Mirth Runs Her Way Into the Breeders' Cup

When the Santa Anita racing office called to say the \$300,000 Rodeo Drive Stakes-G1 on Sept. 28 was projected to have a light field, Little Red Feather front man Billy Koch had an idea.

"Phil D'Amato looked at me, and I looked at him. I said, 'What about Mirth?'" Koch recalled. "He said it wasn't a bad idea."

It ended up being a phenomenal idea, as Pennsylvania-bred Mirth went straight to the lead and ran her way both into the winner's circle and into the \$2 million Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf-G1 at Santa Anita, on the power-packed Nov. 2 card. The 4-year-old daughter of Colonel John—Di's Delight, by French Deputy, may have been a bit of a surprise, but Koch and D'Amato gave her the tool she needed to win: jockey Mike Smith.

"I asked Phil, who wins the most Grade 1 races for us? Money Mike," Koch said. "We called his agent and the rest is history."

While Koch approached the mile and a quarter race with good humor, going as far to joke that a half mile in 50 seconds would be ideal, Smith wasn't laughing. "He was really serious, and said not to worry about the fractions," Koch recalled. "He said he'd watched her races, and just needed to get her into a rhythm. If he could do that, it didn't matter how fast or slow they went because she would be comfortable."

Front-running Mirth, who hadn't won in six starts since February, was able to do just that. Smith got her in front immediately, then controlled the pace through splits of :23.72, :23.81, :23.52, :23.95, and a final quarter in :23.47. "Every quarter went in sub :24, and the last one was the fastest," Koch, who lost his voice for two days after screaming his filly home, said. "That is how you steal a race."

The win was the culmination of a long road for Mirth, who was bred under the banner of Larry Karp's Barlar LLC. The filly took five tries to break her maiden, finally getting it done at Delaware Park in September 2017. She then won two starter allowances at Laurel

Park, prompting a sale from Karp to Little Red Feather.

"Billy was very easy to deal with, and is a great guy," Karp said. "I'm probably Mirth's biggest cheerleader outside Billy and his group. I'm delighted every time she wins or hits the board, and I'll be rooting her like crazy in the Breeders' Cup."

But the sale from Karp to Little Red Feather was immediately followed by a lengthy setback. "She had a little issue and we had to give her time," Koch said. "I have to give credit to our partners, who were extremely patient. It's hard when you invest in a horse and then have to give three months off. People might wonder if we made a bad deal, or bought a bad horse. But our people never questioned the decision."

Mirth returned in January of this year, running sixth in an allowance at Santa Anita before winning one. Then she ran second or third in four of six starts before the Rodeo Drive. "Truthfully, we've always thought very highly of her, and thought she could at least win a stakes race," Koch said.

Stakes winning brothers by Uptowncharlybrown

As any Thoroughbred breeder will attest, it's a very long journey from when a foal takes his first shaky steps to the time he's loaded into the starting gate. Many obstacles can appear along the way, and many foals never even get that far, much less become stakes winners.

Yet the progeny of the Speightstown mare Torchwood have taken that long journey with much success, excelling in their racetrack careers. When Torchwood is bred to the stallion Uptowncharlybrown, something magical happens – from three foals to race, all have won, and two, Midtowncharlybrown and Midnightcharly – are stakes winners. A fourth is waiting in the wings to join his siblings at the racetrack.

All of them are co-owned by Uptowncharlybrown Stud LLC, a partnership group headed by Bob Hutt, and Godric LLC, the stable name of Irene Coletti. They were all bred in Pennsylvania by Godric LLC, and have been trained by Irene Coletti's stepson Ed Coletti Jr., who is based at Parx Racing.

This year, 5-year-old Midtowncharlybrown and 4-year-old Midnightcharly have given local fans a treat when they race, and especially so when they race against each other. In four consecutive stakes races beginning in April the full brothers have gone toe-to-toe, with Midtowncharlybrown winning twice and Midnightcharly winning once.

