Uptowncharlybrown: Worthy of the Big Screen

Bob Hutt likes to start the story of Uptowncharlybrown with a cinema classic: “In a galaxy far, far away...”

The tale of Uptowncharlybrown does seem a bit far-fetched. Hutt’s Fantasy Lane Stable went to \$57,000 to buy a Kentucky-bred juvenile out of a one-time winning Langfuhr mare, ended up on the Triple Crown trail, and ultimately had one of the most impressive stallions Pennsylvania has had in the last decade. But this is no movie, it’s Uptowncharlybrown, who has now recorded 100 wins as a sire courtesy of Oxana on June 10.

Uptowncharlybrown, by Limehouse and out of La Iluminada, is the product of Hutt’s friendship with the late trainer Alan Seewald. Purchased out of the 2009 OBS Spring Sale of Two Year Olds in Training, Uptowncharlybrown cost just \$57,000 and was the 10th highest purchase on the day.

“Long story short, Uptowncharlybrown came to Monmouth and Alan started training him,” Hutt said. “His exploits became legendary. After the first work he ever had Alan referred to him as The Chestnut, didn’t call him by his name. Alan even said, ‘This is the best horse you’ve

ever had’ and he hadn’t even breezed yet. He had a sensational first breeze where he was supposed to go a slow three furlongs, but he went in :34 seconds, galloped out :46 and in :59. From there, the legend was born.”

Later that summer, Uptowncharlybrown held his own working against older graded stakes horses. By the time he debuted December 26, 2009, he came with a great deal of expectation.

Under Seewald’s tutelage and Hutt’s Fantasy Lane Stable moniker, Uptowncharlybrown was sent off as the co-second choice in a Tampa Bay Downs maiden race and drew off to win by nine widening lengths. He wheeled back to take the \$53,000 Pasco Stakes by six lengths three weeks later, making him a horse to watch on the Triple Crown trail. Uptowncharlybrown continued his journey via graded stakes company, finishing third in the Grade 3 Sam F. Davis and fifth in the Grade 3 Tampa Bay Derby.

"We nominated to the Triple Crown," Hutt said, "but truth be told the only race we were going to run in was the Belmont. We were hoping to win the Haskell in our back yard, but God had other plans."

On April 12, 2010, Seewald unexpectedly passed away at the age of 62. "My world was turned upside down," Hutt said.

Just five days later, Uptowncharlybrown went to the post in the Grade 2 Lexington Stakes at Keeneland and finished third. The effort was strong enough to send him to the Belmont Stakes as planned, where Uptowncharlybrown ran a brilliant race to be fifth, beaten just three lengths. An unfortunate saddle malfunction caused

him to lose the eight-pound weight pad under his saddle, and Uptowncharlybrown was disqualified and placed last.

Between Seewald's death and the horse's disqualification, the movie-like story had reached its lowest part, made worse when Uptowncharlybrown was injured training for the Haskell. "That was the end of his career," Hutt said. But his prized equine never did things by the book, and 16 months later returned to the races to run second behind future Breeders' Cup winner Tapizar (and ahead of Grade 1 winner Boys At Tosconova) in an allowance race at Belmont Park.

Retired with two wins, two seconds,

and two thirds in 13 starts for earnings of \$125,030, Uptowncharlybrown was ready to enter the breeding shed. But who would use him? "I retired him to be bred in Alan's memory," Hutt said. "At best, I thought we'd have some claiming horses."

Not everyone was on board; one prominent stallion manager gently told Hutt that he couldn't "let me put good money behind Uptowncharlybrown because he won't make it as a commercial stallion," Hutt laughed. "I knew what he was saying. I knew he was giving his best advice as a manager. But I told him I had a higher contract, so I was going to see where it went."

Hutt then approached Glenn and Becky Brok of Diamond B Farm, who agreed to stand Uptowncharlybrown. "The first foals hit the ground, and Glenn called me in shock," Hutt recalled. "He said, 'the horse is an absolute freak.' They hit the ground running and never looked back."

The first foal on the ground, Alan's Legacy, won a 2016 maiden race by 22 1/2 lengths. True Sweetheart won on debut by 10 lengths at 10-1 odds, and Midtowncharlybrown became a four-time stakes winner, earnings \$573,128, and Charlybrown's Rose was stakes placed.

