Caravel, bred by Liz Merryman, beat the boys once again, taking the Grade 1 Jaipur Stakes and guaranteeing a spot in this year's Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. Wow, what a mare! Angel of Empire, bred by Christian Black, finished a valiant fourth in the Belmont after running wide almost the entire race. He's definitely full of heart! Congrats to all the connections.

Please remember to nominate your horses for PA Day at the Races! July 10th is the early nomination date. Please remember that if your horse is already nominated for the 2yo PA-Sired Pa-Bred Stallion Series, you still MUST CALL the PARX racing office to submit your nomination by July 10.



The PA-Bred PA-Sired 2yo Stallion Series begins next month. The first two stakes in the \$1,000,000 series will be run on Aug. 21, PA Day at the Races. Don't forget about the \$50,000 series trainer bonus for the top three point-earning horses. Nominations for the 2023 series for 2yos, nominations for the Series are now \$5,000. You can go to pabred.com under 'Horses Nominated' to see if your horse is on the list. If not, go to 'Forms' and print the nomination form. Don't have a PA-Sired PA-Bred? Contact a Pa Breeder by looking at our 2023 Stallion & Boarding Farm Directory.

Last call for Broodmares that were not in the state by Dec. 1, 2022, or within 14 days of a public sale (within 60 days of a sale outside the U.S.). They must be bred back to a PA-Sire. We ask that you submit all broodmare domicile forms online. As usual, please contact our office with any questions you may have. Pennsylvania is the only place to Breed & Race! Have a great second half of 2023 and Go PA!

When Caravel was an unraced 2-year-old in training at Fair Hill, her exercise rider boldly told owner/trainer/breeder Elizabeth Merryman, "This is a Breeders' Cup horse!" Hearing those words put the lofty idea in Merryman's mind early. That exercise rider had regularly ridden 2008 Eclipse Award Champion Grass Mare Forever Together, who captured the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf-G1 the same year, so she knew the caliber of horse required to win the biggest races of the year.

Merryman acquired Caravel's dam Zeezee Zoomzoom from a friend who called to tell her about a Congrats mare in Florida that was being retired from racing due to a tendon injury. She was interested in "Zeezee" so she had the mare shipped to Kentucky where she was bred to Mizzen Mast. Merryman chose the stallion because he was an affordable option and, while he was not a flashy sire at the sales, she wanted foals that she could raise and race herself. She also had a sneaking suspicion that her new mare just might be a turf producer.

"I had never taken a mare for free but I liked her pedigree enough to ship her back home after she was bred," said Merryman. "When Zeezee got here she was absolutely wild and I thought, 'What am I going to do with this?' She was going after the other mares in the field and was the alpha right away."

Zeezee Zoomzoom gave birth on Merryman's Pennsylvania farm on March 1, 2017, producing a dark bay filly that would eventually lighten to a flashy dapple gray. Merryman had hoped that Zeezee would calm down with a foal of her own but that was not the case at all. She was mean to her foal, though not quite to the extent that the two needed to be separated. The young filly who would be named Caravel learned to stick up for herself early and that carried forward into her racing career, especially during grueling stretch drives.

"I keep a journal for myself and I recently looked back to see what I wrote about Caravel," Merryman said. "I had written that she was the nicest foal I'd ever had. She was so sweet but really learned how to be tough from the start."

When Caravel debuted as a 3-year-old at Penn National Race Course June 24, she showed that tenacity, remembered Merryman.

"The gate opened and she just stood there. I was shocked since she had always been quick to break in training and I really thought she was going to be a nice racehorse. She was looking

around and suddenly realized, 'Oh, I'm supposed to go fast?' She was far behind but caught up to them and flew right past everyone!"

After being last of 10 and nearly a dozen lengths behind early, Caravel won that 5½-furlong maiden special weight by 1¼ lengths and became a star in Pennsylvania with victories including the \$75,000 Lake Erie Stakes and the PA-Bred \$80,000 Malvern Rose Stakes at Presque Isle.

At that time, Merryman placed Caravel in her daughter Liza Hendrik's new online auction website called Wanamaker's, setting a "dream price" as the reserve. She really didn't want to sell Caravel but she was concerned that personal health issues might affect her ability to properly train such a talented filly. Her son McLane Hendriks was learning but wasn't

quite ready to take over for Elizabeth as a trainer.

"We received calls from all over the country and a lot of people did pre-purchase exams on her," said Merryman. "She ended up not hitting her reserve but I did work out a deal with someone where I kept 25 percent of her. She moved to Graham Motion's barn so I was happy since he's good with turf horses."

