PA Bred Fund fuels stallion numbers

Thanks in large part to confidence in the stability of its breeding program, Pennsylvania was one of only two states to show an increase in the number of mares bred in 2019, according to the annual Report of Mares Bred (RMB) statistics released by The Jockey Club in October.

Information provided to The Jockey Club through October 16 showed that 686 mares were bred to Pennsylvania stallions this year, an increase of 12.5 percent from 2018, when 610 mares were bred.

"This was a great year for number of mares bred in Pennsylvania," said Brian Sanfratello, executive secretary of the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association (PHBA). "In fact, when all is said and done, we should be up around 20 percent over 2018. That's the third straight year with significant increases. With the best breeding program in the country, it's not hard to figure out why."



Pennsylvania's robust 2019 results follow on the heels of a 15.1 percent boost in 2017, and an 8.3 percent jump in 2018.

Overall, The Jockey Club reported that the number of mares bred in North America decreased 3.5 percent. Kentucky, which traditionally leads in breeding activity, saw a 1.1

decrease, with its 220 reported stallions covering 17,123 mares, down from the 17,322 reported as bred in mid-October last year.

California, the second-leading state ranked by number of mares bred in 2019, showed the sharpest decline, dipping to 2,018 mares from 2,482 in 2018, an 18.7 percent slide. Other states/provinces with double-digit declines include Ontario (-13.2 percent), Louisiana (-12.5 percent) and Maryland (-10 percent).

Support for Pennsylvania stallions was especially strong this season. Multiple Grade 1 winner and multimillionaire Hoppertunity (left), who entered stud at Northview PA in Peach Bottom, had 129 mares in his initial book, while Warrior's Reward (above), who stood his first year in Pennsylvania at WynOaks Farm in Delta, bred 115 mares. Another young Northview PA stallion, Uncle Lino, serviced 76 mares, and Uptowncharlybrown, who stands at Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville, bred 73 mares.

"Three years ago, state Legislators and the Governor showed their support for Pennsylvania's breeding program by creating the Racehorse Development Fund Trust," said Greg Newell, president of the PHBA. "That single step sent a powerful message to breeders

across the country that Pennsylvania was the state to bring their mares.

“One change directly associated with the creation of this Trust was an increase in Pennsylvania-sired breeders’ awards,” he continued. “The creation of the Trust and increased Pennsylvania-sired bonuses has encouraged farms to bring in more high-profile stallions. There is a direct correlation between the better quality stallions and the increased numbers of mares bred.”

Echoing those thoughts was Bob Hutt, president of Uptowncharlybrown Stud LLC, which owns and stands Uptowncharlybrown. The stallion has enjoyed bigger books with each passing year due to his stakes-winning, profitable progeny, and he has been strongly supported by Hutt since the start of his stud career.

“Without question, Pennsylvania offers the best state-bred program in the nation; bar none,” said Hutt. “Most breeders aren’t even aware that Uptowncharlybrown Stud, our racing entity, has placed in the top one percent of all owners in the United States for the past three years. That tells you all you need to know, as we race almost exclusively in Pennsylvania. Pennsylvania breeding and racing is alive and well, and we expect it to continue to grow for many years to come. This is definitely the place you want to be.”

Hutt cited Uptowncharlybrown’s (pictured) impressive statistics that have lured mare owners to his court: average earnings per starter of \$87,868; average earnings per start of \$9,559, and an AEI/CI ratio of 2.12/0.75, which compares favorably with the top stallions in the country.

Longtime Pennsylvania owner and breeder Donnie Brown saw an opportunity last year to add an established son of Medaglia d’Oro to the state’s stallion roster, and so decided to stand Warrior’s Reward. With average earnings per starter of \$51,804, and two graded stakes winners (Warrior’s Club, \$856,504, and Axelrod \$750,925) he proved enormously popular, breeding 115 mares.

“The protection of the Breeding Fund money means everything, because it takes away the uncertainty of what might happen in the future,” said Brown. “As breeders know, it takes a few years to get a horse to the racetrack. It’s a big investment, and knowing the Breeding



Fund money will be there is so important. By the amount of inquiries I’ve had recently about Warrior’s Reward, I think he’s going to have another good year in 2020.”

Brown also cited the options available for Pennsylvania-breds once they begin their racing careers in the state.

“If you have a Pennsylvania-bred, we have three racetracks that offer dirt, turf and synthetic, and two of them run year-round,” he said. “We offer something for everybody.”

Paul O’Loughlin, bloodstock manager of Northview PA, said that the farm had an outstanding year due in large part to the renewed confidence in the breeding program.

“It’s all about the Breeding Fund,” said O’Loughlin. “The stability of the Fund, plus the excellent purses in the state, has really made a big impact. There was always concern expressed by breeders as to what was happening with the Breeding Fund money, and now they don’t have to be worried. A lot more people wanted to breed and foal in Pennsylvania this year.”