With the second crop, the Uptowncharlybrowns just kept giving. Wait for It, another four-time stakes winner, has earned \$687,643 with 12 wins in 34 starts. Midnightcharly took the Lyman Handicap, and Dixie Serenade wowed at Belmont Park when she won the Grade 3 Victory Ride. "It's been an unbelievable ride," Hutt said. "He's as

good as anybody out there." Hutt and partners made the decision to not sell any of Uptowncharlybrown's offspring for several years. Ed Coletti, Sr., who handled Uptowncharlybrown during the final races of his career, and son Ed Coletti, Jr. have handled virtually all of the chestnut stud's offspring. The first publicly offered Uptowncharlybrown was only sold two years ago; Oxana was among the first and cost \$65,000 as a juvenile. On June 10 at Monmouth Park, Oxana became the 100th career winner for Uptowncharlybrown, fully swinging the screenplay back to a triumphant return.

"To start out with just seven broodmares of lesser quality and achieve this is more than a dream," Hutt said. "I made this my life's mission, and Uptowncharlybrown is my pride and joy. I love him to pieces."

Uptowncharlybrown has over \$4.6 million in progeny earnings from historically small crops, and boasts an average earnings per starter of \$64,139, a number that towers over his \$7,500 stud fee at WynOaks Farm in Delta, Pennsylvania. "He's larger than life now and is bred to 50 mares every year," Hutt said. "He has attracted the eye of the public, and makes us so proud."

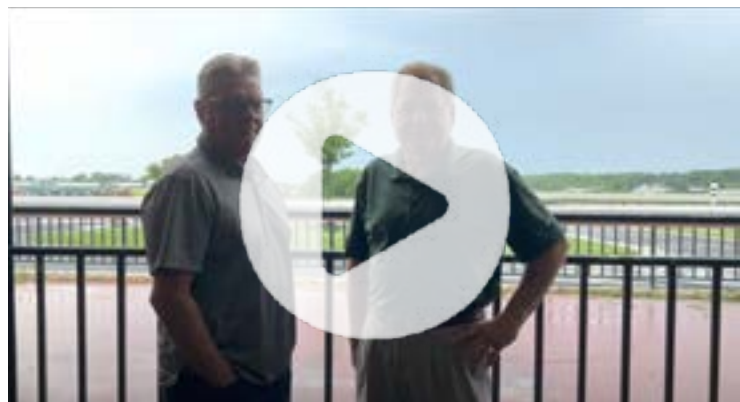

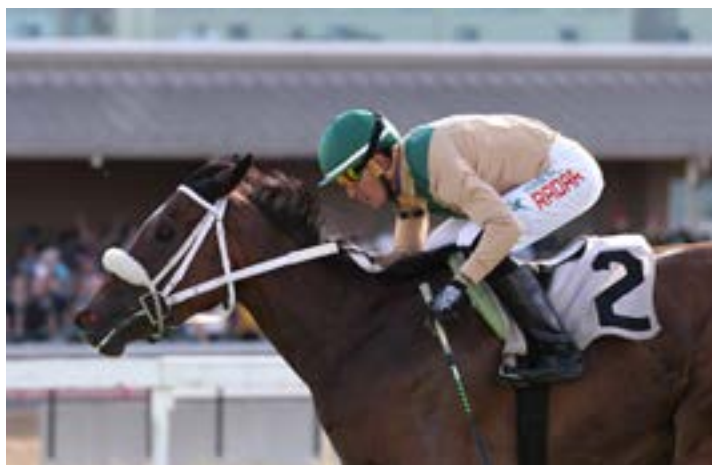

Tom Coulter's breeding program at Arrowwood Farm in York Springs yielded a bonanza on the evening of June 3 at Penn National, with three runners hitting the board in three stakes, two winning. Kicking off the Arrowwood celebrations was Maldives Model in the Lyphard Stakes as she recorded her first stakes victory.

The wonderfully consistent 4-year-old daughter of Petionville trained by Erin McClellan came into the race off the worse performance of her career – her seasonal debut in a Penn allowance a month earlier in which she was the favorite in the field of six on the main track but was eased to finish last.

Returned to the turf for the Lyphard – a surface she had won on and was stakes-placed in four prior starts – she was let go at nearly 11-1 but ran like an overwhelming favorite. Under Tyler Conner, Maldives Model broke alertly, dictated the pace over the soft turf through fractions of :24.26, :49.45, 1:15.09 and 1:41.39, and had plenty left in reserve to cross the line one and a half lengths in front of the 3-5 choice Love in the Air. The final time for the mile and a sixteenth was 1:48.40. The rest of the eight-horse Lyphard field was well spread out, as Wildcat Cartridge was nearly 17 lengths back in third, with fourth-place Eight Danzas finishing 30 lengths behind the winner.