Before the trainer transfer, Merryman also sent Caravel to victories in the \$100,000 The Very One Stakes, \$78,000 Goldwood Stakes and the Grade 3 \$200,000 Caress Stakes at Saratoga.

Unfortunately, after moving to the new barn Caravel was not very successful. She did contest the 2021 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint-G1 at Del Mar but finished last of 12. Her majority owner decided to sell her a few days later at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky's The November Sale. Merryman was very disappointed and along with a partner tried to buy back Caravel, however they were outbid in the end.

"I was afraid that she would be retired as a broodmare after the sale," Merryman said. "I thought she had a lot more potential and she should get another shot at the Breeders' Cup. But the great thing is, now I have a close relationship with her owners

and they keep me informed and involved with everything."

Those owners are Qatar Racing, Marc Detampel and Madaket Stables LLC, and Caravel is now trained by Brad Cox. Since their purchase, the PA-Bred has won eight of 11 starts, including a brilliant 43-1 upset victory against the boys in the 2022 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint-G1, making Merryman's dream come true.

The best part is that Caravel stayed in training for her 6-year-old campaign this year. She is undefeated in three 2023 starts including two graded stakes wins against the boys. Most recently she held off 13 competitors to capture the Grade 1 Jaipur Stakes by three-quarters of a length on Belmont Stakes Day, a Breeders' Cup Challenge Series "Win and

You're In" race for the Turf Sprint.

There was a brief period of time in which her connections considered sending her across the Atlantic Ocean to race at the prestigious Royal Ascot meet. Running a PA-Bred against the very best turf horses in the world was a truly exciting idea, but in the end she stayed stateside for the Jaipur with an even better goal in mind. Caravel is en route to Santa Anita Park in November where she will seek to defend her title in the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. With luck, talent and tenacity, Caravel just may indeed make even more Breeders' Cup dreams come true.

## PA-BRED BELMONT WINNERS Are Historical Treasures

Angel of Empire contested this year's Triple Crown carrying the hopes of all Pennsylvania breeders. The son of Hard Spun, looking to become the first Kentucky Derby-G1 winner since Smarty Jones in 2004, ran one of the best races of his life, finishing third by a length and a half.

The colt then rested and prepared for the Grade 1 Belmont Stakes. It has been over a century since the last PA-Bred captured "The Test of Champions" so Angel of Empire was up against history. The colt ended up in a dead heat for fourth, beaten just over two lengths.

The incredible length of time since a Pennsylvania-bred has captured the Belmont Stakes makes one wonder what it was like 132 years ago when Foxford won in 1891, or when the very first PA-Bred, named Saunterer, won

the race in 1881. In between Panique captured the 1884 running – the only PA-Breds to win the classic

did it in just over a decade.

All three of these horses contested the Belmont Stakes in a completely different era. Unlike many stakes races over the years, the Belmont Stakes has never changed its name. It honors financier and Hall

of Fame racehorse owner and breeder Augustus Belmont I. The inaugural running in 1867 was contested at one and fiveeighths miles going the European style of clockwise, both of which were not officially changed until 1927 and 1921, respectively. So interestingly, all three PA-Breds captured the Belmont Stakes while racing clockwise.

The original location was at Jerome Park in the Bronx and the first Belmont Stakes winner was the filly Ruthless. Jerome Park, which is now remembered by a January Triple Crown trail race called the Jerome Stakes, was named for Leonard Jerome, whose grandson was the great Winston Churchill.

On June 7, 1881, a chestnut colt named Saunterer became the first Pennsylvania-bred winner of the Belmont Stakes. Going clockwise at a mile and a half, the son of \*Leamington out of the Lexington mare Lemonade won by a neck over Eole, with Baltic another half length back in third. The purse was \$3,000, a fortune at the time. Saunterer was ridden to victory by Tom Costello for Hall of Fame trainer R. Wyndham Walden and owner George L. Lorillard. The colt also captured that year's Preakness Stakes run 12 days earlier.

Saunterer was bred by Aristides Welch, owner of Erdenheim Farm in Chestnut Hill, Pa. Welch had recently acquired the older, proven stallion \*Leamington. The brown stallion found the perfect home at Erdenheim, where he was heavily supported by Welch and his colleagues. Welch's friend H. Price McGrath of McGrathiana Stud in Kentucky used \*Leamington during the horse's first season in Pennsylvania. The resulting foal was named for McGrath's friend Aristides and the colt went on to win the very first running of the Kentucky Derby in 1875.

