# **Shooting for the Stars worked for Chapman**

The ride that Smarty Jones took Pat and Roy Chapman on in 2004 was unlike anything they had ever experienced. Since then, Pat has been trying to recapture that feeling, and has gotten close with her special broodmare, Shootforthestars.

Pennsylvania-bred poster boy Smarty Jones won eight of nine starts and earned \$7,613,155. His lone loss came in the Belmont Stakes-G1, where the plucky chestnut colt was attempting to win the Triple Crown. Just 18 months after Smarty Jones's run ended, Roy Chapman—fondly known as "Chappy"—passed away after a lengthy battle with emphysema. Pat Chapman believes that "Smarty's" considerable grit, brilliance, and resulting theatrics helped prolong the life of her ailing husband.

"He and I did everything together," Pat Chapman said. "That November after he passed, I was at the [2006] Keeneland sale hoping to buy some girlfriends for Smarty Jones."

With the help of Robert Clay, the owner of Three Chimneys Farm, where Smarty Jones stood at stud, and that of bloodstock guru Anne Peters, Chapman looked at dozens of mares. "I kept trying to buy one mare after another, and I kept getting outbid," she said. "We walked pounds off ourselves looking at all these mares, trying to take one home. Then we came across this mare, Shootforthestars. I loved her pedigree, and thought, 'The stars are aligning. I have to take her home.'"

Bidding quickly skyrocketed for a mare who hadn't ever raced. "I bid an obscene amount to buy her," Chapman said. "I told Robert Clay I couldn't go any higher, but he said to just go one more bid. And I got her." Shootforthestars hammered at \$450,000.

The price made sense based on female family alone: third dam Lotka was a Grade 1 winner who scored in eight stakes races and placed in four others. She produced nine winners from 11 to race, including four stakes horses. Lotka lived out her days at the Our Mims Retirement Haven in Kentucky, passing in 2013.

Her best daughter, Lotta Dancing, won the Grade 3 Affectionately at Aqueduct in 1996. She had been Grade 1-placed the year

prior, and retired with \$358,201 to her name. Her first son was Fantasticat, a Grade 2 winner in the United States who began his career in Ireland. All eight of Lotta Dancing's starters won.

Her very first foal was Shootforthestars. From one of the final crops of 1977 Triple Crown winner Seattle Slew, Shootforthestars never raced but her daughter by Giant's Causeway (named General Consensus, later dual Grade 2-placed in California) had sold as a yearling a few months earlier for \$400,000. The mare had foaled a Smarty Jones colt that March (future winner Keefer).

"I had determined that I wanted her," Chapman said. "And when they pointed at me and said, 'Sold!' I thought, 'Oh my God, Chappy, what have I done?' My husband would shoot me; he would never have let me spend that kind of money. But I just had this dream of combining Smarty Jones with a Seattle Slew mare. The dreams I had for this mare were about as out of line as the price I paid for her!"

Shootforthestars was in foal to Elusive Quality—Smarty Jones's sire—when Chapman brought her home. That resulting foal was My Elusive Star, who was a stakes-placed, four-time winner in Pennsylvania. From there she became essentially "married" to Smarty Jones, producing nine straight foals by the classy runner.

Grade 1 winner Centralinteligence came first. The wickedly quick colt was sold for \$90,000 as a yearling, and went on to win the Grade 1 Triple Bend Handicap at Hollywood Park. He was injured

### PA STALLIONS LEAD REGION BY GSW

Of the four stallions standing in the Mid-Atlantic region represented by a graded stakes winner in 2020, three stand in the Keystone State.

Recent arrival Wicked Strong is the latest to sire a winner in elite company when his 2-year-old son Brooklyn Strong (right) rallied for a game win in Aqueduct's time-honored Remsen Stakes-G2 on Dec. 5. The race was worth 10 points on the Kentucky Derby leaderboard, which places him sixth on the rankings. The New York-bred owned by Mark Schwartz and based with trainer Daniel Velazquez, who has a string at Parx, Brooklyn Strong has won three of his four starts, including the Sleepy Hollow Stakes at Belmont Park.



Earlier in the year Wicked Strong's 3-year-old son Wicked Runner scored in the Grade 3 Clasico George Washington Stakes in Puerto Rico. The son of Hard Spun with two crops to race stands at Pin Oak Lane Farm in New Freedom.