To date, Northview is the leading Breeding Fund program award recipient, with \$323,810 earned in stallion bonuses.

Even small breeders can now expect to have a good chance at making money with horses they sell or keep to race.

Vicky Schowe and Beatrice Patterson have found it extremely profitable to sell the progeny of their Forestry mare, Avani Force, at auction, and reap the ensuing breeder awards.

In 2017, they sold her yearling colt by Friesan Fire, named Call Paul, for \$20,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale, and, after being resold for \$210,000 as a 2-year-old in training at Fasig-Tipton’s May sale at Timonium, have watched as he’s gone on to capture five stakes, two of them graded, and \$566,670.

Last year, Avani Force’s filly Pink Caddy sold for \$40,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic yearling sale and has now won \$106,730, including the Small Wonder Stakes at Delaware Park.

The talent the pair has shown on the racetrack has earned Schowe and Patterson more than \$66,000 in breeder awards in 2018-2019.

“My personal opinion is that it’s a wonderful program, the best in the country,” said Schowe. “When you register a horse as a Pennsylvania-bred, you get the 40 percent purse bonus as an owner, and the breeder bonuses are amazing. I’ve spoken with people in other states and they were amazed at how good the program is. Beasie [Patterson] and I have been over the moon as to the breeder bonuses that both Call Paul and Pink Caddy have earned for us.”

PA sire Flashback has Breeders' Cup Champion

When Flashback arrived in Pennsylvania this time a year ago to stand at Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville, the son of one of the world's greatest sires, Tapit, was a top-15 freshman sire nationally, boasted a solid graded stakes record as a runner, and had a big second crop in the wings.

Now he's the sire of the top 2-year-old filly in the nation.

His daughter British Idiom followed a dazzling score in Keeneland's Grade 1 Alcibiades Stakes to take the biggest race in the nation for juvenile fillies, the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies-G1 at Santa Anita on Nov. 1.

In addition to displaying her talent, she proved her toughness, battling favorite Donna Veloce to the wire to win by a neck and virtually guarantee a championship

British Idiom remained undefeated in three starts for owners Michael Dubb, The Elkstone Group (Stuart Grant), Madaket Stables and Bethlehem Stables and boosted her earnings to \$1,381,250. Trained by Brad Cox, she broke her maiden by three and a half lengths at Saratoga Aug. 15 before making her stakes debut in the Alcibiades, which she won by six and a half lengths. She went off as second choice in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies.

Bred in Kentucky by Hargus Sexton, Sandra Sexton and Silver Fern Farm, British Idiom is out of the Mr. Sekiguchi mare Rose and Shine.

Flashback shot to the top of the Mid-Atlantic region's leading 2-year-old sires list for 2019, and moved to sixth on the general sires list with only two crops to race.

The 9-year-old gray stallion remains the property of Gary and Mary West, who campaigned him to win the Grade 2 Robert B. Lewis Stakes and saw him finish second in the Grade 1 Santa Anita Derby (to Goldencents) and Grade 2 San Felipe in his first three stakes appearances at 3, all at a mile or more over a three-month span. In seven starts, he ran six times in stakes, was also second in the 7-furlong Damascus at Santa Anita and third in Churchill Downs' Ack Ack Handicap-G3 at 1 mile, and finished fourth in the Grade 1 Malibu Stakes to retire with earnings of \$405,730.

Flashback is also the sire of Grade 1-placed filly Boujie Girl, Canadian graded-placed Tripwire, and Forever Changed, a stakes-placed earner of \$163,110. His stud fee for 2020 is \$3,500 live foal, with special consideration to mares foaling in Pennsylvania.

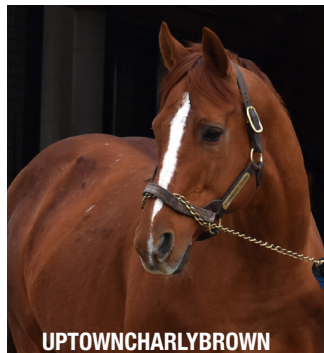
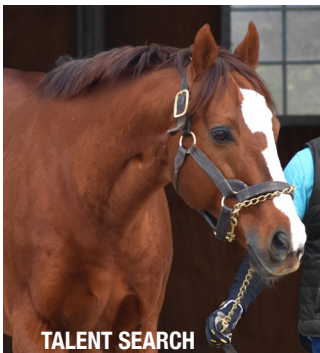

HARLAN'S HOLIDAY SON COMMAND POST JOINS WYNOAKS FARM ROSTER

Command Post, a 5-year-old son of sire of sires Harlan's Holiday out of a half-sister to leading sire Distorted Humor, has been retired and will stand his first season at WynOaks Farm in Delta. His fee is \$2,000 live foal, payable when the foal stands and nurses.

