


LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY



IT'S ALL ABOUT TIME FOR KATE GOLDENBERG

Just about anyone can find a home with Kate Goldenberg, whose presence in the equestrian world spans a lifetime. Her 501(c)(3) organization Safe Haven Equine Rescue in Perkasie houses people, horses, dogs, peacocks, a flying squirrel and most recently, a newborn lamb whose mother rejected her. The farm also regularly draws a diverse group of volunteers to help, especially with the Thoroughbred retirees that she has lovingly accepted for rehabilitation and rehoming after racing.

"I feel like anybody who's here is meant to be here," Goldenberg said.

Only within the past 10 to 15 years has responsible racehorse retirement become a cause that draws headlines. However, Goldenberg has been rehabbing, retraining and rehoming Thoroughbreds for decades. As a breeder, she always welcomes



back any homebred onto the farm after their racing careers are over. Safe Haven Equine Rescue is also a Partner Farm for Parx Racing's Turning for Home, and she has become well known for accepting even the toughest cases.

"We try and make that a priority," she said in regard to her homebreds. "I feel like if you made them then you're absolutely responsible for them."

Goldenberg firmly believes that there is no better healer than Mother Nature and time. "I took a horse named Noble Tu from the track years ago who had a huge bow, high, middle and low. Everybody was asking what in the world I was doing because he could barely walk onto my trailer."

Noble Tu was a 1978 unraced son of Noble Jay. She gave the PA-bred plenty of time off, as well as collaborated with a friend by using alternative methods such as early versions of magnetic therapy and using staples. With tendon injuries, she has her own opinions on rehabilitation. Most people keep horses with soft tissue injuries in a stall for several months to heal. Goldenberg disagrees with this method.

"I bring them home and turn them out in the round pen. They need to keep moving so the scar tissue is able to break apart. And look at what

PHONE: 215-262-8077 www.safehavenequine.com happened with Noble Tu. Everyone said that horse shouldn't have been able to walk again. Now I have a picture of us jumping probably five feet, in my kitchen, and he was an Olympian!"

One of the other stories that jumped right to her mind was a warhorse named Nileator, who also retired with a bowed tendon. Many farms shy away from this type of injury due to the length of time it often takes to fully recover, but Goldenberg has no qualms taking horses with any injury. Nileator, a son of Pioneerof the Nile, arrived at her farm with a big bow and spent two months in rehab before an unexpectedly perfect home appeared. A friend suddenly found herself without

a beginner lesson horse and, even though Nileator was still technically healing from the injury, Goldenberg thought he would be the ideal candidate for the job.

"Nileator had a gift in that if anything was wrong, he'd stop and stand," she remembered. "And I mean, the wind could be whipping or a kid could lose a stirrup, and he'd stop and stand. Someone else in the ring falls off, stop and stand, no matter what. That's something you just can't teach your horse to do. They have to have it in their personality. She says that he's the best lesson horse she's ever had. No one's ever going to fall off because he's at a standstill."



Since then, Nileator, now 12, has fully recovered from his original bowed tendon and is now able to jump with his students. According to Goldenberg, "he looks like a stakes horse and is so well-muscled. I think he was champion jumper at the Horse Park this year."

In 2017, she took a tall, stunning gray gelding named Buzzword to Kentucky for the Retired Racehorse Project's Thoroughbred Makeover. She rode him in the Field Hunter division and that's when Claire Dunkie offered to catch ride in Dressage. Claire fell in love with him and convinced her boss to purchase Buzzword immediately. Goldenberg and Dunkie had never met before but are forever intertwined through Buzzword, who was technically not even for sale at the time.

But it took a long time to get there, and the full story of Buzzword showcases the true power of patience and love. He was bred by the well-known, Grade 1-winning Mercedes Stable and he himself is by multiple Grade 1-winning sprinter Zensational out of Grade 2 winner Brooke's Halo. His good looks attracted awestruck gazes on the racetrack every morning. Unfortunately, his massive body couldn't hold up to racing and he blew his tendon so badly that euthanasia was recommended. Goldenberg offered to give him a chance, so she kept him at Safe Haven for over a year before starting his retraining, and the rest is history.

Sound horses also find their way to Goldenberg and while those are few and far between, she remembers every single one. Sewanee was crowned Parx's Racing's "Winningest Horse" in 2013 after crossing the wire first in six of 10 starts. He is now a champion show jumper in upstate New York with his new family.