Warrior's Reward, the region's leading active sire of 2020 who stands at WynOaks Farm, Delta, is the sire of Prairie Meadows Cornhusker Handicap-G3 winner Night Ops, as well as Puerto Rican Grade 3 winner Exclusivo.

Poseidon's Warrior's multimillionaire son Firenze Fire has won three graded stakes in 2020, to push his career total to seven. Poseidon's Warrior's stands at Equistar Training and Breeding in Annville.

in the 2013 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile-G1, but went on to be retrained as a riding horse.

Winners Cash Finance, Champion Color, and Sky Wise came next, followed by a horse Chapman kept, Nasa. The bay colt was the closest Chapman got to replicating Smarty Jones: he won the 2014 Pennsylvania Nursery and ran second in one of the first Kentucky Derby preps of 2015, the Grade 3 Jerome Stakes.

"He looked like he might follow in his daddy's footsteps," Chapman said, "but he didn't quite have that talent." Nasa earned \$263,024 from 12 starts.

Kendricks and current 3-year-old Dreams Untold also became winners—the latter has won half his eight starts—to push the mare's record to 12 winners from 13 to race. Shootforthestars' offspring have earnings of nearly \$1.75 million. Unfortunately, Shootforthestars has been very difficult to both get and keep in foal; she either aborted or didn't catch in 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2019.

Shirley Lojeski, who keeps Shootforthestars at her Emmaus, Pa., farm, said, "There's added anticipation waiting to

see if she's in foal. Once she has a foal, I don't worry if it's going to be good, because she's had no bad foals. The thing is whether or not she's going to get in foal this year."

Shootforthestars has a juvenile filly in training named Sail Above, and produced another Smarty Jones daughter earlier this year. She did not catch for 2021 until July, and is due to have a very late foal next year. "This may be her last foal," Chapman said of her 22-year-old mare. "I am so thankful to Rodney Eckenrode at Equistar Training and Breeding, which is where Smarty stands now. Shootforthe-stars goes up there and spends quite a while trying to get in foal."

Lojeski added about the beloved mare, "She's friendly, and very nice that way. She's not a bossy mare with the other ones, she just blends in and stays out of trouble. You just have to hold your breath on whether she will get pregnant."

Chapman, 79, is anticipating the final few foals from Shootforthestars, and is busy keeping track of the 20 horses she still owns. "I sure don't feel my age," she said. "I think it's keeping up with these horses that keeps me feeling good."

# A Letter From the Executive Secretary





This has been a year full of very difficult times for all and I hope that we can get back to a semi-normal state sometime in 2021. With all that has happened, you have hung in and made it another great year for the Pennsylvania Breeding Program. Our number of mares bred is up for the fourth year in a row. New stallions continue to arrive and we have the best breeding program in the nation. Your help contacting Legislators was the reason the Race Horse Development Trust Fund remained untouched.

Remember, if you purchase a mare in foal at a public auction after Dec. 1, she must be brought into the state within 14 days of purchase through foaling (60 days if purchased at an overseas sale). During the foaling year the foal or its dam must spend at least 90 days in the state in order for that foal to be eligible to become a registered PA-Bred. You can also bring in your mare anytime, stay 60 consecutive days through foaling and breed back to a PA-Sire. You can find that PA-Sire in our new 2021 Stallion and Boarding Farm Directory. It is going out to all breeders before the end of December but you can view it now at pabred.com.

Our 11th annual Stallion Auction on <a href="mailto:thoroughlybred.com">thoroughlybred.com</a> will begin on Jan. 12 and end on Jan. 18 so you'll be able to bid on seasons from all over the country. Just go to our website to view the available seasons.

# PA-BRED HORSE OF THE YEAR MIRTH SELLS FOR \$1.05 MILLION

The value of Barlar-bred Mirth continued to rise when the 5-year-old mare, carrying her first foal, sold for \$1,050,000 at Fasig-Tipton's exclusive The November Sale the evening of Nov. 8 in Lexington, Ky.


Katsumi Yoshida was the winning bidder for the Grade 1 winner consigned through ELITE, Agent . The daughter of Colonel John was last bred in May and believed to be in foal to classic sire Constitution

Mirth launched her racing career for her breeder, Larry Karp, as a 2-year-old and took five tries to break her maiden. But after winning three straight into her 3-year-old season, she was purchased privately by California-based Little Red Feather Racing and was turned over to trainer Philip D'Amato.

