Dollinger grows her role in the Thoroughbred industry

With most of the world quarantined at home, there is plenty of time for reminiscing. Certainly one of the most intriguing memories for horsemen is how each and every one of us became a member of the Thoroughbred industry.

Some have been members for generations, such as the Lymans of Maui Meadow Farm in West Chester, Pa. And then there are the newest members of the game – like 21-year-old Claudia Dollinger.

Although a newcomer to the Thoroughbred industry, she is a lifelong horsewoman. She began taking riding lessons at just 6 years old, was mucking stalls by 12 (in exchange for lessons) and was soon showing hunters with trainer Jody Vesty.

“Jody was the first person to introduce me to breeding,” noted Dollinger. “She bred a lot of Welsh/TB crosses and I was able to help start them when they were old enough.”

She proudly purchased her first pony in 2014 for \$500 and switched to a new discipline and trainer. It was a success: in training under Hugh Cann, Dollinger qualified for both the 2015 Devon Horse Show and Pony Finals in show jumping.

Connections in the show world helped her find a job in the equine industry. She had grown up riding alongside Logan Charlton, daughter of Vintage Thoroughbreds’ David Charlton. When it was time for Dollinger to officially enter the workforce, Charlton’s wife told her to come on out to their farm. She began working on the weekends and slowly added more weekdays until she was a full-time employee.

“The racing world is a lot different than the world I was used to. It was much more intimidating at first,” she admitted. “But I feel that the racing world is where I prefer to be. There are so many awesome people in the Thoroughbred world that have really helped me grow.”



The barn manager position became available in the spring of 2018 and Dollinger jumped at the opportunity. She was thrilled to gain even more experience with the group of horses – which included broodmares, yearlings and even racehorses undergoing rehabilitation.

“I was so lucky and excited to take the job because it was my dream to work with horses every day,” she said. “It was an incredible amount of responsibility and I am so thankful that David trusted me to take care of his horses.”

An even bigger opportunity arose when Charlton’s lease on the farm ended this past

December. Dollinger decided to take a big chance of her own going into the new year – she now leases the property herself while also working full time as a customer service representative and accountant. At first the workload was a challenge, but she says that she has started falling into a rhythm, especially with the help of her boyfriend Alex Cavan.

“He wasn’t into horses until he started dating me,” she said with a laugh. “He works at an auto body shop and helps with the horses on the side. He is slowly learning to ride but prefers to just cuddle the horses.”

Before Charlton left, he offered a special deal to Dollinger. One of his broodmares was in foal to Hoppertunity. Once the mare gave birth, the foal would belong to him but Dollinger would be the new owner of the mare Judiane's Jubilee (by Congaree and nicknamed "JJ"). That fateful day finally occurred on March 22, nearly a month after JJ's due date and causing Dollinger to lose plenty of sleep.

"Oh my gosh, delivering for the first time was amazing and terrifying at the same time," she said. "I went out to check on JJ around 8:00 in the morning and her water broke right as I walked up to her. It only took eight minutes before the foal came out. I immediately fell in love with the filly who I call Tallulah. It also gave me a huge appreciation for JJ. Now I can't wait to do it again next year!"

Next year she will hopefully bring her first three official homebreds into the world. Dollinger was gifted a second broodmare named Champagne Rhythm (by Eddington), who will be bred to Hoppertunity. Judiane's Jubilee will

also be bred back to Hoppertunity. A third mare, Magnawave, will be bred to a show jumping stallion named Carasca Z.

Longtime breeder Justine Howell gave Champagne Rhythm to her this year. The two met when Dollinger still had her first pony and Howell allowed her to use the indoor arena during the winter.

"[She] is a huge inspiration to me," Dollinger said. "She lives down the road from me and has a wonderful breeding facility. She has taught me a lot about getting into the breeding world and is always teaching me more."

Dollinger also credits Curtis Beale "Woodberry" Payne as a major role model. Payne owns Ingleside Training Center in Virginia, which is located on the historic grounds of Montpelier, the home of President James Madison.

"He was a hunter/jumper rider before being a race trainer and he does a wonderful job with the horses. He applies a lot of the basics from the hunter way of riding when he trains."

