# Uncle Heavy sparks excitement on the Triple Crown trail

There's a new colt on the Triple Crown trail and Parx Racing knows him well after his 2023 campaign at the Bensalem oval. But now the name Uncle Heavy is rippling through the nation after he thrust himself into the spotlight by scoring a nose victory in the \$250,000 Withers Stakes-G3 at Aqueduct Racetrack Feb. 3.

The Pennsylvania-Bred, Pennsylvania-Sired son of Social Inclusion is named in honor of longtime horseman Mark Reid, who was originally given the moniker "Heavy" while on the University of Maryland wrestling team.

"This was 30, 40 years ago," he said with a laugh. "I started working for 'Dickie' Dutrow – father of Rick and Anthony – and all the grooms called me 'Heavy' too. When I came up to Pennsylvania nobody knew about it until someone from Maryland called out to me. Everyone loved it, especially my nieces. That's when it became 'Uncle Heavy'."

Reid first saw the colt's dam Expect Wonderful as a 2-year-old and immediately knew he had to get her. He purchased the daughter of Tiz Wonderful for longtime client Daniel Ryan of Smart Angle LLP and trained her throughout her career.

"I always liked her," Reid remembered. "She's a big, physical mare and once she started breezing, she really covered a lot of ground. Unfortunately she had some setbacks and just didn't get to show her true talent."

Expect Wonderful retired with four on-theboard finishes from six lifetime starts. Soon after she retired, Ryan decided he wanted to disperse all of his broodmares and focus more on his racehorses. Reid sent her through the 2020 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December Mixed Sale under his own Walnut Green banner. She was in foal to Social Inclusion at the time.

"She wasn't bringing any bids so I bought her for my friend Michael Milam. On the drive home, I called him on the phone and said, 'Mike, I bought you your first broodmare.' He wasn't quite ready to have a broodmare so I told him that was perfectly fine. My wife and I kept her because we just couldn't afford to have her leave; she was that good."

Expect Wonderful's first foal, who was bred by Ryan's Smart Angle LLP, was named Roan Burgundy (The Factor) and eventually brought \$70,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May 2-year-old sale. Still racing at 4, he has three wins from 15 starts, with earnings approaching six figures.

Her second foal would be Uncle Heavy, who was actually a bit of a celebrity before he was even born. The Pennsylvania Horse Racing Association's Ashley Eisenbeil reached out to Reid about participating in a new program that was geared at attracting new horseracing fans by setting up live foaling cameras at a few local farms.

"Ashley was very persuasive," he said, chuckling. "It was definitely pretty raw to have it all out there. You never know what could happen, but luckily his foaling went smoothly. Expect Wonderful was the last of ours to foal that year [May 2]. It worked out and I'm happy that it brought in some new fans."

When Uncle Heavy was a yearling, Reid gave Mike Milam a call again and offered to sell the colt to his friend of over 35 years at essentially the amount he had put into the horse. He also told Milam that he would recognize the dam. Milam agreed right away. Reid broke Uncle Heavy at his farm and then sent him to a friend for further training at Sharp's Farm in Middletown, Del. That's when the sparks of potential truly began to show.

"I've been in the game a long time so I've seen a lot," Reid said. "You can think you have something special and then it doesn't work out. But with Uncle Heavy, he was just like his mother: a big, physically strong horse. He had the right temperament with a nice, laid-back attitude. The question was whether he would want to beat his buddies in competition."

When it was time, Mark Reid called his brother Robert "Butch" Reid Jr., and the colt joined Butch's racing stable at Parx Racing. Mark had officially retired from training in 2022 and was confident that his brother was the man for the job.

