JUST ONE TIME WINNING BIG FOR BREEDER

Warriors Reward LLC Gets First Grade 1 Winner

When the hammer fell for Hip 1376 at the 2017 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, few expected the baby in utero would end up being a Grade 1 winner, let alone just a stone's throw from the auction ring.

Chad Schumer signed the \$45,000 ticket on behalf of Donny Brown and Tom McClay's Warriors Reward partnership. The 7-year-old mare, named Ida Clark, was a daughter of Speightstown who was carrying her third foal following an uninspiring racing career that saw her win two of 10 starts for \$25,000 in earnings.

Despite her less-than-flattering race record, her pedigree offered promise as the half-sibling to two stakes winners, including Grade 3 winner and black-type producer For Rubies. And despite not meeting her reserve on her first trip through the ring when in foal for the first time, two of her earlier foals sold for \$55,000 and \$65,000 respectively.

Ida Clark was in foal to first-year stallion Not This Time, a promising son of Giant's Causeway whose racing career was cut short by injury. After breaking his maiden on second asking by 10 lengths, Not This Time demolished the Grade 3 Iroquois field at Churchill Downs by nine. He would end up going off the clear-cut favorite in the Grade 1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile, but his rally ultimately fell a neck short of eventual juvenile champion Classic Empire. It would be his final career race, as a suspensory injury later that month ended his racing career.

Out of the five-time stakes winning mare Miss Macy Sue, Not This Time's pedigree earned him a spot at a central Kentucky stud farm. The fourth foal for his dam, he was already a half-brother to stakes-winning filly Taylor S, as well as Breeders'



Cup Dirt Mile-G1 and Woodward-G1 winner Liam's Map. Not This Time's stud career commenced at Taylor Made Farm, and Ida Clark was one of his first customers.

Shipped north to Pennsylvania, Ida Clark settled into her new home. In late January, her first foal, Black Stetson, broke his maiden at Parx Racing. Two months later, Ida Clark delivered a leggy chestnut filly with a crooked blaze down her face on Easter, April 1, 2018. Two weeks following the birth of his newest sister, Black Stetson posted an 18-1 upset in the Bridgetown Stakes at Aqueduct.

Now the dam of a stakes winner, Ida Clark was subsequently bred back to Kentucky stallion Outwork and entered in the following year's Keeneland January Sale, where she sold for \$60,000. Off to New York, the Not This Time filly would be her lone Pennsylvania-bred for Warriors Reward.

After growing into herself in Pennsylvania, the filly was sent south to Virginia to receive Virginia certification. That May, she was officially named Just One Time. She was broken and went through her first lessons, posting the first few breezes of her career in September of her 2-year-old year at the Ingleside training center in Charlottesville, Va.

The following month, she was shipped back to the Keystone State and into the Penn National barn of trainer Michael Salvaggio Jr. The filly breezed consistently for the next six months before finally showing up in the entry box for the May 14, 2021, card at Penn National.

Already nearly midway through her 3-year-old year, Just One Time was one of only two first-time starters in the field of 10. Despite that, she was a close second choice in the wagering. Fractious in the gate, Just One Time still managed to break sharply to contend for the early lead with Made to Hustle. Following pressured fractions of :22.11 and :45.63, Just One Time secured the lead turning into the stretch. She turned away a bid from Amen Sylvia before pulling away to a comfortable 1¾-length score in a final time of 1:11.45 for 6 furlongs.

The performance was enough to warrant a jump straight into stakes company for her next start. With the Malvern Rose Stakes for sophomore Pennsylvania-bred fillies two months later, Just One Time continued to train forwardly at Penn National before shipping into Presque Isle for the stakes affair. With a field of seven lined up for the 6½-furlong contest, Just One Time ended up the second choice behind Kentucky shipper Rookery. Settling just behind early leaders Tactical Pajamas and Jenna's Lil Agnes through splits of :22.71 and :45.91, Just One Time moved in to take advantage turning into the stretch before blasting away to a 4¼-length victory over the all-weather surface. She posted a final time of 1:17.42.

Returning to Presque Isle the following month for the Lady Erie Stakes against open company, Just One Time was installed second choice behind Kentucky invader Bullseye Beauty. Blasting from the gate, the filly went toe-to-toe with 12-1 longshot Lady Edith on the early lead. With jockey Angel Rodriguez struggling to restrain his mount, the pair ripped through the opening quarters in the ultra-swift times :21.60 and :43.96. While the duo still turned into the stretch together, the pack was closing in, and Just One Time gave way late as Bullseye Beauty swept to the front. Just One Time ended up fading to seventh in the field of 10.

Regrouping from her first loss that displayed some of the filly's inexperience, Just One Time returned in a Penn National allowance the following month. With the field scratched down to four, the filly sat a length off the early leader in the opening stages before taking command through splits of :21.92 and :45.27. She drew away down the stretch under a hand ride, posting a 6¼-length victory in a swift 1:09.28 for 6 furlongs.