It took more than seven months for Mirth to make her first

start for her new connections, but by the end of her 4-year-old season she had run 11 times, made her stakes debut that June and three months later won Santa Anita's Rodeo Drive Stakes-G1 at  $1\frac{1}{4}$  miles while leading at every call in 1:58.47. She concluded the year with a score in the Robert J. Frankel Stakes-G3, and had set the pace in the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf-G1 before giving way late to be beaten less than 6 lengths.

Mirth won or placed in seven of 11 starts in 2019, earned \$347,281, and was named PA-Bred Horse of the Year, champion older female and champion turf female. Out of the stakes-placed French Deputy mare Di's Delight, Mirth is a half-sister to stakes winner Vault and stakes-placed Heat Dome. The family includes Di's Delight's half-sister Copper State, a multiple stakes-winner and Grade 1-placed runner of \$486,141.



Two weanlings sold for six figures at The November Sale, a Practical Joke colt for \$110,000 and a Bolt d'Oro colt for \$105,000. Forgotten Land Investment Inc. bred the son of Practical Joke—Secret Quality, by Elusive Quality. Found in the colt's family is two-time Breeders' Cup winner Rushing Fall (who sold at the same sale for \$5.5 million). Cavalier Bloodstock made the purchase.

The Bolt d'Oro was bred by Blackstone Farm LLC out of the Roman Ruler mare Roman Bluff, and is a half-brother to stakes-placed Flying Frank and Easy Money. His dam is a half-sister to multiple graded stakes winner May Day Rose. He was bought by Blue Sky Stables. Both weanlings were sold through Taylor Made Sales Agency.

#### **Keeneland November Sale**

The top price of 30 PA-Breds sold at Keeneland's November Breeding Stock sale was the multiple stakes-winning 4-year-old filly Please Flatter Me, who attracted a final bid of \$200,000 from Win-Star Farm LLC when selling as a racing or broodmare prospect. The daughter of Munnings out of She's Flattering (by Flatter) was bred by Mary Katherine Haire, sold as a short yearling in January 2017 to Daniel Ryan for \$12,000, dominated in her first start at 2 for Smart Angle LLC, did the same next out in the Blue Mountain Juvenile Fillies Stakes, and next appeared under the colors of Madaket Stables LLC and Heider Family Stables LLC. She was undefeated at 2 after winning Laurel Park's Gin Talking Stakes, and was a stakes winner and graded stakes-placed at 3. She last ran in late August.

# ROWAYTON IS FIRST SON OF INTO MISCHIEF TO STAND IN REGION



### To Stand at Diamond B Farm in Pennsylvania

Glenn and Becky Brok have announced that Rowayton, a Grade 1-placed son of two-time leading sire Into Mischief, has been retired and will enter stud at their Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville in 2021.

A six-figure 2017 Saratoga sales yearling bred in Kentucky by H. Allen Poindexter, Rowayton won a maiden special weight in his 2-year-old debut at Del Mar and next out ran second to that year's eventual champion Game Winner in the Grade 1 Del Mar Futurity. He completed the year of three starts with a third in the Grade 1 American Pharoah Stakes.

A winner at 3, the bay finished third behind Code of Honor in Belmont's Grade 3 Dwyer and in his final start of the year was fourth in a rip-roaring finish in the Grade 1 H. Allen Jerkens at Saratoga, in four-horse photo with Mind Control, Hog Creek Hustle and Shancelot, where he finished a neck behind the winner Mind Control.

Campaigned by OXO Equine LLC, Rowayton retires with earnings of \$252,130 in nine starts.

Rowayton is out of the Indian Charlie mare Rosemonde, a half-sister to multiple Canadian champion Miss Mischief. Says Brok, "Rowayton displayed his brilliant speed winning at Belmont Park where he was only two-fifths over the track record, blazing six and a half furlongs in 1:14% when he was trained by Don Chatlos.

"His sire is enjoying incredible success and being from the family of champion Proud Spell, we feel like he will be a very important addition to the stallion ranks in the Mid-Atlantic region." Rowayton's family also includes Grade 1-winning juvenile and sire J P's Gusto, Mexican champion Letruska, a 2020 graded stakes winner in the U.S., and Grade 1 winner Imaginary Lady.

Rowayton enters stud for an introductory fee of \$5,000. The Broks will announce a breeding incentive plan for breeders to earn a lifetime breeding right in the near future.

# TIGHT TEN ENTERS STUD AT MOUNTAIN SPRINGS



Tight Ten, a precocious son of Tapit, enters stud in 2021 at the beautiful new Mountain Springs Farm in Palmyra.

