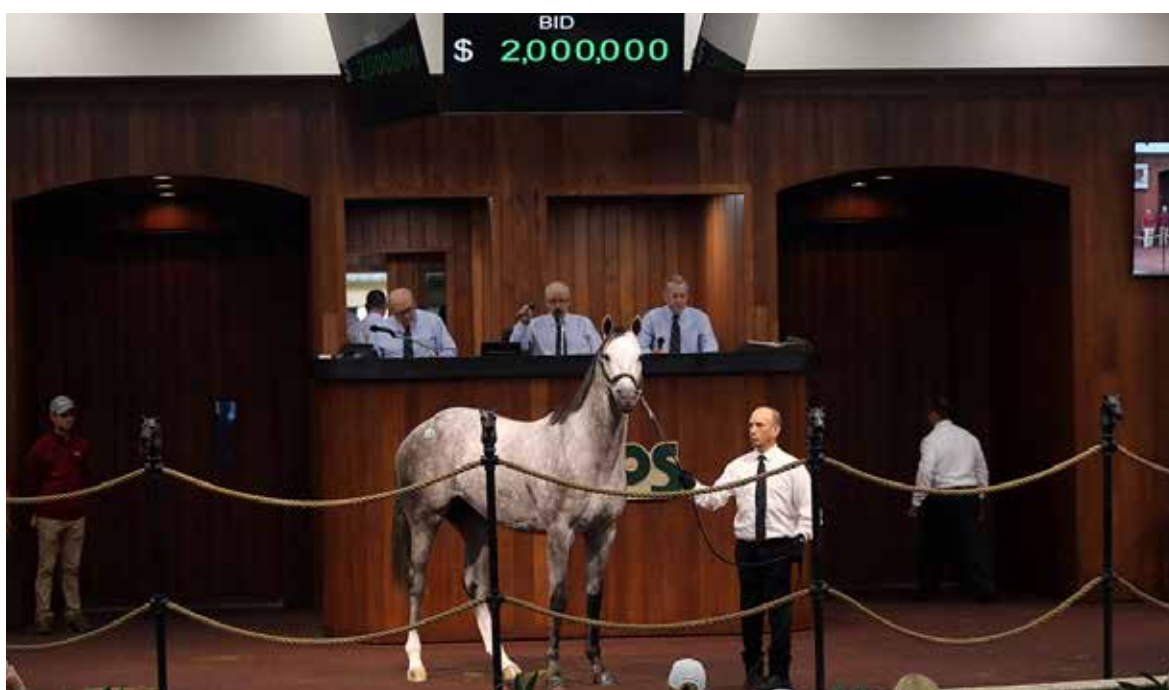

PA-Bred Stakes Preview: Penn Mile Day



Penn Mile Day, June 1, offers a 12-race card that features eight stakes worth a total of \$1.3 million. Post time for the first race is 2:45 p.m. Led by the richest race of the year at Penn National – the Grade 2, \$500,000 Penn Mile – the card includes four MATCH Series stakes as well as two stakes for PA-Breds.

There are 22 Pennsylvania Bred restricted \$100,000 stakes races on the schedule for 2019, worth a total of \$2.75 million in purses when calculating in the 25 percent bonus for all PA-Sired PA-Bred horses finishing first through third in all restricted stakes.

Contact the racing office or check the tracks' websites on a regular basis for closing dates, updates and changes of the 2019 schedule.

Penn Mile Night

The two PA-Bred stakes on Penn Mile Day are for 3-year-olds. The New Start for fillies (Race 4 - post time 4:06) attracted a field of nine evenly-matched entries, the morning line favorite the D. Wayne Lukas trained Ultimate Mo. The Danzig (Race 5 - post time 4:34) has 11 colts and geldings entered, with graded stakes winner Call Paul the 8/5 morning line favorite. ■

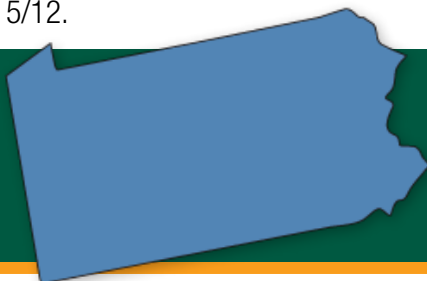

Pennsylvania Broodmare Domicile Requirements & Registration Eligibility for 2019 Foals

Please note the following broodmare domicile requirements for the 2019 crop of foals. Mares bred to registered PA-Sires are up again this year, according to our preliminary count, and continuing that trend will move us to an increase in registered foals, which is our priority.

- The dam of the foal resided continuously in Pennsylvania since **DECEMBER 1** of the year of conception through foaling. Mares not being bred back will fall under this category.
- The dam of the foal was purchased at a public sale after **DECEMBER 1** of the year of conception and brought into Pennsylvania within 14 days of the date of purchase and remained continuously through foaling. During the year of foaling, the foal or its dam spent at least ninety (90) days in the state.
- The dam of the foal arrived after **DECEMBER 1** of the year of conception, foaled in Pennsylvania and was bred back to a registered PA stallion standing in Pennsylvania and the dam of the foal resided **SIXTY (60)** consecutive days during which foaling occurred.