Maldives Model recorded her third win in 13 starts to push her earnings past the \$165,000 mark. In five prior outings she finished second, twice in stakes company – to

future Grade 1 winner Just One Time in the Malvern Rose over the Tapeta at Presque Isle in her stakes debut last July, and against older mares in the Maryland Million Ladies at Laurel behind Epic Idea. Until her 2022 debut, she had never finished worse than fourth.

One of 10 foals, six winners, out of the Arrowwood Farm homebred El Prado (Ire) mare Tahitian Pearl, Maldives Model is a full sister to the mare's second richest runner, the 2009 gelding Distant Islands (five wins, \$153,434). Tahitian Pearl's last three foals, all by Petionville, are Maldives Model; 3-year-old filly Nature Trail, also campaigned by her breeder and most recently second in a maiden race at Penn on July 1; and unraced 2-year-old colt On an Island.

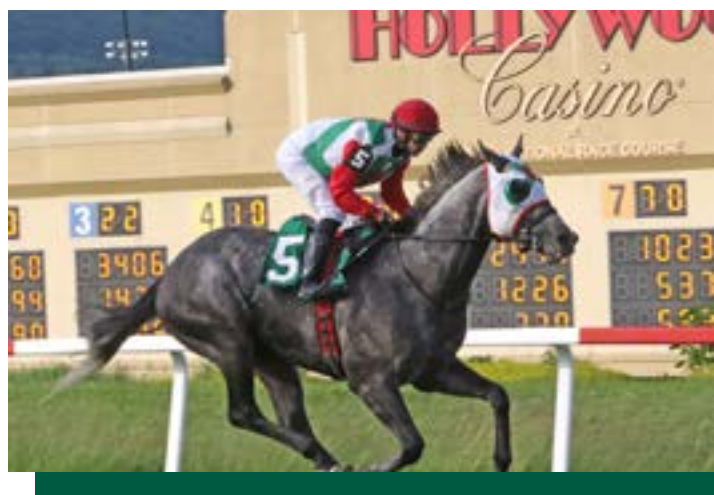

Joseph Imbesi's homebred Buy Land and See is now a two-time stakes winner after a dominating performance in the With Anticipation Stakes on the June 3 card at Penn National.

The turf-loving gray son of Cairo Prince immediately vied for the lead for rider Flavien Prat, was clear by two lengths after three-quarters of a mile, and turned into the stretch nearly eight lengths on top. From there it was smooth sailing as the 2-5 favorite in the field of eight crossed the wire a six and three-quarters-length winner. Off fractions of :23.67, :47.78, 1:14.26 and 1:42.27, his final time for the mile and a sixteenth over the soft turf was 1:50. Lacco Ameno, a 75-1 longshot, ran on to finish second, nearly five lengths ahead of 5-2 second choice You Must Chill.

Buy Land and See launched his career at 2 with trainer Steve Klesaris and made his debut with a third on the turf at Saratoga; finishing in second that day was future millionaire and Grade 1 winner Art Collector. A dominating victory on the turf next out at Parx sent the colt back to New York, where he won Belmont Park's Awad Stakes at a mile on the turf.

Long breaks have punctuated Buy Land and See's career. There was a nine-month break between his last start at 2 and first at 3, but he proved ready with a five and a quarter-length Parx allowance win as the overwhelming favorite. In his other two starts at 3 he was third in Saratoga's Mahony

Stakes and fourth in the Grade 2 Hill Prince Stakes at Belmont that October. When he reappeared nearly a year later it was for trainer Tony Dutrow.

Racing exclusively in New York from October 2021 through May 2022, and kept in training through the winter, Buy Land and See made five starts in allowance company, with three seconds, a third and a fourth, after a failed first attempt from the Dutrow barn in a graded stakes. He came into the With Anticipation off a second-place finish, by a nose, over the Belmont Park turf, in which they ran a mile in 1:33.17.

Buy Land and See is the second stakes winner bred by Imbesi out of Maria's Mon's unraced daughter Twiggles, whom Imbesi purchased as a yearling at Keeneland September for \$5,000. The first is Sweet Bye and Bye, a Sky Mesa filly born in 2015 who earned \$508,560 with eight wins, four seconds and four thirds from 21 starts, eight in stakes, was multiple graded stakes-placed, and counted wins in the 2018 Crowd Pleaser Stakes against males, and last year's Sand Springs at Gulfstream Park.

