Congrats to the Barlar-bred Simply Joking, who gave it her all and finished second by half a length in the G2 Fantasy Stakes at Oaklawn Park on March 29. What a stretch run! She earned 50 points toward the Kentucky Oaks. Hopefully, we'll see this PA-Bred start next in the Oaks.

We're well into breeding season again so go to pabred.com and check out the PA Stallion & Boarding Farm Directory on the home page and book your next, or first, PA-Bred. Need a place to board and foal your mare? Please give us a call at 610-444-1050 as space is available.

I'm happy to announce that there will be no registration fee for the PA-Sired PA-Bred Stallion Series in 2025. If your 2yo is PA-Sired PA-Bred you will be automatically registered to run. The only exception will be the third and final leg of the 2024 Stallion Series which will be run on Sept. 19 on PA Day at the Races, with stakes purses of \$100,000 for 3yos & 3yo fillies. These horses were already registered as 2yos in 2024. Any 3yos you wish to enter in these races will have to be nominated by paying the \$5,000 stated late fee to the PHBA before the nomination date of Tuesday, September 2. A \$50,000 breeder bonus for horses that finish first, second and third in total points for the 2024 series will be paid after these races.



series will be paid after those races – \$25,000 for first, \$15,000 for second and \$10,000 for third.

We'll be having our first PA Yearling Show on June 21 at Brandywine Polo Club in Chester County. Four categories, plus one for champion, will be offered with lots of prizes. You should have received show information and a registration form in the mail, online and in this report. Only \$50 to enter. We also will be paying two \$20,000 bonuses, split between the top-four 2yo and 3yo show participants, based on total earnings and not limited to PA races.

Domicile forms are mandatory and should have been completed by Dec. 1 or when your mare comes into the state if breeding back to a PA stallion, or within 14 days of a public sale. Again, **if you need a place to board and foal your mare**, **please give us a call at 610-444-1050 as space is available**. If you are still using paper registrations, please make sure you forward a signed copy of the Code of Ethics, which is attached to the registration form. We will be transitioning to paperless this year. Wishing you a fantastic 2025, and remember, PA is the only place to Breed and Race! Go PA!



Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association Releases 2025 PA-Bred Stakes Schedule

Over \$1.4 million in purses will be up for grabs in 2025 as the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association (PHBA) has announced its 2025 stakes schedule for registered PA-Bred and PA-Sired/PA-Bred horses.

All three Pennsylvania racetracks will combine for 18 total state-bred stakes.

Horsemen should note that there has been a slight shuffling of dates and locations in 2025.

Three-year-olds will close out the current PA-Sired, PA-Bred Stallion Series, which began last year, on September 19th at Parx Racing with the \$100,000 Prince Lucky Stakes and the \$100,000 Imply Stakes for fillies. The top three point earners across the six-race series will split a \$50,000 breeder bonus at the conclusion of the final races. The current leader is Honorable Win (Winchill), who captured both the Miss Blue Tye Dye Stakes and Miss Behaviour Stakes in 2024. Last year's two stakes for males were split between Whistle Pig Stakes winner The Boy's Warrior (Warrior's Reward) and Fenton Forever (Pat On the Back), who captured the Wait For It Stakes. Those two are tied for third place in the standings, while Reelin N Dealin (Pat On the Back) sits in second following runner-up finishes in both stakes events.

Juveniles of 2025 will begin their PA-Sired/PA-Bred Stallion Series races at Parx Racing in December with the \$75,000 Wait For It Stakes and the \$75,000 Miss Behaviour Stakes.

The 2025 PA-Bred stakes season will kick off at Penn National Race Course during its featured Penn Mile card on Friday, May 30. Older turf routers will contest two \$75,000 stakes going 1 1/16miles, the Alphabet Soup Handicap and the Lyphard Stakes for fillies & mares.

Penn National will also host all other PA-Bred turf stakes this year, with the \$75,000 Marshall Jenney Handicap for older sprinters and the \$75,000 Crowd Pleaser for sophomores moving over from Parx Racing, to be contested on Friday, August 15th.

On Father's Day in June, Parx Racing opens its schedule with two \$100,000 sprints for older horses: the Page McKenney Handicap and the Unique Bella Stakes.

Presque Isle Downs will feature three PA-Bred stakes over its all weather course on Mondays in July: the \$75,000 Malvern Rose Stakes for three-year-old fillies going 6 ½ furlongs and two events at 1 mile 70 yards, the \$75,000 Hard Spun Stakes and \$75,000 Princess of Sylmar Stakes for fillies & mares.

