Congratulations to the winners of our 3&up PA-Sired PA-Bred Stakes run at PARX on October 22. The Disco Chick was won by Nature’s Candy, bred by Y. Kolybabiuk. A great story goes along with this win as the breeders, Jerry Kolybabiuk and his wife Maria, actually bred and raced Disco Chick. They were so excited after the win as this race really meant a lot to them! The Jump Start Stakes was won by the Elizabeth Houghton-bred 3yo Silhoutte Cove, trained by her son Bernie. Both breeders will receive about \$18,000 in breeder awards as PA-Sired PA-Breds receive 40% in awards.

The 2024-2025 PA-Sired PA-Bred Stallion Series concluded on PA Day at the Races. The breeders of the top three point-earners over the six-stakes series split \$50,000 in bonuses! Congratulations to the winner Honorable Win (by Winchill), who earned \$25,000 for her breeder Pewter Stable. Carousel Queen (Uptowncharlybrown) was second in total points and earned \$15,000 for her breeder Dennis Johnson. The third-place prize of \$10,000 was split between Reelin N Dealin (Pat On the Back), bred by Barbara Rickline and Gabe Rispo, and The Boy’s Warrior (Warrior’s Reward), bred by Warrior’s Reward LLC, who ended with the same point total. The Breeder Bonuses were presented in the winner’s circle between the two PA-Sired Stakes on October 22. Congrats to all.

I’m happy to announce that there will be no registration fee for the PA-Sired PA-Bred Series which begins Dec. 30, 2025, at PARX with two 2YO \$75,000 stakes at 6 furlongs. Don’t miss out. If your 2YO is a PA-Sired PA-Bred, you will be automatically registered and eligible to run.

Congratulations also go out to the 17 breeders who surpassed the \$100,000 mark in total awards through September! Our leaders, Warriors Reward and Uptowncharlybrown Stud, are fighting it out again this year. Warriors Reward is currently leading with \$671,455. Wow! Will they be the first breeder to hit the \$1 million mark? We have 303 breeders that have received an award in 2025. If you want to become part of our program or just want more information, give me a call at 610 444 1050.

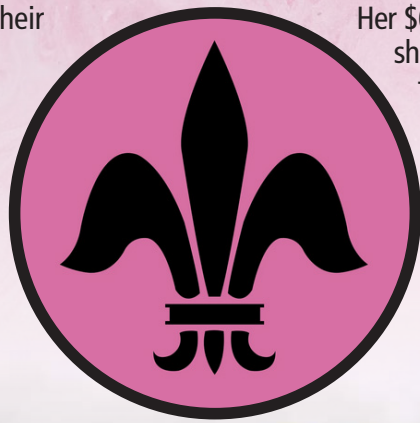
GRADUATES TO GRADED STAKES WINNER

Three-year-old filly wins Grade 2 Lexus Raven Run in fourth career start

When trainer Butch Reid and his clients make their shopping list for Thoroughbred auctions, they strategically consider every Pennsylvania-bred. In combing the grounds at the 2023 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall Yearling sale in Timonium, Md., one of Reid's stops was number 406. It was love at first sight for Reid recalling seeing Kappa Kappa for the first time. Two years later, he joined her in the Keeneland winner's circle after her gallant victory in the Lexus Raven Run Stakes-G2 on October 18.

"She was my number one horse in the sale," he said. "She had the size, the correctness, the attitude. She checked all the boxes."

Her \$65,000 price tag turned out to be a bargain as she thus far has banked \$278,375 while winning three of four career starts for Reid's Wellesley Stable, LC Racing and Cash is King. She previously raced at Reid's year-round Parx base where she won her debut by 9¾ lengths on July 24. She rebounded from a runner-up effort in allowance company to score by 6 lengths in a state-bred allowance test on September 19.

Bettors reacted to her big class leap to the Raven Run by making her the second longest price in the 10-filly field at 27-1, but her team had good reason to enter.

"It had a little bit to do with the numbers," Reid said. "We like the Ragozin Sheets and the Beyer Speed Figures and her numbers were as good as any in the country. Plus, we were running out of chances to race against straight 3-year-olds. We decided to go ahead and take a chance."

