


The 2018 Eclipse Award Champion Female Sprinter capped off her year with a thrilling victory in the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint-G1 at Churchill Downs, her fourth consecutive stakes win, a streak which started in the Malvern Rose at Presque Isle Downs, followed by the La Lorgnette at Woodbine and the Grade 2 Raven Run at Keeneland. Racing exclusively in stakes in her seven starts-with a second in the Cicada at Aqueduct and a third in the Weber City Miss at Laurel-she earned the most of any PA-Bred in 2018 with \$848,076.

Five wins from nine starts included the 5-furlong Marshall Jenney Stakes over the Parx turf, and a three-race win streak earlier in the year. He was also third in the Laurel Dash at Laurel Park in the fall, rallying late to miss winning by a half length.



OLDER FEMALE UNIQUE BELLA

GR/RO, F, Foaled March 2, 2014 Tapit—Unrivaled Belle, by Unbridled's Song Bred by Brushwood Stable

The two-time Eclipse Award winner– 2017 Champion Female Sprinter and 2018 Champion Older Dirt Female-her season ended in July, but not until she added two more Grade 1 wins to her record-the Clement L. Hirsch and Beholder Mile-as well as the Grade 2 Santa Maria Stakes, and a second in the Grade 1 Apple Blossom from four starts to become a millionaire. She was the third richest PA-Bred of the year with \$680,000.

Winner of seven of 11 starts, she concluded her season with a victory in the Grade 3 Robert J. Frankel Stakes at Santa Anita, where she earlier won the Swingtime Stakes at a mile on the turf in 1:32.77. Her first career stakes win came in the Osunitas at Del Mar during the summer after starting her season with four straight wins, all at Santa Anita. With \$365,665 earned in 2018, she placed fifth on the top PA-Bred earners' list.

TURF MALE • OLDER MALE **SPRING QUALITY**

B, G, Foaled March 17, 2012 Quality Road—Spring Star, by Deputy Minister Bred by George Strawbridge Jr.



Winner of his first Grade 1 in one of the most exciting races of the year, the Manhattan on Belmont Stakes Day in which nine horses were separated by less than 2 lengths, he went into the race off a second in the Fort Marcy-G3, and was third in the Sword Dancer-G1 at Saratoga. He was the top-earning PA-Bred male of 2018 with \$684,785 from five starts, all graded stakes.

The Life and Legacy of Jump Start

The Pennsylvania breeding program suffered a massive loss on May 19 when leading sire Jump Start died of complications from colitis. The 20-year-old stallion had been standing at Richard Golden's Northview PA at the time of his death.

"He deserves all the recognition he can get," said syndicate shareholder Hank Nothhaft. "From a sire standpoint, he was the biggest undiscovered gem in the country."

Jump Start was a larger than life presence in the Mid-Atlantic region. He had the pedigree and race record to be an attractive stallion anywhere, but his arrival in Pennsylvania for the 2010 season changed the shape of the breeding program in the state.

Jump Start was born Jan. 28, 1999, at William T. Young's Overbook Farm in Kentucky. The son of A.P. Indy was out of the Storm Cat mare Steady Cat, herself a multiple graded stakes-placed winner of \$224,427. Her dam, Hopespringsforever, was a full sister to classy sire Miswaki and dam of Grade 1-placed Union City. Jump Start was Steady Cat's first foal; she went on to produce the dam of Grade 1 winner Mastery and the dam of multiple stakes placed Conquest Windycity.

Jump Start went into training with Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas in 2001, debuting at Churchill Downs June 23 of that year. The strapping dark bay won, scoring by 2¼ lengths with future Kentucky Derby starter Request for Parole running third. Jump Start then won the \$150,000 Saratoga Special-G2 over Booklet, who then went on a four-race winning streak including two Kentucky Derby preps. Jump Start never won again.

Fifth in the Grade 1 Hopeful Stakes at Saratoga and second in the Grade 1 Champagne at Belmont Park, Jump Start ran off the board in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile while injuring himself. He was retired to his birthplace of Overbrook Farm to stand for an initial fee of \$5,000.



