The third and final leg of the 2024 Stallion Series will be run in 2025, with purses of \$100,000 for 3yos and 3yo fillies on PA Day at the Races (date TBA). A \$50,000 breeder bonus for horses that finish first, second and third in total points for the series will be paid at that time — \$25,000 for first, \$15,000 for second and \$10,000 for third. The current leaders are posted in this issue.



We'll be having our first PA Yearling Show on June 21 at Brandywine Polo Club in Chester County. Four categories and a champion category will be offered with lots of prizes. You should have received show information and a registration form in the mail and online. Only \$50 to enter.



PAT ON THE BACK

a perfect choice for Wynter by nikki sherman

FENTON FOREVER

WITH BREEDER/OWNER DESMOND WYNTER AFTER WINNING THE WAIT FOR IT STAKES Pennsylvania is the home of several exciting young stallions whose freshmen crops hit the track rolling in 2024. One of those sires is Pat On the Back, who as a racehorse became a millionaire in just 30 career starts, winning from six furlongs to a mile and an eighth. Eight of his nine wins were in stakes races and his greatest victory came in the \$300,000 Kelso Handicap (G2) at Belmont Park in 2019.

Upon retirement from racing, he was sent to Godstone Farm in Pa. It was there that Cristina Holmes first met Pat On the Back. She had previously worked in finance, but after having her youngest daughter she took a leap of faith and pursued a career change.

Pat On the Back made a splash last fall when his sons Fenton Forever and Realin N Dealin nailed the exacta in the \$100,000 Wait For It Stakes at Parx Racing. Pat On the Back is available in 2025 for \$3,500 LFSN.

"His owners, who continue to be actively involved, decided we would all work together with the opportunity of me leasing Pat in 2021," said Holmes. "It is a great group and we made it work through hard work and dedication.

"Pat On the Back's first year I got to start him in the breeding shed at Godstone Farm. He has great, solid bone and he is built like a brick house, with his fantastic shoulder and a powerful rear end. He really stamps his babies with that same shoulder and rear end."

Breeder Desmond Wynter liked what he saw with Pat On the Back right away and scheduled a 2021 date with his prized broodmare Fairy Gray. Wynter noted that he was drawn to attributes like his racing versatility and conformation.

The stallion's first group of foals included Fairy Gray's first colt, a handsome chestnut named Fenton Forever. Wynter named the colt after John Fenton, a longtime beloved backstretch worker who had recently passed away.

"Fenton Forever was a special foal," Wynter remembered. "You could walk up to him in an open paddock filled with other young horses and put your hands around him. He would just stand right there. He grew up to be an easygoing horse who knows when it's time to run."

And boy can Fenton Forever run! He is undefeated in two starts for Wynter Racing Stable and trainer J. Tyler Servis, breaking his maiden by 3 ½ lengths in a juvenile maiden special weight and following that up with a scintillating score in the \$100,000 Wait For It Stakes by the same margin.

Fairy Gray has given Wynter quite the ride since she first caught his eye at the 2014 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling Sale. He looked at her catalog page and was immediately intrigued. She was a daughter of the royally-bred Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) winner Cat Thief and a Pennsylvania-Bred to boot. "Ever since entering the racing world in the early 1970s, my favorite things to do are look at bloodlines and nicks," he said. "I really liked Fairy Gray's bloodline, conformation and temperament. I also believed she would make a good broodmare."

So he kept an eye on the filly and when he noticed that she failed to meet her reserve, Wynter called the sales agent with an offer. He was successful. After Wynter decided it was time to make her a broodmare, he began his favorite pastime of researching breeding nicks. He focused on Pennsylvania stallions to take full advantage of the PA-Bred program. Pat On the Back was one of those stallions.

But first, Fairy Gray produced a gray filly by Well Spelled named Ell Gray who broke her maiden second time out by an impressive 5 ½ lengths. Ell Gray is now retired and will be bred this spring for a 2026 foal by none other than Pat On the Back.

Social Inclusion sired Fairy Gray's next foal, another gray filly named Gray Lightning. Wynter gave his grandson Hudson the

honor of naming that filly. They knew she was fast, but how fast was a bit of a shock. She debuted at Parx Racing as a juvenile and she absolutely dominated while going gate to wire in front, ultimately winning by 6 ¾ lengths. Two starts later, Gray Lightning obliterated an allowance field by 14 ½ lengths at Parx Racing.

That race sent ripples of excitement through the racing world, with Wynter receiving interest in Gray Lightning. He begrudgingly decided to place her into a new digital sale being offered by Fasig-Tipton. She topped the auction, bringing a life-changing \$370,000 from Dubai-based NR Club.

"To this day, Hudson still has not forgiven me for selling his horse without his permission," Wynter admitted. "It did feel good to know that I bred a horse of such quality. I hope she does well with her new connections."