Midnightcharly kicked off the stakes spree with an exciting, off-the-pace victory in the \$100,000 Lyman Handicap for Pennsylvania-breds at Parx Racing on April 27, in which he split rivals as he began his rally in the seven-furlong event and then kicked into high gear late under regular rider Mychel Sanchez. That day, Midtowncharlybrown, who was coming off a four-month layoff, was part of the early pace but settled for fifth.



Midtowncharlybrown, however, got a bit of revenge on his younger sibling when he roared back to win the \$100,000 Chocolate Town Sprint at Penn National on June 1. Over a surface for which he has shown a great affinity, the chestnut led all the way in the six furlong contest for open company, setting swift splits of :22.06, :44.41 and :56.36, then having enough left in the tank to hold back the on-rushing Killybegs Captain to prevail by a neck in 1:08.83, with Midnightcharly rallying from last to grab third-place money.

The battle of the brothers continued on Aug. 3 in the \$100,000 Banjo Picker Sprint Stakes at Parx, and the result was a razor-thin victory by Midtowncharlybrown over Midnightcharly. This time, Midtowncharlybrown engaged in a ding-dong duel with Cowboy Mz until deep stretch, and then slowly edged away to a neck decision over his fast-closing brother. Finishing third was the tough-as-nails multiple stakes winner The Man.

And finally, both horses competed in the \$100,000 Bensalem Stakes against open company at Parx, and while neither prevailed, both finished within two lengths of the ship-in winner Engage, from the Steve Asmussen barn.

Through Oct. 26, Midtowncharlybrown has won 10 of 21 starts and \$477,408, while

Midnightcharly has won six of 14 starts, and \$311,008.

A full sister, 3-year-old Charly's Charm, is an allowance winner this season, earning \$80,270 from eight starts, while 2-year-old full brother Charly's Assassin is preparing for his career at Irene's farm in Ocala.

"Torchwood has been the broodmare who lays the golden eggs, so to speak," said Hutt, who raced Uptowncharlybrown and decided to stand him in Pennsylvania at Glenn and Becky Brok's Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville, in large part to honor his late friend and trainer, Alan Seewald. "It's like magic when she's been bred to Uptowncharlybrown."

Irene Coletti raced Torchwood, and in 2011 the filly made two starts at Monmouth Park after debuting at age 4. After finishing last in both events, Irene decided to bring her back to her farm, not originally intending to breed her. But when her friend Hutt offered her a free season to his newly-retired stallion Uptowncharlybrown, she decided to take a chance.

"Torchwood wasn't much of a race horse," said Irene. "But she was very sound, and so sweet and beautiful... the kindest horse I've ever been around. And all her babies are very kind, like her."

Karp also thought highly of her. He originally bought the stakes-placed French Deputy mare Di's Delight for \$55,000 at the 2011 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. "The reason I bought her is because one of her sisters had a nice stakes winner by Jump Start, and I had just gotten involved in Jump Start," he said. "Long story short, I was involved with Darby Dan at that point, and their general manager had a season to Colonel John. I put up the mare, they put up the stallion share, and the plan was to sell the pregnant mare. But when she was only going for \$23,000 I decided to buy her back."

Di's Delight has been a strong broodmare, with eight winners from nine to race including the stakes-placed Heat Dome. After Mirth, she produced the winning Jump Start filly Vault. Karp still owns Di's Delight and Vault.

"Now I'm in the process of figuring out who she goes to in 2020," Karp said of Di's Delight, noting she will be bred in Kentucky. "Colonel John is a Tiznow stallion, but he and other sons Tizway and Tiz Wonderful are all in Korea now. About the only Tiznow I can find is Tiznow himself, and he's getting older." Vault, meanwhile, won an allowance race at Penn National just three days before the Rodeo Drive. She is three for 11 lifetime.



