BROODMARE KATARICA DISCO IS A PERFECT 10

A perfect winning record for one amazing broodmare.

Bo Derek may have been known as a "perfect 10" when starring in the 1979 film 10, but as a broodmare Katarica Disco has 10 winners from 10 starters, and that's more impressive. Among her offspring are three stakes winners and two stakes placed runners, and daughters boasting enough pedigree to be tremendously valuable mares themselves.

Katarica Disco, a 2004 daughter of Disco Rico and the Caveat mare Legal Kat, is the pride of St. Omer's Farm. Susan

Quick's Maryland operation only hosts a few broodmares now, but among them are Katarica Disco and millionaire Silmaril, who is related through the foundation mare Kattegat's Pride.

Quick and her husband Stephen bought their first mare in 1977, and that was Pilgrim's Pride. Just two years later, Kattegat's Pride was born; the daughter of North Sea would have an outstanding career with 19 wins, nine seconds, and three thirds in 54 starts for earnings of \$511,812. Amongst her victories were the Grade 3 Gallorette Handicap at Pimlico in 1984, and she raced from Maryland all the way to California.

When Kattegat's Pride retired, she kicked off the family tradition of being fabulous producers: she had three winners from three to race.

The only filly of the three was Kattebuck, a gray daughter of Spend a Buck who won once in 16 tries. But she would have seven winners from eight to start, including Silmaril (five for seven to date as a broodmare, including multiple stakes winner Beren) and Legal Kat (eight for eight winners from starters), who in turn became the dam of Katarica Disco.

"She was born here," Susan Quick said. "Her association with us goes all the way back to 1979. A friend was standing a stallion named Disco Rico, which is how we ended up using him." Popular Disco Rico won nine of 17 starts for earnings of \$532,244, and was a seven-time stakes winner including a pair of Grade 3 events.

On the track, Katarcia Disco started only three times, winning twice. She broke her maiden at first asking at Laurel Park, scoring by 13 ¼ lengths at 66-1 odds, then won an allowance race before finishing off the board in the 2007 Maryland Million Oaks. Just like that, her career was over.

Barbara Wheeler of WynOaks Farm, who is married to the Quicks' son Chip, said, "The mare came off the track and my father in law was going to bring her to WynOaks to

start her here. Susan was always giving him a heck of a time about bringing home more racehorses."

WynOaks Farm is the breeder of Katarica Disco's first foal, a Crypto Star filly named Cryptic Kate. She won three times, earning \$95,714 for Lynda Furlong, who purhcased her as a yearling for a mere \$1,500.

Pink Princess came next, and earned a whopping \$572,135 the hard way. The Weigelia mare never took a stakes trophy home, but did place in the 2018 Power By Far Stakes at Parx. The hard-knocking mare ran 66 times with 42 top three efforts, mostly battling in the claiming and allowance ranks. She has since been retired and has produced one foal to date.

"My father in law took her (Katarica Disco) back the next year, and we were going to go back and forth," Wheeler said. "My mother in law owns her outright now, and she's living high on how well the mare has done."

Fat Kat was bred as a partnership between WynOaks and St. Omers Farm. The 2011 edition of the Weigelia – Katarica Disco cross won nine of 29 races including a stakes. She was also a \$1,500 yearling that was pinhooked as a \$50,000 juvenile, and earned \$423,318.

Mischief Music, Katarica Disco's 2012 filly, was lightly raced compared to her siblings, but did win twice and has since become a producer herself, with her first starter — Count the Shells – finding the winner's circle. Mischief Music still calls St. Omers Farm home.

Grade 2-placed Disco Rose was born in 2013. She was another classy and consistent sort, running second or third in four stakes races while earning \$449,280. She was purchased by LC Racing for \$25,000; LC Racing would go on to purchase several of her siblings.

Another durable campaigner out of Katarica Disco is Smooth B, who was born in 2015. In 39 starts he has earned \$528,288, winning the Danzig Stakes at Penn National and

placing in six other black type races. Smooth B is about to embark on his sixth season at the track.

