LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

Congratulations to Our Shot, bred by Dr. S. Mark Rayburg Inc., who recorded his first graded stakes victory in the \$350,000 Grade 2 Woodford Stakes. At the Maryland Million, it was a Pennsylvania-bred who stole the show in the Distaff. Foxy Junior, a homebred for Dianne Stern, won her second straight stakes in the \$100,000 Maryland Million Distaff. She took the \$100,000 Plum Pretty Stakes at Parx last out and is now 5-for-6 this year. The Boy's Warrior, bred by Warrior's Reward LLC, made it two stakes in a row by winning the Mark McDermott at Presque Isle Downs. The 2yo is a perfect 3-for-3 with earnings of \$142,200, breeder awards of \$56,880 and \$14,220 in stallion awards. That's a total of \$213,300. Wow!



The next races in the PA-Sired PA-Bred Stallion Series are scheduled for Dec. 30 at PARX. The series races for 2yos and 2yo fillies will carry a \$50,000 breeder bonus for horses that finish first, second and third in total points for the series: \$25,000 for first, \$15,000 for second and \$10,000 for third. This bonus will be paid after the 3yo races in 2025.

We have four new stallions coming to PA for the 2025 breeding season. The millionaire, graded stakes-winning, Munnings-sired Zozos; Imposing, the first son of Gun Runner standing outside of Kentucky and out of champion five-time Grade 1 winner (including the Breeders' Cup Distaff) Untapable; PA's own son of Weigelia and winner of over \$900,000, Beren; and Enticed, a multiple graded stakes-winning son of Medaglia d'Oro and multiple G1 winner It's Tricky. Take a look at the new additions and a 40% breeder award.

If you are still using paper registrations, please make sure you forward a signed copy of the Code of Ethics, which is attached to the registration form. We will be transitioning to paperless the beginning of 2025. As usual, please contact our office with any questions you may have. Wishing you a fantastic finish to 2024, and remember, PA is the only place to Breed and Race! Over \$30 million paid out in 2023 to PA-Bred owners and breeders in Breeder Awards, Owner Bonuses and Restricted Races. Go PA!!

PENNSYLVANIA-BRED CONTINUE TO DOMINATE

at the

THOROUGHBRED MAKEOVER

Every October the Retired Racehorse Project hosts its annual Thoroughbred Makeover at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington, Ky. The event, held Oct. 9-12, has turned into one of the most exciting and anticipated competitions of the year. In 2024, more than 280 Off-The-Track Thoroughbreds showcased their abilities in one (or two) of the 10 disciplines: barrel racing, competitive trail, dressage, eventing, field hunter, freestyle, polo, ranch work, show hunter, and show jumper.

The Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association (PHBA) has been a proud sponsor of the Makeover, awarding \$5,000 to the highest-performing Pennsylvania-Bred. PHBA Executive Coordinator Averie Levanti was on-hand to watch the week of festivities.

"I've attended the Thoroughbred Makeover the past four years and it's something I look forward to every year!" Levanti said. "It's so much fun having the chance to chase Pennsylvania-Breds around the Horse Park for the week as they show off their new skills in their second careers.

"For the second year in a row, Pennsylvania-Breds ended up winning two of the 10 disciplines offered. They represented only 17 of over 280 entrants in this year's Makeover and yet we still ended up as the only state-bred program with multiple winners. Last year's winners came in polo and barrel racing, while this year's winners were in field hunter and show hunter. It's fantastic to be able to display the versatility of our Pennsylvania Thoroughbreds once they move on from life on the racetrack."

Highlighting the Keystone State's contingent was He Did It, ridden and owned by amateur Anissa Butler. The duo captured the Show Hunter division, defeating 41 competitors. They also contested Show Jumping where they finished 8th of 49 horses.

He Did It hails from a deep Pennsylvania female family that travels back through George Strawbridge Jr.'s Augustin Stables, to Derry Meeting Farm. The 17.1-hand 4-year-old son of Blame is a grandson of the Caveat mare Ratings, herself a five-time stakes winner. He Did It, a full brother to graded stakes winner Daisy, sold as a yearling for \$275,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Yearling Sale. High hopes as a racehorse fizzled out after two unplaced efforts for owner Mark Grier and trainer Arnaud Delacour. However, retirement from racing has given He Did It the opportunity to shine.

