Breed to a PA stallion and receive 40% in Breeder Awards, up to 40% in Owner Bonuses, eligibility for the PA-Sired, PA-Bred Series, and hundreds of Restricted Races. Wow!

The 2023 PA-Sired PA-Bred Stallion Series just concluded. Congrats to Aoife's Magic (bred by Mohns Hill Farm LLC), Notice of Action (bred by Bryan Minnick) and Jody's Ruby (bred by Gilman Hallenbeck) who finished first, second and third in total number of points for the 2023 Series. They earned their trainers \$25,000, \$15,000 and \$10,000 respectively. The series is being expanded to include 3yos for the 2024-2025 period. For foals of 2022, the \$200 fee due by January 31.

SRE POWER added to 2024 Pennsylvania stallion roster

With breeding season fast approaching, the choices for Pennsylvania broodmare owners have expanded with five exciting new additions to the state's roster. All have solid credentials, and offer breeders the opportunity to have future runners for the rich PA-Sired, PA-Bred Stallion Series.

BEVERLY PARK



Bay, 2017, Munnings—Madeira Park, by Langfuhr Standing his first season at Mountain Springs Farm, Palmyra, PA Stud fee: Private

The winningest horse in North America in 2022, Beverly Park retires with a career record 29 victories (and 19 placings) in 64 starts, for earnings of \$646,655. The durable son of top-10 sire Munnings captured 15 of 30 starts in 2022 while competing at 14 tracks around the country, from Timonium to Fair Grounds, Charles Town to Churchill Downs.

Beverly Park made at least one start a month from July 2021 through April 2023 – twice during the span he competed four times in a single month: in January 2022 – running at Oaklawn, Charles Town, Turfway Park and Laurel Park and winning twice; and November 2022 – at Charles Town, Churchill, back to Charles Town and Mahoning Valley, and again winning twice. Seven times in his career he started three times in a month. At one point he scored in eight straight.

Now 7, the solidly-built bay speedster is out of graded stakes winner and stakes producer Maderia Park from the family of millionaire and Kentucky Derby-G1 runnerup Lookin At Lee.

Gray, 2017, Cairo Prince—Twiggles, by Maria's Mon Standing his first season at Bonner Hill Farms, Littlestown, PA Stud fee: \$15,000 LFSN

A six-time stakes winner of \$578,390, Buy Land and See has been retired by breeder/owner Joseph Imbesi after racing from 2 to 6, winning eight times and placing in seven others in 20 starts, and recording stakes wins on dirt and turf. He won back-to-back runnings of the With Anticipation Stakes over the Penn National turf course by a combined 12 1/4 lengths, and just missed the course record for the 1 1/16 miles in the 2023 running.

During a stretch of seven races from June 2022 to August 2023 he won five times, all stakes, and was named PA-Bred Champion Turf Male for his 2022 season.

The richest runner for his graded stakes-winning sire Cairo Prince (by Pioneerof the Nile), who consistently ranks among the top stallions in the nation, the 7-year-old gray is a half-brother to multiple stakes winner and graded stakes-placed Sweet Bye and Bye, an earner of \$508,560. His winning half-sister, On a Star, is the dam of multiple stakes-winning juvenile and 2022 PA-Bred champion Flor de Sombra. His dam, Twiggles, is a half-sister to two stakes winners including Cara Marie, the dam of graded stakes-winning juvenile filly Girl Daddy, who won twice and was third in the 2020 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Stakes-G1 in three starts and whose first foal sold for \$700,000 as a yearling at Keeneland September in 2023.

Dark bay or Brown, 2014, Maclean's Music—Quick Temper, by A.P. Indy Standing at Pin Oak Lane, New Freedom, PA. Stud fee: \$3,500 LFSN, \$3,000 if sending two mares to any Pin Oak Lane stallions, or \$2,500 for three or more mares.

Pennsylvania is home to another classic winner as Grade 1 Preakness Stakes-winning Grade 1 sire Cloud Computing has moved from Kentucky to stand his first Pennsylvania season. A member of the first crop of the brilliant Maclean's Music (by Distorted Humor), Cloud Computing defeated champion Classic Empire and Kentucky Derby winner Always Dreaming in the Preakness, the fourth start of his career. He won his debut going six furlongs at Aqueduct that February, finished second in the Grade 3 Gotham in his second start and followed with a third in the Grade 2 Wood Memorial. In a career of eight races, he retired with earnings of \$1,125,200.