\*Leamington lived at Erdenheim Farm until his death on May 6, 1878. He was the leading sire in the United States four times, including when he defeated 16-time leader Lexington in 1875. In addition to Saunterer and Aristides, \*Leamington also sired Pennsylvania-breds Iroquois, the first American-bred horse to win the Epsom Derby, 1879 Preakness Stakes winner Harold and National Museum of Racing Hall of Famer Parole, and top sires Longfellow (another Hall of Famer) and Eolus.

Interestingly, Iroquois and Harold were full brothers out of the quality Erdenheim Farm broodmare Maggie B.B. The mare also produced Belmont winner Panique, who was sired by another Erdenheim Farm stallion named Alarm. Panique captured his Belmont by a half length over Preakness Stakes winner Knight of Ellerslie; the purse was \$3,150 despite it being a four-horse field.

Panique was trained by Hall of Famer James G. Rowe Sr. and ridden by Hall of Fame jockey James McLaughlin, who captured six of seven straight Belmont Stakes starting in 1882. The chestnut colt was owned by the Dwyer Brothers, Phil and Mike, who rode McLaughlin on each of their five Belmont-winning horses. The Dwyer Brothers also won the Kentucky Derby twice, the Preakness

Stakes once and the Travers Stakes five times. This year, Belmont hosted the 100th edition of the Dwyer Stakes, named in honor of the brothers.

In 1890, the Belmont Stakes moved to nearby Morris Park Race-course, also in the Bronx. One year later, third choice Foxford captured the mile and a quarter Belmont Stakes, as usual going clockwise. The son of Stratford (a son of \*Leamington) won by a neck over odd-on favorite Montana. The purse had surged to \$5,070. Foxford was owned by C.E. Rand and trained by Michael Donavan. His rider, Edward "Snapper" Garrison, is also in the Hall of Fame.

Foxford was bred by Alexander Johnston "A.J." Cassatt. The prominent civil engineer for the Pennsylvania Railroad had a love for racehorses and foxhunting, so he purchased land and created Chesterbrook Farm in Berwyn, Pa. Cassatt did sell many of his foals but also raced under the pseudonym Mr. Kelso or Kelso Stable. As an owner he cheered on 1886 Preakness winner The Bard and 1889 Belmont winner Fric.

In addition, Cassatt helped found the National Steeplechase Association. His personal life was like a fairy tale, as his wife Lois was the niece of James Buchanan, the 15th President of the United States. His and Lois's extended family included songwriter Stephen Foster and A.J.'s sister was impressionist painter Mary Cassatt.

Both Erdenheim Farm and Chesterbrook Farm still exist, though in much smaller pieces. Cassatt's Chesterbrook Farm has been turned into a subdivision but one of the farmhouses remains today. Aristides Welch's Erdenheim Farm has been through several different ownership changes, but a fairly large part of the original farm still is working. Over the years it has been home to a multitude of livestock, including cows, chickens, pigs and purebred show horses. The farm is currently run by the McCausland family and they are returning to the farm's roots - raising Thoroughbreds.

There will be a day when another Pennsylvania-bred captures the prestigious Belmont Stakes-G1, hailing from lush green Pennsylvania fields.

Caravel's timing is perfect. The 2022 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint-G1 champ recorded her second stakes win on a classic weekend, the most recent — and most important — on Belmont Stakes Day (June 10) at Belmont Park when taking the Grade 1 Jaipur Stakes over a large field of male rivals. The win solidified her standing as the best turf sprinter in the nation, male or female, and put her squarely on the NTRA's Top-10 Thoroughbred Poll. The Jaipur is also a Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" race, which guarantees her a spot in this year's Turf Sprint, along with free entry.

For the first time since last October's Franklin Stakes-G3, the start of her current five-stakes win streak, Caravel didn't get the lead at the start. Breaking from post 11, she chased Nothing Better from the outside through fractions of :22.19 and :44.80.

Well in hand as she rounded the far turn, she took command at the top of the stretch and charged to the finish, holding off all late runners and winning by nearly a length. Her final time for the six furlongs on the firm turf was 1:07.93. It was exactly one year earlier that she last ran at the six-furlong distance, also resulting in a win. That came in Belmont's Intercontinental Stakes-G3 for fillies and mares — in a final time of 1:07.59.