"He's just incredible; I'm speechless," Butler said shortly after their Show Hunter win. "I have watched this horse in another barn every week, never even seeing his whole body, thinking one day I wanted to own him. He's truly a gentleman and so willing to work. I was a little worried I made some amateur mistakes, but I am really happy that I was able to sit up and relax since mistakes do happen. I just had to let it go and remember we are still training!"

Finishing just .250 points behind Butler in the Show Hunter finale was fellow PA-Bred In the Air. The 3-year-old son of Warrior's Reward and rider Caitlan Brooks entered the finale

in fifth place but wowed the judges, who aptly rewarded them with a huge bump into second place. But that was not the end for In the Air, Brooks, and owner Presley Galland. They similarly qualified for the finale in Field Hunters with a fourth-place in preliminary competition. This time they vaulted all the way to the top, being crowned Field Hunter champion.

Brooks was aware of how special her mount had to be for this to be possible. "He's actually only 3, so there's nothing more I could have asked of him. He's been lovely and consistent all week. We had luckily just been in the ring for the show hunters, so I just trusted him and went out there and had some fun."

In the Air, out of the Fusaichi Pegasus mare Curious Wings, raced five times for owner/breeder Copper Penny Stables, with one third and earnings of \$4,331.

John Van Schaik captured the Top Amateur award in the Polo division while riding Pralinesallshookup. The duo ultimately finished third after entering the finale in fourth place. By Eclipticalspraline and out of the Shakin It Up mare Empress Montez, the 4-year-old gelding's female family impressively goes back to multiple Grade 2 winner Capeside Lady.

Pralinesallshookup was bred by Mary Haire and Maria Haire and was raced by Maria Haire. He was clearly better suited for a life after racing, with no wins in six starts and earnings of \$3,181.

James C. Chandley bred Fairview, a 4-year-old daughter of Blofeld. Though she only earned \$15,795 on the racetrack, Fairview has excelled over jumps for Brenda Awad in her second career. The pair were given the CANTER USA Grad Award after finishing 7th of 42 in show hunters and 11th of 49 in show jumping.

Olivia Smith and The Programmer finished 43rd of 99 entrants in Dressage but received a truly special commendation when presented with the Best Conditioned Dressage horse award. Bred by Thomas McClay in 2018, The Programmer won three of seven career starts and earned \$72,856. The gray gelding is by The Factor and was campaigned by trainer Tim Girten for Warrior's Reward LLC.

Familiar face Layne Shaffer returned to the Kentucky Horse Park with Arrowwood Farm-bred Noteworthy. Shaffer is most well-known for her success with fellow Arrowwood-bred Floo Powder, who captured the 2021 T.I.P. Championships Barrel Racing Average category during that year's Thoroughbred Makeover. Shaffer and Noteworthy finished 7th of 20 in Barrel Racing.

Jamison Glass rode warhorse Vishnu to an 11th-place finish in Show Hunters. Bred in 2017 by William Solomon VMD, the son of Last Gunfighter finished on the board in 28 of 60 career races, won five and earned \$107,793.

Fellow warhorse Screen Saver (by Albert the Great), who captured nine of 57 starts and earned \$363,137, was bred by Rick Molineaux. Now 8, Screen Saver last raced in July (with trainer Jamie Ness), which gave rider Maddy Hall a short window of training before the Makeover, but they still finished 28th of 51 in Competitive Trail.

Island Peak sired two Makeover competitors in 2024. Call Me Peak and Emma Vanderwal finished 13th in Freestyle and 40th in Competitive Trail. A winner of one race from seven starts, Call Me Peak was bred by Emma Morrell. Also by Island Peak was Randall Russell-bred Chicken Talk, who finished 35th in Competitive Trail with rider Savanna Belanger.

Thru Novas Eyes and Jill Diestelhorst contested Ranch Work and Freestyle, where they placed 17th and 19th, respectively. Thru Novas Eyes was a homebred for John McCaslin, who also trained the now 6-year-old daughter of El Padrino during her two-race career.

Everest Stables bred Meet the Elite, a son of Sharp Azteca, and campaigned him at Parx Racing where he won twice. Hailey Holleman rode Meet the Elite in Competitive Trail and Dressage.

