PA-SIRED IS THE WAY TO GO

When breeders make decisions about where to breed a mare, the difference between a PA-Sired PA-Bred and a non-PA-Sired PA-Bred can feel subtle on paper. On the racetrack, however, that decision has very real financial consequences. In Pennsylvania, the numbers make a compelling case that PA-Sired is the way to go.

The breeder of a registered PA-Bred receives an award whenever that PA-Bred finishes first, second or third in any pari-mutuel race run in the state. For PA-Breds sired by registered Pennsylvania stallions, the breeder award amounts to 40 percent of the purse earned. For PA-Breds sired by out-of-state stallions, the award is 20 percent. That single distinction, 40 percent versus 20 percent, creates a significant earning gap that compounds over the course of a horse's career.

Owners benefit as well through Pennsylvania's Owner Bonus program, which rewards the owners of PA-Breds finishing first, second or third in designated races at Parx Racing, Penn National and Presque Isle Downs.

Owner bonuses are a percentage of the purse share, are considered part of a horse's official earnings and are deposited directly into owners' accounts when purses are released. Owner bonus percentages vary by track, with Parx Racing currently offering a 40 percent owner bonus, Presque Isle Downs 30 percent and Penn National 25 percent.

To illustrate how quickly the difference adds up, consider a \$50,000 maiden special weight race at Parx Racing. A non-PA-Bred winner earns 60 percent of the purse, or \$30,000, which is the full extent of the earnings tied to that victory. A PA-Bred that is not PA-Sired earns the same \$30,000 purse share, plus a 40 percent owner bonus paid by the track, which equals \$12,000. In addition, the breeder earns 20 percent of the purse share with the owner bonus, or \$8,400, bringing the total earnings tied to that single win to \$50,400.

A PA-Sired PA-Bred earns even more. The owner again earns the same \$42,000. But the breeder awards increase to 40 percent of the purse share, bringing the total to \$58,800 for the same \$50,000 race. Stallion awards further increase the return for eligible Pennsylvania stallions.

That gap widens over time, particularly for breeders. The breeder of record remains the same no matter who subsequently owns the horse, meaning breeder awards continue for the life of the runner as long as it competes in Pennsylvania. Stallion awards are earned when a registered PA-Bred by a registered Pennsylvania stallion finishes first, second or third in the state and also remain tied to the stallion's ownership at the time of conception.

Beyond the raw earnings, PA-Breds also enjoy structural advantages within the racing program itself. After breaking a maiden, PA-Breds have access to allowance races restricted to Pennsylvania-Breds. It is important to note that clearing a condition in a restricted PA-Bred allowance does not count toward that same condition in an open allowance. A PA-Bred can win a non-winners of two races condition in a restricted race and still remain eligible for the open non-winners of two allowance, with the same structure applying at the non-winners of three level.

That advantage is illustrated clearly by Pachelbel, a daughter of Hoppertunity, who was standing in Pennsylvania at the time of her conception, making her a PA-Sired PA-Bred. Racing exclusively at Parx Racing in 2025, she benefited from the track's 40 percent PA-Bred owner bonus and the full PA-Sired breeder award structure.

Pachelbel won five races during the year, progressing through starter and allowance company. Because the allowance races she won earlier in the season were not restricted to PA-Breds, she later remained eligible for a non-winners of two races other than allowance written exclusively for PA-Breds, giving her an additional opportunity to earn at the same condition

level. She also finished second in the \$75,000 Disco Chick Stakes, a race restricted to PA-Sired PA-Breds.

On the racetrack alone, without awards or bonuses, Pachelbel earned \$274,170 in 2025. According to the PHBA's most recent update, her season also generated \$105,911.20 in breeder awards, \$60,208 in owner bonuses and \$26,477.80 in stallion awards. Combined, those incentives added \$132,389 beyond her regular purse earnings, bringing her total 2025 earnings to \$406,559 and placing her atop the Pennsylvania Breeding Fund leaderboard.

Had Pachelbel not been PA-bred, her total earnings for the year would fall from \$274,170 to \$199,112, a difference of \$75,058, in addition to forfeiting the \$132,389 in additional awards.

When viewed race by race, the difference between PA-Sired and non-PA-Sired may appear incremental. But over the course of a season, and especially over the course of a career, the advantage becomes unmistakable. Higher breeder awards, stacked bonuses, stallion incentives and added condition flexibility all point to the same conclusion. For breeders and owners alike, PA-Sired is the way to go. ■

MAILATA TACKLING DERBY DREAMS

*Colt carries name of
another sports figure*

The name Mailata is well known to Philadelphia-area sports fans and is gradually becoming more familiar. Jordan Mailata is a Super Bowl-winning offensive tackle for the Philadelphia Eagles and the four-legged Mailata is the Pennsylvania-bred runaway winner of the Parx Future Stars Stakes on Dec. 30.