Now Karp and the Little Red Feather partners have their eyes on the 2019 Breeders' Cup. "We can't wait to see Sistercharlie chasing us early," Koch said of the seven-time Grade 1 winner and defending champion, who is likely to go favored in the Filly and Mare Turf. "We are realists, we aren't going into it thinking that Mirth can do the same thing she did in the Rodeo Drive. That's not our expectation. But we

are going to enjoy the week, have a great time, and watch her run against some of the best in the world. And we've got Mike Smith again."

And there is always the scenario that Mirth can once again steal a major Grade 1. "That's the beauty of horse racing. There are no guarantees," Karp said. "You lead your horse over there, and take your chances." ■

Of the two stakes-winning brothers, Irene said, "Midtowncharlybrown did everything right from the beginning. He had a great way of going. When I started galloping him with other horses, he started showing me he could run. A child could ride him but in company, he's strictly business. Off the track, he's a pussycat.

"Midnightcharly was like a child," she said. "When he was working head-to-head against another horse, he'd slow down, he didn't have a clue in the beginning. He was a big goof. But he's learned."

Ed Coletti, who trains all of the Uptowncharlybrown Stud horses, said that, although Midtowncharlybrown and Midnightcharly are full brothers, "they are two totally different animals."

"Midtowncharlybrown, the oldest, is very easy to train," said Coletti. "There's been no issues with him since he's been here. He skips

over the ground and is very easy on himself, and he has no bad habits. He's all business when he trains and races. He carries his head higher than Midnightcharly, and he reminds me of his sire.

"Midnightcharly wants to play around a lot," Coletti continued. "He was a handful as a younger horse and we gelded him. He's kind of quirky and he likes to bow his head and buck and play. Midtowncharlybrown is a little smaller and stockier, while Midnightcharly is leaner, and has a longer stride. Both of them have great personalities – they're very friendly and always stick their heads out when they see people, because they both like attention. My daughter Amanda spoils them."

From his first foal crops, Uptowncharlybrown has far exceeded expectations. According to industry statistics, his average earnings index, or AEI, is 2.13, which ranks among the top stal-

lions in the country. He has average earnings per starter of \$84,485, with 68 percent starters from foals, 69 percent winners from starters, and a stakes performer in every crop. And the best is yet to come, as "Charly's" success at stud has attracted bigger and better books of mares.

"We love the Pennsylvania program, and we've got a great team, which includes Glenn and Becky Brok," said Hutt. Through Aug. 31, Midnightcharly is the second-leading Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association fund earner with \$194,290 (combined stakes, breeder, stallion and bonus awards), while Midtowncharlybrown is the fifth-leading fund earner with \$129,390.

Added Hutt: "I am very proud of Uptowncharlybrown and all of 'Charly's Angels,' as I call his sons and daughters. They are keeping the memory of Alan Seewald alive for me." ■

PA STALLIONS TOP REGION BY NUMBER OF MARES BRED IN 2019

Northview PA's first-year stallion Hoppertunity, and WynOak Farm's Warrior's Reward, new to Pennsylvania in 2019, each covered more than 100 mares to lead all stallions in the Mid-Atlantic region in 2019, according to The Jockey Club's Report of Mares Bred (RMB) statistics received through Oct. 16, 2019.

A total of 28 stallions standing in the state were reported to The Jockey Club thus far for 2019, and those stallions covered a total of 686 mares, for an average book of 24.5 mares bred. Although the number of stallions in the state dipped slightly (from 32 reported in 2018), the number of mares bred rose 12.5 percent, the highest jump of any of the top 10 states.

Multiple Grade 1 winner Hoppertunity, whose earnings of \$4.5 million make him the richest stallion to enter stud in the region, bred 129 mares his first season. He was one of 65 stallions in the nation to cover 125 or more mares. The son of Any Given Saturday stood for \$5,000.

Established sire Warrior's Reward covered 115 mares his first year in Pennsylvania. Standing for \$4,500, the son of Medaglia d'Oro entered the breeding season as the region's leading sire by North American earnings in 2018.