Standing his first years at Spendthrift Farm, last year he ranked 15th nationally on the second-crop sires list and third among all Pennsylvania sires by progeny earnings with \$2.7 million. His North American winners are led by Super Derby winner Big Data and I'm Very Busy, the latter graded stakes-placed at 2 and 3; from one crop conceived in the Southern Hemisphere while in Chile in 2019, he is represented by Group 1 winner Zajarova and three other stakes performers. His daughter My Witch Asquifar was the 2022 champion imported 2-year-old filly in Mexico and two-time Grade 1 winner.

Cloud Computing is one of five winners for the graded stakesplaced A.P. Indy mare Quick Temper. His second dam, millionaire Halo America (by Waquoit), won the Grade 1 Apple Blossom and eight other stakes, and also produced Marino Marini, a million-dollar sales yearling who became a stakes winner in Ireland and was Grade/Group 1-placed in Ireland and the U.S.

Bay, 2016, Big Brown—Marilyn Monroan, by Tapit Standing his first season at Cabin Creek Gettysburg, Gettysburg, PA Stud fee: \$3,500 LFSN

A graded stakes-winning millionaire son of champion and Kentucky Derby/Preakness winner Big Brown, Somelikeithotbrown won 10 of 33 starts over six seasons, registering eight stakes wins from 3 to 6, while earning \$1,712,893. He scored graded turf wins in the Bernard Baruch Handicap-G2 at Saratoga, the Dinner Party Stakes-G2 while setting the current course record of 1:40.09 for 1 1/16 miles at Pimlico, and the WinStar Mint Million Stakes-G3 at Kentucky Downs, and a Grade 3 win in the Jeff Ruby Steaks over Turfway Park's main track at 3. His 12 placings, all in stakes, included thirds in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf and Keeneland Turf Mile Stakes, both Grade 1.

A half-brother to stakes winner Jolting Joe, he is out of a Tapit mare from the family of Breeders' Cup Juvenile-winning champion 2-year-old Stevie Wonderboy.

Chestnut, 2018, Constitution–Whisper Number, by First Samurai Standing his first season at Blackstone Farm, Pine Grove, PA Stud fee: \$4,000 LFSN

A graded stakes-winning Grade 1-placed millionaire by one of the nation's leading sires, Warrant stands his first season in 2024.

A 6-year-old son of classic sire Constitution (who stands the 2024 season for \$110,000), Warrant was on the board in 15 of his 19 starts over three seasons, won stakes at distances ranging from 1 1/16 miles to 1 1/2 miles, raced at 10 different tracks. and earned \$1,102,833. He captured the \$400,000 Oklahoma Derby-G3 at 3 at Remington Park, one of six consecutive stakes wins or placings, and recorded his first stakes victory in the Texas Derby at Lone Star Park earlier in the year.

The flashy chestnut was eight times stakes-placed, five graded, including a second in the 2022 Santa Anita Handicap-G1 in which he was beaten a head by Express Train after pressing the pace between rivals throughout the 1 1/4-mile fixture. He recorded a career-high 104 Beyer Speed Figure in the impressive performance.

Out of the First Samurai mare Whisper Number, Warrant is a half-brother to graded stakes-winning sprinter and \$675,975-earner Ms Locust Point. Stakes-winning second dam Santerra is also the granddam of 11-time stakes winner and \$1,403,536-earner Mr. Buff. Also found in the family is Grade 1 sprinter Friendly Michelle.

Peace and Justice Offers Versatility Galore

t should come as no surprise that one of the hottest young stallions in Pennsylvania is Peace and Justice. A gorgeous dark chocolate in color, he is the only son of international sire sensation War Front standing in the Keystone State.

Peace and Justice drew attention for his good looks and solid pedigree right from the start. When he was offered as a yearling at Keeneland, he sold for \$425,000. Breeder Jay Bligh and Steve Young of A1A Racing have been involved in his female family for decades, working together to plan the matings that eventually resulted in Peace and Justice.