Parx will also play host to the PHBA's signature event, Pennsylvania's Day at the Races, to be held on Friday, September 19th - an added race day on the eve of the \$1 million Pennsylvania Derby. In addition to the two aforementioned PA-Sired/PA-Bred sophomore stakes, the day will also feature the \$100,000 Storm Cat Stakes for older horses going 1 mile 70 yards.

Older PA-Sired/PA-Bred horses will have an opportunity for \$75,000 in each of two stakes at Parx Racing on Wednesday, October 22nd. The Disco Chick Stakes for fillies & mares is a new addition to the schedule, joining the Jump Start Stakes, with both to be run at 7 furlongs.

Juvenile stakes for PA-Breds begin at Parx Racing on Thanksgiving Eve, Wednesday, November 26th. The \$100,000 Shamrock Rose Stakes for fillies shifts from its prior location at Penn National to the Parx oval, joining the \$100,000 Pennsylvania Nursery. The latter stakes boasts a history of being the first stakes win for the immortal Pennsylvania-Bred Smarty Jones.

"It's one of our best pedigrees, one that we've cultivated for more than 30 years," Sikura said shortly after the Seagram Cup score.

"I have great admiration for Mike Tyson, and I thought this is a special horse, so I wanted to name him Tyson. Wonderful horse, beautifully bred."

Like his namesake, Tyson became a champion. He was honored as Canada's Sovereign Award champion dirt male of 2023.

After launching his career as a debut 3-year-old winner for Pletcher, Tyson joined Carroll's barn and opened his 4-year-old campaign with a Woodbine win. He was third in his stakes debut in the Eclipse Stakes-G2 prior to capturing the Seagram Cup and Dominion Day. He then shipped from Woodbine to Saratoga to check in third in the Jockey Club Gold Cup Stakes-G1. Those eye-catching performances earned him the Sovereign Award.

In his first of two starts the following year, Tyson made a strong late run to finish a close second in Woodbine's Eclipse Stakes-G2. He was in the spotlight again last year at the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale where shoppers were drawn to his powerful stallion potential. At the barn and in the pre-sale holding area, Tyson was the proverbial "whole package" of good looks, charm, solid race record, champion credentials and one of the best pedigrees in the stud book. He was led into the auction ring in the final minutes of the last session of the nine-day auction and exited as the day's sale topper with the Myers' bloodstock advisor Ed Price signing the receipt at \$175,000.

"The first time we saw him was at the Keeneland sale," Myers said. "He was our second choice but our first choice was scratched. But glad we purchased the one we got. My first impression was that he is very classy and couldn't look much better for a racehorse than he does. We thought he would go for about \$250,000, so we were very happy to purchase him at \$175,000."

His pedigree brims with so many stakes horses that his official abbreviated catalog page only traces to his second dam and is overloaded with the sought-after black type that signals runners of the highest quality. Relatives consistently



command gaudy prices at the sales, such as Arcangelo's dam Modeling, an unraced half-sister to Tyson's dam Honouring who sold as a weanling for \$2.85 million.

His third dam, Grade 2 winner Better Than Honour, was honored as 2007 Broodmare of the Year. In addition to being the dam of two classic winners, she produced Irish champion Man of Iron and graded winner Casino Drive.

NEW CHAPTER FOR STONE JUG RANCH

As enamored as Myers was with Tyson at the sale, he was even more impressed as Tyson settled in at Stone Jug Ranch. "Tyson is very smart," he said. "For a stallion he is mannered pretty well. Very classy and minds his own business. Couldn't ask for much more."

Although Tyson is the farm's first stallion, Stone Jug Ranch is well versed in raising premium animals while simultaneously housing racehorses. The acreage in the Blue Ridge Mountain foothills was known for producing Scottish Highland show cattle but the herd of 40 has been downsized to about five. The land is divided into two separate farms a few minutes apart.

"One part is 100 acres with about 30 acres of pasture for horses," Myers said. "The other has 65 acres and we have 50 acres of pastures."

Named for the road on which it sits, Stone Jug Ranch, conveniently located to Interstates 76 and 81, is home to

about a dozen mares, with more arriving during breeding season. Prior to being purchased by Myers in 2017, the property had been in the same family for generations.

The Myerses drifted away from Thoroughbred racing while raising cattle at Stone Jug Ranch but later circled back to raising racehorses.

"We have been doing breeding in Pennsylvania for about eight years," Darryl Myers said. "We live in Pennsylvania for about five months a year. We decided a few years ago that we may start looking for a good stallion to stand at our farm to breed our own mares. It just makes sense. There may be more stallions in the future. We have plenty of room for the future to grow."