From an outside post, the daughter of Omaha Beach matched strides with the leaders early before dueling with fellow longshot Vodka With a Twist in midstretch. The pair were on near-even terms until Kappa Kappa regained command to grab victory by a head in the closing strides. Her time for the 7 furlongs was 1:23.90 with Hall of Famer John Velazquez in the saddle.

"She'd been beating up on horses pretty easily up in Philly, so she certainly showed some gameness today like we hoped she would," Reid said in the post-race interview.

Glenn Bennett of co-owner LC Racing also was in attendance.

"I was dying (watching the stretch battle), but the way she fought back, it was awesome," he said. "I couldn't be more excited. She's just a great filly. It's unbelievable (to win at Keeneland). It's the first time I've been here and the first time I've raced a horse here."

Kappa Kappa's name is a nod to her Pennsylvania connections. She is named after Bennett's daughter's Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority at Villanova University. Kappa Kappa is among about

100 horses in Bennett's portfolio of large and small partnerships.

"I try to have as many horses as possible," he said. "For me it is the same rush whether I have 30 percent or 100 percent. It is about the action. Plus, it's no fun rooting by yourself. We literally always look at all the Pennsylvania-breds in the sales. It's a big thing. I like to go to the races at Parx when possible. The PA program has been great with the bonuses they have."

Chuck Zacney of Cash is King was not in attendance, but his name is recognizable as owner of Afleet Alex, the 2005 Eclipse Award champion 3-year-old colt and winner of the Preakness and Belmont Stakes. He shares ownership of about 20 horses with Bennett.

"Alex and the big stage was special but several years later, I realized it's not easy getting back to the big stage," he said. "Winning at Keeneland in a prestigious Grade 2 race is always nice. Lots of history there. We now know we have a special horse. Johnny V gave an excellent ride. Making her switch leads in deep stretch was a difference maker. One of the many reasons he's a Hall of Famer."

KAPPA KAPPA'S EARLY DAYS

Kappa Kappa was bred in the name of the Stone Jug Ranch of Darryl and Jill Myers. She was born and raised at the acreage in the Blue Ridge Mountain foothills in Dillsburg, about 20 miles south of Harrisburg. The land was once known for producing Scottish Highland show cattle before the herd was downsized. Named for the road on which it sits, Stone Jug Ranch had been



in the same family for generations before being purchased in 2017 by the Myeres. The Myeres had drifted away from Thoroughbred racing while raising cattle but later circled back to raising racehorses. Earlier this year, they welcomed the impeccably-bred Tapit stallion Tyson – a Canadian champion and Grade 2 winner – to their roster.

Kappa Kappa was fast from the beginning according to Darryl Myers.

"There were three foals that year – a Goldencents colt, an Omaha Beach filly and a Dialed In filly," he said. "The Omaha Beach baby was born 15 days early. She was not an easy foal. Had lots of energy when she was young. She was very fast running in the fields. Always wanted to be in the front."

Eventually she was sent to the Keeneland September Yearling Sale where she was offered on the ninth day of the 12-day auction. She left the ring unsold after failing to reach her reserve on a final bid of \$55,000. A month later, Reid saw what others missed when he had the winning bid at the aforementioned Fasig-Tipton sale.

As Kappa Kappa developed her talent, Reid was mindful to not rush her to the races.

"Early on in her training she had some issues," he said. "She was a big, growthy filly. We really wanted to take our time with her. I am fortunate to have owners like Chuck and Glenn who let me take all the time I need with the horses. We didn't

get to do too much with her as a 2-year-old. She always looked good and trained well. She had all the regular 2-year-old setbacks, but it worked out because we didn't push on her. Our patience is paying off in the long run."

The Myeres watched her capture the Keeneland stakes from afar.

"I had a good feeling she would do very well after seeing her run at Parx," Darryl Myers said. "I was planning to go to the race but wasn't sure she was going to get in off the also-eligible list and we didn't find out until the last minute."

Although they do not receive state-bred breeder bonuses for out-of-state earnings, the Myeres clearly gained bragging rights and could capitalize in the future via Kappa Kappa's younger sister. Both were produced by the Pioneer of the Nile mare Pharoah's Princess, a one-time winner and half-sister to Grade 2-winning millionaire Pat On the Back. The mare had no foals in 2023 and 2024 and produced a Pennsylvania-bred Tiz the Law filly in March for Stone Jug Ranch.