On the board in six of his seven starts while campaigning for Gary and Mary West, Command Post won three times – allowances at Monmouth and Gulfstream Park at distances from six furlongs to a mile and 70 yards – and was stakes-placed when third in Monmouth's Long Branch Stakes after being steadied repeatedly and in tight quarters during the running. He amassed \$104,110.

Command Post is from the final crop of Harlan's Holiday, whose sons at stud include the nation's 2019 leading sire Into Mischief, with more than \$17 million in progeny earnings and 20 stakes winners in 2019.



Out of the Lemon Drop Kid mare Danzig's Humor, Command Post is a half-brother to Venezuelan champion 2-year-old colt One Way, and Group 1-placed Venezuelan stakes winner Freely, and to the dam of \$220,835-earner and multiple stakes performer Angel At War.

His second dam, Grade 1-placed graded stakes winner Danzig's Beauty (by Danzig), produced six winners, topped by track record-setting multiple

graded stakes winner Distorted Humor, a son of Forty Niner who has sired 163 stakes winners to date and was North America's leading sire in 2011. Third dam Sweetest Chant was a seven-time stakes winner with graded wins in the Grade 2 Arlington Matron and Orchid Handicaps. The family includes Canadian champion Never Retreat, millionaire Seaside Retreat, multiple graded winner Cassaleria and graded winner Liam's Dream, a winner of four of five starts. ■

NORTHVIEW PA OPEN HOUSE: DEC. 15

Northview PA in Peach Bottom will be hosting an Open House on Sunday, Dec. 15 from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. The farm's five stallions will be available for inspection, including the busiest stallion of 2019, multiple Grade 1-winning multimillionaire Hoppertunity, who covered 129 mares his first season at stud.

Hoppertunity is richest horse to ever enter stud in the region after a career in which he counted 19 graded stakes wins or placings and more than \$4.7 million in earnings. He raced through age 7 and retired sound.

Two stallions on the roster have first runners coming to the races in 2020 – brilliant miler Peace and Justice, by classic sire War Front, and track record-setting stakes winner Uncle Lino, by champion and classic sire Uncle Mo.

Established sires Medallist and Bullsbay round out the roster. Light fare and refreshments will be available. ■

A Letter From the Executive Secretary



It's been another great year for the Pennsylvania Breeding Program and I look forward to 2020. Our number of mares bred is up for the third year in a row, this year by 12.5 percent. New stallions continue to arrive and we have the best breeding program in the nation. You're going to want to pick up a mare or two so you don't miss out on the new breeding season. If you purchase a mare in foal at a public auction after Dec. 1, she must be brought into the state within 14 days of purchase through foaling. During the foaling year the foal or its dam must spend at least 90 days in the state in order for that foal to be eligible to become a registered PA-Bred. You can also bring in your mare anytime, stay 60 consecutive days through foaling and breed back to a PA-Sire.

In 2020 we'll be adding two new benefits for PA-Sired PA-Breds. Starting in January Penn National will be adding two maiden claiming races to each condition book. One for the boys and one for the girls. We will also be adding a \$100,000 stakes race, the Jump Start, just for PA-Sired PA-Breds! There isn't a better time to breed to a PA stallion.

Our 10th annual Stallion Auction on thoroughbred.com will begin on Jan. 16 and end on Jan. 18 so you'll be able to bid on seasons from all over the country. You can go to our website, pabred.com, to view the available seasons.

SHAMROCK ROSE SELLS FOR \$2.5 MILLION TO TOP PA-BRED OFFERINGS AT KY FALL SALES

On a night of stars, one of the brightest to go through Fasig-Tipton Kentucky's The November Sale auction ring was 2018 Eclipse Award-winning female sprinter Shamrock Rose. Selling as a broodmare prospect, the Pennsylvania-bred 4-year-old filly was purchased for \$2.5 million by Mike Shannon, agent, from the consignment of Bluewater Sales, agent.

Shamrock Rose last started this past April and retired with five wins, all stakes, including the 2018 Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint-G1, for earnings of \$968,962. Bred by Florida-based couple Thomas and Lori Fackler's Best A Luck Farm, she was first offered at auction at the 2017 OBS April 2-year-olds in training sale by her breeders, and was purchased for \$120,000 by Conrad Farms, for whom the daughter of First Dude raced her entire career.

Shamrock Rose is a half-sister to four other winners out of the Exclusive Quality mare Slew's Quality, a half-sister to multiple group stakes winner Slew the Red. Her fourth dam, seven-time stakes winner Great Lady M, most famously produced Horse of the Year and Hall of Famer Lady's Secret. Other notable runners in the family are champions Believe (Jpn) and Mahbooba.