Myers is well versed in growing a business. He founded the Dillsburg-based Myers Steel Works and serves as president and CEO of the family-owned company known for manufacturing steel structures. He is applying that same business insight to developing Tyson's stallion career. Tyson is available for those seeking to capitalize on Pennsylvania's lucrative bonus program for state-bred horses. His advertised stud fee is \$3,500 with discounts available for multiple bookings and stakes-winning and -producing mares.

Myers succinctly summed up his vision.

"Pennsylvania is a beautiful state and the stallion and breeders' awards are a good thing," he said.





When Rich Miller sold his longtime farm in 2019, that was supposed to be the start of his retirement. Instead, it was the beginning of a full-fledged breeding and racing operation that dwarfs his prior setup and is now one of the biggest breeding enterprises in Pennsylvania. Mountain Springs Farm, now located in Palmyra near Penn National Race Course, offers eight stallions available to breeders and has plenty of room for broodmares, foals, youngsters and layups.

Miller calls it "semi-retirement" now, laughing as he thinks about it. "I always enjoyed the horses and the racing the most at the old place. Now I have 80 horses here year-round, with horses coming in and out all the time. About 15 broodmares are mine, two stallions are mine, and then there's the young stock. I didn't intend for this to happen but a couple of opportunities presented themselves and I decided to bite the bullet and go."

The Miller family has been involved in horses for well over half a century. When he was a kid, Miller's parents had a place called Little Dutch Farm, where they offered pony rides, trail riding, a restaurant and even housed a few amusement park rides. In 1968 they moved to Shartlesville, where Mountain Springs began, literally from the ground up. The name fit because it was nestled right next to a mountain, which gave birth to a multitude of springs and creeks flowing right onto the property.

"It was my mother's parents' farm," Miller remembers. " And there was nothing there. We developed the whole thing from scratch. I was pretty young back then but I remember the outdoor arena and rodeos the most, getting them started, adding the roofs and stands. It was a long process and a lot of work in the beginning."

His father decided to add a campground on the property and that set the dominoes in motion. Once the grandstand was built, they started holding rodeos, concerts, and even a demolition derby. Family members competed in everything.

But Rich Miller was especially enamored by Thoroughbred racing after he bought his first racehorse out of a New Holland auction in 1978. He galloped the horse himself at home and the gelding rewarded him with a victory in Miller's very first race. He soon began breeding his own racehorses, even standing a few lower profile stallions for Pennsylvania breeders over the years. Some of those stallions included Grade 2 winner Meadow Monster (Meadowlake), Turn West (Gone West), Storm Center (Storm Bird) and Fini Cassette (Talc).

But everything changed when he received an offer on the property that he could not refuse. That set in motion a nearly two-year search for a property that could house his 30-40 horses, one which already had a basic setup with barns so he could move the horses right in.

Miller admits, "I didn't want to start from scratch again. I'd already done that. So while we were looking at another property nearby, this one came up because it fit exactly what we were looking for. I never even quibbled but said I needed to move in right away. We signed all the papers and it all fell into place. I'm glad the others didn't suit."

He transferred the name Mountain Springs Farm to the massive 200-acre property, which was more than double the size of the tract in Shartlesville. It allowed him to really invest in breeding and racing, bringing his focus back on his original love of horses. He started by standing two of his own stallions, one a multiple graded stakes-placed son of Tapit named Tight Ten and the other a stakes-winning, Grade 1-placed grandson of War Front and Storm Cat named Uncle Benny.

The farm also stands some of the state's leading sires, including Uptowncharlybrown, whose offspring earned breeders \$2 million between 2023-24 while topping the state's rankings. Young stallion Enticed moved to Pennsylvania for this breeding season and boasts a brilliant pedigree: he is a son of Medaglia d'Oro out of the multiple Grade 1-winning mare It's Tricky. From his first two crops to race,

Enticed is the sire of graded stakes winner Visually and stakes winners Under the Palms and Shimmering Allure. He ranked eighth in the nation last year among second-crop sires.

The rest of the Mountain Springs stallion roster is promising and exciting. Alejandro boasts a sparkling pedigree, being by superstar Curlin and out of Grade 1 winner Rachel's Valentina, herself a daughter of Hall of Famer Rachel Alexandra. Well Spelled (Spellbinder) and Eastwood (Speightstown) are among the leading sires in Pennsylvania. And Beverly Park (Munnings) screams hardiness after a 64-race career with 29 victories, highlighted by a 15-win 2022 season that saw him lead the nation in wins.