"Unfortunately, Pharoah's Princess died this year unexpectedly from colic when she had the Tiz the Law by her side at two months old," Myers said. "She was the sweetest mare and she was in foal to Tyson. We had to get the filly a nurse mare immediately."

The youngster carries big dreams for Stone Jug Farm. "She is growing up to be a very nice filly," Myers said. "We may sell her for the right price or just race her." ■

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PENNSYLVANIA-BREDS CONTINUE TO SHINE AT THE THOROUGHBRED MAKEOVER



Over a decade ago, the Retired Racehorse Project's Thoroughbred Makeover began as a celebration of second chances – where former racehorses from across the country gather at the Kentucky Horse Park to show off their newfound skills. Each October, hundreds of Off-The-Track Thoroughbreds (OTTBs) demonstrate just how versatile, athletic and willing they can be, in one or more of 10 disciplines ranging from barrel racing to show jumper.

Since 2018, the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association (PHBA) has sponsored a \$5,000 award to the highest-scoring PA-Bred, making it one of the most lucrative state-bred bonuses offered. That investment has paid off in more ways than one – year after year, PA-Breds continue to excel, often claiming division championships and special honors.

A competitive field of 290 competed, included 14 PA-Breds, a notable increase from nine just two years earlier. From polished show hunters to gutsy barrel racers and confident trail mounts, these Thoroughbreds once again proved that it truly pays to be a PA-Bred – not just on the track, but far beyond it.

This year's Thoroughbred Makeover also featured a major change in format, which made the Championships more exciting than ever. In previous years, only the top five horses from each discipline advanced to Saturday's Finale. But in 2025, the Retired Racehorse Project expanded the Championship field to the top 10 from each division, allowing twice as many horses and trainers to stay through the weekend and compete for their share of the prize money.



MISS PRETENDER

Leading the PA-Bred contingent in 2025 was Miss Pretender, who captured the High-Point PA-Bred Award with owner and rider Rachel McMahon. The 4-year-old daughter of Mendelssohn competed exclusively in the Show Hunter division, where her stylish presence drew attention throughout the week. After finishing fourth of 58 entries in preliminary competition, Miss Pretender dazzled again in the finals to climb into second overall – ironically only behind McMahon's other mount, Mentha. Her consistent brilliance in one of the Makeover's most competitive divisions sealed her title as the year's highest-scoring PA-Bred.

Bred by Barlar LLC, Miss Pretender hails from one of Juddmonte Farms' royal female families. She commanded six figures at auction, selling for \$110,000 as a yearling and \$260,000 as a 2-year-old, and proved her quality on the racetrack as well, winning a maiden special weight at Parx Racing and earning \$51,400 in three career starts.

"I was very excited to hear Miss Pretender won the top Pennsylvania-Bred award!" said McMahon. "I picked her because she had the best trot I had ever seen on a Thoroughbred, which is why I feel she moved up in her placing. She definitely hacked her way to the top! Miss Pretender is very fancy all around, but her trot is incredible – very sweet, but she definitely knows she's a queen."

Also earning a place in the Show Hunter finals was Ms Kays Cowgirl, ridden by Kasey Evans. Entering the finals in ninth, their poised and consistent performance lifted them all the way to a fourth-place finish overall. The big, kind 6-year-old

mare by Imagining is a second-generation homebred for Brian Schartz.

Evans noted, "With her naturally rhythmic canter, easy lead change, and sweet disposition, Cowgirl shows all the potential to become a top child or adult hunter for a rider looking to put the finishing touches on a willing and athletic partner."



Flex Warrior, better known around the barn as "Teddy Spaghetti," is a son of Warrior's Reward bred by Copper Penny Stables and ridden by Caitlan Brooks, who also piloted his full brother In the Air to 2024 Field Hunter Champion and Show Hunter Reserve Champion. Representing Team Teddy Spaghetti of Maryland alongside junior rider Grace Hammer, Brooks guided the 3-year-old dark bay gelding to another standout performance. Competing in both Field Hunter and Show Hunter, Flex Warrior placed 29th in the latter but earned his way into the Field Hunter finals after a preliminary seventh-place finish among 13 entries. Once again, his grit and composure paid off as Teddy surged up the leaderboard to finish second overall in the finals.