And then there was Dangerous Maize, another sound mare who had a difficult attitude but loved to jump. "She would give people a really hard time," said Goldenberg. "This girl bought her because her trainer said that if she wanted to be good, she needed to get a horse like her so she could learn to ride with her head. When we had Maize, we tried her over this giant four-foot oxer and she just thundered over it. Everyone wanted to make it higher but I said no, because she was brave enough that she would try it."

But the horses that Goldenberg and her Safe Haven Equine Rescue are most known for are those that truly need her knowledge, care and patience, like Buzzword. She takes the cast-offs, the horses who nobody wants.

"I have dozens of horses that are not so great but are probably

better off than some of the performance horses. All they have to do is eat carrots and get petted. In my little world, a lot of them are fine. I would rather stand in the field and eat carrots and apples than barrel race.

"Hero for Hire was here for a few years. We would wean the babies and put them with her. I would call her in the summer for meals but one day she just wouldn't come in. We found her behind the hay piles, standing over one of the weanlings who was sleeping. She was literally the best mother ever. She's now in an embryo transfer program which was perfect."

And so Goldenberg continues to accept horses with nagging injuries like Fivefourthreetwone, Yougotthatgoinforu and Uptown Boy (who combined made 129 starts, won 25 and earned just shy of \$1 million). Those three found a home together with a wonderful family. But if she can't find a suitable home for one, she has no problem keeping the horse, waiting for the right time.

Goldenberg has high praise for the owners who do take horses that are unrideable or can only be trail horses. "
I think it's wonderful when they do find the right home. The passion and love these people have for those horses is pretty incredible."

Life of Passion

LIBERTO EXCITED **ABOUT BREEDING,** CAPO KANE

Leonard Liberto remembers some of the advice given to him when he decided to venture into Thoroughbred racing. He's been in the game long enough to share wisdom as well.

"When I started in this business, I had \$100,000 and knew nothing. Now I know everything there is to know about horses. But I don't have the \$100,000," he joked.

Liberto bought his first horse 25 years ago, a Fast Gold gelding named Gold N Regal. He was a \$5,000 claim that got Liberto started on a path that has him now standing a stallion at Bonner Hill Farms in Pennsylvania. That stallion, Capo Kane, won the 2021 Jerome Stakes and finished third in the Withers

Stakes (G3), the next-to-last race of a five-race career in which he won twice and earned \$147,500. The California-bred entered stud the following year. Liberto says that he doesn't believe in comparing Capo Kane to other stallions, just those from the same sire—Street Sense.

"That's really what I am more con-

proceeds go to the T.C. Williams Youth Sports Camps, which strives to teach children the benefits of sport.

"Williams goes around to different underprivileged communities... and we donate money to that organization to help children with computers and things that they would need as far as learning experiences," Liberto said.

Liberto, who partners with Anthony Como in Bing Cherry Racing, discusses his start in the industry, being in a regional market, and making horse racing a family affair. "I love the industry. I love the business.

BLOODHORSE: You've got Capo Kane standing in Pennsylvania. What's going on with him and how is his breeding going?

cerned about," Liberto said. "I'm not too concerned about the other 20 stallions standing in Pennsylvania because I'm the only Street Sense. I'm not comparing Street Sense to Speightstown, I'm not comparing to Medaglia d'Oro. If you want a pedigree of Street Sense, you're going to come to Capo Kane."

Capo Kane is also featured in a children's book titled, "The Story of Capo Kane". Written by T.C Williams, the book is illustrated by children with and without disabilities, and the

LEONARD LIBERTO: So far, everything's been going real well. We were accepted pretty favorably in the state of Pennsylvania, by the breeders in Pennsylvania. We got a few people outside of Pennsylvania, people from Virginia and people from Maryland that have nice mares. We've been hanging in; it's been a lot of fun. I've got a passion for this. And it never gets old when you see the babies.

BH: What made Bonner Hill Farms the right place for him?



LL: When we originally were looking to stand him, we looked at what was available in the local area between New York, Laurel (Maryland), Virginia, and Pennsylvania. We kind of fell in love a little bit with the Pennsylvania program. ... We really wanted to get somebody who certainly was already standing stallions. So Bonner Hill already stands Pat On the Back and now they have Buy Land and See. The fact that they have now three stallions really makes it nice because breeders have a variety to choose (from), and what breeding works well with their mares.