All five of Twiggles' foals to race are winners of six figures – combined they have earned \$1,224,417. Imbesi has the mare's 4-year-old Kentucky-bred allowance-winning filly Laynlomakndough at the track with Ken McPeck. Her last reported foal is a 3-year-old Pennsylvania-bred daughter of Liam's Map named Damanda who has been working at Parx since May but has yet to start. ■

Celebration number two on the evening of June 3 in Penn National's winner's circle for Tom Coulter and the Arrowwood Farm crew came after homebred Nimitz Class closed full of run to win the Danzig Stakes by three-quarters of a length. His final time for the six-furlong stakes for 3-year-olds was 1:09.82.

Sent off the 4-1 second choice in the field of 10, Nimitz Class was settled back by Tyler Conner in seventh off quick early fractions of :21.30, :44.11 and :56.85. Making his move going into the far turn, he got caught up a bit in traffic, split horses, took aim at favorite Uncle Buddy and surged past.

One race later, Arrowwood's homebred New Hire proved tough with a third-place finish behind Bazinga C in the New Start Stakes.

Making his stakes debut in the Danzig, Nimitz Class recorded his third win in a row, following allowance scores at Penn in March and April. Trained by Bruce Kravets, the Munnings colt returned to compete in Laurel Park's Concern Stakes on July 2. Stumbling out of the gate and having to make up ground, he rallied to finish second. Never worse than fourth in his seven career starts, Nimitz Class boasts a record of 7-4-1-0 and earnings of \$138,938.

Nimitz Class is the second stakes winner this year for Arrowwood's broodmare Five Diamonds. A stakes-winning daughter of Flatter, Five Diamonds was purchased by Coulter in November 2011 out of the Keeneland Breeding

Stock sale for \$52,000 as a maiden mare. Five Diamonds has produced six foals of racing age, four winners, including Kaylasaurus, winner of the Primonetta Stakes at Laurel in April. Kaylasaurus made 18 starts for her breeder until claimed last November for \$25,000 at Penn National. Since then, while racing at Laurel, she has also won the Willa On the Move Stakes last December, finished second in the What a Summer Stakes and was fourth in the Grade 3 Barbara Fritchie. In her most recent outing she ran third in Penn National's Susquehanna Valley Stakes on June 17 and now has earnings of \$330,683 from 24 starts.

Five Diamonds' 2-year-old colt Totonaco (by Free Drop Billy) has yet to start. She didn't have a foal in 2021 and delivered a colt by Lookin At Lucky this March. ■

Bazinga B was a popular racemare who changed hands multiple times during a career spent mostly in the claiming ranks. The daughter of Lion Hearted from the family of Canadian champion Cash Deposit won four races in 18 starts over three seasons and was stakes-placed when second in Pimlico's Geisha Stakes at 4 in 2015. When she was dropped in for a \$13,000 tag at Penn National in February 2016, trainer Tim Kreiser dropped the slip on behalf of Joseph Besecker, who was on the rise as one of the winningest owners in the country. She finished off the board in her next start for her new connections and shipped off to the breeding shed.

Six years later, Besecker and Kreiser were reaping the rewards for the \$13,000 claim when Bazinga B's first runner, Bazinga C, recorded her fifth win –and fourth in a row – from nine starts when taking control down the Penn National stretch in the New Start Stakes for 3-year-old fillies on June 3. The daughter of Exaggerator drew off to win by one and three-quarter lengths, finishing in 1:09.18 for the six furlongs.

Besecker bred the filly in partnership with the Exaggerator Syndicate and offered her as a weanling at the 2019 Keeneland November sale, where Sennebec South Farm signed the ticket for \$37,000. At the OBS sale the following October, Joseph Besecker got her back on a \$62,000 bid.