Despite making the big change into breeding and racing, she still rides when time permits. Her personal riding horse, a Hanoverian mare named Cassandra, is currently on lease with a friend. However, she already has a new project horse – a retired Thoroughbred named Messy Marie. She hopes to compete with the mare in this fall's Thoroughbred Makeover at the Kentucky Horse Park in both the show jumping and hunter/jumper divisions.

She may be new to the industry, but Dollinger is well aware of the current situation in Pennsylvania. Without even being asked about the political climate, she said that she very much hopes Governor Tom Wolf steers clear of his earlier plan to divert funding from the horse racing industry.

"It is incredible to think about how many people are involved and employed through the Thoroughbreds in Pennsylvania. From farriers to feed mills to breeders and trainers... It would crush a lot of my future plans and dreams with the industry." ■

Grants for Breeders

Dear Breeders,

The past few months have been a challenge to say the least. We have listened to many of your stories explaining your difficulties and have been trying to help with some relief. Thanks to the generosity of Chuck Zacney and Glenn Bennett, along with a contribution from the PHBA, we are happy to announce that we are offering grants to help alleviate some of the financial hardship you are experiencing.

The grants will be awarded as follows: \$250/horse, up to a maximum of \$1000 (four horses). We are asking breeders to submit a letter explaining your financial need along with any other information you feel is necessary, but you must meet the following criteria:

- Be a current 2020 PHBA Member
- Breeder must have bred and currently own a domiciled registered PA-Bred 3 years of age or older and submit proof of such
- PA-Bred or Non-PA-Bred Mares may qualify as long as they have foaled in PA in 2019 or 2020 and meet other listed criteria
- Horse Breeding is your primary business or you've just lost your primary source of income due to Covid-19

All information should be submitted and postmarked by June 15, and feel free to contact Brian Sanfratello with any questions.

I'm glad to say that the meeting with the Governor's staff on May 28 went very well. All we need is the okay from the State Health Department on our racing protocols and we'll be good to go. We should hear back by Friday, June 5. All PA tracks are ready to go and should be running very soon. A thank you goes out to all the members of our Coalition and all the lobbyists involved!

I've been asked whether there will be Breeder Awards and Owner Bonuses when racing begins. Regular breeder awards will be paid and the amount of the owner bonus will depend on the purse structure and the number of racing days at each individual track. We are currently working with the Horsemen to determine the percentages. The PHBA has a reserve but we need the casinos to be up and running as soon as possible as we do not receive any money from simulcasting.

Last week you received an email explaining the Breeders Grant program. A copy can be reviewed in this issue. If you need it, please take advantage of it and remember to submit your information and have it postmarked by June 15. A big shoutout goes to Chuck Zacney and Glenn Bennett for generously helping our breeders during this trying time.

As we get back to racing remember that the breeding season is coming to an end shortly, so don't miss your chance in 2020. Go PA!!!

NORTHVIEW STALLION STATION TO SELL PENNSYLVANIA DIVISION

Northview PA, the Pennsylvania property in Peach Bottom which houses four stallions, has been put up for sale, announced Northview Stallion Station management on May 11. Northview PA will continue to operate normally until the property is sold or, should it not sell by fall, until Nov. 30, at which time the resident stallions will be moved to the Maryland division.

One of the largest stallion operations on the East Coast, Northview Stallion Station made the decision to consolidate and focus on the Maryland division. In a letter to clients, Northview General Manager David Wade and Vice-President Michael Golden stated: "We have strived to offer Mid-Atlantic breeders some of the best stallions and service in the region. We thank you for your business, your trust, and especially for the

relationships we have developed over the years.

"As happens with most businesses, however, circumstances often change and Northview has made the difficult decision to consolidate our operation and focus on the Maryland division.

"This will have no effect on the remainder of the 2020 breeding season. While there is no guarantee that an individual or group will purchase the farm with the intention of carrying on our vision, we certainly hope that is the case."