BH: Talk about being regional and being one of the little guys. What pressures do you feel as the industry keeps evolving?

LL: We don't have any real pressures as regional. I'm sure the people in Kentucky are under much more pressure than we are because they've got a lot of money invested. I'll give you an example: McKinzie covered 500 and some (mares) since he stood. But when you break it down to who's better than who, as a stallion, it's going to be based on percentages. It's going to be based on numbers. It's certainly not going to be based on the fact that he's better than Capo Kane or Maxfield is better than Capo Kane or Speaker's Corner was better than Capo Kane. The only time those will determine who's better than who as a stallion, or the best son of Street Sense, it's going to be the numbers. I could have 10 foals and all 10 are graded winners. I'm better than Maxfield and McKinzie.

BH: How much are you following Capo Kane's offspring? And are there any that you're excited about?

LL: I'm excited about every single one of them that I see standing and nursing. Depending on the mares, the body types, certainly they're going to be different. The conformation is certainly going to be different, but what's it been looking like now is we've been getting some nice long-legged, big- chested babies, and so this year we have yearlings and actually Jan. 24 was our first foal for the 2024 season. And he's looking real good.

BH: Your career in the industry has evolved a bit in the last few years. You haven't run a horse on your own in a couple of years. Why the change?

LL: At one time, when I first started, I had 22 runners with one trainer, and obviously I moved around. I had a few other trainers in different states. ... But recently, I have not run anything other than I had a horse named Marathoner, but he was under the Capo Kane Investments ownership. And he did okay. ... When we bought Capo Kane, it was \$26,000. I bought Ny Traffic for \$22,000. ... But the industry, I think, the biggest expense to make any money is in the breeding business. But I always looked at return on investment.

> So if I'm investing a lot of money, I should get a bigger return. That's what we're hoping for.

Pennsylvania is doing some big things and I don't see anywhere else to be right now.

BH: What do you enjoy about the breeding aspect of the industry?

LL: The breeding aspect of it is just a small portion of the success and joy it brings to me. If we had no breeders, we wouldn't have any horses, right? We get excited when we see all these different owners with our babies. We haven't had any yet, but we got 49 covers in 2023, we had 28 covers in 2022, and in 2024, we're looking at probably getting another 30 or 35. So, you know, again regional, we don't look at the numbers of mares. Not like Kentucky. They

breed 150-200 a year. ... The biggest joy is certainly watching one that you bred, run. And in Pennsylvania, if you're the breeder, you get 40% of that purse forever. So you know, kind of a nice thing.

BH: Have you thought about getting back into the racing side of things?

LL: Yeah, we're eventually going to be between my partner and I we have 10 mares ourselves. We'd love to be able to race them ourselves. But I calculate that by the time you

breed a horse, wean it, and get into training and bring it to the track and hopefully, you can run as a 2-year-old. If not a 3-year-old. You got to spend about 30 to 40 grand on one animal, not a lot of money, but it's a lot of money if you have 10 of them. So, you're talking about spending, \$330,000 to \$400,000 to get your 10 babies to the races and sometimes it doesn't make sense because it doesn't matter how much money you have, you don't spend it unwisely; you try to incorporate a bunch of other people that want to become part of a syndicate. And that's what we're looking at next. Hopefully, a Capo Kane racing syndicate.

BH: What made you want to get into the industry?

LL: A friend of mine said, 'Hey, meet me at the track.' We were up at The Meadowlands and I'm looking down at the paddock and on the TV I see him in the paddock. He gets done and his horse came in dead last but he came up and he said, 'What do you think?' I said, 'I don't know. Looks like a loser to me.' He said, 'Come on, let's get in. You give me some money and I will go buy one.' I gave him \$2,500 and he put up the other \$2,500 and we went and claimed the horse. In today's money that horse went on to make \$276,000. ... And then my first horse I bought was Lady

Katie, who originally was named Blackjack Lady. And I changed the name to Lady Katie; my mother's name is Katherine. And she went on to win \$150,000. She won four in a row. She won the New York Stallion Park Avenue Stakes.

BH: What haven't we touched on that you think people would like to know?