A graded stakes-placed runner, he is bred on the same cross as leading second-crop and classic sire Constitution – both are by three-time leading sire Tapit and out of a Distorted Humor mare.

After easily breaking his maiden first time out at Churchill Downs in wire-to-wire fashion by more than four lengths, Tight Ten ran second, beaten a length, in the historic Saratoga Special-G2 behind Call Paul after leading in midstretch. In his third career start, the Winchell Thoroughbreds homebred led nearly the entire trip of the mile and a sixteenth Iroquois S-G3 at Churchill Downs, just getting caught in the final strides by Cairo Cat to finish second.

His final start at 2 came in the \$2-million Breeders' Cup Juvenile-G1, where he hit the inner rail shortly after the start and emerged with a torn hind end ligament. He returned to the winner's circle at 4 and retired with earnings of \$132,369.

Standing 16.1 hands with outstanding athletic conformation, Tight Ten is offered for an introductory fee of \$2,500 live foal. Additional mares can be bred for \$2,000 each.

A lifetime breeding right will be awarded to breeders after booking four mares.

Tight Ten is out of the winning mare Devils Humor; his second dam is multiple Grade 1 winner Fleet Renee (by Seattle Slew). Third dam is multiple graded winner Darien Miss.

Tight Ten is nominated for the Breeders' Cup and is eligible for the Pennsylvania-bred program. He takes up residence at the new 200-acre Mountain Springs Farm. With facilities rivaling any in the state, the experienced horsemen at Mountain Springs Farm provide excellent mare and foal care at affordable rates.

# PEACE AND JUSTICE TO STAND AT BLACKSTONE FARM

Peace and Justice, a three-time winning miler and the fastest son of top international stallion and emerging sire of sires, War Front, standing in Pennsylvania, will relocate to Blackstone Farm in Pine Grove for the 2021 breeding season.

Peace and Justice is represented by first-crop 2-year-olds this year. His top runners include Like a Saltshaker, winner of the Fitz Dixon Jr. Memorial Juvenile Stakes and runner-up in Belmont Park's Awad Stakes at Belmont.

In the sales ring, a juvenile filly by Peace and Justice sold for \$70,000 at the OBS sale held in June, a multiple equaling 20 times his stud fee.

On the racetrack, Peace and Justice ran three 95+ Beyer Speed Figures, including a Santa Anita allowance contest in dominant fashion by 51/4 lengths. Throughout his career, Peace and Justice defeated multiple graded stakes winners, including Grade 1


winner Drill. He earned "TDN Rising Star" status and ran three-fifths seconds off Horse of the Year Wise Dan's course record at Santa Anita with a wire-to-wire mile victory in 1:32.36 (:22.47, :44.55, 1:08.05, 1:20.20) and just shy of the record set by Tourist in the Breeders' Cup Mile-G1.

Out of the winning Smart Strike mare Strike the Sky, Peace and Justice is a half-brother to Grade 2 winner Hudson Steele. He is also half-brother to Lauren Byrd, the dam of graded stakes winner Hakam and Grade 1-placed dirt runner My Man Sam.

This family also includes champion What A Treat and legendary foundation Coolmore sire Be My Guest.

Peace and Justice will stand for \$3,500 live foal, stands and nurses at Blackstone Farm.

## 2020 PA-Bred Stakes Recaps



The 2020 stakes schedule winds down with PA-Bred stakes for 2-year-olds at Penn National and Parx Racing.

#### **Shamrock Rose Stakes**

Juvenile fillies faced the Penn National starter the evening of Nov. 6 in the newly named Shamrock Rose Stakes for their chance to earn black-type. Favorite Plane Drunk could not be caught as she led the field through fractions of :21.83, :45.05 and :57.48 and cruised home a 3 1/4-length winner in 1:10.62 for the six furlongs.

Triple Threat Stables' homebred filly earned her first stakes win, and improved her record to two wins and a second in four starts to push her earnings to just shy of \$100,000.

Plane Drunk, a daughter of Stay Thirsty—Annette's Jet, by Golden Missile, displayed her budding talent in her second career start in September, when she shot away to win by 11 3/4 lengths at Parx going five and a half furlongs. Her first stakes attempt was against nine other fillies over a sloppy Delaware Park track less than three weeks later. She couldn't catch winner Street Lute (now a three-time stakes winner), but dug in to get the place spot.