Although Jump Start did well, he became available for sale in 2009 and went to South American partners, standing in Argentina during the Southern Hemisphere season. At the same time, bloodstock agent Carl McEntee purchased 75 percent of him to move the young stallion to Ghost Ridge Farm in Pennsylvania.

"He was the catalyst of my career," McEntee said. "I felt incredibly lucky to have purchased him when I did. Obviously it speaks volumes of what I thought of him because I bought him twice – for Northview as well."

Jump Start was transferred to Northview in 2011, where he stood the rest of his career. "He had been a solid, consistent horse with good size and substance, good bone," McEntee said. "Essentially he was a horse I thought would garner enough attention for the program to elevate the Pennsylvania breeding industry. He was the right horse at the time for the market."

Overall, McEntee believes that Jump Start, "...changed the breeding program in Pennsylvania. Here was a stallion standing for \$10,000 with in excess of 100 mares for the first four years and onwards." Larry Karp was a shareholder from the time Jump Start first arrived in Pennsylvania. "I met Carl and [Ghost Ridge owner Tarry Bratton] at a sale at Timonium by chance," Karp recalled. "I did not know either one of them." Karp and his daughter combined owned six and a half shares in Jump Start. "Obviously he was one of the smartest, best purchases I ever made in terms of a stallion. At \$10,000 he was in a class by himself. He's been a top 50 stallion in the country virtually every year since I got involved with him. The return on my investment from this stallion was unparalleled."

To date, Jump Start has sired 730 winners and 69 stakes winners for progeny earnings over \$64 million. His leading runners include Argentinian Horse of the Year Idolo Porteno (Arg), who won the prestigious Gran Premio Carlos Pellegrini-G1, Argentinian champion Seresta (Arg), Uruguayan champion Sexy Reasons (Arg), and \$2.2 million earner Prayer for Relief, who was a two-time Grade 2 winner. Pants On Fire, who earned \$1.6 million, also won a pair of Grade 2 races among his eight stakes victories, and \$1.5 million earner Rail Trip took the Grade 1 TVG/Betfair Hollywood

Gold Cup in 2009. He was second in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile-G1 in 2012.

Willet was a stakes winner at all three major New York tracks, while Pennsylvania-bred Miss Behaviour won the Grade 2 Matron at Belmont and the Grade 3 Charles Town Oaks at Charles Town. Another Pennsylvania-bred, Disco Chick, won 10 of 42 starts and earned \$735,250.

"I jumped at the opportunity to get to Jump Start," Nothhaft said. "Based on Carl's recommendation, I was going to be paid back based on his proven record, which did prove to be the case. As I got more experience and more mares I started using my breeding seasons instead of donating or selling them."

Nothhaft was always impressed by the demeanor of the top sire. "He was so calm for a stallion, kindly, and a gentleman. I always loved to visit him at the farm, and was so impressed by his physical condition as he aged. I expected him to go on for a lot longer."


The team at Northview was devastated by the loss. Bloodstock manager Paul O'Loughlin said, "He was a sweet, great horse. He had all the attributes: happy, kind, good at his job. He was pleasant to be around. Everyone really loved him."

"The people at Northview did an outstanding job managing that stallion," Karp said. "It's a big loss for Pennsylvania and the whole Mid-Atlantic breeding program. He got Breeders' Cup horses, Grade 1 horses... Even from my own mares – and I don't have great mares – it was amazing how he churned out winners. This will go on for at least another three or four years."

Karp has two Jump Start yearlings in Florida, and one runner on the track. Nothhaft has five Jump Start offspring "in various stages of the pipeline," and bred a Pioneerof the Nile mare to him this season for next year. "I won't be surprised if he turns out to be quite a good broodmare sire, too," he added.