The dark bay filly was more than ready for her career debut the following September, as she led throughout a

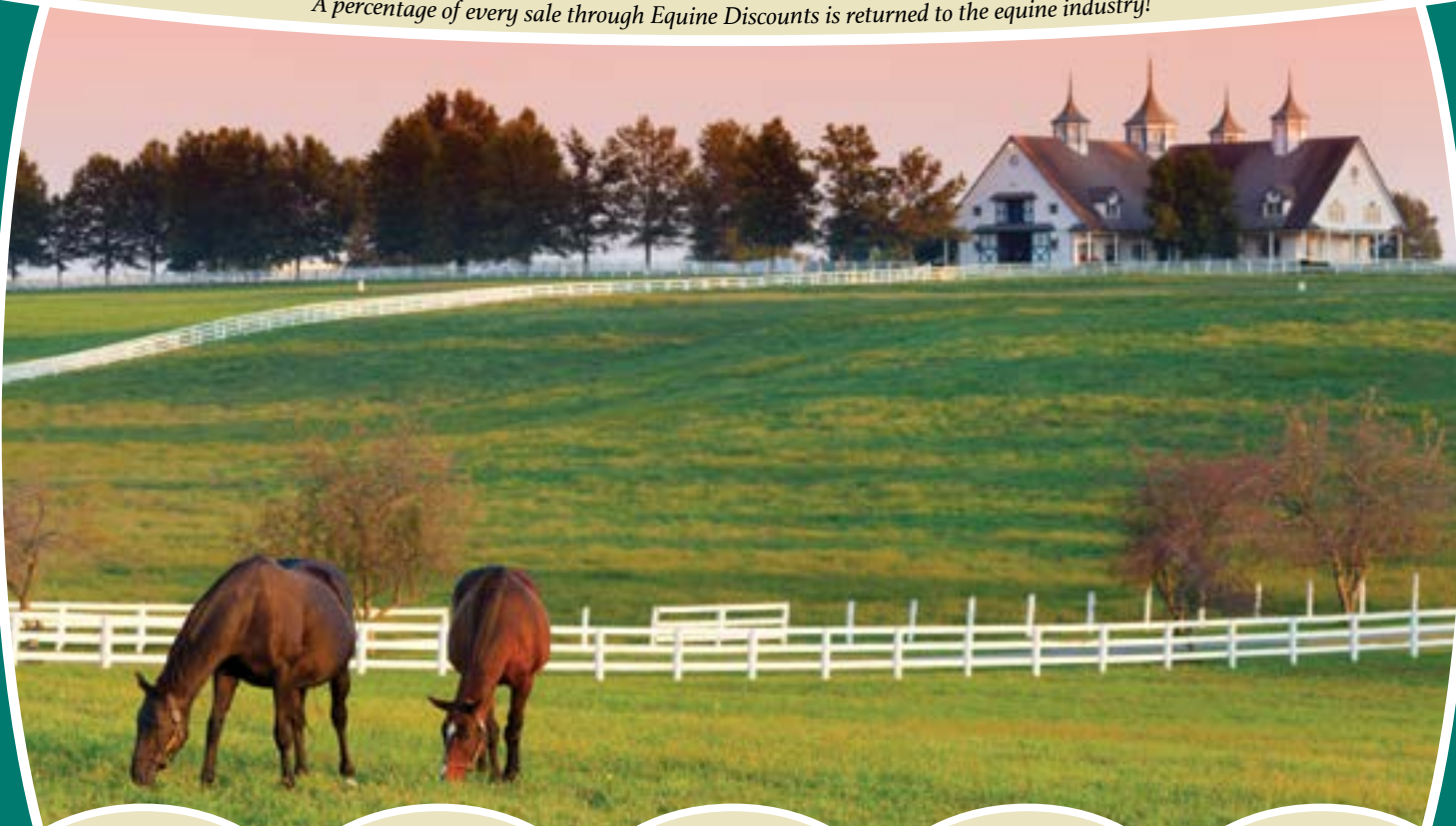
five-furlong maiden special at Penn National and powered away to an eight and a half-length victory. Her next start five weeks later saw her finish second in Delaware Park's White Clay Creek Stakes. An off-the-board finish in the Shamrock Rose Stakes and a second in allowance company, both at Penn, completed her season.

It took her second start at 3 to get back to the winner's circle, and she hasn't missed since. After a February allowance score at Penn in February, Bazinga C was risked twice for \$62,500 at Laurel in March and April but returned to her stall. Sent off as the 7-5 favorite in the five-horse New Start field, she settled off quick early fractions under the guidance of Horacio Karamanos, made a four-wide move and didn't look back. Her latest win pushed her earnings to \$188,056.