Louisa Legato rode Cripple Creek in Dressage. Michael Moran bred the 4-year-old son of English Channel.

One of the most heartwarming stories of this year's Thoroughbred Makeover was Justine Howell and her Whysper Wynd Farm. Not only were two horses she bred competing, but she rode one of them. Howell tracks every one of her homebreds and was waiting for the moment that Stonegate would be ready for retirement. The 9-year-old son of Paynter earned \$219,134 while winning four races and finishing on the board in 19 of 37 starts. When it was time, Howell excitedly welcomed Stonegate home. The pair made the trip to Kentucky, where they competed in Dressage.

Howell was also on-hand to cheer on Taryn Marcks in Barrel Racing aboard Champagne for All, who was out of her mare Champagne Rhythm. They ended up finishing 20th in the division. Howell's enthusiasm for breeding, racing, and aftercare is exactly what the Retired Racehorse Project and the Thoroughbred Makeover is all about. ■

Runnymede Farm Raises to Race for the Advantage

The late afternoon sun spread golden light across the pristine rolling hills of Runnymede Farm in Coatesville, Pa. Gathering at the "Training Barn" were owners Greg and his wife Caroline Bentley, as well as Farm Manager Joe Cassidy. Breeding Manager Jim Bergen would join the group later in a light and airy broodmare barn at the precipice of one of the hills.

The barn was fairly empty, save for stakes-placed Loose Ends, who had recently returned home for the winter. The 5-year-old son of Divining Rod was still in racing shape and stood proudly on the side of a lush slope after Cassidy requested that he be led out for photographs.

"We think he has the ability to make the transition into steeplechasing well," Cassidy noted, before adding, "He's the first one back home but the others are coming soon. We like to bring them home, and the great thing is that they can stay in shape. When they go back to the racetrack, they're pretty much ready for four-furlong breezes and our trainers love that."

Runnymede Farm is not just a breeding facility; it also houses a fully-accredited 6-furlong Tapeta training track, an outdoor swimming pond and a Hitchcock pen. Not only does the home team use the facilities, but some of the top horsemen from a variety of disciplines schedule usage, including the United States Equestrian Team, Eventing Team, and steeplechase trainers. Cassidy said that they mixed the length and width of swimming docks from two of the nation's top eventers to create their own "Best of the Best" pond. Every single horse

on the grounds of Runnymede Farm has swum in the pond.

Cassidy said that their team believes that this is crucial to the development of their horses. "It teaches them that 'No' is not an answer. We've found that it helps them in so many ways, the most obvious of which is in the starting gate. We also send every horse through our Hitchcock pen. It's great because all the people on the farm line up to watch on those days!"

A Hitchcock pen is a circular wooden chute that includes hedge-shaped jumps. The horses are then "free lunged" around the course. Cassidy admitted that not every horse has shown ability at jumping (or swimming), but that they still learn an immense willingness to try.

Runnymede Farm was purchased by the Bentleys from Diane Wister, whose brother is George Strawbridge Jr., a member of the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame's Board of Trustees. Strawbridge races under Augustin Stables and his Derry Meeting Farm—birthplace of Storm Cat—is adjacent to the 440 acres that encompass the Bentley's portion of Runnymede Farm. The original Runnymede Farm was over

2,500 acres. Those two properties, as well as several others, include 1,700 acres of neighboring green space for Pennsylvania's Chester County.

Greg and his four brothers founded an infrastructure engineering software provider called Bentley Systems in 1984. In the 40 years since its inception, the company has become internationally successful, yet continues to hold its headquarters right in Exton, Pa. That success has allowed Greg and Caroline to pursue their love for horses and horse racing. Since there is a well-known Runnymede Farm in Kentucky, the Bentleys decided to race most of their horses under the moniker Runnymoore Racing, LLC.

