Rodney and Sharon Eckenrode hosted a fantastic party at their Equistar Farm to celebrate the induction of Smarty Jones into the National Racing Hall of Fame. Pat Chapman, on behalf of Smarty, received an official PA Senate citation from Senator Chris Gebhard, the first ever presented to a non-human. Way to go Smarty!



I’m happy to announce that there will be no registration fee for the PA-Sired PA-Bred Stallion Series in 2025. If your 2yo is a PA-Sired PA-Bred you will be automatically registered to run. The only exception will be the third and final leg of the 2024 Stallion Series, which will be run on Sept. 19 on PA Day at the Races, with stakes purses of \$100,000 for 3yos and 3yo fillies. These horses were already registered as 2yos in 2024. A \$50,000 breeder bonus for horses that finish first, second and third in total points for the 2024 series will be paid after those races – \$25,000 for first, \$15,000 for second and \$10,000 for third.

If you are still using paper registrations, please make sure you forward a signed copy of the Code of Ethics, which is attached to the registration form. We are transitioning to paperless this year. Wishing you good luck for the balance of 2025, and remember, PA is the only place to Breed and Race!!

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SMARTY JONES

PHILADELPHIA'S CHAMPION FINALLY GETS HIS CROWN

'SMARTY' IS ALL YOU NEED TO SAY.

The name alone still brings back memories of the colt who made Philadelphians believe in something bigger than themselves. Few horses in modern racing history have had that kind of cultural impact. Smarty Jones wasn't just a Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner; he was Philadelphia's horse, a working-class champion who inspired people who had never before set foot on a racetrack.

This summer, more than two decades after his unforgettable Triple Crown bid, Smarty Jones was inducted into the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame. He became eligible for the Hall in 2009 but was repeatedly passed over by the nominating committee. This year, his first time actually making the ballot, the voters made sure he got in. For the Pennsylvanians who had rallied around him in 2004, the accolade felt like the crowning moment he had always deserved.

"I had heard through the grapevine that if they could just get his name on the ballot, the voters would do the rest," said Pat Chapman, who bred and owned Smarty with her late husband, Roy, under the moniker Someday Farm.

During the ceremony on August 1, 2025, she was teary-eyed while standing at the podium as she reminisced. "I'm so glad I lived to see this day. This is a bit of vindication for Smarty because he did not quite win the Triple Crown. But the Hall of Fame, that's the crown."

The colt's journey was unlikely from the day he was born on February 28, 2001. Foaled in Chester County, he was one of 914 Pennsylvania-Breds that year. He was first named Get Along, but Chapman changed his name to honor her mother, Mildred Jones, who shared a birthday with the colt and had carried the nickname 'Smarty' as a child.

But before he ever made it to the track, tragedy and hardship shaped his story. In December 2001, the Chapmans' trainer Robert Camac and his wife, Maryann, were murdered, rocking the racing world

nation-

wide. And then two years later, under the care of trainer John Servis, Smarty reared up in the starting gate and slammed his head, fracturing bones around his eye and sinuses. Only sheer will kept him alive as world-renowned veterinarian Dr. Patty Hogan worked to save his life.

By the fall of 2003, Smarty was ready to run. Ridden by local jockey Stewart Elliott, he crushed all competition in his first two starts, one the Pennsylvania Nursery, by a combined 22¾ lengths. He made his sophomore debut just three days into the new year, stepping up in class for the Count Fleet Stakes at Aqueduct. A stumble out of the gate followed by a wide trip around the first turn were merely obstacles to be overcome, and Smarty took them all in stride. When he grabbed the lead he never looked back, drawing away to a 5-length score.

What followed was one of the most thrilling campaigns in modern racing.

Smarty swept Oaklawn Park's three Kentucky Derby preps before storming into Louisville, where he became the first undefeated Derby winner since Seattle Slew. His victory landed him in *Sports Illustrated*, becoming the first Kentucky Derby winner in 21 years to grace its cover. *Time* magazine also named him one of its 100 most influential "people" in 2004.