One Fat Kat, Disco Deja Vu, and Fore Harp followed, each picking up at least two wins apiece. Disco Ebo, born in 2019, became Katarica Disco's third stakes winner when the Weigelia daughter took the \$200,000 Shamrock Rose at Penn National last year.

Katarica Disco's 10 winners have earned more than \$2.5 million on the racetrack. "She's a nice mare, and you would never know she's 18," Quick said. "She looks like she's about four. That family ages well, Silmaril also acts like she's about two!"

Quick noted that Katarica Disco is, "a really pretty mare, big and dark," and added that her yearling Weigelia colt, who will be sold later this year, is a knockout. "He's a big, good looking dude," she said.

Kattegat's Pride is buried in the front yard of St. Omer's Farm, but through Katarica Disco, her legacy flourishes. Katarica Disco is not currently in foal, but is expected to head back to Pennsylvania stallion Weigelia for 2023. Weigelia stands at WynOaks Farm.

Few broodmares can boast that all 10 of their starters have won, but Katarica Disco is in a class of her own. Perhaps they should make a movie about her success?

MILLIONAIRE ROW:

REAL SOLUTION: THE TEN FURLONG SPECIALIST

The Ramsey Farm of Ken and Sarah Ramsey has quickly become a staple in American thoroughbred racing. The white and red silks have become a frequent sight at racetracks across the United States for the past quarter-century. Since purchasing land in Nicholasville, Kentucky in 1994, the Ramseys have gone on to become the all-time leading owners at Churchill Downs and Keeneland, four-time champion owners, and two-time champion breeders.

For all of the accolades they've since received, it all started with one horse. Sarah Ramsey purchased her first thoroughbred at the 1993 Ocala March Two-Year-Old Sale, offering up \$41,000 for a filly by French Group 1 winner Lear Fan. With Ken's nickname for his wife being "Kitten", Sarah's first thoroughbred was appropriately named Kitten's First.

Kitten's First won on debut against males at Belmont Park before stepping up into stakes company in the Junior Champion at Monmouth. Sent off the favorite, she struck the gate at the start and fractured a hip. In the blink of an eye, Kitten's First's racing career was over. The following year, the Ramseys purchased historic Almahurst Farm and began their breeding operation with Kitten's First.

To say Kitten's First was the foundation of a racing empire was an understatement. While she produced a handful of nice horses, her fourth foal was where she made her mark. In 2001, she foaled a chestnut colt with a white blaze by El Prado. He was named Kitten's Joy.

After twice racing on dirt, Kitten's Joy was switched to grass. Over the final twelve starts of his career, he won nine times and finished second on the other three occasions. As a three-year-old, he notched six graded stakes, two of which were Grade 1, before falling short to longshot Better Talk Now in the Breeders' Cup Turf. His accomplishments were still enough for him to be chosen as 2004 Champion Male Turf Horse. No three-year-old has won the award since.

Ken Ramsey began shopping for a stud deal for his champion, but he was quickly confronted with the realities of the American racing industry. In the dirt-dominated, speed-oriented world of North American racing, Kitten's Joy, a long-winded turf horse, was far from conventional. So Mr. Ramsey took it upon himself and stood Kitten's Joy for stud at Ramsey Farm.

Kitten's First developed laminitis and soon foundered, and she was euthanized at fifteen-years-old in the same year Kitten's Joy entered stud. The Ramseys began buying broodmares en masse to support their newest stallion. Taking the advice of fellow owner-breeder Brereton Jones, the Ramseys stamped their stallion's offspring by incorporating "Kitten" into their names as often as they could. And in an industry where Kitten's Joy was set up to fail, he did the exact opposite.

From their one foundation broodmare and her one son, the Ramsey's racing and breeding empire was complete. Kitten's Joy proved all doubters wrong by becoming a two-time champion sire in the United States. He's led the turf sire list on six occasions (and counting), and to date has produced fourteen G1 winners, thirteen millionaires, and four champions.