The last PA-Bred to earn a spot in the finals was My Brown Eyed Girl, a 5-year-old daughter of Uptowncharlybrown bred by Barbara Rickline. Junior rider Ava Botterio carried on the strong state showing at the Makeover. After a ninth-place finish out of 23 in the preliminary round of Barrel Racing earned them a berth in the finals, the pair charged up the leaderboard to finish fifth overall. They also contested Competitive Trail, where they placed 19th of 38 entries.

The most accomplished racehorse among the PA-Bred entrants was Colonel Juan, an 11-year-old warhorse whose career spanned eight years, 67 starts and more than \$400,000 in earnings. Bred by Dun Roamin Farm Inc., the handsome son of Colonel John recorded 11 victories before beginning his new chapter under trainer Lisa Carter. Together they competed in both Freestyle and Dressage, finishing 24th of 28 and 45th of 84, respectively.

Uncle Remi also turned in strong performances, finishing 12th in Show Hunter and 24th of 60 entries in Show Jumper. The 6-year-old bay son of Uncle Lino was bred by Lawrence and Constance Smith and ridden by Brenda Awad.

Uptown Miss, a 3-year-old daughter of Uptowncharlybrown bred by Danielle Marie, was ridden by Kennedy Seaman. The chestnut filly placed 14th in Freestyle among 28 entries and 60th in Dressage, showcasing the same expressive movement and attitude that have made her sire's offspring so recognizable in the show ring.

Sole Risk, an unraced 3-year-old son of Gun Runner bred by Jon Marshall, represented Pennsylvania in both Competitive Trail and Dressage with rider Carly Kowalshuk. They finished 22nd in Competitive Trail and 40th in Dressage.

Eleven-year-old Ultimate Baroness, bred by Justin Morrell and Pat Gledhill, was another veteran campaigner bringing her racetrack experience to Kentucky. The daughter of Cozar made 55 career starts with eight wins before transitioning to life after racing. She competed in both Show Hunter and Dressage, finishing 27th in the latter, and proved that age and mileage are no barriers to success in a second career.

Also representing the Keystone State was If We Get Lucky, a gelded son of Irish War Cry bred by Shirley Lojeski. A four-time winner on the racetrack, the 5-year-old showed his adaptability with rider Kajsa Kajander, finishing 11th in Competitive Trail and 19th in Barrel Racing.

On Another Level, a gray daughter of Speightster, was bred by Equivine Farm LLC and ridden by Logan Hart. The 4-year-old filly competed in both Competitive Trail and Show Hunter, finishing 32nd and 39th, respectively.

Two additional PA-Breds, Smart and Fast and Warrior's Special, represented the state. Smart and Fast, a 5-year-old son of Congrats out of a Smarty Jones mare bred by Mesingw Farm LLC and an earner of more than \$115,000, entered both the Show Jumper and Show Hunter divisions. Warrior's Special, ridden by Katie Irvine, joined him in the show hunter ring.

The Makeover also featured a spotlight on retired broodmares, a growing but still new division designed to guide former broodmares into a third career. Among this year's entrants was Victoria E, bred in Pennsylvania by Blackstone Farm, who was so well-regarded that she was given the opportunity to pass along her genes. A seven-time winner herself, her granddam was Soviet Problem, who not only garnered over \$900,000 in career earnings, but also finished second by a head in the 1994 Breeders' Cup Sprint-G1 behind Cherokee Run. Upon her retirement, Victoria E was sent to Kentucky where she produced a 2024 colt by Greatest Honour. Since then, the daughter of Warrior's Reward became a riding horse and was able to contest this year's Makeover as a Retired Broodmare. While the number of broodmares competing is still small, the big 10-year-old bay represented herself exceptionally well. Ridden by Doreen Durr, she snapped up first place in both Broodmare Show Hunter and Broodmare Dressage.