With three champions, 24 graded winners, and 70 percent winners from starters, Jump Start had a genuinely tremendous impact on the state of Pennsylvania. "He was able to come to Pennsylvania and step up," Nothhaft said. "He really dominated and produced a good bunch of horses. What more can you ask for in a regional sire?"



PA-Bred Stakes Recaps: Penn National and Parx Racing



Pennsylvania's Day At the Races is fast approaching, but PA-Breds have had a lot of opportunities leading into the day that celebrates Keystone state runners.

Danzig Stakes

Less than a week before he was named PA-Bred champion 2-year-old male, Call Paul showed where he ranks among the local set at 3 by dominating the Danzig Stakes.



Rating just outside early leader Admiral Abe through the opening quarter, he went to the front as he pleased, took control on the turn while still in hand and drew off to win by 6 lengths. The 2-5 favorite in the field of nine, Call Paul completed the six-furlongs in a snappy 1:09.

It was the fourth start of the year for the son of Friesan Fire, all in stakes. He kicked off 2019 with a victory in Gulfstream Park's Swale Stakes-G3, finished third in Aqueduct's Grade 3 Bay Shore, and was second in the Gold Fever at Belmont Park. With \$195,020 in earnings this year, he has banked a career total \$474,520 from nine starts.

Bred by Beatrice Patterson and Vicky Schowe, the bay colt out of Avani Force, by Forestry, is trained by Jason Servis for owners Michael Dubb, David Simon, Bethlehem Stables LLC and Bruce Irom. Dubb purchased him for \$210,000 at the 2018 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May sale.

New Start Stakes

Making her stakes debut, Gap View Stables and Jagger Inc.'s Gotta Be Strong flew down the stretch to capture the New Start Stakes by a half-length, catching favorite I'm the Talent in the final strides. Her final time for the six furlongs was 1:10.64.

Claimed by Ness for \$50,000 at Parx in her first start of 2019, Gotta Be Strong has been an extremely consistent filly – in 11 starts since her debut last September, she boasts a record of 5-3-2 for earnings of \$241,090. She won the race in January when claimed and has not been risked for a tag since while recording three wins and three seconds and earning \$198,000.



Bred by Scott Naylor and sold as a yearling at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall sale for \$2,100 to Chris Melton, Gotta Be Strong made the first five starts for owner Albert R. Lupcho Jr. and trainer Marcos Zulueta. The only off the board effort was her first time out, when she broke "very slowly" according to the race chart and ended up sixth of 12. She won next out in late September, taking a five and a half-furlong maiden claimer while in for \$40,000 – sent off as the 4-5 favorite she won by a length over a sloppy track.

Racing primarily at Parx, she has made several trips to Laurel Park, and most recently was third behind fellow PA-bred Please Flatter Me in the Alma North Stakes on June 16. The daughter of Strong Mandate is out of stakes winner Gotta Rush, by Wild Rush, whose youngest foal is a current Jump Start yearling named Bold Rush.



Lyphard Stakes

For the second year in a row Larry Karp's Barlar LLC colors were in the winner's circle following the first PA-Bred turf stakes of the season when his accomplished homebred Imply pulled away as the overwhelming 1-10 favorite to win her second Lyphard Stakes by nearly 4 lengths.

The 6-year-old daughter of former PA sire E Dubai recorded her fifth career stakes win and first of the year. The \$619,228-earner trained by Bernie Houghton has a lifetime record of 26-10-7-2 and is 2-for-2 in 2019 with her latest score.

Karp bred Imply, and her stakes-winning half-sister Advert, out of the Orientate mare Allude. After producing Advert in 2014 the mare was sold at that fall's Keeneland November sale for 100,000-asignificant return on investment as Karp had purchased her three years earlier at the November sale for 17,000. Advert, an earner of 226,458, is still in training this year at 5 but has yet to start.