The colt also captured the restricted Pennsylvania Nursery Stakes a month earlier.

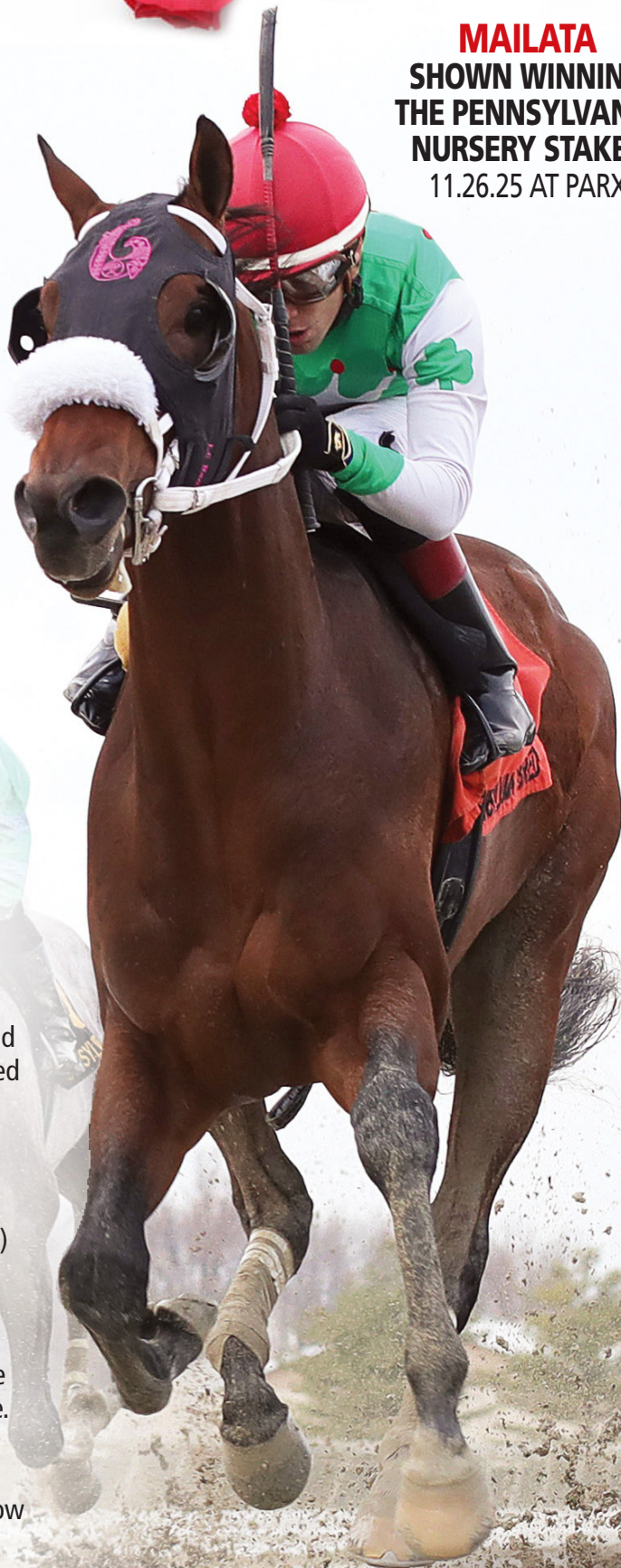
A special name needs a special horse and Mailata scored early on. Glenn Bennett, whose LC Racing bred and campaigns the 3-year-old son of Maximus Mischief with Chuck Zacney's Cash is King, reserved the label for a standout prospect.

Their Kennett Square-based bloodstock advisor Mark Reid was among the first to tab Mailata as a potential star when he was a young foal. Others concurred as Mailata (pronounced "my – lotta") progressed under saddle. And Reid's brother Butch saw his talent when he arrived at his Parx barn for his racing career.

As stadium suite owners, Bennett and Zacney have close ties to the Eagles franchise and are eager for the tackle to meet the racehorse.

"I have been sending win pictures to one of the Eagles employees and he sends them to Jordan," Bennett said. "Hopefully he will show up for one of the big races."

Mailata likely will make his next start in a traditional early steppingstone to the Triple Crown. He has shown promise and improvement in each race, punctuated by his 19-length score in the Parx Future Stars. The race was more of a public workout as he faced only two rivals after six others scratched. After dueling for the early lead, Mailata set sail to increase his advantage under Mychel Sanchez.