Bazinga B has had one starter from three foals of racing age. She is the dam of a 2-year-old Hoppertunity colt named Bazinga D and has a yearling colt by Uncle Lino. She was bred back to Uncle Lino for this year. ■

It took patience so see reigning PA-Bred Horse of the Year Chub Wagon in 2022. She last appeared in the Plum Pretty Stakes on September 25 at Parx Racing when she notched her eighth win of the year in nine starts and her growing fan club wanted more. They got their wish on June 27 at Parx when the 5-year-old returned in the Power by Far Stakes for state-bred fillies and mares.

Back on the worktab in April, Chub Wagon was blazing through her June works and owner/breeders Daniel Lopez and George Chestnut and trainer Guadalupe Preciado pointed her for a new test, her first try on the turf, in the Power by Far.

The race lost half the 10-horse field when it came off the turf, and Chub Wagon's test would have to wait for another day. But multiple stakes winner and defending Power by Far champion Hey Mamaluke made the return tougher than expected for the 3-10 favorite. Setting solid fractions of :22.20 and :45.67, Hey Mamaluke still had fight in her as Chub Wagon launched her challenge in the stretch. Digging down, Chub Wagon got the better of the determined Hey Mamaluke and won by three-quarters of a length. It was another eight lengths back to Castilleja in third. Final time for the five furlongs over a sealed track was :58 flat.

The win was the 11th in 12 starts in Chub Wagon's career – her only loss a second in the Dr. Teresa Garofalo Memorial last August. Unraced at 2, and a two-time winner at

3, Chub Wagon has raced exclusively in stakes since April 2021. The Power by Far was her seventh stakes win. The daughter of Hey Chub out of Lopez's homebred mare Takin the Plunge has now earned \$593,600.

Takin the Plunge (by Lion Heart) is the dam of five foals of racing age. Her other two starters are multiple stakes-placed Chubofftheoldblock, a full brother to Chub Wagon, and 4-year-old Helosthismarbles. A son of Uncle Lino, Helosthismarbles sold as a 3-year-old at last December's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Mixed sale for \$25,000 after one start. This year he's undefeated in three outings and has earned \$60,360.

Takin the Plunge has been bred to Hey Chub each time since and has a 2-year-old filly named Chit Chat Chub and a yearling filly yet to be named. ■

Greg and Caroline Bentley are known for their successful stable of runners. First steeplechasers. Then such graded winners as Postulation and their son's Arlington Million-G1 winner Hardest Core, classic starter Alwaysmining, and current acquisition Cinnabunny. Five years ago they began to assemble a broodmare band – the result of that effort was seen in the running of Crowd Pleaser Stakes for 3-year-olds at Parx Racing on June 26.

The top two finishers, Undercover Kitty and Loose Ends, were bred by the Bentleys and race for their Runnymore Racing. Both are Cathal A. Lynch trainees who were making their stakes debuts. Loose Ends was the favorite in the field of seven that went to the post, the race losing a few entrants when it came off the turf.

A member of the first crop of Divining Rod, Loose Ends is the first foal for the Giant's Causeway mare Giant Shadow, who was campaigned by the Bentleys. He had a few more races under his belt compared to his stablemate, hit the board in all six of his sophomore starts, and was a winner 11 days earlier.

Undercover Kitty hadn't won since a maiden special weight at Parx in January. But he had been racing against older runners and finished second behind a 5-year-old at Parx in March. And he had already competed at the distance. Bettors sent him off as the fourth choice at 6-1. It was no contest.

Leading from the start, through soft fractions of :24.22, :48.53, 1:13.19 and 1:38.65, Undercover Kitty poured it on. Ahead by six lengths at the top of the stretch, he maintained the margin to the wire. Loose Ends closed well and easily held off Epic Luck for second. Final time for the mile and a sixteenth over a sealed track was 1:45.20.

A gelded son of Kitten's Joy, Undercover Kitty boosted his record to 7-2-1-1 for earnings of \$103,710. He is the second foal the Bentleys have bred out of stakes winner and graded stakes-placed Judy In Disguise (GB), a daughter of Elusive City purchased out of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages sale for \$50,000 in foal to Shanghai Bobby. The Bentleys also campaigned the Shanghai Bobby colt they named Eleazar. He won his first start at Delaware Park in June 2021.

The mare was given the year off after delivering Undercover Kitty in May 2019. She had a Vino Rosso colt last year and was bred back to Golden Lad. ■

Caravel's star quality was on display at Belmont Park on June 10 as she controlled the pace and stayed there to capture the Grade 3 Intercontinental Stakes, the second graded stakes win of her career. The victory, her ninth in 15 starts, was worth \$110,000, which pushed her earnings over the half-million mark (\$563,777).