Two weeks after the Derby, he demolished his rivals in the Preakness by 11½ lengths, still the largest margin in the race's history. Afterwards, the colt traveled with police escorts from Pimlico to his home base in Bensalem, Pa., and then later to Belmont Park for the final leg of the Triple Crown. Few horses in history received such treatment, and by then it was clear Smarty wasn't just a racehorse—he was a national star.

In Philadelphia, Smarty was treated like a hometown sports legend. Philadelphia Park opened on Saturday mornings between the Preakness and

Belmont so fans could watch him train. More than 10,000 people came out, packed 10 rows deep on the apron, many also wearing Phillies, Flyers, and Eagles jerseys. Children and adults alike waved signs as they cheered. 'Smarty Parties' were held all over the country.

On June 5, 2004, 120,139 fans filled Belmont Park, a record for the largest crowd in the track's history that's never been broken. For much of the race, it looked like Smarty would deliver the long-awaited Triple Crown, but pressure was relentless throughout. In the final strides, Birdstone surged past and the grandstand fell silent. Marylou Whitney, the owner of Birdstone and a true member of racing royalty, admitted she was heartbroken that Smarty's dream had ended.

Even in defeat, Smarty's season was extraordinary. He was voted Champion Three-Year-Old Male of 2004 and earned a \$5 million bonus from Oaklawn for sweeping its series and the Derby.

When Smarty retired, Philadelphia Park hosted a celebration in his honor, where fans once again crowded the apron to say goodbye. Fifteen years later, Parx Racing held another 'Smarty Party' to honor the anniversary of his record-breaking season. The event felt like a replay of his retirement parade, with many of the same people in attendance. Some who had been teenagers in 2004 were now adults working in the sport, inspired by Smarty's story. Even John Servis' sons became trainers, while Stewart Elliott's son, Christopher, is a promising young rider.

Three Chimneys Farm in Kentucky won the bidding war to stand Smarty at stud, also inheriting the droves of fans wanting to visit their hero. He returned to the Keystone State in the early 2010s and stood for five years before joining the Kentucky roster at historic Calumet Farm. In 2019, he was back in his home state and now headlines the stallion roster at Rodney Eckenrode's Equistar Training and Breeding in Annville, Pa.

Smarty quickly schooled Eckenrode on the rules of his happiness, chief among them a steady supply of carrots and mints. On August 9, the farm hosted one more 'Smarty Party' to

celebrate his Hall of Fame induction, and, of course, attendance was overwhelming, with fans traveling from all over the country.

"Smarty's 24 and I don't even want to think about a day that he won't be here," Eckenrode admitted. "He's the first one to talk to me in the morning and the last one to say good night."