Over the years, the couple has been blessed with several nationally-recognized racehorses. The three most well known now share a pensioners' paddock at Runnymede Farm. The Bentleys acquired Postulation, who gave them a thrilling victory in the \$250,000 American St. Leger-G3 at Arlington Park in 2017. Alwaysmining gave them the thrill of

competing in a Triple Crown race after he earned a spot in the 2019 Preakness Stakes following six straight victories, including an eye-opening 11½-length score in the local prep, the \$125,000 Federico Tesio Stakes. While Alwaysmining was unsuccessful in the Preakness, he ultimately earned \$618,549, including three more wins, of which two were stakes. And perhaps their most exciting win was with Hardest Core, who captured the 2014 Arlington Million-G1 over some of the best turf horses of his generation, including the prior year's Breeders' Cup Turf winner Magician (Ire), defending champion Real Solution, 2013 Canadian Horse of the Year Up With the Birds, and multimillionaire Side Glance (GB).

"After Hardest Core, we thought it was easy," Caroline laughed.

When Hardest Core was sent to the farm between racing seasons, he "babysat" a young filly named Giant Shadow. The daughter of Giant's Causeway had captured three races in a

row, including a maiden special weight and allowance at Parx Racing, before a dull stakes debut necessitated a break for the winter. Coming full circle, Giant Shadow is now the dam of Loose Ends. And what was also so special about Loose Ends' stakes-placing in the 2022 Crowd Pleaser Stakes? Well, the winner was also their own homebred, Undercover Kitty. They were officially in the breeding game.

"We came to realize that, even with everyone meaning well, you're never going to know as much about a horse you're buying as the seller does," Greg noted. "But if you breed and raise the horse then you have the advantage. It made sense that breeding to race is really our intended final state here."



Loose Ends

Caroline added, "We bought fillies with an eye for breeding but we were very new at it so we weren't sure what our goals really were, other than to race a horse that we really bred."

A major addition to their team was Bergen, who came with an impressive resume. Bergen had experience in every facet of the Thoroughbred industry: from working for three Hall of Fame trainers, to managing a training center outside Toronto where he also advised some of the top breeding farms in Canada, and assisting trainer Jonathan Sheppard for 17 years. Bergen was even recruited for several years to work at Cambridge Stud in New Zealand based on his strong knowledge of American pedigrees.

When Bergen came to Runnymede Farm, he joined forces with Calvin Smith, who had done all of the foaling since 1980 for Derry Meeting Farm. Bergen said, "We worked so well together. I used to say that Calvin had his hands on more Grade 1 legs than any trainer in the neighborhood. He was there when Storm Cat was foaled and was learning how to foal

when Danzig was foaled. He was a mammoth of a man but gentle as a lamb, yet strong as a bull."

Sadly, Smith passed away in June 2023. He left a huge hole in the hearts and operation of Runnymede Farm and this year's foaling season was a difficult one for the employees. Bergen credits their close location to New Bolton Center, as well as one of the hospital's interns who had a strong interest in foaling, as the way the farm was able to successfully process the season.

Meanwhile on the racetrack, Runnymede Racing was taking flight, with multiple homebred Pennsylvania stakes winners including Stern Chaser, Late Frost, Treveso, and the exciting juvenile filly Caprice (by Golden Lad).

Since purchasing Runnymede Farm, the Bentleys have strived for success in local programs. With the advent of the PA-Bred, PA-Sired program, their team is even more focused on supporting Pennsylvania breeding. Bergen noted that they have a weanling half-brother to Caprice by now-pensioned Pennsylvania sire Warrior's Reward.

The Runnymede team is excited moving into the future. Their new mares include stakes-winning PA-Bred Cinnabunny (in foal to Munnings), multiple stakes-placed homebred In a Spin (by Hard Spun), PA-Bred stakes winner Tappin Josie, and a daughter of Triple Crown winner Justify.

"We would like to take full advantage and be participating in all of the Pennsylvania races and where we're not, we want to fill in the gaps," Greg said. "We want to show what kind of agricultural operation you can have when you have good people with good experience." ■