With a broodmare band over 100 strong, the Ramseys sent small groups of mares to foal out in regional markets. Diamond B Farm in Mohrsville, Pennsylvania was one of them. In 2008, the Pulpit broodmare Reachfortheheavens was sent to Diamond B to foal out her first baby, and the colt by Kitten's Joy arrived in the world on January 17, 2009.

In a rare exception, the colt was named without the traditional "Kitten" moniker and was christened Real Solution. The Ramseys decided to campaign Real Solution in Europe, although not in the country most people would expect.

On November 8, 2011, Real Solution debuted at Capannelle Racecourse in Rome, Italy, drawing away to an easy 2 ¼ length score. Under the care of trainer Gianluca Bietolini, Real Solution returned at age three to win a conditions race by seven lengths. With the Italian Derby in mind, the colt made his stakes debut in the Premio Botticelli, winning the 10.5 furlong event by five comfortable lengths. Real Solution was assumed to be a lock in the Group 2 Italian Derby and was sent off at odds of 2-5, but his unbeaten streak came to an end when he struggled to close in over the soft turf.

After finishing second in another conditions race in Italy, the decision was made to return Real Solution to the United States for his four-year-old campaign. He was transferred to top trainer Chad Brown and made his American debut in May of 2013, finishing a closely beaten fourth in the G3 Fort Marcy.

Making his Grade 1 debut next out in the Manhattan Handicap, Real Solution finished third while beaten only 1 ¾ lengths by five-time G1 winner Point of Entry. The promising performance warranted another shot at the highest level, and Real Solution shipped west to Chicago for the G1 Arlington Million. Known for attracting international participants, the 2013 Arlington Million attracted a field of thirteen, including six horses from overseas. The South African-bred The Apache was adding another continent to his globetrotting season, having already run in Dubai and England for his first year outside of South Africa.

The Apache and Real Solution broke from the gate as the fourth and fifth betting choices in the field of thirteen, and both of them settled around midpack. The Apache got first run, bulling his way towards the front of the pack to put himself within contention as the field approached the top of the stretch. Real Solution was sitting three lengths behind while looking for running room, and he exploded at the first chance for clear sailing. The Apache had taken the lead from defending champion Little Mike at the 3/16th pole, but he barely had time to open up daylight before Real Solution catapulted alongside. Just as it appeared Real Solution would fly past his rival, The Apache miraculously managed to keep his head in front for the final half furlong before crossing the wire with the advantage.

As the horses began galloping back, an objection lit up the toteboard. Alan Garcia aboard Real Solution had lodged a claim of foul against The Apache. The head-on view told the story. While initially starting down on the rail, The Apache began to drift out badly, bumping with Real Solution once, twice, three times all the while carrying him out towards the center of the racetrack. Five minutes later, the verdict was in. The Apache was disqualified, and Real Solution was made the official winner of the Arlington Million.



Real Solution followed up his first Grade 1 success with a third place effort in the G1 Joe Hirsch Turf Classic, beaten a length by Little Mike and stablemate Big Blue Kitten. He took a crack at that year's Breeders' Cup Turf but failed to make an impression, finishing five lengths behind Magician.

Returning at age five, Real Solution opened his year with a fourth place finish in G2 company. He stepped back up to the G1 level in the Man o' War at Belmont Park, closing from last place but failing to catch the frontrunning Imagining by ¾ of a length. Real Solution next tackled the Grade 1 Manhattan Stakes, a race run at the same 10 furlong distance as the Arlington Million.

The 5-1 fourth choice in the field of ten, Real Solution took up his usual midpack position as frontrunning Five Iron opened up a massive lead. As the rest of the field began to shave away at Five Iron's lead, Real Solution sat poised in fourth place while widest of all. He had dead aim on his foes as they banked into the stretch, grinding his way past Five Iron, Kaigun, and Seek Again to inch 1 ½ lengths clear at the wire and notch his second victory in a million dollar G1 event.