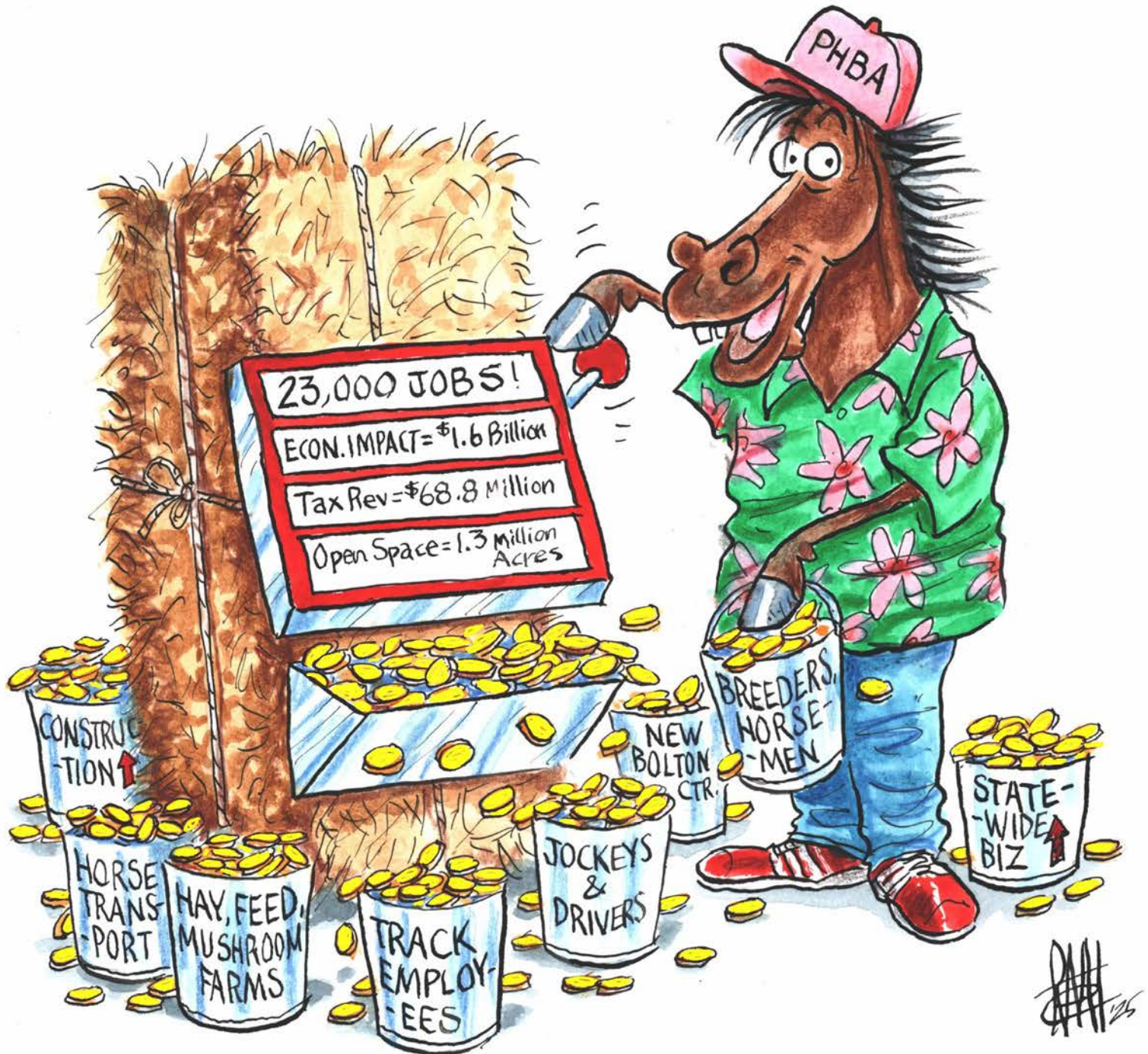
At the Hall of Fame induction, emotions ran high. "Chappy is not here to enjoy this with us," Chapman said of her late husband. "He would be loving and cherishing every minute, but he's here in my heart. He's always here in my heart. I look around the room and I see the faces of so many Pennsylvania Thoroughbred horsemen, Pennsylvania breeders, Pennsylvania fans, and racing fans from other parts of the country. You've all worked so hard to keep Smarty's memory alive, and well, you've done a great job. I thank every one of you."

Servis, who admitted he spent serious time preparing his speech, summed up what made the colt so special. "Smarty Jones wasn't just a champion, he was a horse who captured the imagination of racing fans everywhere. His grit in the stretch, his unrelenting will to win and his undeniable charisma make him unforgettable. But beyond his talent, Smarty Jones had something even more special—he had a connection with people."

Elliott, who rode Smarty in every race, agreed. "He wasn't a big horse, but he had a big heart and he stayed in there for me," he said. "I am so grateful and happy that finally Smarty Jones was elected into the Hall of Fame. He was definitely the best horse that year and he deserves never to be forgotten. Many people know Smarty, but I am fortunate and lucky enough to say that I was the only one on his back and felt how determined he was, how much heart he had and how much he loved to run."