The bay overcame adversity in his career debut on Aug. 20. He briefly escaped from his handlers in the saddling paddock and tossed his rider in the warm-up. Despite the antics, he refocused to race mid-pack and finished third. A month later, he was the clear favorite against 11 challengers and checked in fourth after rallying from behind. On Oct. 29, stretching to a 1-mile distance, Mailata unveiled his true promise when he duelled for the early lead before gaining command for 2½-length score with Sanchez in the saddle for the first time. He wrapped up his season with the aforementioned stakes triumphs, both at 7 furlongs, to start inspiring Derby dreams.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Zacney has been on the road to the Kentucky Derby-G1 before as owner of 2005 third-place finisher Afleet Alex. The colt went on to win the Preakness Stakes-G1, Belmont Stakes-G1 and Eclipse Award as champion 3-year-old male. In 12 starts, he banked nearly \$3-million with an 8-2-1 record.

Zacney was still relatively new to the Sport of Kings when Afleet Alex entered his life. He had been involved in out-of-state partnerships but disbanded in 2000. His next acquisition was Afleet Alex, a \$75,000 bargain at the Fasig-Tipton May 2-year-old in training auction in Timonium, Md.

"I consider him my first horse because he was local," Zacney said. "I was at the sale when [trainer] Tim Ritchey was bidding on him."

The experience propelled Zacney to expand his Thoroughbred holdings in search of duplicating Afleet Alex's astounding success. He made a return to the Triple Crown in 2020 as a partner in Ny Traffic, who was unplaced in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness. Zacney was on a parallel path with Cathryn Sophia, winner of the 2016 Kentucky Oaks-G1.

While Afleet Alex, Ny Traffic and Cathryn Sophia were purchased at auctions, Mailata represents an especially close kinship because the owners knew him before he was born. Zacney's connections began when he signed the \$340,000 ticket for an Into Mischief colt at the 2018 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May sale. Known now as Maximus Mischief, he won all three starts at 2, including the Remsen Stakes-G2, for Cash is King and LC Racing. Retiring after his only start at 3, a third-place finish in the Grade 2 Holy Bull in February,

the partners retained some breeding rights when he retired to stud at Spendthrift Farm in Lexington and send him a handful of mares each season.

One of them is Bouquet of Gold, an unplaced daughter of Medaglia d'Oro purchased privately after she did not meet her reserve on a final bid of \$45,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December sale in 2020. She was pregnant to Speightster and the resulting offspring is Pennsylvania-bred Jeanne Marie, who transformed into a stakes-winning earner of nearly \$300,000 for the partnership (through Jan. 24). Her next foal is Mailata. Bouquet of Gold then produced state-bred full siblings to Mailata—a 2-year-old colt now in training and a yearling filly. She has no foal for 2026 and plans for her next mating have not been finalized.

Bennett purchased his first racers in 2012 and estimates he now has a 100-horse portfolio in various partnerships both large and small.

"I'd rather have partners," he said. "It is just more fun to enjoy the experience with other people."

Bennett met Zacney met about seven ago and the duo is no stranger to the big time. One of their recent accomplishments, along with co-owner and trainer Butch Reid, is Pennsylvania-bred Kappa Kappa, winner of the Keeneland's Lexus Raven Run Stakes-G2 in October in her stakes debut. She was a \$65,000 yearling purchase at the 2023 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic fall sale.

Kappa Kappa further fueled Bennett's craving for high-caliber racing.

"You have to cherish those big wins because they don't happen very often," he said. "I am in it to get to the big ones. Trying to make memories for my friends and family."

Both Zacney and Bennett are willing to spend premium prices for premium prospects when the time is right and both think long term by accumulating broodmares. Bennett is especially excited about acquiring the broodmare Adorabella at the 2023 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale for \$550,000. At the time, her first two foals were stakes winners Girl Trouble and Book'em Danno, the latter who excelled further to become the 2025 Eclipse Award Champion Sprinter. She gave Bennett a now yearling Pennsylvania-bred Medaglia d'Oro colt. Her 2026 Forte foal will be born in the Keystone State and she will be bred to Not This Time.

"I keep saying I am going to cut back but I keep getting more," Bennett said. "I always think the next one is 'the' one."

With youngsters at farms, prospects gearing up, runners and stakes winners at the ready and an aspiring Triple Crown racer with a catchy name, Zacney and Bennett have plenty to look forward to this year and beyond.