The 2025 Thoroughbred Makeover once again proved that PA-Breds stand among the best in the nation, not only for their ability on the racetrack but for their adaptability and heart in second careers. Supported by the PHBA's \$5,000 High-Point PA-Bred Award, these talented Thoroughbreds showcased the dedication of their breeders, riders and connections who believe in giving every horse a meaningful life beyond racing. ■

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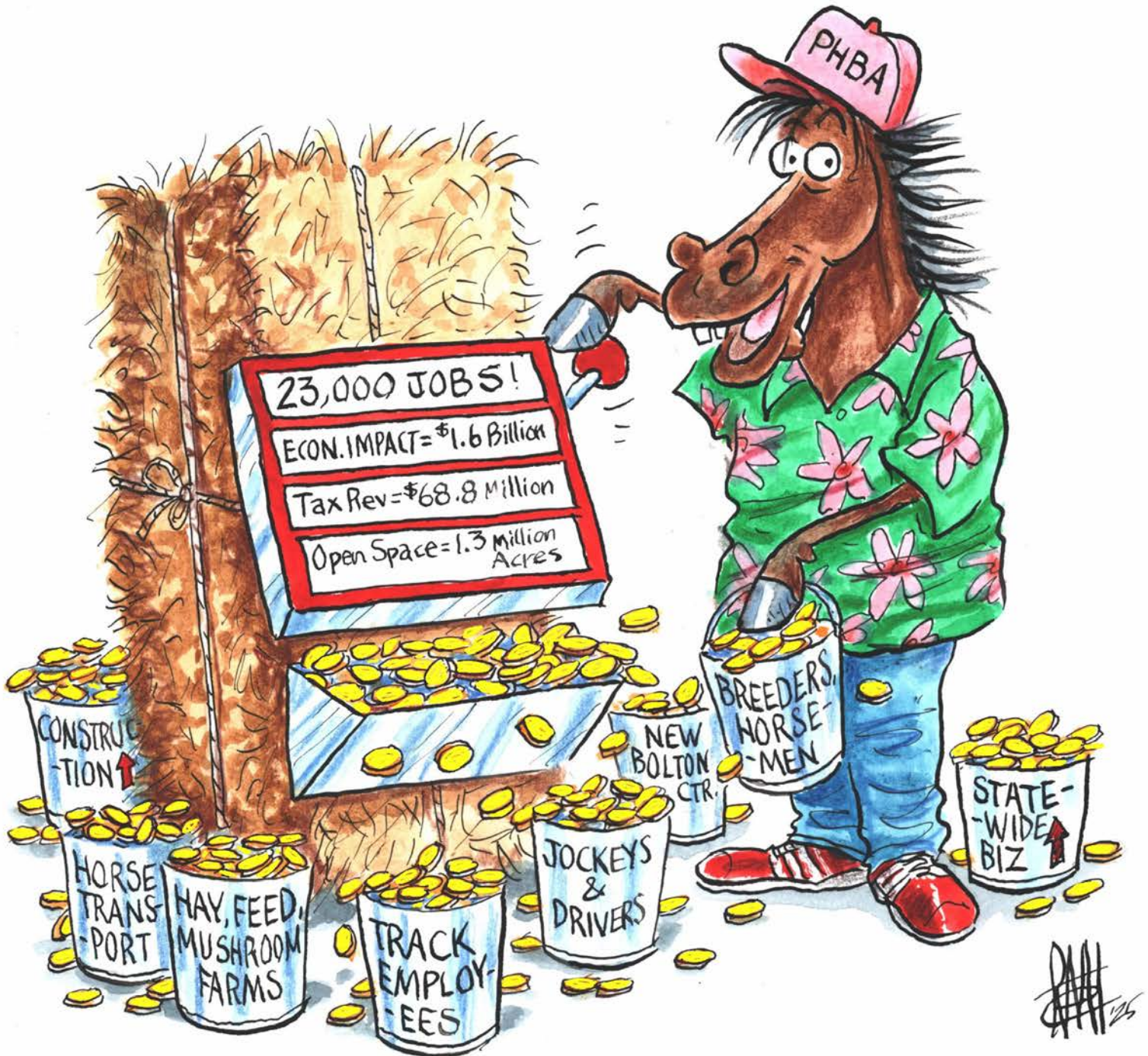

Kappa Kappa's record of two wins and a second in three starts, all at Parx Racing, didn't entice bettors when looking at Keeneland's Grade 2 Raven Run Stakes for 3-year-old fillies on Oct. 18.