"This is a family that I have a long relationship with," noted Young. "My longtime client and friend Jay bought (his) granddam, so we have had three generations. I trained Peace and Justice's mother for Jay. Peace and Justice is a horse that was always very special. We believe he had Grade 1 ability." Agent David Ingordo purchased the colt for Justice Family Racing and remembers, "He was a gorgeous yearling with a strong, athletic walk; a really well-balanced War Front colt with a lot of scope. From the first day we put tack on him at Mayberry Farm we always thought he was special."

Peace and Justice raced from coast to coast, winning three times at a mile on the turf for trainer John Shirreffs and boasting Beyer Speed Figures over 95 each time. He defeated stakes winners Drill (Grade 1), My Best Brother (Grade 2) and Quiet Force (Grade 3).

"He had phenomenal ability, winning on the lead in each of his wins from start to finish, going in :22, :44, and 1:08, while running a mile," said Young. "He had terrific mechanics on the racetrack. He had 11 (bullet) workouts on the dirt as well."

When the time came for retirement, Young pounced on the opportunity to buy the stallion back, and he knew right away that Pennsylvania was exactly where he would send Peace and Justice. He also had a unique idea to attract potential breeders: a \$250,000 bonus rewarded to the breeder of the stallion's first stakes winner. He thought it would be a great way to familiarize people in the region with a horse who had never raced there.

"I thought he was a Kentucky-quality stallion and when he was available I knew I had to bring him to Pennsylvania," he said. "He is by War Front and out of a Smart Strike mare named Strike the Sky. None of those horses ran on grass even though Peace and Justice ran only on turf. We felt he would throw dirt horses. That's one of the reasons we brought him to Pennsylvania, because there are three tracks here that offer all three surfaces."

Now that his oldest crop is five years old, it is clear that Young was 100 percent correct. Not only has Peace and Justice sired winners on dirt, turf and all weather, he is most recently the sire of a steeplechase winner. In addition, his runners' lifetime average over \$5,000 per start - exactly his stud fee for 2023.

"The numbers are wild," Young said. "They can run on any surface, including mud. It doesn't seem to matter what the

mare looks like because he is throwing his speed and versatility. Right now he has 16 percent winners on dirt, 17 percent in the slop, and 16 percent 2-year-old wins. If you look at (the A1A Racing mares), it's even higher. This horse is the best sire in Pennsylvania."

Like a Saltshaker (dam by Harlan's Holiday) was Peace and Justice's first winner and first stakes winner. Now 6, the gelding also truly represents a racehorse who can run on anything. With a career record of 12 wins from 28 starts (through mid-December), Like a Saltshaker has earned nearly \$400,000 over three different surfaces and 11 racetracks. He captured the \$75,000 Fitz Dixon Jr. Memorial Juvenile Stakes at Presque Isle Downs over the all-weather track at 2, and then was second in the \$80,000 Awad Stakes at Belmont Park on a yielding turf course in his very first attempt on grass. Another stakes placing occurred as a 3-year-old at Parx Racing in the \$100,000 Crowd Pleaser Stakes, which was taken off the turf due to weather conditions, and Like a Saltshaker finished second going long over the wet track, making him a three-time stakes horse on all three surfaces. Thus far in his career, he has won races at Presque Isle Downs (4x), Churchill Downs (3x), Hawthorne Race Course (3x), Horseshoe Indianapolis (1x) and Keeneland (1x).

Dontlookbackatall (out of an Arch mare) was a \$150,000 2-year-old purchase in 2022 who races on the national scene. Under the tutelage of Christophe Clement, she won first time out in a 5½ furlong maiden special weight on the turf at Saratoga Race Course as a 2-year-old and was fourth in her other two starts, both New York stakes, including the Grade 3 Matron. Last year Dontlookbackatall captured an allowance on dirt at Parx Racing in July, was second in her next two starts on turf at Saratoga and Belmont at the Big A, and in her final start of the year stepped it up in class with a second-place finish on turf in the \$125,000 Glen

Cove Stakes in New York in October. In nine lifetime starts, she's finished first or second seven times while earning \$222,590.

And then there's Lightning Ridge (out of a Point Given daughter), who not only won on the dirt but has now turned into a promising steeplechaser with top trainer Keri Brion, who has had him since the beginning. Lightning Ridge made his jumping debut a winning one, drawing off to score by 6³/₄ lengths, with "fluent jumping" skills, at Shawan Downs in September. On Nov. 12 at Charleston, he absolutely destroyed a field of 3-year-olds, capturing the Alston Cup by an emphatic 21 lengths.