For Philadelphians, and for racing fans everywhere, Smarty Jones remains unforgettable. He was the horse who made a city believe, who packed Belmont Park to record numbers, and who inspired children to chase their own dreams. Now, at last, Philadelphia's champion has his crown. ■

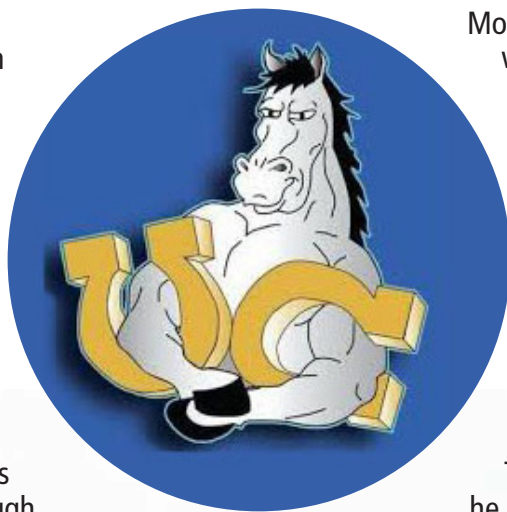

It's All About the Horse for **RALPH SANTELLA AND HIS** BY NIKKI SHERMAN **ULTRA CHAMPIONSHIP RACING**

Ralph Santella's love of racing began in Brooklyn, where his father would take him to Aqueduct and Belmont to watch the horses run. His dad wasn't just a fan, he was a gambler who sometimes owned inexpensive horses, \$2,500 claimers that raced at Garden State, Philadelphia Park and Penn National. They weren't fancy, but he loved every minute of being around them. One of his favorite memories is of a tough old campaigner named Fatty Boy, who raced an astounding 161 times from 1986 to 1995. Santella still remembers begging his father to claim him, even though they didn't have the money.



More than once, he conveniently came down with a sudden "illness" on school mornings, just so he could slip away to watch his favorite horse run. When he moved from Brooklyn to Lebanon, Pa., as a teenager, Fatty Boy was still racing at nearby Penn National, cementing his lifelong connection to the track.

That bond with his father and those early experiences planted the seed for Ultra Championship Racing LLC, the partnership Santella co-founded in 2010. Though he works in software sales by day, he built UCR into a stable that today has about 57 horses: broodmares, yearlings, horses in

training, one stallion and of course a few retirees like Missin the Big Dog. Santella jokes that Big Dog, his first good horse, is "child support", since the gelding lives on a farm in Bernville and still gets weekly visits. "I'll bring him to my place eventually," Santella said, but for now, spoiling him with carrots and attention is just fine.

It's more than a joke, though. It reflects a core promise he's made to every horse he's ever owned. Santella has always ensured his horses are cared for once their racing days are done. That commitment extends across his operation, whether it's a hard-knocking claimer, a stakes winner or even a stallion.

That care was especially meaningful in the story of Fierce and Strong. The first foal out of Santella's first mare, Doubleclickdamouse, the 5-year-old gelding was named by his sister Melissa during her fight with pancreatic cancer. Despite her immense pain, she smiled and said, "You know what, you have to be fierce and strong to deal with this." The name stuck, and the horse has more than lived up to it.

While goofy and quirky on the farm, Fierce and Strong blossomed once placed on the turf. He delivered UCR its first Pennsylvania-bred stakes winner in 2024 with the \$100,000 With Anticipation at Penn National. This year he's continued rewarding Santella with three more wins in four starts, including the \$100,000 Wolf Hill Stakes at Monmouth and the \$75,000 Alphabet Soup Handicap at Penn National. "It was

surreal," Santella said of that first stakes win. "I'm usually not emotional in photos, but this one was so different because my sister named him."

When Melissa was sick, Santella moved to New Jersey to be closer to her. Living near the Meadowlands gave him an outlet during that difficult time, and it was there that he developed a fascination with harness racing.