LL: I would love people to understand that this isn't just a game that we play. This is a business. This is something that we have a passion for. Do you want to be a chef and be stuck in a kitchen at 120 degrees? Hell no. But if you've got a passion for cooking, that 120 degrees doesn't bother you. So you know you have to have a passion for what you do, and I don't care whether it's horses, horse racing, caring for the elderly. I don't care. Whatever you do in life, if you don't have a passion for it, go find something else to do because you're going to be one miserable person as you age. I have a passion for it. So do my sons. I have three sons who are operating my construction company. And my wife and I, we love it. We go into the winner's circle. It's just a family thing. I have photos that have 40 people in those win photos.

Drum Roll Please, the first foal out of the accomplished PA-Bred racemare Imply, burst onto the classic scene in splendid fashion in Aqueduct's \$150,000 Jerome Stakes on Jan. 6, scoring with ears pricked by 3 3/4 lengths for his first stakes victory.

Classic hopes were dashed less than two weeks later when the Brad Cox-trainee was injured in a workout at Belmont Park while preparing for the Feb. 3 Withers Stakes-G3. Reported as a sesamoid fracture in his left hind ankle, an expected return will take months following surgery. It will be an eagerly awaited return.

Bred by Larry Karp's Barlar LLC, Drum Roll Please recorded his Jerome victory as the 3-5 favorite in the field of five. The Gold Square runner came in off a solid showing in the Grade 2 Remsen Stakes in early December, his stakes debut, in which he finished third after making a big move from off the pace going 1 1/8 miles, his first start beyond a mile.

The Jerome, run at a one-turn mile over a track labeled fast, but considered deep and slow, saw the favorite at the rear of a tightly-bunched field off slow fractions — an opening quarter in :24.50, the half in :49.06. With Javier Castellano

up, Drum Roll Please was four wide around the turn (after 6 furlongs in 1:14.92) and went wider still for the stretch run, hitting the front with an eighth to go before drawing off. The final time was a pedestian 1:41.91.

"I had the one-hole and I let him break and get good position himself, don't take away anything and don't force it too much. Let him develop," said Castellano. "Everybody rushed a little bit to get the spot. I was able to get a better spot in the race, off the pace. Teach the horse something for the future. I like that idea and it worked out great. Perfect trip behind horses, step outside and let him roll and teach him something. I like the way he did it today."

Although now a mute point, the chestnut colt added 10 Kentucky Derby qualifying points, which upped his total to 13. He had been listed on the Kentucky Derby Future Wager until being scratched.

Cox's New York assistant Dustin Dugas told the media after the race: "We've seen a lot of growth with him physically and mentally in the mornings, so we were expecting something nice from him today, and he showed it. We've always thought he would go all day, and now with that fitness and that physical development, he can."

Gold Square racing manager Joe Hardoon added how pleased he was with the effort. "He got it done. We were a little worried how the track was playing after the first couple races. It looked real deep and slow and hard to pass horses, but he got the job done."

A bit overwhelmed in his debut at Saratoga last July while sprinting on a sloppy track (he was sixth of 10, beaten 5 lengths), the \$250,000 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling Sale purchase was second at a mile next out at the Spa, then broke through with a 2-length score at the Belmont at Aqueduct meet in October as the even-money favorite, completing the mile distance in 1:36.46.

Drum Roll Please is a son of PA-bred star Hard Spun, one of the nation's top sires who consistently ranks in the top 10. His dam is by E Dubai, whom Karp purchased and brought to stand in Pennsylvania in 2011. Imply is from the stallion's second PA-sired crop.

Campaigned under the Barlar banner, \$772,728-earner Imply won 12 of 30 starts, seven stakes, and was the leading Breeding Fund recipient horse of 2019, with bonuses of \$245,375 (including all awards, she earned Barlar a total of \$307,170).

Imply is a year-older half-sister to Barlar-bred and campaigned Advert, a stakes winner of \$230,498. The duo are out of the stakes-placed Orientate mare Allude, whom Karp purchased for \$17,000 at Keeneland November in 2011 in foal Divine Park (the result \$140,490-earner Refer), and sold for \$100,000, in foal to Shackleford, three years later. The female line traces back directly to Sharon Brown, dam Hall of Famer and Horse of the Year Holy Bull.