A field of 10 was sent out for the 7-furlong stakes worth \$300,000 for non-Kentucky-breds. Ragtime was the favorite at 6-5 after winning Churchill Downs' Dogwood Stakes-G3 and finishing second by a neck in Saratoga's Test Stakes-G1 in her two previous outings. Also getting attention was PA-Bred Simply Joking, a two-time stakes winner and graded stakes-placed in her first three career starts who was returning to the races for the first time since running off-the-board in the Kentucky Oaks-G1.

Trainer Butch Reid shipped Kappa Kappa, owned by the partnership of LC Racing, Cash is King and his own Wellesley Stable, from Parx for her stakes debut. She went off the second-longest shot in the field at 27-1.

Showing her customary speed, Kappa Kappa shot from her nine post and charged for the lead. There was a three-way battle during the early stages as Kappa Kappa, Delightful Claire and Usha raced through a quarter in :22.81 and a half in :45.94. Heading into the far turn, Kappa Kappa shook off those two rivals, but was immediately joined by another longshot, as Vodka With a Twist ranged up to her outside at the top of the stretch.

It was a battle to the finish. Vodka With a Twist started to pull away, but Hall of Fame rider John Velazquez noted that the Pennsylvania filly "... showed a lot of heart. She found herself at the three-sixteenths pole in front, the other horse (Vodka With a Twist) passed her and then she came back and put up a good fight.

"This is her first time being here (at Keeneland), so you could see she was looking (around) a lot from the three-eighths pole to the five-sixteenths pole and I kind of waited for the horses inside of me to get head-and-head with me, and when we got

to the quarter pole she waited. She got surprised by the horses outside. Finally I went back to left-handed and she responded nicely. Very nicely done." The winning margin was a head as the chestnut filly stopped the clock in 1:23.90. The result earned her a 91 Beyer.

"She's been beating up on horses in the fields pretty easily up in Philly, so she certainly showed some gameness today like we hoped she would," said Reid after the race.

It was Reid's second Keeneland stakes victory – his initial one came in 2020 when Vequist won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies-G1.

Unraced at 2, Kappa Kappa made her debut in July, scoring by nearly 10 lengths in open maiden special weight company at 6 furlongs. Less than a month later the daughter of Omaha Beach stretched out to a mile in allowance company, stalked the early pace, and ran gamely to finish second in the 10-horse field. She recorded win number two on Sept. 19 by a dominating 6 lengths against state-bred runners going 6½ furlongs. With her stakes score, she boosted her earnings to \$278,375.

Bred by Darryl and Jill Myers' Stone Jug Ranch LLC, Kappa Kappa is by the fourth foal out of the Pioneerof the Nile winning mare Pharoah's Princess. After being sent to the Keeneland September Yearling sale in 2023 and returning unsold, she appeared in the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale two weeks later where she was purchased by LC Racing for \$65,000.

Pharoah's Princess delivered a PA-Bred filly by Tiz the Law in March and was bred back to Stone Jug Ranch's first-year stallion Tyson. Sadly the Myerses lost the mare in May to colic. ■

Candy Reward concluded her 2025 Presque Isle Downs season with a repeat victory in the H.B.P.A. Stakes on Oct. 6. The 2025 edition was a near repeat of 2024, as she raced for the lead throughout and crossed the wire in 1:39 change for the mile and 70 yards.

This year's running saw her post moderate fractions early as she cruised along about a length in front of her closest pursuer. The even-money favorite in the field of eight kept clicking them off (:24.15, :47.84 and 1:11.38), kicked for home with a daylight lead, and cruised under the wire a 1¾-length winner. Her final time of 1:39.25 bested the previous year's time by .28 seconds.

It was Candy Reward's 10th career start at the Erie track, and sixth win (plus a second, a third and two fourths). She has won three stakes at Presque Isle, having also taken the Princess of Sylmar in late July, and was third in her career debut at 2 in the track's Finest City Stakes. And \$259,980 of her total \$318,055 in earnings have come over the Tapeta surface. Her other three starts have been at Penn National, where she boasts two allowance wins and a third in maiden special weight company. Over a span of a year she was 6-for-6 until a fourth-place finish in the Presque Isle Downs Masters Stakes-G2 on Sept. 19 (beaten a total of 3 lengths) halted the streak.