Six PA-Breds sold for six figures at the Fasig-Tipton sale. Next at \$450,000 was graded stakes winner Fahan Mura, a 5-year-old daughter of English Channel from the family of champion Sweet Catomine and Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic-G1 winner Life Is Sweet selling as racing or broodmare prospect to Paca Paca Farm. She was bred by Michael J. Moran.

Graded stakes winner Cosmic Burst brought a final bid of \$375,000. The 4-year-old Violence filly bred by Pewter Stable was purchased by Winstar Farm LLC.

Weanlings made up the other six-figure prices, with an Arrogate filly out of Mahkama, by Bernardini, bred by Blackstone Farm LLC, selling for \$300,000 to Parker Place Racing; a Candy Ride (Arg)—Randie's Legend, by Benchmark colt bred by HnR Nothhaft Horse Racing LLC going to AROC Racing for \$235,000; and a Blackstone Farm LLC-bred filly by Constitution out of Rutherford Rd, by First Samurai selling to Dailey Bloodstock LLC agent for \$135,000.

The highest-priced PA-bred sold at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock sale was the graded stakes winner Lucy N Ethel, who brought \$650,000 on a bid from Woodford Thoroughbreds.

The 6-year-old daughter of During, bred by Jetta Thoroughbred Corp and J.A.G. Racing Inc., was sold in foal to Quality Road on an early February cover.

A weanling son of Speightstown out of Tensas Cowgirl, by Cowboy Cal, bred by HnR Nothhaft Horseracing LLC, sold to de Meric Stables, agent for \$225,000.

His dam is a half-sister to Grade 1 winner Big World.

The final six-figure November sales was Giant's Causeway's 3-year-old daughter Giant Blossom, purchased by Michael Lischin and Bob Petersens Stable for \$100,000. Sold in foal to Frosted, Giant Blossom is out of Grade 1 winner Cotton Blossom, a half-sister to Vicarage, and was bred by Brushwood Stable.

One mare offered to made headlines by not selling was Grade 1 winner Dame Dorothy, who went home as a \$3.1 million RNA. Offered by Stone Farm, agent, the 8-year-old half-sister to multiple Grade 1 winner Mrs. Lindsay is in foal on a late cover to Uncle Mo. Her oldest foal, a current 2-year-old filly by Curlin named Spice Is Nice, is in training at Belmont Park but has yet to start. ■

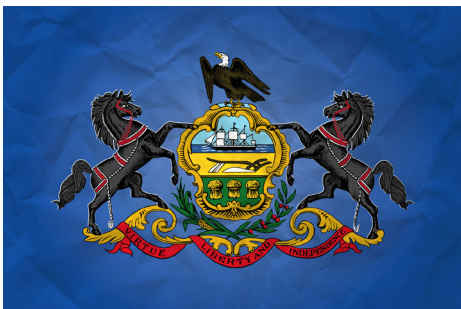

2019 PA-Bred Stakes Schedule



The final stakes of the year will be run on Dec. 7 at Parx Racing as 2-year-olds line up for the Pennsylvania Nursery. The last two winners of the Nursery, Prince Lucky and Call Paul, are both graded stakes winners in 2019.

Blue Mountain Juvenile Fillies Stakes

Greg Newell's homebred filly Precious is all that and more. The 2-year-old daughter of Fed Biz followed a 14-length maiden-breaking debut in October at Parx with a daylight score in the Blue Mountain Juvenile Fillies Stakes at Penn National on Nov. 27.

The John Servis-trained filly came into the stakes with solid works, including a bullet :47.92 half-mile, handily, over 43 others on Nov. 2 at Parx. She went off the 3-1 third choice in the Blue Mountain field of five, as favoritism fell to the Chad Brown-trained New York maiden special weight winner Autonomous. The favorite went right to the lead and set fractions of :22.40, :45.76 and :58.49 as Precious and Trevor McCarthy galloped along at the back of the field. Precious started to pick it up going into the far turn and burst away in the stretch, winning by three lengths and getting the six furlongs in 1:11.44, as Autonomous faded to third.

Precious is the third winner from four foals Newell has bred, in the name of Newell Thoroughbreds, out of the stakes-placed Smarty Jones mare Brilliant Sunshine, and is his first homebred stakes winner. Newell is the current PHBA president – you can read more about the breeder in the August Report.

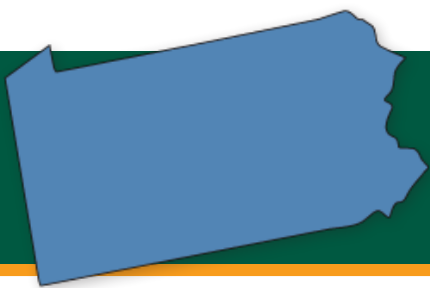