The Manhattan would end up being the final victory of Real Solution's career. After failing to defend his title in the Arlington Million, he was retired following a poor effort in the Joe Hirsch Turf Classic on September 27, 2014. From his four years on the track, Real Solution ran fifteen times with five wins, two seconds, and two thirds for lifetime earnings of \$1,374,175. He won three stakes races, including two Grade 1's worth \$1 million apiece, and placed in three others. He was named PA-bred Champion Older Male and Champion Turf Horse in 2014.

Real Solution was initially retired to stand alongside his sire at Ramsey Farm in 2015. The Ramseys began to consolidate their stock the following year, and Real Solution was moved to Calumet Farm. After a two-year lease at Blue Star Racing in Louisiana, Real Solution returned to Calumet Farm in 2020 and is standing for a 2022 stud fee of \$5,000. His top progeny to date include two-time Canadian stakes winner Sister Peacock, stakes winners Ramsey Solution and Catch a Bid, and the stakes-placed Speedy Solution and Queens Embrace.

Just One Time certainly did not disappoint in her first start outside of Pennsylvania. In what was also her first start in graded stakes company, the four-year-old daughter of Not This Time charged to a hard-fought, come-from-behind victory in the Grade 2 Inside Information Stakes at Gulfstream Park.

While previously trained by Michael Salvaggio, Just One Time was transferred to the barn of leading trainer Brad Cox in November. Out of the Speightstown broodmare Ida Clark, and bred by Donald Brown's Warrior's Reward LLC, Just One Time went four-for-five in 2021, picking up stakes victories in the Malvern Rose Stakes at Presque Isle and New Start Stakes at Penn National when facing Pennsylvania-bred company.

Going off the 3-2 favorite in the field of ten, Just One Time and jockey Joel Rosario settled well back in seventh in the early going as fellow Pennsylvania-bred Jakarta helped carve out the early fractions up front. In tandem with the second betting choice Four Graces, Just One Time

and her rival launched bids around the far turn at the same time. While Four Graces was able to dive towards a hole along the inside, Just One Time was forced to go widest of all turning into the stretch. With Jakarta clearing to a lead in the stretch, both Just One Time and Four Graces rallied up on her outside. Passing a tiring Jakarta, Just One Time had just a little bit more to outfinish her rival and cross the wire ¾ of a length ahead of Four Graces. 2 ½ lengths further back, Jakarta held on for third.

The Grade 2 victory was the fifth in six starts for Just One Time, whose career earnings now stand at over \$289,000. Owned in partnership by Warrior's Reward LLC and Commonwealth New Era Racing, the filly stopped the clock in 1:23.81 for seven furlongs.

Pennsylvania Nursery winner Witty started off 2022 the same way he ended 2021. In his first start since his 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ length Nursery romp, Witty's three-year-old debut looked much the same as he soared to an ever-growing 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ length score in Laurel Park's Spectacular Bid Stakes.

The 6-1 third choice in the field of eight sophomores, Witty settled in the clear just behind frontrunning favorite H P Moon down the Laurel Park backstretch. After his rivals ticked off opening quarters in 23.00 and 46.82, Witty began to cruise up to the frontrunners while four wide around the far turn. With H P Moon under pressure from 12-1 shot Coastal Mission, Witty and regular rider Carol Cedeno breezed past and spurted to a four-length lead entering the stretch. Coastal Mission kept on into second as Witty continued to pull away under mild urging before crossing the wire 7 3/4 lengths

in front, ears up. It was his first victory in open company. The final time was 1:25.38 for seven furlongs.

In taking down the \$100,000 stakes, Witty's career earnings reached \$204,000 with a tally of three victories in four starts. Sired by Maryland stallion Great Notion, Witty is owned and bred by Elizabeth Merryman, and a half-brother to graded stakes winner Caravel. Trained by Merryman's son, McLane Hendriks, the victory was only the third in nine starts for the fledgling trainer.

Could we see Witty on the Kentucky Derby trail next?