Uncle Heavy debuted Oct. 23 in a 6-furlong open maiden special weight at Parx and made heads turn while battling the overwhelming favorite Twilight Dancer toothand-nail from start to finish. Uncle Heavy crossed under the wire a neck in front, while the third-place finisher was 11¾ lengths behind the duo. Afterwards, Mark received calls and text messages from dozens of people congratulating him while also jokingly jabbing at him because they knew that the horse was named after him. The colt was the slight favorite in his second start, the \$100,000 Pennsylvania Nursery Stakes Nov. 28, but it was an unmitigated disaster right from the start. When the gates opened he hesitated and then greenly ducked in, losing contact with the field. He did gain a lot of ground throughout the race, but his start, combined with a wide run around the turn, saw him finish fifth in the 7-furlong stakes.

His next start in the \$200,000 Wait For It Stakes for PA-Sired, PA-Breds Dec. 27 at a mile and 70 yards was a completely different scenario. Butch Reid had Uncle Heavy ready to roll for his first start around two turns. Although the colt still broke a half-second behind the others at the start, he was able to overcome the deficit and joined the pacesetters after 6 furlongs. Uncle Heavy loved the added distance, so when the time came at the top of the stretch, he found another gear and took off, capturing his first stakes by 1¼ lengths.

His 3-year-old debut in the Withers was a step up in class and he went off a slight longshot at 9-1. The favorite was Lightline, a \$600,000 Keeneland September Yearling purchase, while the eventual second-place finisher El Grande O already boasted two stakes victories and over \$300,000 in earnings. Other horses in the field included Speed Runner, whose dam was purchased for \$1 million, and \$400,000 Keeneland September purchase Mission Beach. Uncle Heavy beat them all.

Unexpectedly, horses from Belmont Park were locked down and not permitted onto other racetracks when a horse tested positive for EHV-1 the very same day as the Withers. While the race was at Aqueduct, one of the other horses in the race had shipped in from Belmont and had been stabled in the same barn as the ill filly. After the race, Uncle Heavy was not able to return to Parx. He is now at a nearby farm, training on the jogging machine and getting some turnout time. This means he would miss a potential start in the Gotham-G3 March 2 at Aqueduct, but he would be able to come in fresh for the Grade 2 Wood Memorial April 6, which would work out perfectly timewise.

"It's been very exciting," Mark Reid said. "We're down to just the one mare, Expect Wonderful. She has a 2-year-old by Peace and Justice who my wife, the breeder, named Beyondexpectations. And this year she's going to open her pocketbook a little for a trip to Kentucky to visit Omaha Beach.

"Now I don't have to worry about hustling or the pressure. I've spent a lifetime in this business and if this is the way it ends then the best part of it is that I get to sit down with my wife Barbara and we can just smile about it all together."

Congratulations to the Barbara Reid-bred Uncle Heavy who finished first in the Grade 3 Withers after winning the \$200,000 PA-Sired PA-Bred Wait For it Stakes. Next up could be the Grade 2 Wood Memorial at Aqueduct. Cross your fingers and good luck!

A big thank you goes out to all of our Stallion Season donors and purchasers who made our 2024 auction a big success. Proceeds from the auction are used toward our lobbying efforts in Harrisburg. The 2023 PA-Sired PA-Bred Stallion Series has concluded. Congrats to Aoife's Magic (bred by Mohns Hill Farm LLC), Notice of Action (bred by Bryan Minnich) and Jody's Ruby (bred by Gilman Hallenbeck) who finished first, second and third in total number of points for the 2023 Series. They earned their trainers \$25,000, \$15,000 and \$10,000 respectively. The series is being expanded for foals of 2022 to include 3yos. The nomination fee is now \$500 until April 30. Replacing the trainer bonus this year will be a \$50,000 breeder bonus for horses that finish first, second and third in total points for the series: \$25,000 for first, \$15,000 for second and \$10,000 for third.

By now you should be familiar with the online registration system on our website. We are

transitioning to that in 2024. If you are still using paper registrations, please

make sure you forward a signed copy of the Code of Ethics, which is attached to the registration form.

All broodmare domicile forms should have already been entered online for the 2024 foaling season except for public sales and breed backs. Please submit your form when your mare enters the state. These domicile reports are MANDATORY and if not completed, your foal could be denied PA-Bred registration.