"Watching how much calmer Standardbreds were than Thoroughbreds blew my mind," he said. "Seeing someone unload two Standardbreds at the same time and hold them while they filled out an in slip—I'd always think, try that with two Thoroughbreds!" While Thoroughbreds remain his first love, his time at the Meadowlands gave him another outlet and deepened his appreciation for all horses during one of the most difficult times of his life.

As UCR grew, Santella's passion expanded to breeding, and in 2024 he took his most ambitious step yet: acquiring Enticed, a stallion with a royal pedigree. Bred and raced by Godolphin, Enticed is by Medaglia d'Oro out of multiple Grade 1 winner It's Tricky (by Mineshaft). He won the Grade 2 Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes at 2, the Grade 3 Gotham at 3, and earned nearly \$600,000 before retiring to Darley Stud in Kentucky. Popular from the start, he covered nearly 150 mares in his first season in 2020.

When Santella sought to bring a Kentucky stallion to Pennsylvania, Enticed stood out. Darley insisted he secure a suitable home first, and that became Mountain Springs Stables in Palmyra, owned and operated by lifelong horseman Rich Miller. Equipped with all new fencing and a brand new stallion barn, Mountain Springs offered the right environment. Standing for \$5,000 live foal, Enticed gives Pennsylvania breeders access to world-class bloodlines in their own backyard.

"Enticed is already spoiled," Santella said. "He's big, friendly, gorgeous—just a treat to be around. Part of the reason we acquired him was to bring a solid Kentucky stallion to Pennsylvania. I believe it strengthens the PA breeding and racing program over the long term."

Santella embraced marketing for Enticed with a fancy logo, website, videos and even merchandise. The campaign has worked, raising awareness and generating bookings. Enticed covered more than 60 mares in his first Pennsylvania season, despite an early hiccup in the print ads when his phone number was misprinted. "Lesson learned—always have someone else proofread," he laughed.

At home, Santella is proud of the mares that anchor his breeding program. "I have a few mares here: Fierce's mom Doubleclickdamouse and stakes winner Marz Express are two of them," he said. "I know we aren't supposed to have favorites but Doubleclick has been one of my favorites since she was in training, and for a massive mare she is a sweetheart."

For all the success, Santella keeps his focus on the horses themselves and the people who care for them. "I couldn't do this without the support of my team—from partners to trainers and their staff. Watching how much grooms put their hearts and souls into a horse, and the love they have for them, is inspiring," he said. "But in the end it's all about the horse, and happy horses win races."

His own role is to make sure they're happy: on weekends he buys over 200 pounds of carrots at the farmers market, then drives barn to barn handing them out with peppermints. It's part welfare check, part therapy. "It's probably more beneficial for me than them," Santella admitted. "Not too many things take stress away like a nudge or hug from a horse."

Today, with nearly 60 horses in the fold, a growing breeding program, and a stallion of Enticed's caliber now in Pennsylvania, Santella has come a long way from cheering for Fatty Boy with his dad. Yet his philosophy hasn't changed: every horse deserves a safe, loving home when the spotlight fades. Enticed will be no exception—when his breeding career ends, he too will retire to a place like Old Friends in Kentucky.

"It's about giving back to the sport I love," Santella said. "And about building something that lasts." From the racetrack to the breeding shed, from Brooklyn to Pennsylvania, Ralph Santella's Ultra Championship Racing is built on loyalty, passion, and the simple joy of being by the side of a horse. ■

The striking dappled gray is magnetic. His running style is riveting. The adjectives to describe the dynamic Witty really know no bounds.

The Lizzie Merryman-bred, trained and co-owned (6-year-old son of Great Notion turned in another sensational effort in Colonial Downs' \$150,000 Van Clief Stakes on Aug. 9, coming from dead last under Jaime Rodriguez going 5½ furlongs and getting up to win by a neck. The Daily Racing Form chart comments recounted his dramatic run: "unhurriedly brought up the rear from off the rail, fanned nine wide into upper stretch still seeing the entire field, launched a furious rally widest of all to drive past in late stretch." His final time was 1:02.52 over the firm turf.