"I've always raced some of my homebreds," notes Miller. "But we are a lot more commercial now. Enticed looks like he's going to really take off. And Uptowncharlybrown and Eastwood are doing good. We're breeding a lot more mares than I ever have. With the number of stallions, it's hard to accommodate all the mares right here, so we do a lot of trailer breedings. This year we've

bred quite a few already but April is going to be my busiest month. People are breeding later nowadays because it's nice when you can foal them and turn the babies right out. It makes more sense."

That works with how Miller prefers to handle his racehorses. He usually saves his 2-year-olds until the very end of their juvenile seasons, or even stretching into 3-year-olds. He wants to let them mature on their own. And he especially likes that the PA-Bred stakes schedule has adjusted its PA-Sired/PA-Bred races to better support older horses.

In the meantime, Miller will continue doing what he does best: working hands-on with the horses. "Sometimes I think I did the right thing and other days I lean the other way. But I think we're going all right. I don't get off this place very often, especially now during the breeding season. It's seven days a week right now."

But Miller wouldn't have it any other way. Retirement - or "semi-retirement" - suits him just fine.







q, 3, Maximus Mischief–Flatter's Secret, by Flatter. (\$130,000 2023 FTMOCT) O-Cash is King LLC and LC Racing, B-Dr. & Mrs. William E. Riddle Jr. (PA), T-Robert E. Reid Jr., J-Eliseo Ruiz, \$44,100.

Supporting the dynamic Maximus Mischief continues to pay dividends for Cash is King LLC and LC Racing LLC and trainer Butch Reid. Their newest stakes winner, Baby Dukes, is a member of the second crop of the stallion who stands in Kentucky, but has had a ton of success in Pennsylvania.

After placing twice in stakes at 2, Baby Dukes made his 3-year-old debut in Parx Racing's City of Brotherly Love on March 4. Sent off the 6-5 favorite in the field of five, he broke sharply from his inside post, went to the lead, and was challenged the entire 1 1/16 miles.

Able to slow the pace down, through fractions of :24.40, :49.16 and 1:15.17, Baby Dukes was headed at the top of the stretch and lost his lead. But there was no giving up in the bay gelding as he dug down to regain the lead in midstretch under Eliseo Ruiz and pulled out a three-quarterlength victory. His final time was 1:52.71.

Purchased out of the 2023 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern fall yearling sale for \$130,000, Baby Dukes came out running at 2, leading at every call to win his first start an open maiden special weight at Parx – in June 2024. Word was out early as he went off at 2-5.

A Saratoga trip didn't go according to plan as he wound up sixth of seven in his stakes debut, the Grade 2 Sanford, 6½ lengths behind the winner. Six weeks later he was back, scoring a Delaware Park allowance over future multiple stakes winner Barbadian Runner.

His stakes-placed efforts came when finishing third in Delaware Park's Rocky Run and the Pennsylvania Nursery at Parx. Following his stakes win in the City of Brotherly Love, Baby Dukes shipped to Laurel for the Private Terms Stakes on March 22. After dueling for the lead early, he gave way

to finish third in the 11/16-mile test. In eight lifetime starts, he has three wins and three thirds for earnings of \$143,275.

His sire, Maximus Mischief, was a \$340,000 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May purchase by Chuck Zacney and raced for the Cash is King LLC and LC Racing LLC partnership. Trained by Reid, Maximus Mischief showed brilliance at 2 by winning all three starts, including Aqueduct's Remsen Stakes-G2.

Retired due to a soft-tissue injury early in his 3-year-old campaign after finishing third in Gulfstream Park's Holy Bull Stakes-G2 in his sophomore debut, Maximus Mischief has become one of his sire Into Mischief's most popular sons at stud while standing at Spendthrift Farm in Lexington.

Other stakes runners by Maximus Mischief trained this year by Reid for ownership that includes Cash is King and/or LC Racing are Toboggan Stakes winner Maximus Meridius and stakes-placed 3-year-old filly Maximus Angelicus, who ran third for LC Racing and Wellesley Stable in the Main Line Stakes one race prior to the City of Brotherly Love.

Baby Dukes is the second foal for Dr. and Mrs. William E. Riddle Jr.'s mare Flatter's Secret. The daughter of Flatter was claimed by the Riddles for \$4,000 out of her 35th and final start at Penn National in March 2018. The seven-time winner of \$115,022 was bred that spring and produced winner Uncle Gary G (by Uncle Lino) the following April.

Flatter's Secret's only other reported foal to date is a yearling colt by Wicked Strong born last March. She was bred back to Cloud Computing.