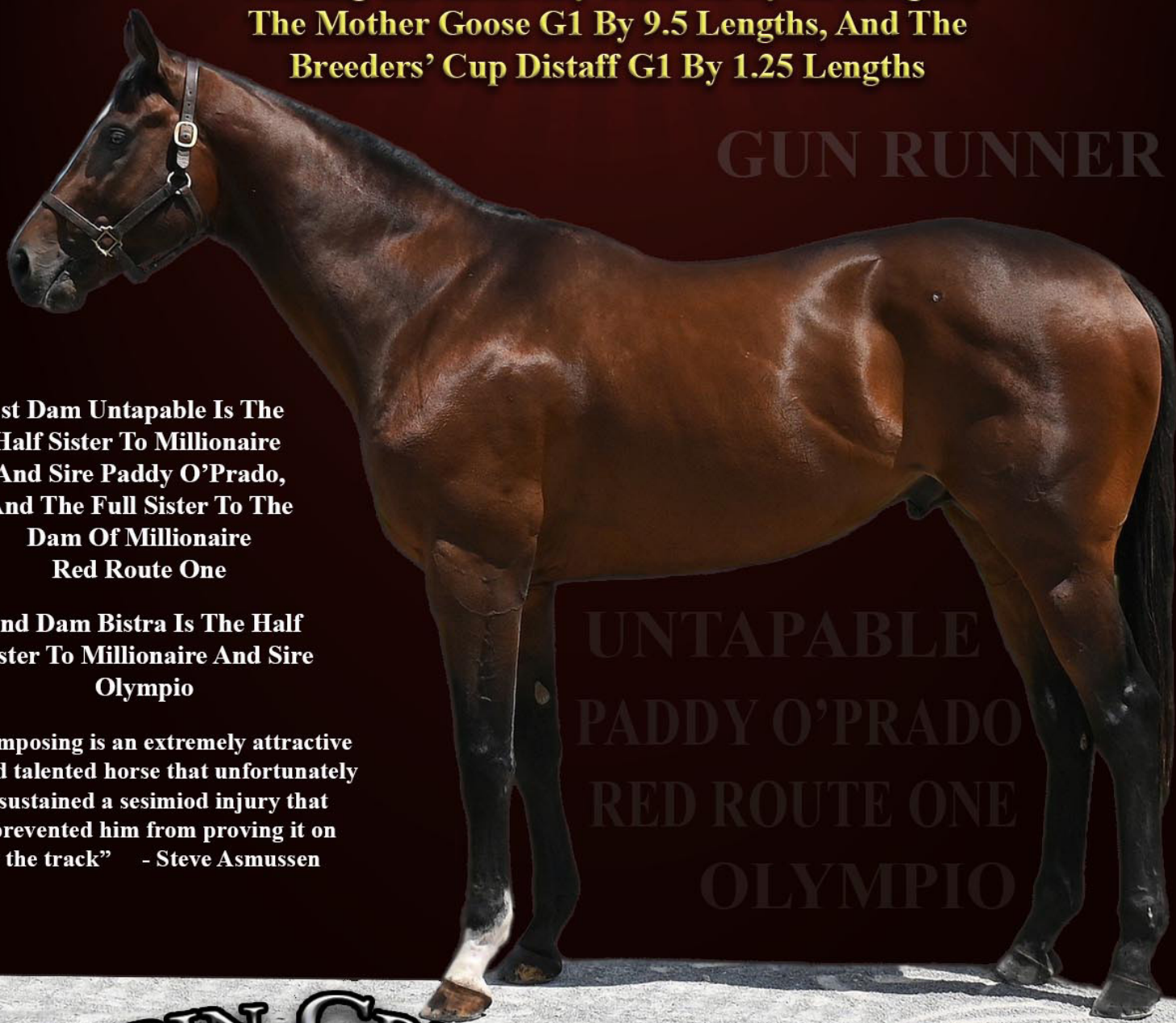

With a PA-Bred by a Maryland stallion in the barn, the connections of Foxy Junior have taken advantage of the regional state programs. After defeating PA-Bred fillies and mares in the Plum Pretty Stakes on the PA Derby Day card on Sept. 21, the dark bay daughter of Cuba went postward in one of the most contentious races on the Maryland Million day card at Laurel on Oct. 12, the 7-furlong Distaff Stakes. She chalked up her fifth win in six starts this year with her three-quarter-length score.

Bred and owned by Dianne Stern and trained by Bernie Houghton, the 4-year-old filly went postward under Jomar Torres, who has been aboard for all her starts this year. The 5-1 third choice of the nine fillies and mares, she was always in contention, grabbed the lead at the top of the stretch, and proved determined to the wire as she held off second choice Sheilahs Warcloud and favorite Spencerian to complete the distance in 1:23.86.

“We agreed on this spot after [the win in] the last race,” Houghton said.