It was his second stakes win of the year in four starts, and eighth of his career, and pushed his lifetime earnings to \$897,782. He has won 11 times in 33 starts, with 11 seconds (eight stakes) and a third (also a stakes), and is a stakes winner on both dirt and turf.

Witty's earlier win this year came in the Jim McKay Turf Sprint Stakes on Preakness day at Pimlico. In between the wins he contested the Harvey Pack Stakes at Saratoga on July 4th, but wasn't able to reel in the frontrunners, winding up fifth of 11.

Witty continues to add to the sensational record of his dam Zeezee Zoomzoom. The daughter of Congrats produced as her first foal two-time PA-Bred Horse of the Year Caravel, winner of the 2022 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint-G1 who retired a multiple Grade 1 stakes of nearly \$2 million. Zeezee Zoomzoom's other four foals of racing age are all winners. And her current yearling by Justify sold at Saratoga five days before Witty's most recent win for \$1.4 million to Qatar Racing, who co-owned Caravel and bought into Witty a year ago.

Zeezee Zoomzoom has a 2025 filly by Nyquist born March 5 and was bred back to McKinzie.

Witty is among the entries for Colonial Downs' \$150,000 Da Hoss Stakes at 5½ furlongs on the turf on Saturday, Sept. 6. Also entered in the field of nine are Fore Harp and Smooth B. ■

Fore Harp has raced five times in 2025, all at different tracks. In his first start at Penn National since December 2021, he delivered his second stakes win of the year when getting up to win the Marshall Jenney on Aug. 15.

Yet one more of the remarkable offspring of Weigelia and the Disco Rico mare Katarica Disco, 7-year-old Fore Harp came out like gangbusters in his first start of the year, taking Laurel Park's 5½-furlong King T. Leatherbury Stakes on the turf in April by nearly two lengths over Witty after leading at every call.

A softer turf at Pimlico greeted him next in the Jim McKay Turf Sprint in May and, while Witty was getting the win, he was backpedaling to finish last of seven.

A trip to Saratoga in June looked promising early, as he led an allowance field through splits of :21.46 and :44.36. He dug in but gave way late and finished last of nine going 5½ furlongs, although beaten all of 5½ lengths.

Monmouth in July was next. But a bad stumble at the start didn't help his cause. He got to the lead in the Wolf Hill but tired and again wound up 5½ lengths back in last place behind winner Fierce and Strong.

Of the six sent out in the Marshall Jenney, Fierce and Strong was the 3-5 favorite; Fore Harp third choice at 4-1. Breaking a step slow, Fore Harp didn't make the front or set dizzying fractions, instead chasing a few lengths back of second-choice Tarsus Warrior, who went the quarter in :22.05 and the half in :44.23.

When Frankie Pennington asked him to go, Fore Harp responded, catching Tarsus Warrior in deep stretch and winning by a half-length. Finishing fastest of all was Fore Harp's stablemate and older brother (by three years) Smooth B. The latter recorded his 16th career on-the-board stakes finish (four of them wins) and pushed his earnings to \$1,097,102.

Owned by LC Racing in partnership with James Bonner and trainer Butch Reid, Fore Harp is closing in on a half-million in lifetime earnings – his 35 starts yielding \$497,256, with eight wins, six seconds and six thirds. His other stakes win came in the 2023 Laurel Dash at Laurel over Witty.

Purchased by LC Racing for \$80,000 at the 2019 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall yearling sale, Fore Harp was unraced at 2, won a maiden special weight in his third start at 3 at Parx and has run up and down the East Coast ever since.

He is one of 11 foals, all winners, bred by the St. Omer's Farm of the late Stephen Quick and his wife Susan out of Katarica Disco. Now 21, Katarica Disco has six stakes performers, all by Weigelia – the others being five-time stakes winner (one this year) and \$811,134-earner Disco Ebo, stakes winner Fat Kat, graded stakes-placed Disco Rose and stakes-placed Pink Princess. ■

Making his first start at Penn National, his first in a stakes, and his first for new connections, Ohio Joe came home first in the Crowd Pleaser Stakes for 3-year-old PA-Breds on Friday afternoon, Aug. 29, for owner Bran Jam Stable and Dave Clark and trainer Louis Linder Jr.