Robellino Stakes

Fast and Accurate, the PA-Bred champion 3-year-old male of 2017, had a solid season at 4, with a stakes win in September in Parx Racing's Alphabet Soup Stakes, and multiple stakes placings. He kicked off his 5-year-old campaign more impressively – after

winning an optional claimer (risked for \$80,000) at Fair Grounds in January, he was in a dead heat for first (but disqualified and placed second) in the Old Man Eloquent Stakes at Gulfstream Park in February, and shipped to Keeneland where he just missed when second in allowance company.

The Robellino Stakes, his fourth start of the year, was his first in his home state since taking the Alphabet Soup. Set off as the 3-5 favorite, he lived up to his odds. Biding his time in mid-pack early, the gray rallied around the far turn and drew off to a 5½-length score over 11 rivals. His final time for the mile and a sixteenth over firm turf was 1:39.77. Trained by Michael J. Maker for owners Skychai Racing LLC, Kendall E. Hansen and Sand Dollar Stable LLC, the son of Hansen boosted his earnings to \$622,827 while getting his seventh career win, fifth in a stakes, in 23 starts.

Crowd Pleaser Stakes

Trainer Miguel Vera has taken Chilly in Charge on the road since sending the 3-year-old colt out for his first start in January at Laurel. His fifth start landed him at Parx for the Crowd Pleaser, his stakes debut, and the dark bay made quite the impression – winning by 12 lengths as the 9-10 favorite in the field of seven.

The Newtown Anner Stud colorbearer, a \$170,000 OBS June sales horse at 2, was entered in his first turf test after breaking his maiden in his prior start at Woodbine on the all-weather surface. But the Crowd Pleaser – named for the graded stakes-winning PA-bred grass horse – came off the turf, and Chilly in Charge proved he could win on two different surfaces, with turf still in his future.



A dark bay son of Take Charge Indy bred by Horseshoe Valley Equine Center LLC out of the PA-bred mare Holiday Chills (by Harlan's Holiday), Chilly in Charge is a half-brother to stakes-placed Chilly Start, a \$335,711-earner and 11-time winner, and \$216,100-earner Huntin'theholidays. Holiday Chills delivered a PA-bred filly by Tapiture in May.

Power by Far Stakes



Wildcat Combat had won or placed in five of her six prior efforts at Parx, but she was somewhat overlooked when stepping up to stakes competition in the Power by Far. The 5-year-old daughter of former PA sire Messner went off at 8-1, was patiently ridden behind the early leaders, and pulled clear in the stretch to win by a length going five furlongs on the main track after the race came off the turf. It was her sixth win, and first in a stakes, in her 18-start career, and boosted her earnings to \$270,005.

Owned by Lyno E. Maraspin and trained by Miguel Penaloza, Wildcat Combat dropped into the claiming ranks as a 3-year-old after winning a maiden special weight at Penn National for breeder Donald L. Brown Jr. in August 2017. Brown lost her for \$25,000 at Penn a month after her first win, and she has competed primarily in allowance company since, never longer than six furlongs.

Wildcat Combat is the first foal out of the Lion Hearted mare She Is a Lioness, who is also the dam of 4-year-old Messner filly Mess'n Around, a winner of five of her 12 starts.

Pennsylvania Broodmare Domicile Requirements & Registration Eligibility for 2019 Foals

Please note the following broodmare domicile requirements for the 2019 crop of foals. Mares bred to registered PA-Sires are up again this year, according to our preliminary count, and continuing that trend will move us to an increase in registered foals, which is our priority.

• The dam of the foal resided continuously in Pennsylvania since **DECEMBER 1** of the year of conception through foaling. Mares not being bred back will fall under this category.

• The dam of the foal was purchased at a public sale after **DECEMBER 1** of the year of conception and brought into Pennsylvania within 14 days of the date of purchase and remained continuously through foaling. During the year of foaling, the foal or its dam spent at least ninety (90) days in the state.

• The dam of the foal arrived after **DECEMBER 1** of the year of conception, foaled in Pennsylvania and was bred back to a registered PA stallion standing in Pennsylvania and the dam of the foal resided **SIXTY** (60) consecutive days during which foaling occurred.