NR Club kept Gray Lightning with Servis at Parx Racing, where she took down another PA-Bred allowance field by 12 ¼ lengths. Keeping her in Pennsylvania was a smart decision and it also provided Wynter with additional breeders' awards. She next traveled to Saratoga Race Course and earned black type with a third in the \$150,000 Jersey Girl Stakes. Gray Lightning then went on a break, but has been breezing steadily down at Oaklawn Park this winter for her comeback.

Meanwhile, Fenton Forever has been enjoying a winter


vacation down south before he heads north in the spring. His connections have high hopes for the PA-Bred's sophomore campaign. He also has a Pat On the Back yearling full sister named Adel's Way and of course she is a PA-Bred.

"I was there when Fenton Forever won the stakes," Holmes fondly recollected. "It was not only exciting for Pat On the Back, but it was extra special because of John Fenton's family being able to attend the race. We were all in tears. So thank you John Fenton for looking down on us that day!"

Fenton Forever and Pat On the Back will indeed forever be in the hearts of Holmes and Wynter. In addition, both agree that the Pennsylvania breeding program is the best breeding program in the country.

Bursting with praise, Wynter eagerly shared, "In my opinion, the PA-Bred program is the BEST breeding program. The breeders' awards and bonuses offered for a PA-Bred are second to none."

Holmes also noted that the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association and its staff have been crucial to her success, even acknowledging that someday she aspires to join its board. "I think the PHBA has a lot of plans in the pipeline to help our future in racing. Hopefully I will be able to get involved and help with the future of racing because I truly believe in our PA program. With one of the highest returns in breeders' awards, Pennsylvania is one of the best in the nation."





MAXIMUS MERIDIUS POSSESSES BY NIKKI SHERMAN PENNSYLVANIA POWER

This winter a new Pennsylvania-Bred stakes winner burst onto His two closest competitors are by two of the top sires in the national stage when Maximus Meridius scored back-to-back the country, Into Mischief and Gun Runner. MAXIMUS MERIDIUS (CONT.)

Six years ago, Maximus Mischief looked to be on the verge of taking his home base fans from Parx Racing on a thrilling ride. He notched three victories from four career starts, including a score in the \$250,000 Remsen Stakes-G2 and a third-place finish in the \$350,000 Holy Bull Stakes-G2, with a combined win margin of 17 lengths. Maximus Mischief was one of the favorites for the Big Dance, but that dream came to an abrupt halt due to a soft tissue injury during a workout before the Florida Derby-G1.

Despite his short career, the good-looking son of Into Mischief was an immediate hit among breeders, where he stands at Spendthrift Farm in Kentucky. The gamble was a success, as Maximus Mischief has turned into a stellar stallion. From just a few crops of racing age, he is already the sire of 13 stakes winners, including Grade 1 winner Raging Torrent.

And not only are his offspring precocious, they are also getting better with age. A perfect example is Maximus Meridius.

He broke his maiden by an electrifying 10½ lengths in his career debut as a 2-year-old at Parx and is now a stakes winner at 3 and 4.

Maximus Meridius was born in Pennsylvania at Westerly Farm in West Grove, the former site of Walnut Green Farm. Owner Ann LaPides is relatively new to the world of horse racing, but is very well-versed in the equine industry.

"Myself and Marie Legault, my farm manager, came from the hunter/jumper world," LaPides explained. "We do not race, nor do we even go to the track. We are strictly farmbased, focusing on the care and wellbeing of the horses that are with us. In addition to Thoroughbred broodmares, we also have layups for the racetrack and show ring, and retired horses from many different equine disciplines.

> "The farm encompasses 100 acres; most of it large fields with excellent, deeply-rooted grass. We are fortunate to have this ideal location to take care of our horses, such as this part of Pennsylvania provides."

> > LaPides purchased the property from Mark Reid, a mainstay in the Mid-Atlantic region, and he has been a guiding light during Westerly Farm's journey into Thoroughbred racing. Reid suggested Maximus Mischief as the sire for LaPides' Quiet Virtue, who was not

> > > only a winner on the track but also competed over fences for Westerly Farm. The daughter of Quiet American is also the dam of two-time winner Stevie T (Commissioner),

but the cross with Maximus Mischief was so nice that Ouiet Virtue produced a full brother to Maximus Meridius who is now a 2-year-old.

"It has really proven to be an excellent match," said LaPides. "Meridius was born the same year and in the same field as Uncle Heavy, Jeanne Marie and others that have gone on to have success at the track. He was easy to spot because of his blaze and friendly nature."

Reid was also the link between Westerly Farm and Maximus Meridius' racing connections. Reid's brother, Robert "Butch"

Reid Jr., trains for owners LC Racing LLC, Cash Is King LLC, and Wellesley Stable. The group actually owned and trained Maximus Mischief himself, and have been highly successful in both breeding and purchasing the stallion's offspring to compete in Pennsylvania.