The future looks just as promising

for Peace and Justice; his most recent crop of juveniles to race were phenomenal. Force of Justice (Mineshaft) recorded two wins, including a front-running 9 ¹/₄-length allowance victory at Charles Town (through mid-December). And Steve Young is especially excited about debut winner Blameitonmymomma (Congrats).

But his best 2-year-old of 2023 was Capo (Majestic Warrior), who became Peace and Justice's second stakes winner in a roundabout way. Bred by A1A Racing, Capo finished fourth for A1A Racing and trainer Larry Rivelli's Down The Stretch Racing Stables in his career debut at Presque Isle Downs in August. He then shipped down to Kentucky, where he blew

away the competition at Churchill Downs by 3 ½ lengths. According to Young, Capo galloped out many lengths in front and should be a horse that will love longer distances.

His best race would be his next start, when he returned to Pennsylvania under new connections – having been claimed out of the Churchill Downs race by Jacinto Solis – and ran in the \$100,000 Pennsylvania Nursery Stakes. Capo rolled back after less than a month to win by a hard fought nose. If that race name is familiar, that's because Smarty Jones won it exactly two decades ago.

> On another note, Peace and Justice is already stepping on the map for future sport horse prospects. While most are still on the track, it is exciting to see that several retirees have already shown promise in second careers. Amelia Jean Foster of Cannonbrook Farms in Lexington, Ky., has a 4-year-old in for retraining and has nothing but praise about her.

"She is sound and personable, with great gaits," said Foster. "She's sweet to handle and the sky's the limit for career number two!"

Cathy Howard adopted Jack n' Ice (Lion Heart), a member of the stallion's first crop, a few years ago. "Jackie is smart, brave,

responsive to cues and a dream to ride. With each ride she keeps improving by leaps! She is a special girl for sure. I can't wait to see what she brings to the table."

Without a doubt, Peace and Justice is one of the most versatile stallions in the country and the state of Pennsylvania is lucky to have him available to breeders. This is all thanks to Steve Young and Blackstone Farm in Pine Grove, where he stands for \$5,000.

When asked about the Pennsylvania breeding program, Young had plenty of praise. "I think it is the most amazing breeding program in America. Pennsylvania has a ton of potential and the sky is the limit for the future!"

Pushing ever closer to the million-dollar mark in career earnings, LC Racing, Cash is King and Gary Barber's Morning Matcha concluded her 4-year-old campaign as it began – with a stakes win – after taking the \$125,000 Staten Island division of the New York Stallion Stakes Series at Aqueduct on Dec. 3.

Eligible for the 7-furlong event for state-sired fillies and mares as a daughter of New York's three-time leading sire Central Banker, Morning Matcha had run in the series before, when second as the even-money favorite in the \$500,000 division in 2021 for 2-year-old fillies. Sent off the 3-4 favorite in 2023, the bay bided her time in last going down the backstretch after breaking a step slow, rallied five-wide as the six fillies and mares headed into the stretch, and flew down the lane over the sloppy track to win by 3 3/4 lengths under rider Mychel Sanchez.

Trainer Butch Reid noted about her trip after the race: "You can't change her game. She doesn't like to be rushed. She likes to be held together for the first quarter of a mile and then you can go ahead and do what you want with her."



The 2022 PA-Bred champion 3-year-old filly off a year in which she became a stakes winner and placed in five stakes, three graded, including a second in the Grade 1 Cotillion, Morning Matcha kicked off her 4-year-old season with an easy 2-length victory over Disco Ebo in the Unique Bella Stakes at Parx in April.

Taking aim at the Grade 2 Delaware Handicap in July, she missed by a nose in a Del' Cap prep, the Obeah Stakes, in May, and finished third behind Eclipse Award favorite Idiomatic in the featured event itself.

In seven starts during the year, all stakes, Morning Matcha also finished second in the Plum Pretty at Parx in September and third in Aqueduct's Turnback the Alarm in November. Her only off-the-board finish was a dismal turf attempt in the Mrs. Penny as the favorite in the field of 13.

Reid told the New York media department she will race exclusively on dirt in the future.

"No more turf. We can eliminate that possibility," he said. "That's the only bad race of her whole career, I believe."