"I think she showed today she's one of the best in the division," said Brad Cox, who took over her training after she sold for \$500,000 as a racing or broodmare prospect at Fasig-Tipton's star-studded The November Sale last fall. Clicking off fractions of :22.58, :44.75 and :56.45, she came home in 1:07.59 for six furlongs over the firm turf.

Now owned by Qatar Racing, Marc Detampel and Madaket Stables LLC, the 5-year-old daughter of Mizzen Mast captured the Queen Stakes at Turfway Park to kick off her season but finished sixth of 13 in the Grade 2 Twin Spires Turf Sprint against males at Churchill Downs in May. "It didn't work out, but nobody was kicking down the inside at Churchill at all," noted Cox.

The first foal out of 2021 Pennsylvania Broodmare of the Year Zeezee Zoomzoom (by Congrats), Caravel is a half-sister to stakes winner Witty. Racing solely in stakes since August 2020, Caravel has won seven times during that span and placed in three others. Her other graded win came at Saratoga last summer in the Grade 3 Caress, her third stakes win in a row. ■

After taking Laurel Park's Spectacular Bid Stakes in January, his third win in a row and second in a stakes, Witty was given some time off after being diagnosed with bone bruising. A summer campaign was still in the cards, with his first start on the turf in the Penn Mile-G2 the goal.

Witty made the Penn Mile on June 3, but didn't show any of his former zip over the soft course and was crushed by more than 30 lengths. Back on the main track while making his Delaware Park debut nearly four weeks later, he defeated two foes with ease in the six-furlong Stanton Stakes on June 29.

With regular rider Carol Cedeno aboard, Witty was hurried early, given the go-ahead while circling his battling rivals and kicked away to cross the wire a five-length winner. Final time was 1:10.60.

Bred and owned by Lizzie Merryman and trained by her son McLane Hendriks, Witty has won four of his six career starts while amassing \$238,000. By Great Notion and a half-brother to turf sprint star Caravel, Witty is one of four foals of racing age for Zeezee Zoomzoom. The three to race are all winners. The mare has a 2-year-old colt by Holy Boss named Mission Man who recorded his first breeze at Fair Hill on June 25. Witty has a yearling full brother yet to be named and has a half-sister by Street Boss born in May. ■

A graded stakes winner at 3 when she captured the Grade 3 Monmouth Oaks at Monmouth Park in July 2021, SMD Ltd.'s homebred filly Leader of the Band was looking to add another stakes win to her resume. With a gutsy performance she accomplished it in Monmouth's Lady's Secret Stakes on June 11 over a sloppy track.

Tackling favorite Beth's Dream at the top of the stretch, the two fillies battled to the wire – the winning margin was a head after the mile and a sixteenth. Final time was 1:45.87. She is 5-3-3 from 13 career starts and has earned \$398,690.

Trained by John Servis, Leader of the Band has two wins this year from four starts. She returned to the winner's circle in March after a 10 1/4-length allowance score against state-bred fillies and mares at Parx, her first win since the Monmouth Oaks.

In between her stakes wins, Leader of the Band made five starts. She was second in the Cathryn Sophia Stakes, which led into her final start of the year, Parx's Grade 1 Cottillion, where she finished sixth of eight in the race won by Clairiere.

The Lady's Secret victory gives the filly's connections free entry and starting fees to the Grade 3 Molly Pitcher Stakes on the Haskell Stakes undercard. "I'm tickled with this performance," said Servis. "We'll point her to the Molly Pitcher. That's why we have kept her here at Monmouth, to point for that race."

A daughter of Bandbox, Leader of the Band is out of SMD Limited's Catsuit. Claimed by trainer Don Reeder for SMD Limited in late May 2004 at Philadelphia Park, the Sir Cat mare produced her first foal for S.M.D. Ltd. in 2007.

From 10 foals, the now 22-year-old mare has nine starters, eight winners and four PA-Bred stakes performers. She is also the dam of multiple stakes-placed runners Authoritative and Ill Conceived, as well as Burano, her last reported foal. A daughter of Uncle Lino born May 16, 2019, Burano was second in last November's Shamrock Rose Stakes at Penn National. Catsuit failed to produce a foal the past two years after being bred to Irish War Cry. ■