"Mark and Butch Reid have excellent owners, and I was very happy to be able to sell to them," LaPides noted. "We appreciate the work put in by all, and the commitment the owners have to their horses. Everyone at the farm is thrilled to see any of the horses born here go on to do well at the track."

Maximus Meridius began his career with that dominating victory as a juvenile and was competitive over the next several months, capturing an allowance at Parx in his third start, and finishing second in both the \$150,000 Bay Shore Stakes and \$150,000 Gold Fever Stakes in New York.

But after two disappointing efforts, he was gelded. It made a world of difference. Maximus Meridus, the gelding, became quiet

in the paddock and was highly focused. That gave him the ability to dig in and fight it out in stretch duels, where he would find his best stride late and dive under the wire in front. That's exactly what propelled him to his two straight stakes victories.

Maximus Meridius has finished no worse than fourth since his "equipment change", including second-place finishes in the \$300,000 Steel Valley Sprint Stakes at Mahoning

Valley Race Course and the \$75,000 Salvatore M. DeBunda Sprint Stakes at home. His fourth-place finish was in the \$400,000 Gallant Bob Stakes-G2 when out-of-towner Bentornato beat him by just 3 lengths. Bentornato went on to run second in the \$2-million Breeders' Cup Sprint-G1 in his very next start.

With eight of his 15 career starts occurring in the Keystone State, Maximus Meridius has given all of his connections even more to celebrate, thanks to his Pennsylvania-Bred status. In 2024, he earned an additional \$44,556 in state-bred awards.

"Mark and Butch Reid have excellent owners, and I was very happy to be able to sell to them,"

LaPides noted.

"The PA breeder incentives are essential in keeping horse breeding in Pennsylvania," remarked LaPides. "With the breeder awards, small breeding businesses are able to afford to stay in the state, keeping not only the people who work at the farms employed, but also those who grow hay and straw, provide veterinary and farrier services, and a multitude of others."



Maximus Meridius rolled into 2025 with the same energy he finished 2024, and recorded his second stakes win in a row in Aqueduct's \$175,000 Toboggan Stakes on Feb. 1.

Trained and co-owned by Butch Reid with LC Racing and Cash is King, the son of Maximus Mischief led at every call in the 7-furlong sprint, posting early fractions of :22.95 and :45.90, swept through 6 furlongs in 1:10.55, and fought off Runninsonofagun to win by a neck. The final time was 1:23.36, which resulted in a 98 Beyer.

Reid commented to NYRA officials after the race: "This is a horse that early in his career, he would kind of make the lead and hang, but now horses are coming to him and he's fighting them off and he has matured and come a long way. I think it's maturity, and the ultimate equipment change (gelding), has helped him a lot."

Gelded in the summer of 2024, Maximus Meridius has a three wins and two seconds in five starts since October. "He's turned into a completely different racehorse," Reid added. "He acted so stoic in the paddock pre-race and post-race, so he's a different horse now than he was."

Maximus Meridius was ridden by Mychel Sanchez, who last rode him to a second-place finish in Aqueduct's Bay Shore Stakes last April. Sanchez described this year's effort: "It was beautiful. He won last time (nearly) wire-to-wire (under John Velazquez), he ran really good on the sloppy track but today we didn't have a sloppy track. Being in the one-hole, it was simple, if he breaks good, just take the lead and go on from there, but make sure to save enough because today we were going seven-eighths.

"I tell you what, he broke like a rocket," Sanchez added.
"I didn't even have to use him, which helped me to finish up. I waited, waited, waited, he likes the competition to come to me, so I didn't want to open up too early. I just wait, wait, wait, then when they got next to me, it took him a little while to switch leads, but once he switched leads, he went on again with a good fight. He is a good fighter for sure."

Maximus Meridius exited 2024 with a victory in Aqueduct's \$150,000 Gravesend Stakes on Dec. 28. During his career, he's made 15 starts, winning five, finishing second or third in six others, while earning \$500,430. He returned after the Toboggan in a 7-furlong Parx allowance on Feb. 25 and finished second off a gutsy effort in which he was hounded from the start and missed by a neck to pace beneficiary Harp's Hot Corner, who stopped the clock 1:25.97.

Bred by Westerly Farm, Maximus Meridius is out of the Quiet American mare Quiet Virtue, a winner at 5½ furlongs who later raced for Westerly Farm over hurdles up to 2¼ miles. Maximus Meridius is her second named foal.

The mare has an unnamed Maximus Mischief 2-year-old colt now in Florida being broken. Bred to Golden Lad in 2024 she didn't produce foal, and is back in foal to Maximus Mischief.