Morning Matcha was bred by Crane Thoroughbred Services LLC and is the only PA-Bred from six named foals out of stakesplaced Home Ice. Clovis Crane purchased California-bred Home Ice (by Iam the Iceman), under the name 4 Little Monkeys (an entity named for the Crane kids Amara, Dalia, Rosey and Coy), for \$3,500 at the 2018 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December mixed sale with Morning Matcha in utero. "She was a big, strong, pretty mare, and in foal to Central Banker [whose oldest crop were 2-year-olds]," said Crane following Morning Matcha's first stakes win. "I had seen his foals and thought he'd be a good stallion. And the mare could run. We bought her for next to nothing and took a chance." Home Ice died in 2020 without producing another foal.

Morning Matcha now has lifetime earnings of \$899,740 with a record of 24-6-7-7. She was purchased for \$18,000 out of the 2020 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic October yearling sale by LC Racing.

"Not bad for a little \$18,000 purchase," said Reid. "She's been a godsend and just the easiest filly to train. She loves everything about training and racing. She's a real pleasure to train."

Smarty Jones' daughter Aoife's Magic kept her perfect record intact with a blowout victory in the \$200,000 Miss Behaviour Stakes for PA-Sired, PA-Bred juvenile fillies on Dec. 27 at Parx.

Seeing a wet track for the third time in her four-start career, the blaze-faced chestnut was challenged for the lead from the start as the field of eight crawled through fractions of :24.13, :50.83, 1:17.95 and 1:46.60. Set down for the drive to the finish, Aoife's Magic proved strongest of all and coasted 3 lengths clear of longshot Mary's Reward. Final time for the mile and 70 yards was 1:51.38.

Trained by David Dotolo for A and J Racing Stable, Aoife's Magic has won all four of her starts by daylight margins. She dominated by 10 3/4 lengths in her debut at Parx on Sept. 11 on a track labeled good, and returned 12 days later to capture the \$150,000 Imply for PA-Sired, PA-Bred juvenile fillies by 4 1/4 lengths over sloppy going.

Her first fast track start was a Parx allowance on Nov. 15 going 6 furlongs – she won ridden out by 4 1/4 lengths.

Bred by Mohns Hill Farm LLC, the filly is a fifth-generation PA-Bred who traces back to the Jonathan Sheppard-bred Frankie and Johnny. Aoife's Magic's fourth dam, Lonely Balladier, was a multiple stakes winner bred and campaigned by Sheppard and William L. Pape.

Aoife's Magic is the second named foal, and second winner, out of the winning Drosselmeyer mare Polarized, who has a just-turned yearling filly by Smarty Jones and was bred back to the champion for 2024.

Purchased by her owner for \$16,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall Yearling Sale, Aoife's Magic now has earnings of \$261,600.

The conclusion of the rich 2023 PA-Bred PA-Sired 2-year-old series saw a newcomer emerge, as Milam Racing Stables' Uncle Heavy rallied to overtake Notice of Action and win the \$200,000-guaranteed Wait For It Stakes on Dec. 27 at Parx.

Making his third career start, Uncle Heavy was sent off the second choice at 1.30-1, with Prince Lucky Stakes winner Notice of Action the slight favorite at 1.20-1. Notice of Action looked to be in the best position to reward his backers as he sat just off the early pace while Uncle Heavy broke a step slow and was kept wide throughout from his eight-post, a few lengths back in the third-flight of the nine-horse field through the opening fractions.

Notice of Action spurted away to a daylight lead rounding the far turn of the mile and 70-yard test run over a sealed track as Mychel Sanchez sent a grinding Uncle Heavy wide entering the stretch, then dove to the inside. The two favorites raced as a team for a few strides before Uncle Heavy edged away late to win by 1 1/4 lengths. It was more than 4 lengths back to third-place finisher Addyson's Dream. The final time was 1:48.68, more than two and a half seconds faster than the fillies ran one race earlier.

Uncle Heavy is a member of the second PA-sired crop by former Diamond B Farm stallion Social Inclusion, who stood three seasons in the state (through the 2021 season) before



moving to Florida. Bred by Barbara Reid and trained by her brother-in-law Butch Reid, Uncle Heavy is the second foal out of the Tiz Wonderful are Expect Wonderful, who was purchased with the stakes winner in utero for \$1,700 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December mixed sale in 2020.