With the New Start Stakes one month later at Penn National, Just One Time returned to Pennsylvania-bred company for the 6-furlong event. With the field scratched down to seven, the daughter of Not This Time ended up the 7-5 co-favorite with impressive Parx shipper Oxana. Pressing the quick opening pace set by Secret Banker, Just One Time took over rounding into the turn and bounded away to a 3-length lead by the top of the stretch.

She continued to pull away, crossing the wire 5¾ lengths ahead of Oxana in 1:10.07.

The performance turned heads, including that of Todd Mosteller, executive director of the Pennsylvania Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association. Mosteller owned racehorses through his Commonwealth New Era Racing for 15 years, including on the national stage with Taris. Mosteller purchased the filly for \$90,000 as a yearling in 2012. Taris broke her maiden by 12 lengths at Aqueduct before winning the Wide Country Stakes at Laurel in her second start. After failing as the favorite in the Grade 3 Honeybee and missing six months, Taris returned an 8-length winner in a Presque Isle allowance. She subsequently blew the doors off in the Grade 2 Raven Run Stakes at Keeneland, annihilating the field by 9 lengths in a track record time of 1:21.32 for 7 furlongs. At the following month's Fasig-Tipton November Sale, she hammered for \$2.35 million to trainer Simon Callaghan on behalf of Coolmore.

Mosteller reached out to Donny Brown about buying into Just One Time, and the pair struck a deal, but her new owner believed the filly good enough for the national stage. He recommended that they transfer Just One Time to the barn of two-time champion trainer Brad Cox. The barn change was completed, and the filly posted her first workout for her new trainer at Churchill Downs three weeks following her romp in the New Start.

With plenty of gate schooling and work put into the filly over the next four months,

she was finally ready to debut for her new connections in the Grade 2 Inside Information Stakes. The 7-furlong contest for older fillies and mares was the first start in graded company for Just One Time, but the betting public was not deterred when making her the decisive 3-2 favorite in the field of 10. Despite her extensive schooling, Just One Time was fractious in the gate yet again and got off to a poor start. She found herself seventh of 10, far from her customary pace-stalking position. Jockey Joel Rosario opted to take the filly widest of all around the turn, and she responded once in the clear from kickback. Moving up to third approaching the top of the stretch, Just One Time rallied down the center of the track, collaring fellow Pennsylvania-bred Jakarta in the final sixteenth before holding off the closing kick of Four Graces to post a three-quarter-length victory.

Just One Time had passed her graded stakes test with flying colors, and her team now knew that she was capable of competing at the highest level. The filly and mare sprint division offers minimal top-level opportunities, with only three Grade 1 races available each year outside of the Breeders' Cup. The first is the \$500,000 Madison Stakes on opening Saturday at Keeneland, and Just One Time was pointed towards the 7-furlong contest.

A field of nine fillies and mares lined up for the Madison, including defending champion Kimari, nine-time stakes winner Bell's the One, and Brad Cox's other runner, the last out stakes-winning Lady Rocket. With the quintet vying for favoritism leading up to the race, Just One Time assumed the role over Kimari and Lady Rocket as the gates sprung. And again, Just One Time failed to break with the field. With Lady Rocket and Kimari contending the early pace through a :22.11 opening quarter, Just One Time and rider Flavien Prat found themselves in eighth, leading only the deep-closing Bell's the One. With the pair up front posting a punishing half mile split in :44.50, Just One Time was still 8½ lengths behind, and Bell's the One had already started to unravel her closing kick.

With her rival whizzing past heading into the turn, Just One Time, now last, switched to the outside clear of kickback and began to pick off rivals. As Bell's the One's rally carried her even with the frontrunning duo at the top of the stretch, Just One Time was still over 2 lengths behind and widest of all. Bell's the One began to spurt clear of the tiring Kimari and Lady

Rocket and looked to be on her way to victory before a mud-spattered chestnut materialized down the center of the track, seemingly having jumped into the race at the sixteenth pole. It was Just One Time, closing with a full head of steam, drawing even with her hard-trying rival in the dying stages. Bell's the One tried to fight back, but she gave in in the final strides as Just One Time edged to a three-quarter-length Madison Stakes victory.

It took 1:22.79 for Just One Time to become a Grade 1 winner, and the celebration was euphoric, with the caravan from Pennsylvania piling onto the Keeneland turf course for the winner's circle celebration. The victory marked the sixth of seven in Just

One Time's blossoming career, pushing her earnings above the half-million mark.

Just One Time returned to Churchill Downs to prepare for the second of four female sprint Grade 1s, the Derby City Distaff on the sport's biggest stage, Kentucky Derby Day. This time she shot to the lead, posted swift fractions of :22.36, :44.95 and 1:09.75 and couldn't hold on, winding up third as the 3-2 favorite behind Obigatory.

With an exciting year in store for the Pennsylvania-bred filly, the ultimate goal is a return to Keeneland in November, where the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint will be run over the same course and distance as the Madison.