PIN OAK LANE TO STAND NORMANDY INVASION IN 2020



Dr. William J. Solomon has added Grade 1-placed, track record-setting miler Normandy Invasion to his Pin Oak Lane Farm roster in New Freedom. A 9-year-old son of leading sire Tapit, Normandy Invasion moves from Kentucky to stand the 2020 season for \$2,500 live foal, payable when the foal stands and nurses. His first crop runners are 2-year-olds this year.

"Normandy Invasion, by Tapit, sire of sires (Frosted, Tonalist, Constitution, Tapiture) has the physical appearance and the same pattern as other successful Grade 1 quality horses that I have selected (Havre de Grace, Songbird, Midnight Lute)," said noted bloodstock agent Tom McGreevy. "This is attested to by his second in the (Grade 1) Wood Memorial and fourth in the Kentucky Derby. He possessed both speed and stamina. His track record at a mile on dirt at Gulfstream in 1:33.13 will take an extremely talented horse to break."

Campaigned by Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farms, Normandy Invasion was a winner at 2 when breaking his maiden going a mile at Aqueduct by nine and a quarter lengths, and missed by a nose in his stakes debut, the nine-furlong Grade 2 Remsen, an effort which made the striking bay colt one to watch on the Triple Crown trail.

Sent off as favorite in his 3-year-old debut in Fair Grounds' Grade 2 Risen Star Stakes where he was beaten a length and a half by the winner, Normandy Invasion stepped up and ran a solid race in the Grade 1 Wood Memorial at Aqueduct, rallying behind Verrazano to finish three-quarters of a length back in second.

The Kentucky Derby was his next stop. He took the lead with a quarter-mile to go over the sloppy Churchill Downs oval and ran a game race to the wire, being caught late to finish fourth, missing third place by a head in the race won by Orb.

Normandy Invasion was sidelined by a foot abscess for the rest of his sophomore campaign, and reemerged nine months later in a one-mile allowance at Gulfstream Park. He turned in a sterling performance to win by a widening seven and three-quarter lengths in 1:33.13, a track record which still stands, off fractions of 1:08.66 for three-quarters, and 1:20.70 for seven furlongs.

Next out came a second in Fair Grounds' Grade 2 New Orleans Handicap behind classic winner and top handicap horse Palace Malice. The rest of the talented runner's career was hampered by extended absences, first caused by a lung infection and later a fractured sesamoid.

Normandy Invasion returned at 5 to finish second in the Carl Hanford Memorial Stakes at Delaware Park and retired after a dozen starts, with two wins and five seconds and earnings of \$551,900.

He entered stud in New York under the ownership of Spendthrift Farm, where he stood three seasons before moving to Kentucky for 2019. He has covered an average of more than 50 mares each year at stud.

Out of the Boston Harbor mare Boston Lady, Normandy Invasion is a half-brother to the dam of 2019 Oaklawn Handicap-G2 winner and millionaire Quip. ■

GRADE 1-WINNING FLASHBACK FILLY BREEDERS' CUP BOUND

The first stakes winner for Diamond B Farm sire Flashback is a Grade 1 winner.

Flashback's 2-year-old daughter British Idiom dazzled by six and a half lengths in Keeneland's Alcibiades Stakes on Oct. 4. Making only her second start – she broke her maiden by three and a half lengths at Saratoga on Aug. 15 – the Brad Cox trainee defeated 10 others for her first stakes win.

The filly owned by Michael Dubb, The Elkstone Group LLC (Stuart Grant), Madaket Stables LLC and Bethlehem Stables LLC heads in as one of the favorites for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies-G1, contested at the same mile and a sixteenth distance as the Alcibiades. Bred in Kentucky by Hargus Sexton, Sandra Sexton and Silver Fern Farm LLC, British Idiom is out of the Mr. Sekiguchi mare Rose and Shine and sold for \$40,000 as a yearling at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale. With her two wins, she has earnings of \$281,250.