Claimed for \$30,000 in his previous outing, a 1-mile and 70-yard race at Parx on July 16 in which he was last of seven, Ohio Joe was making his second start at the Crowd Pleaser's mile and a sixteenth distance – his earlier effort came over the Delaware Park turf two starts back where he finished midpack, beaten less than three lengths, while risked for a \$75,000 tag.

Often found close to the lead in his races, the bay son of Jimmy Creed was settled back to the outside by Anthony Salgado as second-choice The Boy's Warrior, last year's PA-Bred champion 2-year-old male, easily carved out fractions of :22.19, :46.51 and 1:10.44, with ears flicking.

The Boy's Warrior was still in front as the field turned for home, with the 8-5 favorite, stakes-placed filly Queen's Wreath, to the inside and Ohio Joe to his outside ready to pounce. The Boy's Warrior was visibly tiring and Queen's Wreath started to retreat as Ohio Joe was met to his outside by Shadow Factor and the two battled to the wire. It was a head bob finish until Ohio Joe switched leads late and pulled out the half-length victory. The Boy's Warrior was another two lengths back in third. Final time over the firm course was 1:42.12. Sent off as the third-longest price on the board in the field of eight, Ohio Joe returned \$29 for the win.

The victory was the bay gelding's third in 10 starts and the \$44,100 winner's share of the purse pushed his career total to \$106,474. Making his first seven starts at Parx, he was third in his only start at 2, and recorded his first win in a seven-furlong maiden claimer in March while in for a \$40,000 tag. At that time he was competing for Andy Hawthorne, who picked him out of the 2023 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Fall Yearling sale for \$20,000.

The gelding has a long way to go to match the record of his dam, the Bernstein mare Little B Rosson, who raced 11 years, made 101 starts, won or placed 53 times and earned \$511,500. He has one-upped her however, as he's a debut stakes winner; she made five stakes starts, with her best finish a second in Presque Isle Downs' 2009 H.B.P.A. Stakes.

The mare produced her first foal, PA-Bred Riverboat Bandit (by Keen Ice) in 2020 at the age of 15. He is a two-time winner, including once this year, and has earned \$31,740 while racing exclusively at Penn National. Ohio Joe is her only other foal. ■

The 5-year-old PA-Bred gelding Saburo's Grace added to his streak of 18 straight top-three finishes with a victory on Aug. 10 in the Sprint Series Stakes and a third two weeks later in the Paint the Park Purple Stakes, both at Grande Prairie in Alberta, Canada.

His victory in the Sprint Series was the ninth of his career – and fifth in a stakes – while racing either in Canada or at Great Falls in Montana. In recent starts he's been facing the likes of regular rivals Little J P and Crown Ruler. For his latest

stakes win there was no Little J P, who beat him in his previous start, but he did have to turn back race favorite Crown Ruler, which he did easily by more than a length going 6½ furlongs.

Sent off the favorite next out in the Paint the Park Purple Stakes going 6 furlongs, Saburo's Grace chased a few lengths back of the battling pair of Crown Ruler and Little J P but wasn't able to catch them as Crown Ruler won by 2 lengths; Saburo's Grace just missed grabbing second by a neck.

Saburo's Grace is owned by Barbara Norlander and trained by Lyle W. Magnuson. A son of Saburo, he was bred by Mick Ruis' Ruis Racing LLC, and is one of two foals to race out of Miz Graycee, a daughter of Mizzen Mast campaigned by Ruis to four wins at Santa Anita and Los Alamitos. The mare's other runner, the 3-year-old Kentucky-bred Saburo filly Snow Ghost, is with the same connections and broke her maiden at Grande Prairie on Aug. 24. ■