It was noted the decision was not a result of recent issues. "This has not been a hastily made decision and is unrelated to the Pennsylvania political climate or Covid-19, as we know some will surmise. Pennsylvania has a strong racing and breeding industry that we are certain will continue to grow

and prosper, but it's not where Northview needs to be at this point."

PHBA Executive Secretary Brian Sanfratello released a statement: "I'd like to thank Richard Golden and his staff for providing Pennsylvania with premier stallions such as Jump Start, and for their tremendous service over the last eleven years. Northview has helped us rise to one of the best breeding states in the country. As mentioned in the press release, this will have no effect on the balance of the 2020 breeding season and it is also our hope that a buyer for the farm will carry on in their footsteps. The PHBA wishes them the best of luck in the future."

The Pennsylvania property is listed with Patterson-Price Real Estate, one of the largest agricultural real estate companies in the region. ■

JAKARTA FIRST PA-BRED STAKES WINNER DURING THE PANDEMIC

In two starts for Three Diamonds Farm, Jakarta has remained perfect, and now at age 5 is a stakes winner.

Purchased by Three Diamonds for \$35,000 out of the Joseph Besecker dispersal at last December's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Mixed sale, Jakarta had at the time four wins from nine starts and earnings of \$87,416, all at Penn National. Shipped to Florida to new trainer Mike Maker, the daughter of Bustin Stones made her debut for her new connections on March 18 at Gulfstream Park and scored by nearly three lengths going 5 furlongs in her first attempt on the turf.

She made her stakes debut in Gulfstream's \$75,000 Powder Break on May 16. It was the first time she was asked to go as far as a mile, and was back on the main track after the race came off the turf. Lead-

ing at every call, she turned back the likes of graded stakes winner Valedictorian to win by two and a quarter lengths at 11-1. She covered the distance in 1:36.37. The win was her sixth in 11 starts (with two seconds and a third) and increased her earnings to \$159,986.

Farm, Jakarta is the only foal for the winning Stormello mare T J's Stormy Wit. Arrowwood purchased the mare for \$2,500 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December sale with Jakarta in utero. She delivered the bay filly on Feb. 1, and turned violent, totally rejecting baby. "We tried for about a week to get her to allow her to nurse and it was just not going to happen," related Arrowwood farm manager Layne Shaffer of the ordeal. "[T J's Stormy Wit] was taken home by myself and resold as a riding horse — she really was a lovely mare but just clearly not into being a mom."

Jakarta was raised on a Pony of the Americas nurse mare and eventually joined the racing stable for her breeder. She made her first start last summer in a Penn National PA-Bred maiden special weight, led every step and aired by 10 lengths as the favorite.

Gate issues when refusing to load in her next three starts, all in allowance company, compromised her chances — a third-place finish would be her best showing. Dropped in for a \$16,000 tag for the first time in her career on Aug. 31, Jakarta behaved better, set the early fractions and finished second, and was claimed from Coulter by Besecker and trainer Brandon Kulp.

Jakarta won three of her next four starts, twice in allowance company, before the December sale. She hasn't finished worse than second in seven starts since her claim last August. ■

FIRST PA-BRED JUVENILE WINNER OF 2020 SCORES IN CALIFORNIA

Making his first start at Santa Anita on May 25, 2-year-old Pennsylvania-bred Hendavid sped away from the field while posting fractions of :22.48 and :46.95, and completed 4 1/2 furlongs in :53.64 with a three and a quarter-length win. Owned by Byerly Bloodstock LLC and trained by Luis Mendez, he earned \$30,000.

Hendavid sold for \$20,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale, well below the six-figure top prices for Blackstone Farm-bred yearlings sold last year. The dark bay colt by former WinStar Farm stallion Overanalyze is out of the Bluegrass Cat mare Alexandria Wa. Blackstone purchased Alexandria Wa as a maiden for \$30,000 at the 2015 Keeneland January

sale in foal to Overanalyze – the result of that mating is the placed runner Ink Splotz, who sold as a yearling for \$45,000.

Alexandria Wa is the dam of five foals bred by Blackstone, including the Oxbow filly Akna, a maiden special weight winner at Parx in February. The mare delivered a filly by Street Boss on April 4. ■