With only two crops to race, Flashback is also the sire of Grade 1-placed filly Boujje Girl, who finished third in last year's Del Mar Debutante Stakes at Del Mar, Canadian graded-placed Tripwire, who was second in his stakes debut last year in Woodbine's Grey Stakes-G3, and Forever Changed, a stakes-placed earner of \$163,110.

The Mid-Atlantic region's current leading 2-year-old sire, Flashback ranked 12th in the nation on the freshman sires list

in 2018 and currently ranks 14th on the second-crop sire lists. He moved to Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville for the 2019 season after standing at Hill 'N' Dale Farm in Kentucky. His stud fee is \$3,500 live foal, with special consideration to mares foaling in the state.

A graded stakes-winning son of Tapit, Flashback is a full-brother to multiple Grade 1 winner Zazu (\$691,985, Las Virgenes S-G1, Lady's Secret S-G1, etc.), who is the dam of group placed Arusha. His half-brother, Corinthian's Jewel, was a stakes winner, and he's also a half-brother to group-placed runner and stakes producer Art Princess and to the dam of 2019 Australian Group 3 winner Hush Writer. Both Zazu and his dam Rhumb Line (by Mr. Greeley) were million-dollar broodmares, selling for \$2.1 million and \$2 million respectively.

Campaigned by Gary and Mary West, Flashback won the Grade 2 Robert B. Lewis Stakes and was second in the Grade 1 Santa Anita Derby (to Goldencents) and Grade 2 San Felipe in his first three stakes appearances, all at a mile or more over a three-month span in early 2013. In seven starts, he ran six times in stakes, also finishing second in the seven-furlong Damascus Stakes at Santa Anita and third in Churchill Downs' Ack Ack Handicap-G3 at one mile, and finished fourth in the Grade 1 Malibu Stakes to retire with earnings of \$405,730. ■

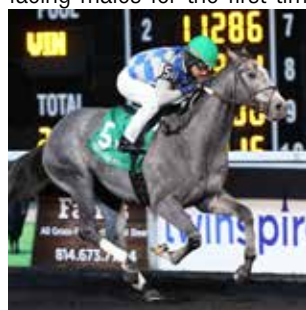
2019 PA-Bred Stakes Schedule

Sent off the 9-10 favorite while facing males for the first time, she put in a gallant effort in the McDermott, but couldn't handle Marie F. Trombetta's News-tome.



Trained by Mike Trombetta, Newstome had the lead by the time the eight-horse field reached the stretch and drew off under Antonio Gallardo to win by three lengths while getting six furlongs in a quick 1:09.68. Weed Wacker, undefeated in her two previous starts, both at Presque Isle, had grabbed the second spot after being boxed in around turn, but she veered out in stretch, bothering Live Wire, who would finish a length back in third. The stewards agreed with the rider of Live Wire

(Andrew Wolfson) that there was enough cause for a disqualification, and the second and third-place results were switched.

It was the second win in three starts for Newstome, who broke his maiden easily first out at Parx on Aug. 3, leading at every call to win by four and three-quarters lengths on the main track. The son of Goldencents made his turf debut at Colonial Downs in the Rosie's Stakes, set the pace, faded and wound up well back in seventh. Presque Isle's Tapeta was his third surface to race on, but he was familiar with it as he trains at Fair Hill. With the stakes victory, he now has earnings of \$105,000.

The gray/roan colt was bred by Equivine Farm (Val McNeely) and purchased by Mike Trombetta for \$30,000 out of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May sale at 2 after failing to reach his reserve as a yearling at Keeneland the previous September.

Newstome is the fourth foal out of the winning Unbridled's Song mare Newstouse, who was purchased by Equivine Farm for \$142,000 at the 2014 Keeneland November sale while carrying her second foal (a son of Shackleford). Newstouse produced fillies by Exaggerator and Declaration of War for Equivine Farm the past two years (both born in February) and she was bred back to Hoppertunity this year.