"I love these beautiful animals," Zacney said. "We are very patient with our horses and give them time off when they need it." ■

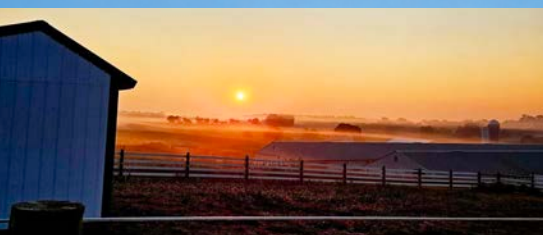

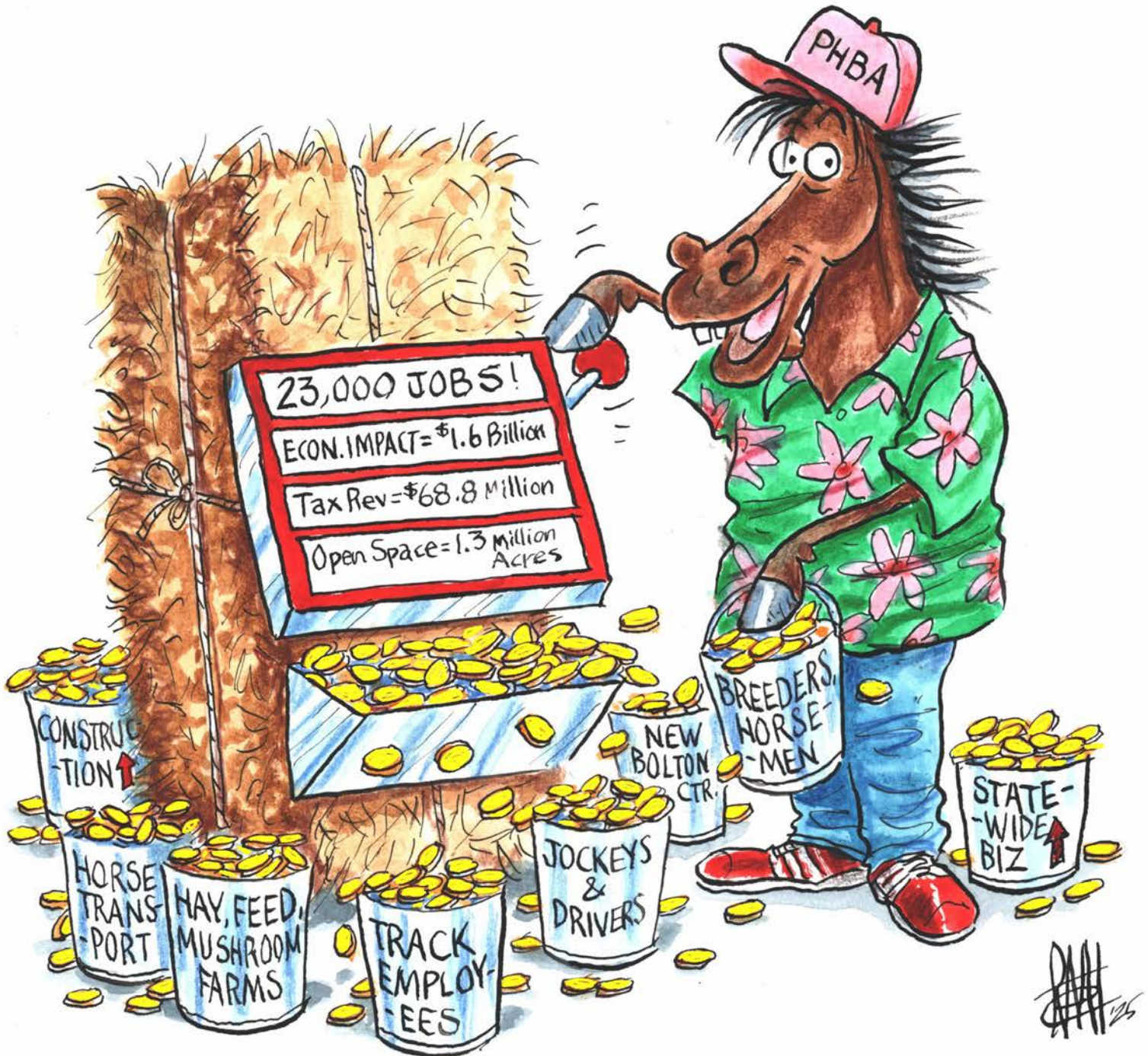

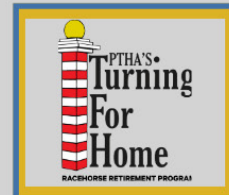