Trained by Brandon Kulp for her breeders, Donnie Brown and Tom McClay's Warrior's Reward LLC, the big-bodied, solidly-built, nearly 17-hand daughter of Warrior's Reward has been carefully handled over her career. In July, Brown noted: "We've always been high on her. We've just been waiting for the mind, body and maturity to all come together. She's a bigger girl - she's solid, and carries good weight. And she's starting to blossom for us now."

Candy Reward is the second foal out of Unimagineable, an unraced daughter of Twirling Candy. The mare's first foal, the Competitive Edge gelding Shy Da Runner, is an earner of \$132,786 and recorded the most recent of his five wins at Presque Isle Downs on Oct. 2.

Unimagineable has a Warrior's Reward 2-year-old filly named Eye Candy Warrior, a Warrior's Reward yearling colt named Mr. Monk, and produced a colt by Kentucky Derby-G1 winner Mandaloun in March before being bred to Cody's Wish.

The imposing Warrior's Reward, who moved to Pennsylvania for the 2019 season and was one of the state's most popular stallions over five seasons before being retired after covering 10 mares in 2024, is now a resident at Old Friends in Kentucky. ■

Jerry Kolybabiuk had wonderful luck with the family of Survey, an Allen's Prospect mare he bought as a yearling for \$15,500 in September 1991 who became a winner and, as a broodmare, produced eight winners from nine starters including six-figure earner Disco Flirt.

That Disco Rico mare produced as her first foal Kolybabiuk's four-time stakes winner Disco Chick. A daughter of Jump Start, Disco Chick raced for five years, earned \$735,250, sold as a broodmare prospect for \$180,000, and has since become the dam of undefeated graded stakes winner Disco Time. And is the namesake for a Parx stakes.

It's only fitting that a winner of the Disco Chick Stakes be bred and owned by Kolybabiuk.

Nature's Candy hasn't quite reached the Disco Chick stratosphere, but she's working her way up by getting her seventh win in 20 starts with solid effort in the Disco Chick Stakes on Oct. 22. Sent off the 3-5 favorite by trainer Hugo Padilla, the 5-year-old chestnut daughter of Uncle Lino acted up in the gate but got away clean and was hustled to the front under Andy Hernandez before being eased off the pace in second behind fractions of :22.78 and :46.11. She took over entering the stretch and turned away the efforts of Pachelbel to win by 2½ lengths in a final time of 1:26.18 for 7 furlongs. It was her fifth win in eight starts this year as she pushed her career

earnings to \$326,557. Earlier wins came in allowance company at Parx and Penn, at distances from 7 furlongs to a mile and 70 yards.

Nature's Candy was recording her first stakes win in her fifth career stakes start. Her other stakes-placing was a third in the off-the-turf Mrs. Penny Stakes at Parx last year.

Out of Easter Blossom, a winning daughter of Speightstown, Nature's Candy represents three generations of Kolybabiuk homebreds. Less than two months after Kolybabiuk purchased Survey in 1991, he selected the winning Drone mare Got a Cold out of the Keeneland November sale. Carrying her seventh foal, Kolybabiuk went to \$13,000 for the 11-year-old gray mare in foal to Dixieland Brass. It was a bargain more than a 100 times over. The resulting filly was Dixie Fever, a stakes-placed runner, but more was to come.

Got a Cold also produced \$645,829-earner and graded stakes winner American Freedom, stakes winner and \$325,436-earner Freedom's Honor and stakes-placed Freedom's Dawn and Freedom Quest. With the majority racing under Kolybabiuk's Freedom Acres banner, they combined to earn nearly \$1.5 million.

Dixie Fever stayed in the broodmare band and produced stakes winner Willie's Luv (dam of Kolybabiuk-bred graded winner Freedom Star), stakes-placed Proud and Free and six other foals, including Easter Blossom.

Dam of five foals, all by Pennsylvania sires and bred by Kolybabiuk, Easter Blossom has four winners, three the earners of six figures. Her most recent foal is the 3-year-old filly Angel of Hope (by Warrior's Reward), who finished third in the Imply Stakes on Sept. 19 at Parx under the Freedom Racing colors. ■

In over four months time Silhoutte Cove has risen through the ranks – from first-time starter, to allowance winner, to stakes performer to stakes winner. Owner Doug Gibson and trainer Bernie Houghton have ridden the wave since a Penn National maiden special weight debut on June 20, when the 3-year-old son of Warrior's Reward overcame a rough start to draw off a daylight winner.