The incredibly consistent 6-year-old daughter of Mizzen Mast bred by Liz Merryman, owned by Qatar Racing LLC, Marc Detampel and Madaket Stables LLC and trained by Brad Cox, now has earnings of \$1,897,577, with 15 wins from 23 starts.

The first four foals for her dam, two-time PA Broodmare of the Year Zeezee Zoomzoom (by Congrats), have raced and won, including multiple stakes winner and \$337,460-earner Witty. Zeezee Zoomzoom's current 2-year-old is a Great Notion colt named Enzo.

When the young broodmare Distinct Sparkle was purchased in a private sale by Pennsylvania-based Morell Bloodstock after walking through the ring at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky's Winter Mixed sale in February 2019, she had two named foals of racing age. Her first was a winner, the second was unplaced. In foal to Grade 1 winner Constitution, the then 9-year-old mare was from a nice family of stakes performers that, going back, included Breeders' Cup Sprint-G1 winner Very Subtle. She cost \$23,000.

Two months later, Dr. Roberta Schneider became the breeder of a Constitution filly out of Distinct Sparkle. And ever since, things have been blossoming in the mare's family. Heartyconstitution, born in April 2019, recorded her first stakes win in Penn National's Lyphard Stakes on June 2. The overwhelming favorite in the field of nine, going off at 1-10, she powered home a one and a half-length winner in the mile and a sixteenth turf test. Irad Ortiz Jr. settled her mid-pack early, angled her out on the turn and by the time they hit the stretch the race was over. She kicked home in 1:39.76 over the firm going.

Based in Kentucky with trainer Joe Sharp, Heartyconstitution races for Wayne Sanders and Highlander Training Center, owned by Larry Hirsch. It was Sanders and Hirsch who spent \$200,000 for the filly at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale in 2020. It was the third time that year she walked through the ring — in January at Keeneland she sold for \$165,000 to Canaan Creek Stables. When Covid delayed the Fasig-Tipton summer sales, she went to the Selected Yearling Showcase that September but returned a \$150,000 RNA.

Heartyconstitution made her debut at Oaklawn Park in January of her 3-year-old season and finished a solid third, then broke her maiden easily the next month. It was decided to try stakes company and she appeared in the Grade 3 Fantasy five weeks later, her first start around two turns. It's the only time in her eight starts she was off the board, as she faded to finish sixth of eight. In her final start of the year, she was stakes-placed at Churchill Downs last July in the Tepin behind multiple graded stakes winner Wicked Halo.

She kicked off 2023 with allowance wins at Fair Grounds in March, at the Lyphard distance on the turf, and Churchill in May, going a mile on the main track. The Lyphard score made it 3-for-3 and increased her earnings to \$248,620.

Schneider, a current PHBA director, has Heartyconstitution's 3-year-old half-brother by Hoppertunity named Tudox Opportunity in training with Penn National-based Elisha Perez. Tudox Opportunity made his debut at Penn National on June 30 and drew off to win by two lengths. Distinct Sparkle produced a filly by Weigelia in 2022 and was bred back to Union Rags

And as for those first two foals? Chateau, the winner at the time, became one of the top sprinters on the East Coast in 2021 and 2022, captured the Grade 3 Tom Fool at Aqueduct, placed in four graded stakes and has earned \$727,219. The second, Dazzle Me, went on to win 12 times and earn \$221,916.

Buy Land and See turned in a monster performance in his 6-year-old debut, just missing a 43-year-old course record when repeating in the With Anticipation Stakes on June 2 at Penn National.

Powering to the front under Mychel Sanchez as soon as the gates opened, Joseph Imbesi's flashy gray homebred dominated every step of the mile and a sixteenth turf test. Cruising easily through early fractions of :23.41 and :46.29, he turned on the afterburners, hitting six furlongs in 1:09.08 over the firm course. He got the mile in 1:32.13 as he opened up by five lengths and finished ridden out in 1:38.07, just .07 off the course record set by Told in 1980.

In the 2022 With Anticipation, he dominated over a soft course, winning by nearly seven lengths and running the same distance in 1:50.

A turf-loving gray son of Cairo Prince now trained by Guadalupe Preciado, Buy Land and See improved his record to seven wins in 17 starts, with six placings, for earnings of \$503,070. The With Anticipation is his third stakes in a row, after taking the Alphabet Soup Handicap last September and the M.P. Ballezzi Appreciation Mile in October, both at Parx, the latter on the main track.