From the final crop of the late Maryland sire Cuba, a son of Not For Love and the 2008 Maryland Million Classic winner who stood on the Eastern Shore in Maryland, Foxy Junior now has eight career wins from 18 starts, for earnings of \$272,669.

A winner at 2 and two-time winner at 3 while also stakes-placed when third in the Fort Indiantown Gap, all coming at Penn National, the filly started this year in May while risked for a \$25,000 tag, rolled home a 11½-length winner, and hasn't been risked since.

The last of three foals produced by the Stern-bred winning mare Foxy Drummer (by Flatter), and only winner, Foxy Junior descends from the stakes-winning Smarten mare Ragtime Doll, a half-sister to stakes winner Two Punch Sonny. Under the stable name Half N Half Stable, Stern claimed Ragtime Doll's stakes-placed daughter Hanalei Bay for \$7,500 in December 2005. Over the next three years, Hanalei Bay made 31 starts, won or placed 16 times, including five stakes-placings, and earned \$142,862 of her career total \$203,722.

Sterns bred the first three foals out of Hanalei Bay, the second being Foxy Drummer. The remaining five foals were bred by Dr. and Mrs. A. Leonard Pineau, including stakes-placed \$409,757-earner Hanalei's Houdini. All seven of Hanalei Bay's foals to race were winners. ■

The rewards of bringing stallion Warrior's Reward to Pennsylvania continue to grow. One of the most popular stallions in the state after he arrived for the 2019 season, Warrior's Reward has three PA-Sired crops of racing age, and those crops have yielded five PA-Bred stakes horses since late August. The latest from his current crop of 3-year-olds is Warrior's Reward LLC's homebred filly Candy Reward.

The bay filly turned in a gutsy effort to win the H.B.P.A. Stakes against open company on Oct. 7 at Presque Isle. One of 11 in the field of fillies and mares racing 1 mile and 70 yards over the Tapeta surface, Candy Reward was sent to the front from the gate by Pablo Morales, a position in which she's been comfortable since her maiden breaking daylight score at Presque Isle in August.

But it was no easy lead as longshot Sweet Alyssa also was keen to go. The two raced as a team through quick splits of :23.19 and :46.69. By the time they were entering the far turn, Candy Reward pulled ahead. But favorite Sand and Sea and a wall of horses were in hot pursuit. As the margin dwindled Candy Reward just held on to win by a head. The final time was 1:39.53, .56 seconds off the track record.

With her third win in her last four starts, all since returning in August after a six-month break, Candy Reward boosted her career earnings to \$125,155 from seven starts. Trainer Tim Girten has seen promise in the filly since sending her out for her 2-year-old debut in October 2023. That came in

the Finest City Stakes, for PA-Bred fillies, at Presque Isle and she ran hard enough to finish third, beaten a half-length by Greavette and Dancing Spirit. The H.B.P.A. was her second start in stakes company in seven starts.

Candy Reward is the second foal out of Unimagineable, an unraced daughter of Twirling Candy. The mare's first foal, the Competitive Edge gelding Shy Da Runner, now 4, has been running well in allowance company at Presque Isle, getting his most recent win out of the Girten barn two days after Candy Reward's stakes win. He has won four of his 20 starts for earnings of \$108,166.

Unimagineable produced a Warrior's Reward filly in 2023 named Eye Candy Warrior and a Warrior's Reward colt this past March.

After covering 10 mares this past season, Warrior's Reward was retired. The 18-year-old has since been gelded and is a resident at Old Friends in Kentucky. He currently ranks second on Pennsylvania's leading sires list for 2024, with progeny earnings in excess of \$2.6 million, and holds the same spot among the state's top juvenile sires.

Unimagineable was bred back to Kentucky Derby-G1 winner Mandaloun. ■

Dixieland Belle, the first foal for Uptowncharlybrown Stud LLC's graded stakes winner Dixie Serenade, outdid her illustrious mother by becoming a stakes winner first-time out when taking Presque Isle Downs's \$100,000 Finest City Stakes on Oct. 14.

Sent off the 6-5 favorite in the field of five juvenile PA-Bred fillies that included Honorable Win, winner of the Miss Blue Tye Dye Stakes at Parx on Sept. 21 in her debut, Dixieland Belle broke a step slowly under Pablo Morales and was outrun as she trailed the field. Taking charge was Night Nurse, who outsprinted her four rivals and had a daylight lead while setting opening fractions of :22.21 and :45.95.