It was all systems go when he joined the field for the Jump Start Stakes at Parx for PA-Bred and PA-Sired runners, 3 and up, on Oct. 22. Dismissed at odds of 13-1, the bay gelding was never far off the pace set by Dropline, gained the lead at the

top of the stretch, and edged away under Frankie Pennington to score 1¾ lengths. His final time for the 7 furlongs was 1:23.76 (off fractions of :23.02, :46.15 and 1:10.97).

Three of the stakes' seven entrants came out of the Houghton barn, including second-place finisher Come Prima, winner of the Prince Lucky Stakes last out and the only other 3-year-old in the race.

Silhoutte Cove notched his third win from five career starts, to go with a second and a third, the latter coming in the Prince Lucky Stakes. He's a second-generation runner from Sylmar Farm, having been bred by Betsy Houghton, as was his dam, Silhoutte Island.

A daughter of Pennsylvania sire Patton, Silhoutte Island launched her career for Sylmar Farm and was a two-time winner before being claimed from her breeder in October 2010. She ran a total of six years, including a busy 18-start 6-year-old season, earned \$143,432 with a record of 49-3-8-6, and made her way back to Sylmar as a broodmare.

Silhoutte Cove is Silhoutte Island's sixth foal, all by Pennsylvania stallions. Of the mare's five to start, all are winners, with Silhoutte Cove the richest with \$121,500. His 5-year-old full-sister Morgans Cove comes next with \$91,059.

Silhoutte Island has a current yearling colt by Wicked Strong named My Distant Drums. She produced a colt this past May by Cloud Computing who has given the name Favorite Song. ■

A trivia question that will stump everyone. Q: Which PA-Bred has the most stakes wins in 2025? A: Saburo's Grace.

The 5-year-old gray gelding Saburo's Grace got his third and fourth stakes wins of the year in late September and mid-October when taking the B Cup Three Year Old and Up Classic, bettering his second-place finish in 2024, and following up with a repeat victory in the Farewell Stakes. In both races at Lethbridge-Rmtc he went off as favorite, turned back Christine's Jack, and won by 1¹/₂ lengths. While the margin was not remarkable, the manner in which he won the Farewell was eye-catching, as he powered away late around the half-mile track.

The purses may be small, but Saburo's Grace has put together a very good year. In nine starts, he has never finished worse than third. His other stakes wins came in the Open in June and the August Sprint Series Stakes, the latter at Grande Prairie in Alberta. He also has three stakes-placings at Grande Prairie. For his efforts, he has earned \$24,225.

During his career, he has racked up 12 wins from 23 starts, nine placings, and earnings of \$59,598. Owned by Barbara Norlander and trained by Lyle W. Magnuson, the son of Saburo was bred by Mick Ruis' Ruis Racing LLC. He is one of two winners for his dam Miz Graycee, a winning daughter of Mizzen Mast campaigned by Ruis.

Little J P is a two-time stakes winner in 2025, getting his second when cruising home a 2³/₄-length winner at Lethbridge-Rmtc in the B Cup Sprint Stakes, two races before Saburo's Grace's win, on the Sept. 28 card. He completed the 5¹/₂-furlong race 1:06.08, just a couple of ticks off the track record.

Also a gray 5-year-old, Little J P is by Prospect Park out of unraced Dances On Water, by In Excess (Ire), and a half-brother to graded stakes winner Gold Rush Dancer. He won his career debut in May of his 2-year-old season at Parx Racing for his breeder John Parker. By the start of his 4-year-old season he was on the southwest circuit, racing in Arizona.

Little J P's recent stakes win was the fifth of his 26-start career. This year he has six starts, won three, and finished second twice. Interestingly, he and Saburo's Grace have met twice during the year. Little J P won the July Sprint Series Stakes while Saburo's Grace finished a length back in third. A head separated them when they finished second and third in the Paint the Park Purple Stakes in August.

Little J P, owned by Jeff Van Nistelrooy, Jim Depew, Rick Wiest, Cory Wiest and Lana Wiest and trained by Depew, now has career earnings of \$88,196, with \$15,672 earned this year. ■