Buy Land and See launched his career at 2 with trainer Steve Klesaris and won Belmont Park's Awad Stakes at a mile on the turf that season.

There was a nine-month break between his last start at 2 and first at 3, and he had another long break between 3 and 4 when off for nearly a year. When he came back he was with trainer Tony Dutrow, who sent him out in last year's With Anticipation.

He is one of five winners for his dam Twiggles (by Maria's Mon), and her second stakes winner. Two years earlier she produced Sweet Bye and Bye, a Sky Mesa filly who earned \$508,560 with eight wins, four seconds and four thirds from 21 starts, eight in stakes, was multiple graded stakesplaced, and counted wins in the Crowd Pleaser Stakes against males, and Gulfstream Park's Sand Springs Stakes.

Imbesi had purchased Twiggles as a yearling at Keeneland September for \$5,000. Her six starters (from seven foals) have earned a total of \$1,464,570. Her first foal, the \$138,414-earner On a Star, is the dam of 2022 PA-Bred 2-year-old filly champion Flor de Sombra.

Gordian Knot, the PA-Bred champion 2-year-old male and PA-preferred male, posted a sensational three wins and a third in four starts in 2022, scoring in two stakes before placing in the Pennsylvania Nursery to complete his championship campaign, all at Pennsylvania tracks.

A son of former Pennsylvania sire Social Inclusion, who now stands in Florida, Gordian Knot kicked off his 3-year-old season in March at Gulfstream Park and finished sixth of seven in the Texas Glitter Stakes while sprinting on the turf. Trainer Guadalupe Preciado shipped him back north, put him in against state-breds on the dirt on June 2 in the six-furlong Danzig Stakes at Penn National, and got him back to his winning ways.

The 7-10 favorite against four others, Gordian Knot broke from his inside post and was settled off the early pace along the rail by Silvestre Gonzalez, as the field raced through fractions of :22.95 and :46.62. Heading into the far turn, Gonzalez shifted the bay gelding five-wide, looped him around the three rivals in front as they took the lead into the stretch and gradually pulled away to win by one and three-quarters lengths in 1:11.52.

With four wins in six starts, including last year's Prince Lucky and Mark McDermott Stakes, Joe Imbesi's bay gelding now has earnings of \$306,800. He's the only winner from three foals of racing age for Mia, a winning daughter of Put It Back who has been bred solely to Social Inclusion. Mia's current 2-year-old is a PA-Bred chestnut filly named Flamingo Way.


Gregory and Caroline Bentley's Runnymoore Racing homebred Late Frost is a star on the rise. In the first start of her sophomore season, the daughter of Frosted scored her first career stakes victory by an eyecatching two lengths in the New Start Stakes on Penn Mile night (June 2) at Penn National.

Late Frost was the co-second choice in the field of six, as favoritism fell to the ultra-consistent 2023 stakes winner Tappin Josie, who came in having been first or second in all five of her starts at 3.

Trained by Michael Matz, Late Frost had been making steady progress since returning to the worktab in March, but hadn't started since finishing second in last November's Shamrock Rose Stakes (to Flor de Sombra) at Penn National. The first two starts of her career were victories at Delaware Park, at six furlongs in her debut in September, and an eight-length allowance winner at the same distance in October. She was the slight favorite in the Shamrock Rose, her stakes debut, where she battled for the lead early but was softened up for Flor de Sombra's late challenge and wound up second.

When the field broke in the New Start, Late Frost was super eager out of the gate and shot to the lead while Tappin Josie dwelt and had to play catch up. Joined by Organized Chaos through opening fractions of :22.76 and :46.80, Late Frost shook clear and kept pouring it on, maintaining a clear lead down the lane. Tappin Josie passed others but never cut into the margin as Late Frost crossed the line and stopped the clock in 1:12.56 for the six furlongs. Simply Stated, the other second-choice, finished third.

In recording her third win in four starts, Late Frost boosted her earnings to \$155,600. She is the fifth, and unfortunately, last foal for the Harlan's Holiday mare La La's Cookin, who died in 2020. La La's Cookin was purchased by the Bentleys' for \$120,000 at the 2018 Keeneland November Breeding Stock sale while in foal to Violence. The resulting filly is winner What's Cookin, who remains in competition for her breeders. La La's Cookin, a half-sister to Grade 1 winner Outofthebox from the family of Grade 1 winner Mighty Appealing, had three earlier foals, two of them winners.