By the time the fillies hit the top of the stretch, Honorable Win, Dixieland Belle and Boujie Betz caught the leader as they fanned four-wide. The race to the wire saw Honorable Win to the outside with a slight advantage over Dixieland Belle in midstretch, but the latter was eager for the battle. Boujie Betz surrendered as the top two continued to fight it out to the wire, with Dixieland Belle edging away late to a half-length victory. Boujie Betz was more than seven lengths back in third. Final time for the 6 furlongs was 1:10.94.

From one of the last crops of the late More Than Ready, who ranked among the best stallions of the past quarter century, the lanky chestnut filly is owned by Uptowncharlybrown Stud LLC, which co-bred her with the More Than Ready Syndicate. The filly was an \$85,000 Keeneland September sales yearling with GEB Bloodstock signing the ticket.

Sent to trainer Mike Trombetta and based at Fair Hill Training Center, Dixieland Belle had been working steadily towards her debut, starting in Saratoga in August. She earned \$60,000 in her first start.

Her dam, Dixie Serenade, was a graded stakes winner of \$348,765 who took three tries to get her first win. A member of Uptowncharlybrown's second crop, Dixie Serenade (out of the Malibu Moon mare Moonlight Serenade) would win five times, including Belmont Park's Grade 3 Victory Ride Stakes as a 3-year-old in 2018. The mare has a 2023 PA-Bred filly by Frosted who sold as a short yearling this past February at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky for \$17,000 and sold again during the summer at OBS for \$30,000. After producing a PA-Bred son of champion and classic winner Essential Quality in April, Dixie Serenade was bred back to Arabian Lion.

As a broodmare sire, Uptowncharlybrown has four daughters with foals of racing age to date. Of their 10 foals, eight have started (with average earnings of \$65,193) and five are winners, led by Dixieland Belle. ■

Getting past a large field going a short distance, Gatsas Stables, Steven Schoenfeld and John P. Terranova II's Our Shot burst through for a 1 3/4-length come-from-behind victory in the Grade 2 Woodford Stakes going 5 1/2 furlongs over the Keeneland turf on Oct. 5.

The 5-year-old chestnut son of Kantharos had been knocking on the door for his first stakes win for more than a year. The Woodford was a true test, as a dozen seasoned turf sprinters took to the firm course. Breaking sharply under Luis Saez, Our Shot soon drifted back and was along the inside while racing midpack off sizzling early fractions of :21.35 and :43.96 set by Souper Quest.

As the field turned for home, Our Shot shifted out but had more than half the field to catch. With a sixteenth mile to go he was flying, drawing off and stopping the clock in 1:02.36.

With a seemingly perfect prep for the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint-G1, part-owner and trainer John Terranova II nixed the idea the next day. "He's not Breeders' Cup eligible, so it's more than likely he won't go," said Terranova. "He is really good

this morning, but the turf sprint season is about done so we'll probably freshen him up and then start him back at Tampa."

An earner of \$570,080 in 19 starts, Our Shot has finished worse than fourth only twice in his career. A \$135,000 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic fall sales yearling consigned by Heart Hill Farms and purchased by Tonja Terranova, agent, Our Shot was unplaced in his only start at 2. He got his first win in his first start at 3 in February at Aqueduct, then ran at seven other tracks in his next seven starts over the next year and a half. He picked up an allowance win in May at Pimlico to conclude his sophomore season, and was back in form at 4 with allowance wins at Tampa Bay, Keeneland and Saratoga and a second in Monmouth's Get Serious Stakes. He added a second-place finish in last year's Woodford Stakes and a third in Saratoga's Harvey Pack Stakes, a race he came back to finish second in this year.

"We hope (he's turned a corner after this performance). We think so," added Terranova. "These turf sprinters, they tend to get better with age and with some seasoning. He was coming into this race doing really well. . . (Jockey) Luis (Saez) gave him a fantastic ride. The whole team did a great job."