Mike Milam, racing under the nom-de-course Milam Racing Stables, purchased Uncle Heavy privately from his breeder. "His father was an original client of my brother Mark," said Butch Reid, who also trains Milam's 2023 Mrs. Penny Stakes winner and two-time graded stakes-placed Neecie Marie. Milam's runners made 18 starts in 2023, winning eight times, with three seconds and two thirds. All are PA-breds.

Uncle Heavy, who didn't make his first start until late October, is a "big, strong colt with a big, long stride," said Reid. "We had our eyes on a route race."

Uncle Heavy broke his maiden first out, at 6 furlongs, by a neck in an open maiden special weight at Parx. He was tested next out in the Pennsylvania Nursery Stakes on Nov. 28. Sent off the 1.20-1 favorite in the field of nine, a poor start, in which he ducked in sharply, negated his chances and he wound up fifth.

By getting his second win, and first in a stakes, Uncle Heavy increased his earnings to \$156,080. He is the second of two winners for Expect Wonderful, whose first foal, Roan Burgundy (by The Factor and bred in Pennsylvania by Smart Angle LLP), is a two-time winner of \$73,610 and also won his debut at 2. The mare's most recent reported foal is a 2022 May colt by Peace and Justice. She was bred the past two years to Weigelia.

GIN TALKING S LRL, \$100,000, 2YOF, 7F, 12-30. WON - CARMELINA

f, 2, Maximus Mischief–Complete St., by St Averil. (\$44,000 2021 FTMDEC) O-Cash is King LLC and LC Racing LLC, B-Lillith E. Boucher (PA), T-Robert E. Reid Jr., J-Sheldon Russell, \$60,000.

Carmelina continued her trek up and down the East Coast when shipping to Laurel for the Gin Talking Stakes on Dec. 30 and dispatching her five rivals with a 2-length score. It was her third stakes win, and fourth win overall in six 2-year-old starts, and pushed her earnings to \$221,800. Owned by Cash is King LLC and LC Racing LLC, the bay daughter of Maximus Mischief is trained by Butch Reid Jr., who also trained her sire for the same connections. Reid related to the media immediately after the race: "Unfortunately we've had to go all over the East Coast to kind of find races for her but she's gotten better with each start.

"Today was a very professional effort by her. She rated very nicely. I actually thought she was going to run off and be a little further in front, but she rated well and Sheldon did a fantastic job, and she finished well for him."



After breaking sharply in the 7-furlong test, Carmelina coasted to the lead with favorite Cap Classique, winner of Laurel's Smart Halo Stakes in her previous start, at her right hip. She went the first quarter in :23.12 and the half in :46.15. "I thought she'd be a little easier in front, to be honest with you. I didn't see a lot of speed in the race," Reid said. "... It's good to see her be resilient and fight back like that."

Hitting 6 furlongs in 1:11.24, Carmelina edged away down the stretch, with Cap Classique being a daylight second over New York shipper Munny Grab. The final time was 1:24.83.

It was the second stakes win in a row for Carmelina, who dominated on Thanksgiving eve in Penn National's Shamrock Rose Stakes by nearly 9 lengths.

She was the first PA-Bred 2-year-old stakes winner of 2023 when winning the Keswick Stakes at Colonial Downs on Aug. 5. Her first win came in her debut, a maiden special weight at Parx, on June 18.

As to what's up next for the filly, Reid noted: "We're taking it one step at a time. I trained her father, and her father got a mile and eighth without any problems, and her mother was actually a turf horse, which is why we came down for the Selima and tried her on the turf, which was a failed experiment, unfortunately. We're going to see just how far she can go and stretch her out step by step."

Purchased as a weanling out of the Gracie Bloodstock consignment by Charles J. Zacney for \$44,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December mixed sale, Carmelina is from the first crop of Maximus Mischief, who ended 2023 as the second-ranked freshman sire in the nation. Lillith E. Boucher bred the filly out of Complete St. (by St Averil), a multiple stakes winner Boucher trained through seven seasons and 42 starts. Complete St. won or placed 17 times and earned \$283,030.

Complete St. raced through age 9, the last race (May 2019) while in foal to Jump Start. That foal died in 2020 – Carmelina is the mare's first live foal. The mare's second foal is a PA-Bred 2-year-old colt by Golden Lad.