Forgotten Land Investment's homebred Movisitor has seen a little of everything in his three years. The son of leading sire Uncle Mo out of the beautifully-bred Medaglia d'Oro mare Ristretto was destined for the sales ring but came home from the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale a \$135,000 RNA.

Plan 2 - the dark bay colt was put into training. And in his second career start with trainer Naoise Agnew he won a maiden special weight against open company over the Presque Isle Tapeta last September, scoring by daylight going six furlongs. Next out was the big leap to graded

stakes company where he found himself on the pace early in the mile and a sixteenth Pilgrim Stakes-G2 but would fade late over a yielding Aqueduct turf course.

In his four races that followed, three in stakes company, two graded, his best results were fifth-place finishes in the Mark McDermott at Presque Isle, a Keeneland turf allowance and the Penn Mile-G2, the latter at 88-1 odds. So what does he do next? He draws away to win the mile and a sixteenth Crowd Pleaser Stakes over a muddy track in his first attempt on the main track.

In a field scratched down to four after the stakes came off the turf June 26 at Parx, Movisitor was the 11-1 longest shot on the board. Breaking sharply under Adam Beschizza, he was taken back and cruised along behind dueling early leaders Winnin'onweekends and multiple stakes-winner and odds-on favorite Ninetyprcentmaddie.

After a half was run in :47.76, Movisitor stayed to the inside and rushed to the front in a surprising move and from there it was breeze as he cruised home by daylight, winning by five and a half lengths in a final time was 1:46.89.

Turned over to trainer Edward Vaughan this year, Movisitor upped his career earnings to \$113,265 (from eight starts) with his first 3-year-old win. He's a member of the same Forgotten Land Investment crop as Grade 1 winner Angel of Empire (co-bred by Black Diamond Equine).

Movisitor has a powerhouse family that traces back to 2-year-old Irish champion filly Sookera (by Roberto). His branch of the Sookera tree includes Hasili (Ire), from which sprung seven Grade/Group winners including champions Banks Hill (GB), Champs Elysees (GB), Intercontinental (GB) and leading sire Dansili. Hasili's full sister Arrive, Movisitor's third dam, produced not only European champion Promising Lead (GB) but group winner and five-time Grade/Group 1-placed Visit (GB), Movisitor's second dam.

Ristretto, unplaced in three starts in England and brought back to the U.S. at age 4 in 2018 in foal (future winner Macrelletta), has two winners from two starters, plus a 2-year-old Nyquist colt born in late May who sold for \$60,000 as a short yearling at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky in 2022 and resold for \$25,000 at this year's Midlantic May sale, and a Justify filly born this February.

Trainer Patricia Farro has taken aim at Parx's Power by Far Stakes three years in a row with Joe Capriglione's homebred Hey Mamaluke. The mare recorded her first career stakes victory in the race in 2021 and last year was relentless in a battle down the stretch to just be edged out by Chub Wagon, who was coming in off her PA-Bred Horse of the Year campaign.

At age 7, the daughter of Jump Start may have been forgiven if she didn't show the same spark as in previous years. On June 26, she proved you can't count her out as she struck again.

The 6-1 fourth choice and oldest runner in the field of six in the off-the-turf Power by Far Stakes, the veteran campaigner, carrying top weight of 128 pounds and rider Andy Hernandez, raced inside early leader Empress Deona through opening fractions of :21.32 and :45.89 as the field sped over a sealed muddy track.



At the top of the stretch Hey Mamaluke took aim on Empress Deona and pulled clear, only to have Hidden Cache and Tappin Josie come flying late. The finish line came just in time as Hey Mamaluke won by a head over Hidden Cache, with Tappin Josie another neck back in third. Final time for the five furlongs was :59.99.

It was the third career stakes win for Hey Mamaluke, who launched her career with a nearly 11-length maiden special weight win as a 2-year-old in December 2018 at Parx. The majority of her 36-start career has been at her home base, where she has started 26 times and counts among her nine Parx scores a victory in the 2022 Penn's Landing. Overall, she sports a record of 36-11-7-0 and earnings of \$621,139. Her other two wins came on winter trips to Aqueduct.

Hey Mamaluke, by the late Jump Start, is the second foal out of Pu Dew (by Lucky Lionel), who was claimed by Capriglione for \$5,000 in December 2009 at age 6 and would eventually retire with 18 wins and \$409,030 earned. The mare's first foal is six-figure earner Hey Braciole (\$290,180). Pu Dew's only other foal to race is multiple winner Hey Dewzpots (2017, by El Padrino).