The six-time winner is the first stakes performer out of the Northern Afleet mare Fleetheart. Breeder S. Mark Rayburg purchased Fleetheart for \$35,000, carrying her first foal by Henny Hughes, out of the 2010 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. Fleetheart has eight named foals, five of them starters, four winners, her last the unraced 2-year-old filly Shiny Dime (by The Factor) in 2022. ■

The Boy's Warrior remained undefeated with his dominant win in the Mark McDermott Stakes at Presque Isle Downs on Oct. 21.

The 2-year-old son of Warrior's Reward owned and bred by Warrior's Reward LLC had taken the Whistle Pig Stakes at Parx one month earlier, and won first time out on Aug. 28 at

his Presque Isle summer base with trainer Tim Girten. With three victories, he now has earnings of \$142,200.

Sent off the 2-5 favorite in the \$100,000 McDermott Stakes for registered PA-Bred juveniles, the bay gelding was never really threatened as he posted fractions of :22.41, :45.50 and :57.02. He entered the stretch with a more than 2-length lead and extended it to the wire to win by 4 lengths. His time for 6 furlongs was 1:09.16, the fastest for a 2-year-old at the meet. And he topped a Warrior's Reward exacta as Ballad of Warrior closed well to finish second, nearly 5 lengths ahead of the third-place runner.

The Boy's Warrior is the second foal out of Inciarte, an unraced daughter of Broken Vow. The mare produced two foals to the cover of Warrior's Reward – Warrior At Bat, now 3, placed in three of his seven starts. The mare didn't have a foal reported in 2023 and delivered a Goldencents colt for Warrior's Reward LLC this past May.

Warrior's Reward, a Grade 1-winning sprinter from the first crop of Medaglia d'Oro, stood in Pennsylvania since the 2019 breeding season until pensioned this year. He's now a resident at Old Friends in Georgetown, Ky. The 18-year-old stallion ranks second on the Pennsylvania leading sires list of 2024. ■

Two 4-year-old PA-Bred geldings making their careers in Western Canada continue to roll as Saburo's Grace captured the Farewell Stakes on Oct. 14 at Lethbridge - Rmtc, and Little J P won the B Cup Sprint Stakes at the same track on Sept. 29. One race later on the Sept. 29 card, Saburo's Grace finished second in the B Cup Three Year Old and Up Classic Stakes.

Saburo's Grace has had the more impressive record at Lethbridge - Rmtc, making five starts over the past two years, four in stakes, winning three and finishing second in the other two.

Little J P's first start at Lethbridge - Rmtc was a disaster after he stumbled at the start of the June race and lost his rider. The B Cup Sprint Stakes was his second start, and a 3-length win.

Saburo's Grace, a 4-year-old gray/roan son of Saburo owned by Barbara Norlander and trained by Lyle W. Magnuson, was the overwhelming favorite in the Farewell Stakes. After stalking the pace, he drew off to win by nearly 3 lengths going 7 furlongs. The win was his second in a stakes this year – he captured Grande Prairie's J.D.A. Raceway Stakes in August – and he has hit the board in all six 2024 starts.

Bred by Mick Ruis' Ruis Racing LLC, Saburo's Grace is the only winner out of Miz Graycee, a daughter of Mizzen Mast campaigned by Ruis to four wins at Santa Anita and Los Alamitos.

Little J P launched his career at Parx Racing in May of his 2-year-old season and won for his breeder John Parker. By Prospect Park out of Dances On Water, an unraced daughter of In Excess (Ire), and a half-brother to graded stakes winner Gold Rush Dancer, Little J P ran in stakes that year at Belmont Park and Delaware Park but was unplaced, and didn't find the winner's circle in six starts at 3, making his last start last year in September at Meadowlands.

In his first start at 4 in February, Little J P was running for a tag for owner/trainer Robert Baze at Turf Paradise. Going through the claiming ranks he was taken for \$4,500 in April and, by the time he won Grande Prairie's Sprint Series Leg One Stakes in July, he was with trainer Magnuson competing for current owners Max Gibb and Rose Rossi. He added the Sprint Series Stakes 15 days later and two more wins – one in allowance company and the latest in the B Cup Sprint Stakes, in which he dueled on the lead and pulled away to win as the 1-2 favorite. He reappeared at Century Downs on Oct. 27 for trainer Rod Heggie in a claiming race and was promptly taken by trainer Karline Kingston for \$12,500. ■
